





OGUN: Mission To Rebuild

enormous task before us to rebuild and transform Ogun State while we stick to our idea of giving account to our people every quarter without making any issue about the fact that September 5 represents our first 100 days in office.

However, since the tradition of judging elected leaders by their performance in the first 100 days in office which was institutionalised by that great American president, Franklin Delano Roosevelt (Napoleon Bonaparte of France actually originated the idea), has now been domesticated in our democracy, I see today as another opportunity to give account of how well our administration has started to put things right in Ogun State.

Incidentally, I am a fan of the administrative style of FDR and his New Deal programme which saw his government use a combination of policies and legislation to effectively tackle the Great Depression of the 1930s. It is for this reason that I also see our efforts in tackling the socio-economic and political challenges facing our people as our own way of formulating a New Deal for Rebuilding, Restoring and Re-positioning Ogun State. We promised the people a five-point programme which include:1) Affordable Qualitative Education; 2) Efficient Health Care Delivery; 3) Agricultural Production Industrialisation; 4) Affordable Housing and ' Urban Renewal and (5) Rural and Infrastructural Development/Employment Generation.

In each of these areas, we have started laying a solid foundation to build a rosy future for our people. And each item on the programme is being implemented in a

way that one complements the other and they all form a total package for unleashing the abundant skills and positive potentials in the state for the purpose of development. For example, education is needed to create a more enlightened citizenry. Immediately this administration took off, we released funds to cover the half-term running costs of public secondary schools to enable the immediate implementation of the qualitative affordable education policy.

Apart from the fact that pupils and students in our primary and secondary schools across the state will no longer pay school fees, we are determined to fully rehabilitate and refurbish the infrastructure in these schools so that the students who attend public schools are in no way placed at a disadvantage compared to their colleagues in private schools. We are carrying out comprehensive renovation work on blocks of classrooms in 100 schools across the 20 local government areas in the state. We have also moved to address the disgraceful situation of the past in which WAEC results of the students in our schools were withheld by the examination body because the government did not pay examination fees as at when due. We have paid N271, 648,750.00 to WAEC to ensure students in our schools who sat for the last May/June school certificate examinations had no problems getting their results.

In order for us to be methodical in the implementation of our affordable qualitative education programme, we have paid N10 million to enable us benefit from the UNICEF sponsored project on the development of the state's strategic plan for the education sector. Apart from secondary education, we have released grants due to seven technical schools and we are in the process of re-equipping these schools to enable them be in a position to provide the much needed corps of artisans for our industrialisation programme. The state government also paid the fees for the final year students of the Government Technical Schools, sitting for the National Technical Certificate/National Business Certificate examination.

As for our tertiary institutions, the government decided to end the era of no subvention, which has plagued them for the past 9 months in some cases, by paying about N1 billion between May and August. Also, our government has removed the 50 per cent increment in tuition fees earlier announced by the last

administration and we further reduced the tuition fees by an additional 10 percent. However, we have noticed that there is need for some radical overhaul of the system so that government investments will be meaningful. We have instituted visitation panels which will make suggestions as to the best means to run the schools.

In the area of healthcare delivery, having convinced ourselves that the existing facilities we met on ground in our primary health care centres are in serious state of disrepair and can therefore not support our healthcare programme, we have begun the repair of 50 primary healthcare centres across the 20 local government areas. New equipment will also be provided in these centres. Early June, we moved swiftly to end the prolonged strike action embarked upon by staff of Olabisi Onabanjo University Teaching Hospital (OOUTH). We have also increased the malaria control programme and intensified monitoring of health facilities in order to eliminate quack operators. We shall not relent on this exercise to rid Ogun State of fake practitioners and peddlers of expired and hard drugs. We have also identified the areas in need of urgent interventions for the purpose of refurbishing and upgrading state-owned hospitals. We will soon begin work on the hospitals as soon as we complete the rehabilitation of the 50 primary health care centres. Again, we have Raised the bar on polio vaccination and malaria eradication campaigns across the state.

The State government has just released additional funds for us to put in place logistics for the continuous, successful implementation of the free health services to pregnant women and babies from ages 0 - 5 as well as to senior citizens of over 70 years of age.

Also, tap water is now flowing in homes around the state capital, Abeokuta, and parts of liebu and Remo divisions. This is due to the huge investments our administration has made in provision of implements and material for our waterworks. We are refurbishing existing and digging new boreholes across the state.

Our agricultural programme is being pursued with zeal. We have processed the N1 billion agricultural loan promised each of the states by the federal government and the fund is now ready for our farmers to access. The state has also provided funds to beneficiaries of the FADAMA project while we have commissioned the Cassava Processing Cottage Industry at Okolemo community. The latter project was executed in collaboration with the British-American Tobacco Nigerian Foundation.

The Ministry of Agriculture has also intensified the raising of turkey birds at the livestock farm in Kotopo village. We have purchased and distributed 40 tri-cycles (meat vans) to aid the transportation of meat from the abbatoir to the market in hygienic condition. Big agric projects will soon commence in some parts of the state as our consultant is about to conclude arrangements with some foreign investors who are interested in establishing farms in our state.

As part of our rural and urban renewal scheme, we have begun rehabilitation and reconstruction of roads across the state. The roads that have been resurfaced and made more motor-able by our engineers from the Ministry of Works include Olomore-Lafenwa-Itoku, Omida-Ibara, Ago-Oko road, all in the state capital, Ejinrin road and Alapo Street, both in Ijebu Ode, Hospital road and Ayegbami-Ajegunle road in Sagamu, Iganmode and Mefun roads in Ota.

Four federal roads have also been repaired by our government because we believe whatever inconveniences our people should be tackled immediately and squarely. Thus, we have fixed the bad portions on the Oke Mosan-Sagamu road, a section of Lagos-Abeokuta Expressway at the foot of the overhead bridge in Sango, Lagos Ibadan expressway in front of the Redeemed Christian Church of God's Redemption Camp and the Owode-Ilaro road. In fact, our intervention in saving federal roads domiciled in Ogun State has significantly reduced the suffering of our people in the State.

The State Executive Council had early last month approved the award of contract for the reconstruction of 28 roads across the three senatorial districts. The first step

towards effecting the council's approval was taken on August 25, 2011 when the CCECC was formally awarded the contract to reconstruct and expand the Ibara roundabout-lta Eko-Totoro road in the state capital. The next road to be awarded to a major contractor for construction is the road stretching across Sango-ljoko-Aro-Akute-Ojodu Abiodun. In the area of creating a clean environment, we are aggressively pursuing a waste disposal programme. We have not only purchased equipment including 5 Hydraulic Hook loaders and 15 refuse bins to evacuate waste, the federal government also donated a compactor and one hook loader with two bins to improve waste management in the state. We have upgraded dump sites in Saje (Abeokuta), Ikoto (Ijebu Ode), Oke-Diya (Sagamu) and Korata (Ota). We also created new dump sites in Siun and Ayetoro Village.

The ministry of Environment has embarked on the of a new waste management system in urban areas which is to be driven by public-private partnership. The areas where the system is already operating include Abeokuta, Sagamu, ljebu Ode, ljebu Igbo, Ago Iwoye, Ifo, Mowe-Ibafo, Akute/Ajuwon/Agbado, Ilaro/ Owode Yewa and Sango Ota/ljoko.

The ministry is also busy clearing water drainages and waterways and removing illegal structures on drainages, Waterways and expressways. Vegetation is also being cleared to make our environment saner and in tune with modern standards. Again, the Ministry has begun the beautification and landscaping of major streets across the state, starting with the state capital. To complement this effort, we are vigorously enforcing environmental laws and enlightening our people on the benefit of creating and sustaining a clean environment.

Again, after a series of painstaking dialogue with the workers union, this administration has fixed a minimum wage which is beyond the amount fixed by the National Minimum Wage Act. Since the end of August, the least paid worker on the payroll of Ogun State government now takes home N18, 250 as against the N18,000 being paid by the federal government.

Let me proudly state that we are about to complete the process of fulfilling our promise to create 10,000 jobs in our first 100 days in office. To accomplish this, we initiated a process in which application forms were distributed across the 20 LGAs and some applicants also filled the forms online. A total of 55,000 applications were received. Professionals were engaged to sift through the applications and select people to fit our needs in the bureaucracy and other areas. The job creamon scheme is an on-going process. By the time we fully implement our industrial sation and agricultural programme in these areas, thousands of jobs will be created in our state.

We are determined to get our people back to work. That is the only bulwark against increase in crime rate. It is the only way to multiply prosperity in our state.

There are other special projects we have worked on. Let me mention a few. For example, the direct intervention of government which resulted in making kerosine available at affordable prices has helped in alleviating the suffering of the people. The government has also secured the approval of President Goodluck Jonathan to set up a joint military/police task force for the purpose of tackling the security challenge in our state. We are determined to We are determined to ensure that hoodlums do not find our state a comfortable base. We have secured 50 new buses under the Federal Assisted Mass Transit Programme. The buses will be deployed for purpose of transporting our people across the State and even on inter-state trips.

Also, you will recall that during the campaigns, we promised that we would not allow the plight of our compatriots who lost their lives, properties or were brutalised and made to suffer different forms of injustices to pass without appropriate measures to seek redress or, at least, investigate what happened. To fulfil that promise, we have set up a 5-member body to be known as the Ogun State Truth Commission, It will be headed by former Supreme Court Justice Pius Aderemi (rtd).

Finally, we are determined to unleash the creative potentials of our people by providing an atmosphere conducive for learning, investment and improved living condition.






















