# GATEWAY GAMES 2006: THE CUTTING EDGE

Ogun State Government was awarded the hosting rights of the 15<sup>th</sup> National Sports festival tagged Gateway Games 2006 on Friday, 18<sup>th</sup> June, 2004. The responsibilities attendant upon the right necessitated the government to inaugurate, on the 9<sup>th</sup> of March, 2005, Gateway Games 2006 Commission with an act of the State House of Assembly with a view to delivering the most successful National Sports Festival.

## THE MISSION

Gateway Games 2006 is one Sports festival planned for the economic empowerment of the youths and the generality of the Ogun State indigenes. This is clearly envisioned in the Games template and equally instructive in its phased execution as exemplified in various socio-economic programmes ranging from roads, water, housing, tourism development and lots more.

Besides, the Gateway Games 2006 Commission had reeled out programmes that had clearly repositioned the National Sports fiesta even when competitions are still some few weeks away. Some of the unprecedented programmes are as listed:

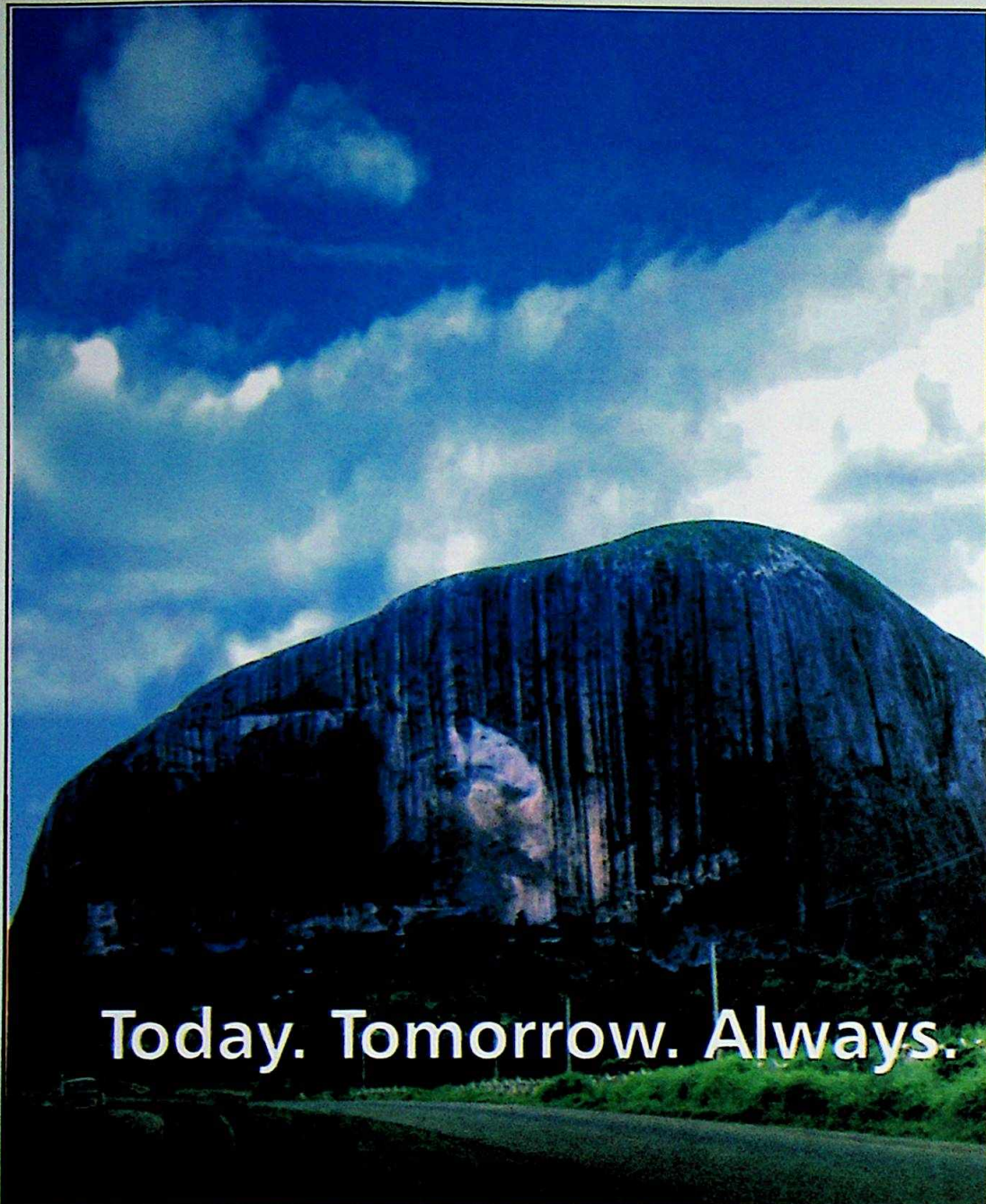

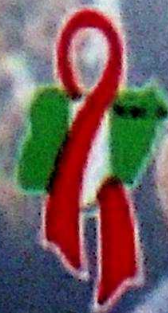

# OGUN STATE SPORTS PROFILE

## 30 YEARS OF ENDURING SPORTS LEGACIES

### (1976-2006)

1. **HISTORY:** Ogun State was created in February 1976 from the Old Western State as a result of which the Ogun State Sports Council, a social oriented, Statutory Corporation was established by Edict 4 of 1977 as contained in the Ogun State of Nigeria Gazette No. 7 Volume 2 of 12 May, 1977 (Now Law of Ogun State Cap 84) and charged with the responsibilities of promoting and developing Sports in Ogun State.

2. **FUNCTIONS:** The main function of the Council is the administration of Sports in the State in all its ramifications, with a view to identifying sports talents, grooms them for national and international competitions.

3. **THE COUNCIL:** For the effective administration of sports, the Law provides for Governing Board of Governors for the formulation of policies for the Council Management and Sports Associations to implement.

4. **OFFICE:** The Sports Council has its headquarters presently at the Alake Sports Centre, Ijeja, Abeokuta with zonal headquarters at Muda Lawal Stadium, Abeokuta, Ijebu-Ode Stadium, Ijebu-Ode. Remo Stadium, Sagamu, Kewa Stadium, Ilaro, Ota and Ijebu-Igbo zonal offices. Offices are also located at Odeda, Owode-Egba, Ayetoro, Ifo, Odogbolu, Ikenne, Ogbera and Abigi. These zonal offices provide services for other Local/Government areas in the State.

5. **DEVELOPMENT OF SPORTS:** At the inception in 1976, the Ogun State Sports Council concerned itself with the development of twelve sports namely Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Boxing, Cycling, Volleyball, Table Tennis, Lawn Tennis, Wrestling, Football, Cricket and Judo. These had increased tremendously to the extent that as at today about 32 are being developed to include Squash Racket, Chess, Golf, Gymnastics, Weight-Lifting, Darts, Taekwondo, Karate, Traditional Sports, Special Sports, Hockey, Handball, Swimming, Scrabble, Shooting, Baseball, Regatta, Kung-fu etc.

6. **COMPETITIONS:** Ogun State has actually made its marks in almost all sports having participated effectively in almost all available national competitions since 1976. The State Started participating in the National Sports Festival right from the 3<sup>rd</sup> Edition in 1977 and the subsequent ones with the following records.

In football, Ogun State has won a number of notable, football events such as Ramat Cup in 1987, Coca-Cola Under-18 in 1992 and '93 and runners up in 1995. Equally Ogun State through the defunct Abiola Babes won the National Challenge Cup in 1985 and 1987 and also runners-up in 1984 and 1986. The State female soccer team won the gold medal at the 10<sup>th</sup> National Sports Festival in Makurdi, Benue State in 1996. Ogun State has also won Shell Football Cup thrice, while the defunct Gateway Football F.C. has been resuscitated and now playing in the National League.

In the game of Cricket, Ogun State is a force to be reckoned with as six of the NNPC all Nigeria Secondary School out of nine Cricket Competition had been won by the State. Ogun State was also the first to win the Cup for keeps and on the verge of retaining the second trophy for keeps. The State has also won the Philips Asiodu Super Cup for the Second consecutive years, National Primary School competition and six-Aside Championships.

Ogun State is the home of Badminton and is the only State that has produced an Olympic Badminton Player in person of Kayode Akinsanya; African Champion and World No. 19 along with other galaxy of players. The likes of S.I. Olusesan, B. Badru, the Akinsanya brothers, Bellos, Roberts, Mustapha, Odedirans and a host of others too numerous to mention are part of the super stars produced for this country from Ogun State.

The game of Table Tennis, Boxing, Chess, Tennis, Cycling, Handball and Wrestling are also good reference points for the State's phenomenal achievements as star athletes have been produced by the State in these Sports up to the African, Commonwealth and world levels of competition.

The household names of the Toriolas, Arogundades, Atanda Musas, Onifades, Okons, Taiwos, Okenlas, Lampteys are names that could not be forgotten in Table Tennis World. Ogun State's record in Cycling for about two decades could not be erased while Boxing, Handball, Wrestling and others are other areas that indelible marks have been made. One cannot but specifically mention names like Amos Ojo in Wrestling, the Bellos and Adeyemi's etc in Handball and many more too numerous to mention.

Perhaps one of the greatest achievement of the State was in the production of star athletes in the Athletics track and field events. The fore-runners such as the Majekodunmis, Sobandes, Yomi Peters, R. Odesinas, A. Olakunles, J. Afuapes, the Commonwealth 4 x 4 100m Gold Medalist, Samson Oyeledun, the Ojumolas, Sowunmi's, Bankole's, Falujo's, Ajayis, Yaya Adesina, Rashida Mustapha, J. Azare, Mosun Soneye, I. Amoa, A. Quadri, as well as the queen of the track, Chief Falilat Ogunkoya (MON) who was the first Nigeria" individual Athletic medalist at any Olympic and one time world Champion in 400m, the Onanugas etc are pointers to our claims in Athletics events.

The Special Sports have also brought joy to the State and Nigeria at large as the first Gold Medal at any Paralympic Games was won by Ajibola Adeoye (an Amputee) from Ogun State at the 1992 Barcelona Paralympics Games where he won 2 Gold Medals in 100m and 200m with World records, The feat he repeated in 1996 Paralympic games in Atlanta, USA where 2 Gold and one Silver Medals were won in 100m, 200, and long jump; Yemi Bamgbose, Wheel Chair Table Tennis player also from the State was once a World No.2 player, Adio Adebisi is also an African Silver Medalist, a feat he achieved at the last All Africa Games in Abuja in 2003.

Our achievement is not complete without mentioning names like Akeem Olajuwon who was one of the junior State Basketball players that represented Ogun State at the junior Championship in Minna in 1980 as well as at African Junior Championship in Zimbabwe same year. Today Akeem the Dream is a world renowned star player based in USA.

In Badminton, We have Tunde Badru, S. Olusesan, I. Roberts, M. Michael, S. Oyelola, F. Mustapha, Akinsanya brothers, Kayode Ige, Abimbola Odejoke and many others. Equally, Ogun State had produced an outstanding Commonwealth Gold medalist in 48kg in Wrestling in person of Amos Ojo who represented Nigeria and won several medals at African and Commonwealth levels of competitions as well as Tabi Agoro, Sunday Adamo, Dele Zinzu etc.





Talking about Boxing, outstanding pugilists such as Ajani Aremu, Sola Faleti, Ayodele Peters, Richard Akinbobola, Abiodun Adebisi, Kingsley Enadegha, Adedayo Adedeji, Bose Osoba and a host of others too numerous to mention had done the State and country proud. For the Ping Pong Games, it would be difficult for any State of the Federation to erase the records got by Ogun State in the production of galaxy of Table Tennis stars right from the Bangbades, Oduntans, Arogundades, Atand Musa, Adeboguns, Toriola brothers, Onifades, Tejuoshos, Taiwos, Lampteys, Kehinde Okanlas, Jude Okors, Merotouns and so many others who were African and Commonwealth Champions.

We cannot forget outstanding Sports personalities of Ogun State Origin who either as administrators or active sports participants had contributed to the development of Sports in this Country. Names such as Segun Odegbami, Late Muda Lawal, Idowu Otubusin, Olu Onagoruwa, Bayo Alli, Ayoola Olusegun (Baba Yara) O.A. Oloyede, J.A Adeola, S.S. Odulate, A. Adekogbe, Biyi Adelaja, Kashimawo Laloko and many others and of course the Isaac Akiyoes, the Sogbesans, Pa Tejuosho, Tinu Dawodus, Pa. (Dr.) Adedoyin, Late Wale Solanke, Alabi Adelanwa, S.O. Williams, M.A. Arogundade, Wale Adesina, Late Sam Oladunjoye, Late S.O. Lawal, the Ilesanles, Ola F. Beyioku, Olu Adeleke, Tunji Onatolu, Prof. Seun Omotayo, Justices Demola Bakre and G.O. Soremi, Fande Osokoya Gen. I. Williams, Pa. Brig. Gen. Henry Adefowope and others all of whom cannot be forgotten in a hurry at all from Ogun State.

**FACILITIES:** Ogun State is proud to say that all necessary Sports facilities are either in place or being renovated to meet the required standard.

The M.K.O. Abiola stadium is with the State-of-the-art facilities with standard football pitch, 8-lane-tartan track, Flood light, public address system, expansive parking lawns, Cricket Pitch, practicing pitches, Hockey pitch, all in an accessible environment.

The Gateway International Stadium, Ijebu-Ode is ready and already commissioned by Mr. President. The Stadium by all standards has been assessed second best to Abuja National Stadium at least in terms of the main bowl, 10-lane tartan track which is the best for track and field events during 2006 Gateway Games together with games village that can accommodate 1000 Athletes and Officials.

The Alake sports centre has halls for table tennis, Badminton martial Arts such as Wrestling, Karate Taekwondo, judo, Boxing etc and three halls including a modern fibre-glass court for Squash Racket Games.

Well laid out court for Handball, Volleyball, Basketball, Abula and Lawn Tennis are equally available while the most challenging golf course in Africa is in Abeokuta. Ogun State is more than ready in terms of Sports facilities which include State owned facilities and social clubs and School Sports facilities. Just recently, Ogun State organized the first ever Rowing, if it is included in the games, scoring or demonstration.

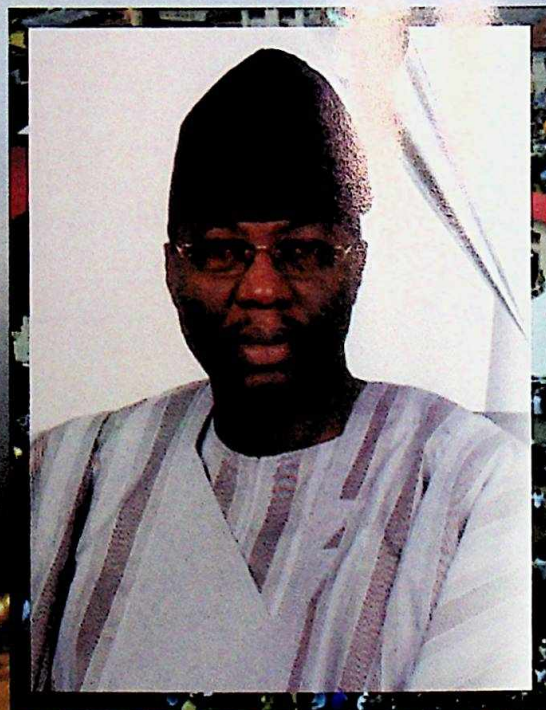

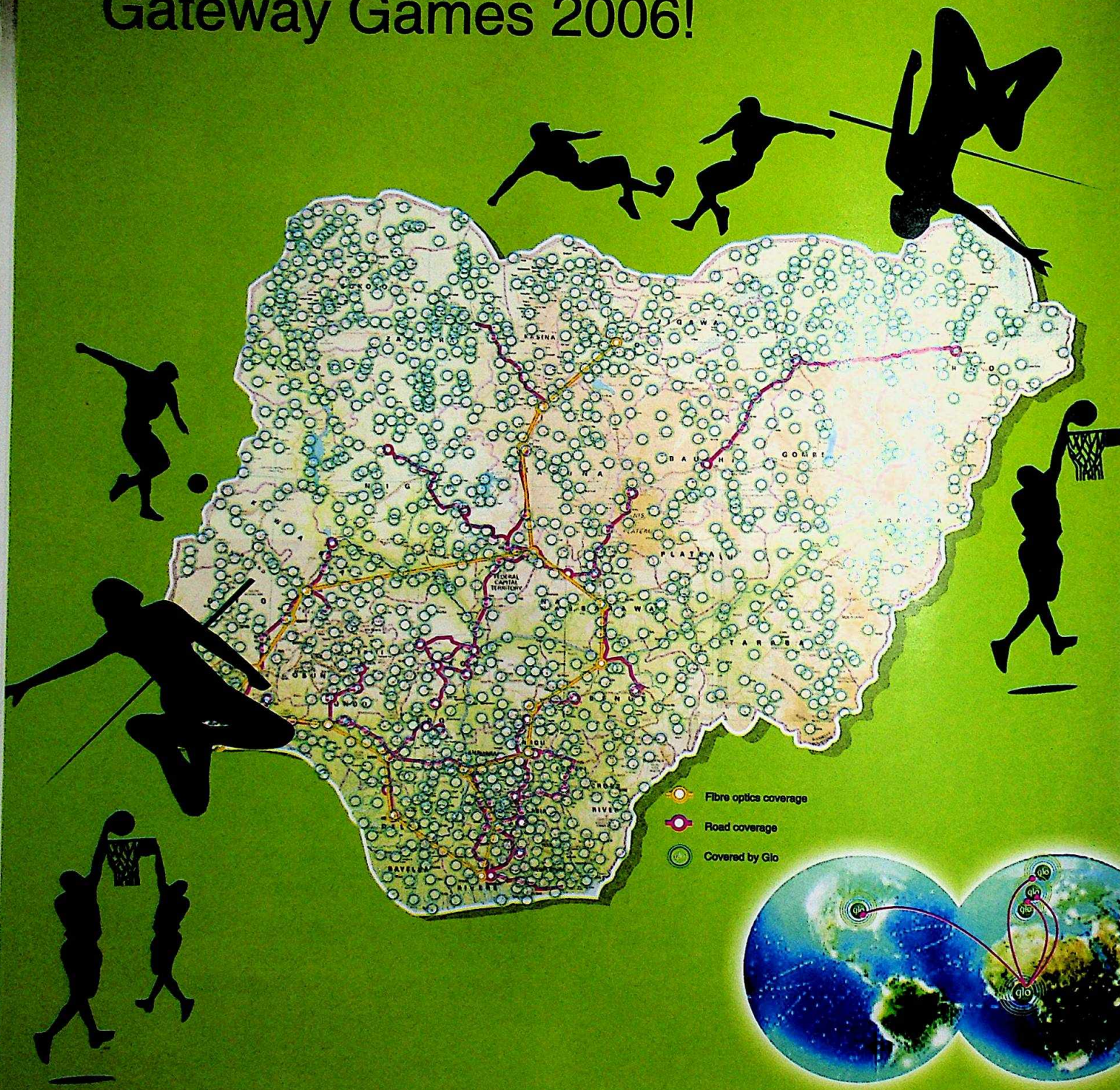
