



The state is remarkably exceptional in many respects:


- Has the historical record of being the state through which Western civilisation entered Nigeria.
- With this civilisation came international trade, Christian religion and Western education.
- The State has a track record in the supply of highly trained manpower to the country at a time when the rest of the country was yet to be fully exposed to Western education.
- In the colonial and pre-colonial days, the people of Ogun State dominated the professions, particularly the legal, educational, medical, engineering and administrative professions as well as religious vocations. It is not surprising, therefore, that the State has produced many prominent citizens in various walks of life.
- The political leadership of Western region was under the control of the State from the early 1940s to the mid-1960s when democratic governance was halted by the military. Today, the
- people of the State are still at the forefront of the country's commercial and industrial enterprises, as well as religion and the professions.
- The first newspaper in Nigeria, Iwe
 Irohin fun Awon Egba, by Reverend
 Henry Townsend was established in
 Abeokuta in 1859.
- Abeokuta, the capital city of the State, is only about 100 kilometres from Lagos, the country's industrial and commercial nerve centre. This proximity and the State's geographical contiguity to Lagos have placed the State in an advantaged position in terms of access to the economic benefits and inspiration that Lagos offers.
- The State is especially blessed by nature in terms of its geographical location. It is not only a creek and lagoon region, it is also blessed with a coastal plain with the elevation increasing northwards from above 40m to 250m above the sea level. The undulating plain is broken by the North West/South sandstone extending from near Aiyetoro in Yewa zone eastward to ljebu-lgbo. There are pockets of rocky outcrops dotting the landscape especially around Abeokuta. With a good climatic pattern of evenly balanced wet and dry seasons, and with a total land mass of about 16,409.26 square kilometres, the State is undoubtedly a fortunate one in terms of location from the point of view of economic, tourist and natural resources potential.
- The State is endowed with wide, extensive, fertile and arable lands which could be turned into agricultural use. With the savannah land in the northwestern part, there exists a large opportunity for livestock production on a large scale to meet the needs of the State for livestock products



and even contribute to the country's stock of such products. The State also has vast forest reserves that could be reforested to meet its demands for timber and wildlife while at the same time preserving the forest resources. Besides, there is a network of lakes, rivers, lagoons and ocean fronts whose resources are also available for tapping. The State has a lot to offer Nigeria and the international community. The State is an embodiment of outstanding traditional cultures which over time have been refined without distortions to make them internationally attractive and alluring. In effect, the State is a tourist's delight. From Remo to Egba and from Yewa to Ijebu, there abound spectacular tourist attractions that could leave the most cynical tourist gasping for breath. The most popular tourist

attraction in the State is the Olumo Rock located in the heart of Abeokuta. Also in Abeokuta at Ogbe is the old Manse. In Ilaro, there is Orona Shrine. In Ipokia, there is Tongeji Island. In Ota, there are St James Anglican School and the Ijamido River Shrine.


- The State is blessed with an abundance of historic monuments that include the Birikisu Sungbo Shrine at Oke-Eri near Ijebu Ode and River Yemoji in Ijebu Ode which has a natural swimming pool.
- The State has almost a dozen universities, two owned by the State, one by the Federal Government and the remainder privately-owned; one college of education; six polytechnics and one college of agriculture.
- The State is very rich in mineral resources: limestone, gypsum, tar, gravel, high quality stone, phosphate,

bitumen. And there is an increasing evidence of crude oil deposits.

Let us make no mistake about it; we




We need to have a dream of our State and I do have one.

On The Driver's Seat

He who stands with the poor and the weak in defence of their interests is the only citizen deserving of a leader's mantle. And always remember, our own society has been built on the sweat of the poor with very little given to them in return. So, let it be your task to learn all the arts and skills to help in uplifting the poor majority.

Where there is no vision, the people perish: that's what the wise king said in Proverbs 29:18. Now, imagine that there is a vision but no visionary - that person with an unusually acute foresight and imagination - to execute the vision. Listen to this: "I do believe that there are a few things we can do for our people and I am fired by the zeal to render service to our people." Those are the words of Justus Olugbenga Daniel, better known as Otunba Gbenga Daniel, and fondly called OGD, in an interview published on July 16, 2001, by a defunct newspaper, The Anchor. Going by happenings in today's Ogun State, those

words can be described as the

profound words of a visionary, and a missionary too.

A critical study of OGD's life shows that leading the way is like second nature to him. For instance, at the University of Lagos (UNILAG) where he studied Mechanical Engineering during the era of the prodigious Prof Ayodele Awojobi of blessed memory, he was President of the Engineering Students' body. At the Baptist Boys High School (BBHS), Abeokuta, which he attended from 1963 to 1973, he represented the school in a lot of extra-curricular activities such as debates and quiz competitions; this earned him exceptional popularity. Now, add learning at the feet of a master such as late Chief Obafemi Awolowo - while at UNILAG, he became the youngest member of the late sage's Committee of Friends - then you have a well-rounded leader.

The story of how he got into Awo's circle is instructive of OGD's sagacity. Concerned that Pa Awo was constantly attacked and vilified by the then radicals, particularly those in the academia, "despite that Awo did so much in Western Region," the young Daniel decided to visit the late sage at his Park Lane, Apapa, Lagos home. He

continues the story:


I introduced myself and I said the reason why I actually came is, I just must understand why you're being attacked when, in fact, from what I had seen you should be hailed. And I said there's something we can do about it. He looked at me and said: 'Young man, what do you want to do?" and I said if you speak to some of these radicals they would begin to see things your own way. He then gave me the authority to invite anyone of them that I feel he should talk with. And the first person I invited was Professor Ayodele Awojobi, who was then my lecturer in mechanical engineering, and who was a known radical and commentator on social and political issues. Prior to the time I invited Awojobi, he was also one of his critics. But by the time I invited him and Chief Awolowo spoke with him, the story changed and he became converted and started to expand the ideals of inviting quite a number of people. I don't want to be mentioning names so that I


don't sound immodest, but I have no doubt in my mind that most of them know themselves. Radicals, University of Lagos based, and virtually all the names that later became "Awoist", got invited into the fold. And that is how I started to attend the meetings of the Committee of Friends.

Born on April 6, 1956, in the ancient city of Ibadan, to Rev. Abraham Adebola and Madam Olaitan Daniel, OGD hails from the Oje dynasty whose gallantry is acclaimed in Makun located within today's Sagamu Local Government Area of Ogun State. At Ibadan, young Olugbenga Daniel began his educational career at Saint James' Primary School, Oke-Ado and later ICC Primary School, Oke-Bola. Following the movement of his parents to Lagos, he completed his primary education at Mushin Public School, Lagos. While in Mushin, even as a Christian, he had the rare opportunity of studying a bit of Arabic language and Islam. This explains why he is at home at Islamic worships.

In a way, religion helped in shaping his character. He confesses:

"...as a young man, I was deeply religious...I was a travelling secretary of the Scripture Union in those days. Even back at the secondary school, I was the chaplain of Ilugun Baptist Church. On Sundays, I had to go and take on a whole church, and I was the one who was ministering to them every Sunday as a student, when all the other students at the Baptist Boys High School went to worship at the Owu Baptist Church. I had to go to Ilugun Baptist Church because there was no pastor at that church, and I think I ministered in Ilugun Baptist Church for close to one year. So, I think I have been lucky that I had such disciplined background." He allows, however: "Having said that, I am not a saint, I am a human being. But I tried very, very hard within limits to ensure that I control whatever situation I found myself. I think the greatest thing I have is that I have the capacity to exercise control."





customary at BBHS then, he attempted the General Certificate Examination (GCE) in Form Four and he came out with the second best result. It was at BBHS that he learnt how to play the organ and became a maestro of sorts.

His streak of excellence continued at the School of Basic Studies at The Polytechnic, Ibadan between 1974 and 1976, leading to an excellent A-Level result. It was with these outstanding results that Daniel got admitted into the School of Engineering of the University of Lagos, where he not only earned scholarship from the United African Company (UAC), he also became

one of the best and beloved students of the legendary Professor Awojobi. An avid reader with an insatiable appetite for knowledge, he frequently visited different libraries to update himself. This directly resulted in his commanding intellectual versatility and intimidating mental perception. It was through the readings that he caught the Obafemi Awolowo bug and imbibed the need for a just, egalitarian and developmental political system, which he believes, is the only imperative for social stability. He was a social activist who served as the President of the philanthropic and highly rated Cosmic Club.

By providence, he served the mandatory one-year National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) programme in Lagos, and had his primary assignment at the School of Engineering, Lagos State Polytechnic. Here, he rose to the challenge of supervising the construction of the department's complex. He equally gave his best in other areas so much so that at the end of the service year, the institution persuaded him to continue as a staff. He thereafter represented the college on the National Board of Technical Education (NBTE) charged with the task of drawing up the curricular for technical education in Nigeria. Apart from being a




Manager in charge of projects and operations and his responsibilities included the design, fabrication and erection of steel structures like crane installations and factories made of steel. He also worked on the design and fabrication of steel storage tanks, trailers, badges and the like. Through a newspaper advertisement that was particularly challenging, he moved dramatically from Metal Construction (W.A.) Limited to H. F. Schroeder (W. A.) Limited, Lagos. At Schroeder, the challenges were indeed greater and the exposure correspondingly impressive. With widespread travelling opportunities, provided through job executions, he became conversant with


many of Nigeria's towns and villages in addition to the daunting task of running three full-fledged, large and independent departments. When he was promoted to the position of Assistant General Manager, the departments under his supervision increased to five with greater responsibilities. As the Deputy Managing Director of Schroeder, old records were broken and new ones were set as he became the first black man to rise to that position after 30 years of the company's operations in Africa. He eventually left the company after he had put in nine years of meritorious service.

With diligently acquired skill and expertise in vertical transportation,

lecturer of Applied Mechanics he displayed such responsibility and acute sense of duty that he was drafted to conduct a whole sessional examination of the Polytechnic, single-handedly, and he did this excellently well. While at Lagos State Polytechnic, his urge for greater self-development inspired him to enrol in 1980 at the University of Lagos for a Master of Business Administration degree (MBA).

Desirous of more exposure, greater challenges and sundry opportunities, he left the academia to practise his profession, joining Metal Construction (W.A.) Limited, Apapa, Lagos as the Assistant Commercial







of developmental initiatives targeted at the rural communities in a bid to address issues of poverty and economic deprivation, in line with the United Nations Millennium Development Goals.

Convinced of the need to plow back into the society some of the abundance it has pleased God to endow him with, GFF became the vehicle for his humanitarian activities which include Microcredit Scheme, Trade Establishment Scheme,

Free Medical Services, Children Deworming, Scholarship Awards to students of tertiary institutions, and Free Screening for diabetes and hypertensive patients. GFF is also involved in distribution of wheel chairs to people with paralysis and provision of financial assistance to people with peculiar needs. Over the years, no fewer than half a million people all over Ogun State have benefited from the Micro-Credit Scheme which is a revolving loan meant for starting small-scale business and the Trade Establishment Scheme (TES) which is essentially about providing implements and tools for starting either a trade or a vocation. The Trade Establishment Scheme, very popular among the masses, makes available items such as refrigerators, deep freezers, water storage tanks, coolers, pop-corn-making machines, block-making

material handling, power plants and general engineering through training, self-development, numerous local and international seminars, workshops, conferences and such activities, he was ready to take his own destiny in his own hands. And, so Kresta Laurel Limited was born. As the founding Chief Executive Officer of the company, he was responsible for the overall planning, equipment selection, specification, liaison with related professionals, acquisition, organisation and general supervision. This brought about the astronomical growth of the company to comfortable leadership position in the vertical transportation industry. Today, Kresta Laurel Limited is undoubtedly a household name throughout the country and beyond - a situation which confirms his diligence.

In July 2002, Otunba Olugbenga
Daniel co-founded with his amiable wife,
Yeye Olufunke Fehintade Daniel, a nonpartisan, non-profit, socio-cultural group,
the Gateway Front Foundation (GFF),
with a focus on improving the lives of the
poor and down-trodden people in Ogun
State. GFF works positively in a series







machines, sewing machines, fishing nets, wheel barrows, etc, which were given free of charge to beneficiaries.

Equally worthy of mention is the Children De-worming Programme which was carried out all over the State. No fewer than 500,000 children have benefited from this programme which was complemented with free medical services provided by the foundation's mobile clinic. Virtually all strata of the society in Ogun State have benefited in one way or another from the activities of the GFF.

Otunba Daniel's generosity and humanitarian activities have not gone unnoticed. Many organisations including the Jaycees and the Rotary Club have honoured him with awards for his exemplary services to the community while numerous communities in Ogun State and beyond have since 1993 been honouring him with chieftaincy titles. To date, he has no fewer than 60 traditional and honorary titles. 





For recreation which he rarely has, he studies biographies and autobiographies of great men. He plays squash, table tennis and the piano.

On, May 29, 2003, Justus Olugbenga Daniel was sworn-in as the Governor of Ogun State - the land of his dream. This did not come on a Silver Salva tray. It was the result of sweat and swot. On June 11, 2002, OGD set out with a team of the best and the brightest on painstaking tour of the nooks and cranny of Ogun State: 1,000 towns and villages in all the 236 wards in the 20 local government areas of the State. Business Unusual




There is a need to set new parameters, to change focus and to re-energise the machinery of government towards optimum goal attainment. While we recognise the value in existing approaches, we equally acknowledge the imperative of seeking new frontiers in the governance of (the) State. The problems

that confront us today are radically different from what obtained yesteryears, calling for enhanced attitudes and aptitudes as we seek to inaugurate a new chapter in the socio-economic and political history of our State.

Our approach to governance will thus be radically different, in accordance with our credo of "business unusual." (This) credo speaks to a desire to engineer a paradigm shift in the way Government business is conducted, to reduce waste and free up resources for developmental projects with long-lasting impact.


Our primary objective is to give hope to the hopeless, to return our State to work and to restore Ogun State to its rightful place among the Federating units of Nigeria. Achieving this objective requires singularity of purpose and patriotic commitment, which I am sure we can muster if we set our mind to it.

In some of the roads we are doing, sometimes the thing is so bad that we have to tar the road before we do the drainage because we cannot just wait. Whereas, normally, we should put drainage before doing the road. But in cases where we can still wait, we do so, for instance at Oba Erinwole Road in Sagamu. OGROMA (Ogun State Road Maintenance Agency) (had) been there for some time, but we found out that it (was) going to be a waste of time to do the road without the drainage. ... In the last few months, OGROMA has been busy with the drainages. Once the drainages are completed we can now fix the road.



The first thing we made up our mind on is that we won't retrench, because to embark on a retrenchment is to add to this problem of unemployment. But, while saying we are not retrenching, we decided that we will rationalise. Our rationalization is not reduction of staff, it is about conducting a staff audit at all levels. Here, it will surprise you that in a lot of government departments there are a lot of idle staff, and you have other departments where people are overworked. We are now going through a process of rationalizing and restructuring through a staff audit. For instance, we are re-arranging OGBC (Ogun State Broadcasting Corporation), and I'm told they have about 30 drivers there. Those drivers were running the place probable 10 years ago when the concept and operation was something different. In the last few years, there has not been any need to keep 30 drivers in OGBC. Meanwhile, another department is requesting for drivers and I said rather than retrench those drivers, just transfer them to where they are needed.

The second thing is to now look at the database of the unemployed. Who are these unemployed? We tried to have a database, and having done that, we now (asked) what are the areas of need? So, we have a process of matching supply

with demand. For example, there are a lot of rooms for teachers at the secondary school level. The problem is about how we are going to pay them. In response to that, we came out with a programme where we said we are going to employ 2000 teachers yearly who will be paid an allowance for a period of one year. That time-frame will give us the opportunity to re-arrange and re-organise. While we keep them off the streets, we are hoping that within that one year, we will be able to absorb them properly into the Teaching Service Commission. After that, we can now take another set of the unemployed. By so doing, we would have gone through a process of gradually absorbing the unemployed teachers.

We are taking a look at other people. What are their qualifications, what else can they do outside white collar jobs. And that was what led to the training of people in Agriculture. I think the programmes are quite successful. The farm estates were there lying fallow. I was at Apoje Farm recently where I was told they needed 120

climbers and they have only two persons who are from Akwa Ibom. I now ask(ed) what really the problem is. Is it that our people don't know how to climb palm trees? I was later told that there is a better way than climbing, which in operation in Malaysia. I now said, can't we study it and use the same model here? We have done that and will commence the training of our people who will not have to climb any longer. In that case, there is an area of need but we lack people who are properly trained to do those things. We now require the competencies to do the work in Apoje. We found the boys on the streets and asked if they will be willing to acquire training in that area which they gladly accepted to do. And with a little help from us, they were trained and they are now moving to Apoje, happy that they are now engaged.

For the long term, we need to now begin to see the kind of education to be offered so that the graduates that are going to come out in the next five to eight years, will be those trained in the areas of demand.

One of the biggest problems in government is leakages and when I used (that word), I'm being very polite.

...There are so many areas we are looking at. For instance, in terms of bank interest alone, due to prudent management within four months into this administration we were able to save N57 million out of bank charges.

We (would tell a bank), "you are charging the state 23 per cent but we now have another bank willing to charge us 18 per cent. We don't want to take this account from you because you've been our friend and ally over the years, but if you are not ready to accept this cheaper rate, another bank will get the account." I don't even hide the name of the bank and everybody was complying without terms, and by that step alone, we have saved a tremendous amount of money.




Agriculture

PLEDGE: We will play the role of enabler and facilitator as we seek to raise the practice and vocation of Agriculture to a level that ensures food security for the populace and

secures sustainable livelihoods and enhanced incomes for our farmers. We will use the resuscitation of the farm settlement scheme to provide large-scale employment opportunities for school leavers and other unemployed youth who show interest in going into Agriculture as a vocation.

With determination and focus on our part and with God on our side, our Gateway State will also become a breadbasket, not only for our nation but also for the West African sub-region at large.









Wealth Avenues in Agriculture and Forestry

Gmelina: In Ijebu East and Ogun Waterside, there is an over-aged and under-utilised 25,000-hectare *gmelina_aborea* plantation with an expected yield of five million cubic feet. Investors interested in the conversion of *gmelina* have a ready source of raw materials.

Cashew: At Ibara Orile, the state has 400 hectares of cashew which are being expanded

continually. Besides, small farmers in the area have individual cashew plots. Thus, cashew processing industries are feasible.

Rubber: Manufacturers of rubberised products can access raw materials from the extensive rubber plantations in Ilushin, Ikenne and Ibiade.

Tomatoes: Tomato production thrives in the Igbesa vegetable belt in the Ado-Odo/ Ota Local Government

Ripe and fresh tomatoes are abundant for more than six months in the year and enough to support a tomato puree industry.

Kolanut: Ogun State is one of the largest producers of kolanut in the country. Its plantations abound in the Remo Zone of the State.

Cassava: Any investor interested in the production of cassava starch, chips, flour and all other derivatives should come to the State where the production of this root crop has been improved through the introduction of high-yielding and disease-resistant varieties.

Poultry: Ogun State is the largest poultry producer in Nigeria such that at certain periods there is usually a glut of poultry eggs. Opportunities, therefore, exist for investment in poultry-based industries such as egg powder and poultry meat processing.

Bee-Farming: Opportunities exist in the abundant forest and crop plantations, to boost honey production for both described fo

duction for both domestic consumption

and export.

Cocoa: More than 3,000 tonnes of co-

coa is being graded yearly in Ogun State. With the renewed in rehabilitation of old grooves of cocoa and the planting of new hybrid

cocoa seedlings, the avail-

ability of more than enough raw materials to feed a cocoa-based industry in the

State is quaranteed.

Rice: "Ofada", though quite nutritious suffers from poor processing and packaging. Yet this rice variant grows vastly in Ofada in Obafemi-Owode Local Government Area. This is a great investment opportunity.

Oil Palm: Palm oil, palm kernel and other derivatives from fresh fruit bunches of oil palm, are seasonal in production. During the peak season, from December to June, there is usually a glut of palm oil. Locating oil palm industries in Ogun Waterside and Ipokia/Ado-Odo Local Government Areas of the State makes investment sense.

Maize: Maize is produced in commercial quantities throughout the length and breadth of the State, particularly in Yewa North Local Government Area.

Industries which make use of maize as

a raw material will thrive. Pineapple: Large and medium scale pineapple farms abound in the State, enough to supply canning industries.

Sugar cane: Large sugar cane plantations exist in Papalanto in Ewekoro Local Government Area. Industries requiring sugar cane as raw material will thrive

and operate profitably in the State. Citrus: Citrus is produced in commercial

quantities in some areas of the State. In the 1970s, much of the citrus used by Lafia Canning Factory in Ibadan, was obtained from


Ogun State. The plantations still exist and expanding them will supply the needed citrus such as sweet orange, grape juice, shad dock and tangelo to relevant industries.

Coffee: There is currently no coffee

processing industry in Ogun State despite the large quantities of coffee that is handled in the State.








Citizen Participation


Culture and Tourism

initiatives.






Education


Information and Communication Technology

PLEDGE: As part of our effort to promote efficiency and transparency in the conduct


of government business, we will immediately embarked on putting in place a cost-effective and up-to-date management information system (MIS) at all levels of governance.





Infrastructural Development


















Bye, bye bureaucracy

Engr Olufolaranmi Olusegun Onayemi, Director of Electrical Services in the ministry of works talks about the "magic" of lighting up Ogun State.

What are the projects that you've been carrying out since the inception of the Otunba Gbenga Daniel administration?

We have been involved in the maintenance of the street lights and also the construction of the street lights on the Sagamu-Abeokuta dual carriageway. In the future, what are the other areas that you think you would want to lay hands on after finishing this one now?

The beauty of what Otunba Gbenga
Daniel is doing to the Civil Service is
the professionalisation of each agency.
Before now, electrical work was saddled
(bundled) among other engineering
works and (this situation) doesn't give
it room to breathe. Because a lot of
things are involved and before you know
it, the big fish would have swallowed
the small fish. But the beauty of what
the administration is doing is that it is
bringing up each profession for optimum
performance.

Before now, the street lighting in Ogun State had been in comatose for between 12 and 15 years. So, by the time we came on board, people were saying, "Eh, don't mind them. That is what they would do and they would soon forget about it (halfway)." They do not even believe that we could turn it around. But the beauty of all these is that the governor brought out electrical works under a government agency called Ogun State Electrification Project (OGSEP) to handle all electrical matters in the state. And this is why we are able to perform. Bureaucracy was removed, and within a short time, you can't believe it,

within two months, we had been able to turn around everything. Every street light in Ogun State. And everybody was marvelling.

In Ogun State? Which towns?

They are working in Abeokuta, liebu Ode, Ayetoro, Shagamu, Ijebu-Igbo and Ilaro. At least, those six towns I mentioned, you will see their street light coming on. People couldn't believe it. Under two months. That is why I say the beauty of it all is the professionalism of each agency of the Civil service. That agency, Ogun State Electrification Project, OGSEP, was created by the governor in October, 2004. Street lighting is just one aspect. The other is rural electrification. The rural electrification cuts across all the nooks and cranny of the State, especially those rural areas where we don't have electricity supply. We are working on it and this year (2005), hopefully, we are going to embark on some.


Another thing this governor is doing is that he wants to give life to people living in the suburban areas. If you look at our major towns, Abeokuta for instance, many of the people living in this town, about half or two-third of them are living in the suburb. And

these are the areas thieves, robbers are penetrating just because of the darkness. And the governor, being concerned about the lives of the people, is having it in mind to see to the electrification of such areas. So that at the end of the day, all these areas would have steady supply of lights (electricity). One, it is going to enhance the living conditions in the area. A lot of my colleagues are living in such areas... they would work in the day and in the night; they would not be able to sleep because they have very poor, low-voltage


electricity supply. They cannot iron their clothes. They cannot power the fan, they cannot sleep. By the time such areas are visited, that situation would be removed. The economy of such area would develop because people like welders, electronic workshops, whatever they are using electricity for, would spring up. And before you know it, people's economy would spring up. And the robbers would fly away because they don't operate in bright light. They cover themselves with darkness. So, when there is light everywhere now, you will see these robbers disappearing. And that is what we call meaningful development. I think this administrationits thinking is excellent.

My people, my officers are very happy. For one thing, we are given challenges.

(No more) idling away. We are all proud now that we are putting into practice what we have learnt. And through that, these challenges, we are improving our skills to the benefit of the state because the state can now boast that they have able hands to handle electrical matters. But if the hands are allowed to rot away, we would just waste off. So, we are happy.










Youth Employment and Job Creation


Investment Drive

Yes, yes. One of the key motivations that push us forward to commit this huge investment has been the governor. If it were not for him, maybe we would have thought twice not to do it.






Transformation in Motion
