



KEY ACHIEVEMENTS OF MINISTRY OF YOUTH AND SPORTS

1. STADIUM DEVELOPMENT

Justice Chuba Ikpeazu Memorial Stadium in Onitsha North local Government Area, the first ever stadia to be built by any Government of Anambra State since the creation of the state in 1991, was built by Mr Peter Obi's administration. The Onitsha South Mini Stadium is almost completed. Efforts are being made towards building more stadia in other zones of the state.

2. 17™ NATIONAL SPORTS FESTIVAL

The potential state contingent actively participated in the South East Zonal elimination of the 17th National Sports Festival held in Enugu per team events. Our state teams qualified to represent the zone in three events namely: football, volleyball and hockey. The state is set to participate in the national festival which will hold in Port Harcourt as from 27th June to 12th July 2011. As a result, the ministry has embarked on two monitoring programmes that supervised the coaching of athletes as stated below:-

5. SPONSORSHIP AND HOSTING OF THE 1ST EDITION OF DIM CHUKWUEMEKA ODUMEGWU OJUKWU U-14 MALE SOCCER CHAMPIONSHIP

The Ministry of Youth and Sports in collaboration with the Youth Sports Federation of Nigeria (YSFON) South-East Zone organized the 1st Edition of Dim Chukwuemeka Odumegwu Ojukwu U-14 Male Soccer Championship at Gabros Sports Field, Nnewi from 11th to 17th December, 2010. The colourful and well attended championship was to honour and immortalize the great living legend of our time - Dim Odumegwu Ojukwu. It was fully sponsored by Anambra State Government. Seven states participated. The states were: Anambra, Imo, Abia, Ebonyi, Enugu, Akwa Ibom and Rivers. The championship created opportunities to discover budding talents to be groomed to be states that participated. Enugu state emerged as champion while Abia and Anambra states came second and third respectively.

OLYMPIC DAY RUN:

The 2010 Olympic Day Run was successfully organized in July, 2010. The event was used to sensitize the people of the state on the need to get involved in sporting activities for physical and mental fitness. Almost all the paramilitary organisations, sports clubs and academies were part of the event including schools and civil servants.

7. SPONSORSHIP OF OFFICIALS TO 2010 WORLD CUP

Three officials of the Ministry were sponsored by the state government to the 2010 World Cup in South Africa.

8. SPONSORSHIP OF OFFICIALS TO 2010 OLYMPIC GAMES:

The state wrestling coach, Mr. Emeka Obidinma was sponsored to the 2010 Youth Olympic Games held in Singapore from 14th to 26th August, 2010.

9. GRASSROOT SPORTS DEVELOPMENT:

As part of the effort to promote sports at the grassroots, coaching clinics were initiated and organized at Justice Chuba Ikpeazu Stadium, Onitsha as part of capacity building for selected coaches, organizing secretaries, sports officers, games teachers and physical education instructors and athletes in August 2009. The key resource persons at the programme were international sports stars like Mary Onyali-Omagbemi and Col. Charles Okeke. The programme has since been extended to all the sports zones in the state and is still going on.

10. WEEKEND SCHOOL SPORTS PROGRAMME:

The state government has initiated weekend school sports programme. Under the programme, athletes in primary and secondary schools are trained on weekends by



the coaches of the Ministry of Youth and Sports and Volunteer Sports Vanguards. The aim is to catch them young, groom and develop their God given talent so that they could become international sports stars.

11. DATA BANK OF ATHLETES:

The ministry is continuously building a data bank of athletes in all the sporting events in which the state is very active. The initiative started in 2009, and has been very useful in making informed decisions and formulation of polices. Data bank on the underlisted 21 sporting events are now available in the ministry.

12. VOLUNTEER SPORTS VANGUARD:

They compliment the efforts of coaches and sports officers in the Ministry of Youth and Sports. Efforts are being made to recruit the young ones among.

13. FORMATION OF SPORTS ASSOCIATIONS, AND REGISTRATION OF SPORTS CLUBS AND ACADEMIES:

The moribund sports associations in the state are being revived now through the formation of vibrant sports associations with patrons and patronesses. Similarly, the government has encouraged the formation of sports clubs and registration of same with the Ministry of Youth and Sports for effective co-ordination of their activities. So far forty sports clubs have been identified but only four of them have registered with the ministry. The registered ones are:



GRASSROOTS SPORTS TRIALS AND GAINS


The main duties of the ministry are to introduce, discover, develop and project athletes to local, state, national and international competitions as well as to provide opportunities for those who can no more participate in competitive sports to use it as recreation for a healthy living. When different types of sports are introduced to people at our locality, the coaches then develop their potential skills in these games. Those that are exceptional are then projected to represent the state and Nigeria at large. In a nut she the duty of the ministry is to produce athletes for local, state, national and international level competition. In order to achieve the above, trials were organised on vious sports at different venues through out the state to give equal opportunity to all potential in letes to show case their talents and be nurtured and groomed to stardom.

The present regime had in August 2009 initiated and embarked on development of grassroot sports where the likes of Mary Onyali, Kanu Nwankwo introduced many sporting skills to the ministry's coaches, sports administrators, games-masters/mistresses. The trainees in return replicated the acquired skills to others in the rural communities. The efforts yielded the desired result as examplified by the state performance in the last National School Sports Festival held in Kano where the state came 5th in the overall medals table with a total of 115 medals made up of 33 gold, 36 silver and 46 bronze madels.

The state is working hard to have up to twenty-five different sports associations. The efforts of the association when tapped would engage our teeming youths to gainful sporting ventures and reduce the crime rate prevalent in our society today. If the aggressive nature of our youths today are channeled to sports like boxing, Karate, Judo and others, they could rise to become world champions in their different weight categories. The state exposes the athletes to outside sporting competitions. Selection of athletes for outside competition is on the bases of outcome of trials that precede the competition.

The aims of the trials are to:-

- (1) encourages mass participation in sports,
- (2) identify new talents in different sports,
- (3) know the standard of our athletes at the moment,
- (4) have a strong data base in sports,
- (5) put the athletes in a competitive mood,
- (6) create more sports awareness in our community.
- (7) know our strength and weaknesses in various sporting events.
- (8) know and categorise our athletes for the national festival and schools sports.

It is worthy to note that the grassroots trials had an instant achievement, in the sense that two athletes were called to the National Camp. They are new discovery from this Internal trials. Immediately after the programme, Otuodinma Uzoamaka who started Karate about a month before the trials went with the team to Kano for an Open Karate Championship. She won the Gold medal and was called to National Camp from where she moved to represent Nigeria at Niger Republic, and won a Bronze Medal. Also in Athletics Akachukwu Igwebuike went to the U-18 Athletics Championship at Oghara Delta State and won a Gold Medal in Javelin and was called to the National Camp. He went further to represent Nigeria at Regional /CAA Youth Olympic Qualification held in Dakar, Senegal and won Gold Medal and qualified to represent Nigeria in the Junior Olympics in Singapore. Along the line he was dropped and eliminated by the National officers for unscrupulous reasons.

The Ministry is very appreciative of all the supports that made grassroots spots development a huge success in its two years of existence and pray that more private companies and public spirited individuals would come to her aid by sponsoring more community sporting outings.



GAINS OF GRASSROOTS SPORTS

ATHLETICS

A product of grassroots sports development of the state, Akachukwu Igwebuike represented the state in the National U-18 Nkoyo Ibori Athletics Championship held at Oghara Delta State in March 2010. He won 3 gold medals. He was called to the National U-18 Camp in May 2010. He was further selected among the athletics team that represented Nigeria at Region/2 CAA Youth Olympic Qualification held in Dakar, Senegal in Javelin. There, he again was a gold medal.

RATE:

Otuodimma Uzoamaka another product of the grassroots sport development programme of the state represented Anambra State at the National Open Karate Championship held in Kano between 30th of April and 5th May 2010. She won a gold medal. The competition qualified her for Olympic even though she was later dropped for reasons best known to the national selection committee. She represented Nigeria and won a bronze medal at the Niger Republic International Karate Tournament. She also qualified to represent Africa in another International Karate Championship in South Africa.

WRESTLING:

Miss Ifeoma Nwoye is the new Common Wealth and African Champion in female wrestling (51kg weight category). She won two gold medals in the second cadet African Wrestling Championship. She was the African qualifier for Youth Olympic Games held in Egypt from 22nd – 25th April, 2010. She also won a gold medal at the Common Wealth Games in India in October 2010 where she represented the nation and African continent.

THE U-13 AND U-17 GOVERNOR PETER OBI BOYS FOOTBALL COMPETITIONS, HELD AT JUSTICE CHUBA IKPEAZU STADUIM, ONITSHA ON 17TH JANUARY, 2010.

PREAMBLE:

On sunday 17th Jan., 2010, a lot of activities carried out by the Ministry of Youth and Sports in 2009 were successfully concluded. The activities that were carried out included: prayer session by the youths for free and fair elections in Anambra State, presentation of awards to youth achievers in creative literary works and sports, march past activities, presentation of an eighteen seater bus to the National Youn Council of Nigeria (NYCN) Anambra State Chapter by His Excellency, Mr Peter Obi Governor of Anambra State, finals of the U - 13 and U-17 Boys Football Competitions and presentation of trophies to winners in the football competitions.

The U-13 and U- 17 Football Competitions between the twenty-one LGAs in Anambra State started in the first week of December 2009. The preliminaries of these championships ended in December 2009. The quarter - final stages started from 4th of Jan. 2010 and was brought to an end on sunday 17th Jan., 2010. It was a keen competition between teams from the twenty-one LGAs in the state.

At the end of the preliminaries, teams from eight LGAs out of the twenty-one that make up the state emerged for the quarter - finals in the U -1 3 category. The teams were from-Aguata, Anambra West, Anaocha, Dunukofia, Idemili North, Nnewi North, Nnewi South and Ogbaru LGAs.

In the U-17 boys Football Competition, teams from Aguata, Anambra East, Awka South, Ekwusigo, Idemili North, Njikoka, Nnewi North and Onitsha got to the quarter final stage. At the semi - final stages teams that qualified in the U-13 category were from - Anambra West, Anaocha, Idemili North and Ogbaru LGAs. In the U-17 category teams from -Awka South, Ekwusigo, Idemili North and Njikoka LGAs reached the semi-final qualifiers.

At the finals of the U -13 competition, Ogbaru LGA team thrashed the Anaocha L.G.A team, by eight goals to nil while in the same category, Anambra West defeated Idemili North through a penalty shoot-out of 6 goals to 4.

In the U -17 Competition, it was quite tough for the teams to get to the finals. In the first semi-final match, it was a clash of the titans as Njikoka and Idemili North LGAs teams used penalty shoot-out to decide who moved into the finals. The tough match was full of excitement and expectation as the team from Njikoka narrowly edged out the Idemili North team by 7 goals to 6 in the penalty shoot out that ensued.

The second semi-final match was more exciting than the first one. The encounter was between teams from Awka South LGA and Ekwusigo LGA. The match also ended on a penalty shoot out but this time, it was so exciting that all the eleven players in each team

took part in the penalty shoot-out. The encounter ended in 13 goals to 12 in favour of Ekwusigo LGA's team.

The third place matches were equally played on Sunday 17" January, 2010 in the morning period at the "Ime - Obi" football pitch, Onitsha. In the third place match between Anaocha and Idemili North LGAs teams Anaocha team defeated Idemili North team by 4 goals to 2, in the U-13 category.

In the U-17 encounter for the bronze medal, Awka South team narrowly lost to Idemili North team by 0-1. After a grueling -encounter, Idemili North team captured the bronze medal in 11-17, while Anaocha got the bronze in the U-13. The stage was finally set for Cgbaru sam to take on with Anambra West while Ekwusigo locked horns with Njikoka LGA team in the U-13 and U-17 finals respectively.

As the match continued, Ogbaru LGA. players displayed superior soccer skills and outplayed their Anambra West counterpart. The encounter ended in 5 goals to one in favour of the team from Ogbaru LGA. In summary, the U-13 competition ended in this line- up; 1st position -Ogbaru LGA. 2nd position -Anambra West LGA, 3rd position -Anaocha LGA.

In the U -1 7 finals, the encounter was very thrilling, exciting and interesting. The budding Flying and Super Eagles displayed their soccer wizardry that attracted the applause of His Excellency, Mr. Peter Obi, Governor, Anambra State and members of his entourage. The match ended in a penalty shoot-out. The two teams that displayed this soccer mastery were from Ekwusigo and Njikoka LGAs. At the end of the grueling encounter the team from Ekwusigo narrowly lost to the team from Njikoka by 4 goals to 5. The stand of the teams at the end of the competition was;

1st position - Njikoka L.G.A. 2nd position - Ekwusigo L.G.A. 3rd position - Idemili North L.G.A.

Finally the Hon. Commissioner for Youths and Sports thanked the Executive Governor for being very supportive in all round development of youth. Presentation of trophies to the winners followed thereafter..

HISTORY AND DEVELOPMENT OF SCHOOL SPORTS IN ANAMBRA STATE

BACKGROUND:

School sports competition in Nigeria was introduced in schools by our colonial masters. The sports competition had its rise from the Empire Day Celebration Games down to the independence period when the competition came to lime light. Prominent schools - primary post limary arid teacher training colleges at the various regions and divisions under peir second administrators and head teachers engaged in inter-house and inter-scholartic games.

The oversees of school sports by then were the Regional and Divisional School Boards in collaboration with school administrators and teachers.

It is interesting to highlight that school sports competitions like the amateur track and field sports popularly called "AAA", the Greater Tomorrow and the "Academicals" cum other sporting events were part of the school sports programmes that popularized many schools and teacher training colleges. Some of the schools known for sports within the period included - the famous Christ the King College (CKC) Onitsha, College of Immaculate Conception (CIC) Enugu, Dennis Memorial Grammar School (DMGS) Onitsha, Nike Grammar School Enugu, St. Charles TTC, Onitsha, Igwebuike Grammar School Awka, Okongwu Memorial Grammar School Nnewi, St. Paul's TTC Awka, St. Theresa's Secondary School Nsukka, Presbyterian College Abakaliki, St. Patrick's Secondary School, Obollo-Eke, Colliery Comprehensive Secondary School Ngwo, Father Joseph Secondary School Aguleri, Zixton Secondary School Ozubulu, St. Peter's Secondary School Achina, Agulu Grammar School Agulu, among others.

Scholars that excelled in sports gained admission or transfered to schools of their choice especially the schools that love sports and competed regularly. Star athletes discovered from some of these schools included -- Emmanuel Ifeajuna, the Common Wealth Gold medalist in high jump, Regina Okafor (sprinter), Beatrice Molokwu (nee Emodi), Mary Onyali Omagbemi (All African Games gold medalist), Evelyn Nwabuisi, nee Okeke (Shot put), Mbanefo Akpom (high jump), Johnny Igboka (high jump) and many others.

Other star athletes discovered in the area of football were as follows: Dominic Ezeani,



Christian Chukwu, Foster Ikeagu, Late Nnamdi Nwokocha, Paul Obiakor, Patrick Okala and a host of others in various sporting fields.

It is worthy to note that the then sports councils, now Ministries of Youth and Sports in many states collaborated with the Ministries of Education in the organization of school sports. This is as a result of vast deposit of potential athletes within the Nigerian schools.

The National Sports Commission, established in 1971 later called on the Federal Ministry of Education to set standard on school sports competitions in Nigeria. This idea was later emphasized in the Nigerian Constitution under the National Policy on Sports where one of the roles of the sports sector in National Planning is to collaborate with institutions of learning for the development of sports. Based on this challenge, the National Sports Commission facilitated the setting up of the Nigeria School Sports Federation in 1976. In the same year, Brigadier Henry Adefope stopped the Sectorial Grier/Powell/Hussey Shield competitions and replaced it with the Nigeria School Sports Federation (NSSF). The first National President of the new body was Mr. Idahosa A. Osifo while the Secretary General was Mr. Wilson Omonode both of the then Bendel State. The Nigeria School Sports Federation is an affiliate of International School Sports Federation (ISSF) with its secretariat in Belgium. The first National Secondary School Sports competition was held in Lagos in 1977 while the second was organized in Calabar in 1978.

SCHOOL SPORTS COMPETITION IN ANAMBRA STATE

In the new Anambra State that was created in 1991, the first State School Sports Competition was organized in 1992/93 academic year under the auspices of the Ministry of Education in collaboration with the then Sports Council as technical partner.

The Local Government and zonal education levels of the competition were handled by the Zonal Inspectors and Area Inspectors of Education assisted by the Sports Council Coaches and Organizing Secretaries.

Not much was done in the area of school sports between 1993 and 2002. However in 2003/2004 the competition was organized. This facilitated the selection of athletes who participated in the National Secondary Schools Sports Competition held in Owerri.

Since creation of the state, the Anambra State School Sports Federation (ASSSF) was in charge of the organization and administration of school sports up till the year 2007 when the State Executive Council resolved that school sports in Anambra State is to be



managed by the Ministry of Youth and Sports in collaboration with the Ministry of Education.

SCHOOLS PARTICIPATION IN STATE COMPETITIONS

In line with the provisions in the constitution, ASSSF at the state, zones and local government levels organized competitions in consonance with the school sports calendar approved each academic year. Every school, primary and post-primary participated from the sub-zones to the local government levels. Games teachers, physical and the education instructors and sports officers along with the various sports committees at each level, coordinated and organized sports whenever the school sports condar was released. Virtually, all schools in each category participated in track and field events, racket games, ball games and swimming for secondary schools students. Events like chess and scrabble were introduced in 2008 while Judo, Wrestling and Taekwondo were competed for the first time in 2009 State and National School Sports Festivals. Nestle Milo Basketball and Shell Cup Football Competitions were equally competed for by interested schools.

To all intent and purposes, sponsored events/games e.g. Nestle Milo Basketball and Shell Cup were competed for by sports loving schools who were able to sponsor themselves at the grassroot levels before moving to the state finals organized by the State Executive Committee. Some of the schools with the events/games they were good at or known for, are as follows:

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE OF SCHOOL SPORTS IN ANAMBRA STATE

There was no defined structure from 1992-1996. Nevertheless, the State Ministry of Education and Youth Development controlled and supervised the organization of school sports. Local Government and Zonal competitions were coordinated under the auspices of the then Area Inspectors and Zonal Inspectors of Education Offices in collaboration with Local Government and Zonal Sports Councils. Principals and Headteachers, Physical and Health Education Instructors, games teachers and other sports loving teachers were never left out. State final competitions were handled by the Ministry of Education including the organized national school sports competitions and sponsored ones by corporate bodies.

It is pertinent to note that in 1998, the Hon. Minister of Sports, Air Cdr Emeka Omeruah (Late) facilitated the setting up of a task force on school sports with a view to restructuring and resuscitating School Sports Federation and its programmes that were moribund. Thus, NSSF was born again and its operational guidelines were passed to states through their various Ministries of Education. As a follow-up, they were urged to form their state schools sports federation without delay. The State Ministry of Education, with Prof. Z.S.C. Okoye as the Hon. Commissioner, championed the formation of the State School Sports Federation in 1997 and was able to produce and adopt Anambra State School Sports Constitution in 1998. The newly elected Anambra State School Sports EXCO led by Nzemeka Olisa as the Chairman and Chris Ejiofor of the Exams and Staff Development Department, Ministry of Education as the Secretary (statutory) along with other EXCO members co-ordinated the election into the Zonal and Local



Government School Sports Committees. The elected committees were inaugurated on the 23rd of September, 1998 at Igwebuike Grammar School, Awka. The Hon. Commissioner then was the patron of the Local Committees including the ASSSF (EXCO).

The structure (Committees) for the organization and administration of school sports as provided in the constitution in the three main committee levels were as follows:

The education zones and local government sports committees, maintained the above structure till 15th August 2007, when the State Executive Council took a decision and directed that the organizers of the State Schools Sports should be Ministry of Youth and Sports in collaboration with Ministry of Education. Sequel to this, it became necessary to set up the structure that will give effect to the decision of the State Executive Council. This necessitated the setting aside of the existing structure at the State level and the setting up of a new one. Consequent upon this, two committees were set up: A four-man policy making committee known as Anambra State School Sports Apex Committee (ASSSAC) and the thirteen-man implementation committee known as Anambra State Schools Sports Implementation Committee (ASSSIC) which is the main organizing body.

FUNDING OF CHOOL SPORTS IN ANAMBRA STATE

As from 1991, and State Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports as it was then known reintroduced the payment of school sports levy as it was done in the old Anambra State. The sports levy did not meet the expectation, since, the modalities for the collection and remittance of the levy was not clearly followed as approved by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports.

Later, a better defined modality was introduced, but, the levy exercise did not meet with success for two or more years and thus, organization of School Sports Competition in the State stopped.

In 2003/04 Session, the modalities for collection, sharing and remittance of PTA School Sports Levy was reviewed.

As agreed in a joint State Schools Sports Stakeholders meeting with effect from second term 2003/04 session, schools were to pay their shares of the levy into one joint account, quite unlike before where each body spends its own collected fund at the level of its school sports commitment. The reason for the above measure was to ensure uniformity and common standards in training of sports officers, physical and health education instructors and games teachers, as well as monitoring of physical education and sporting activities at all levels.

The Ministry of Education's share of the levy was for organizing state final competitions, national and international school championships including sponsored competitions. The levy per student per term for secondary and primary schools respectively was voted for the purchase of sports equipment by the schools authorities.

In 2006, when Mr. Peter Obi came on board as the Governor of Anambra State, he



directed that all Government monies be paid into Government coffers. Sequel to this, funds for the organization and management of school sports were being approved for release by the Governor. This development differed from what obtained in the past when the Hon. Commissioner for Education approved the release of funds for school sports programmes.

The above practice was improved in 2008/09 session when State and National budgetary allocations on school sports were first approved and released to the State Government. This step of action boosted school sports as more money on school sports competitions was guaranteed quite unlike some years back, when no payment or collection of sports levy posed a problem.

Although, the school sports levy was abolished only in public primary and junior secondary schools because of the free education, UBE, payment of school sports levy still holds in private primary and secondary schools as well as in senior public secondary schools.

It is a thing of joy and welcome development to highlight that no administration in Anambra State has invested up to two third of what Mr. Peter Obi's Government has so far released in terms of fund for the sponsorship of school sports programmes from 2008-2010.

In conclusion, school sports in Anambra State judging from the results obtained in 2009 and 2010 state finals and National Schools Sports Festivals in Abeokuta and Kano respectively, has strongly regained its pre-eminent position.

Since 2008 till date elaborate reception are given to all athletes that represent the state in sports festival. Various degrees of scholarship are also being awarded to those of them that win medals.



BRIEF HISTORY OF FOOTBALL IN NIGERIA

It is difficult to say when the game of football first started in Nigeria. The records show that it first flourished in schools and from there spread to clubs. The game was popular with the English and it was only natural that when the early missionaries and schoolmasters came from Britain, they had to introduce the game in the schools and establishments. Speaking at a banquet organised by the Nigere Football Association (N.F.A) in September, 1949 Ernest Okoli, a prominent Nigerian purnalist, mentioned that from 1914, Baron Mulford organised weekly matches between European teams and Kings' College, a prominent Secondary School at the time. Mulford, an English man who was a keen player himself, and was at various times games-master at CMS Grammar School, King's College, St. Gregory and Igbobi College all in Lagos facilitated the matches just before a Nigerian National Team toured Britain in 1949. P.A Courtney, who was the Chairman of the Lagos District Amateur Football Club, mentioned at a dinner organised for the team that the tour was the result of revolution brewed by Mulford since 1931. It therefore presupposes that 1931 could be regarded as the starting point of organised league football in the country.

The Lagos District Football Association was started with foundation club sides who competed in the Mulford Cup.

The teams that participated in the league were the Railway Africs, the Police, the Lagos Town Council, the Calabar 1st XI, the Harbour 1st XI, the Corinthians, U.A.C, CFAO, a French Company which fielded all - European team. In 1949 the five Governors Cup Competitions were held. Representative teams from Lagos, the Northern, Eastern, and Western Regions participated. This was the beginning of the turning point when the N.F.A started to consider-the prospect of a Nigerian team side undertaking a tour of the United Kingdom. The eighteen footballers who eventually went on the tour, became known as the U.K Tourists by football officials and followers of the game-alike. Two major problems faced the organisers of the tour. The first, was how to raise enough money to cover all expenses and the second, was which players to take along for the experimental trip.



When eventually, the final team list was released, it contained five forwards of the Lagos Railway Unions Lions, namely Titus Okere, Baby Anieke, Teslim Balogun, Sokari Dokuboh, and G. Anosike plus one of their defenders Onwudiwe Justin from Ogbunike (left fullback). Five players from Marine namely: Henshaw (the captain), Edet Ben, (inside forward), Mesembe Otu (outside right), Hope Lawson and A.T.B Oltun - (defenders). Dan Anyiam and Shittu both defenders were chosen from the Lagos U.A.C From the province outside Lagos came Chukwurah, Abeokuta brought Isaac Akioye-(goalkeepen, har back- John Dankoro came from Jos, Sam Ibiam came from Port Harcourt, Kano, we central defender from the Lands and Survey team, was made a player/secretary.

THE CHALLENGE CUP:

Even though the League Club Football in Lagos dates back to 1931, and Schools' Football dates back even further, it was not until 1938 that the idea of a Challenge Cup came clearly into view. Baron Mulford, who was the chief motivator of organised football in Lagos, presented the Mulford Cup for competition between Lagos Clubs. This competition continued up till 1952. Earlier than this, there was the Berdedorf Cup, won by Zik Athletic Club (ZAC) in 1938, beating Lagos Township Club (LTC) the junior team of Lagos league. The War Memorial Challenge Cup was launched during the war years but was renamed the Nigeria Challenge cup and matches in the competition were played under rules and regulations of the Nigeria Football Association, hence the name F.A Cup. Nigeria was affiliated to FIFA in 1959 and entered a soccer team for the Olympic Games the following year-1960.

The Zard Cup was re-assigned for competition among Lagos Secondary Schools, while the junior league cup competitions were cancelled. The Zard cup is a forerunner of what is today known as the Principals' Cup in Lagos football. Methodist Boys High School, Lagos was the first to win the Zard cup, beating Baptist Academy 2 - O.

After the civil war in 1970, during that time, 12 States had been created, the competition assumed wider dimensions.

The number of states increased to 19 in 1975 when General Murtala Mohammed became Head of State in bloodless Military coup. According to the rules of the



competition, teams in Lagos and other states were to organise matches and to pick the best team to represent them at the Federal level. These teams were to engage one another on a knockout basis narrowing down to the quarter-finals, semi-finals and finals which were played in Lagos. Initially, the finals were played in Onikan Stadium, until in 1973, the final shifted to a better stadium, when the National Stadium in Lagos was opened.

The story of the F.A Challenge Cup is in reality, the story of Nigerian Football for it was this competition that all that was best in Nigerian Soccer was paraded before the eyes of partisan crowds (Akpabot, 1983).

All the matches of the F.A cup was played in either Onikan or National Stadium annually from 1945 to 1972, when a replay between Bendel Insurance FC and Mighty Jets FC was played at Liberty Stadium, Ibadan after a disputed 2-2 draw in Lagos.

The famous F. A cup or Challenge cup was also called the Governor's Cup. The first club that won the Governor's Cup in. 1945 was the Marine team in Lagos which beat Corinthians by a lone goal.

The indomitable Rangers International FC of Enugu was formed in 1970 immediately after the civil war. The formation of the club was 'muted during the "wee" days of the Nigerian Civil War. As at then, skipper Joe Obodozie was to use the outfit to travel outside the shores of Biafra to canvas and solicit for fund for the execution of the war.

After the war with the instrumentality of Jerry Enyeazu and Dan Anyiam, Rangers was founded. It created a lot of waves in the Nigerian Soccer scene. It is the only club that has not been relegated since its formation.

The name of Air Vice Marshal Bayo Lawal and Late Air Commodore Tony Ikazoboh (Rtd) will ever be remembered with nostalgia in the Annals of Nigerian football. It was the duo that really saw to the establishment of Professional Football in the country.

As the then Minister of Sports and Social Development, Air Vice Marshall Bayo Lawal on February 8,1989, set up a committee to work out the modalities for the introduction of professional football in Nigeria. The committee members were:

Based on the recommendations of the committee, the minister of Youth and Sports - Air Commodore Tony Ikazaboh signed the establishment Decree of April 9, 1990 into Law - thus Professional Football in Nigeria was born.

Consequently 16 different teams/clubs on the criteria of the Professional Football Implementation Committee were registered for participation in the Nigeria's first - ever attempt at Professional Football.

The 16 teams were:

The league kicked-off historically on may 12, 1990 - between Stationary Stores, Football Club, Lagos and Iwuanyanwu Nationale Football Club, Owerri. The Professional League, started in 1990 while the Premier League started in 2004. Presently we have the Premier League with 40 clubs manned by the league Premier League (NPL) Board and the National League manned by the league football Federation (NFF). 








