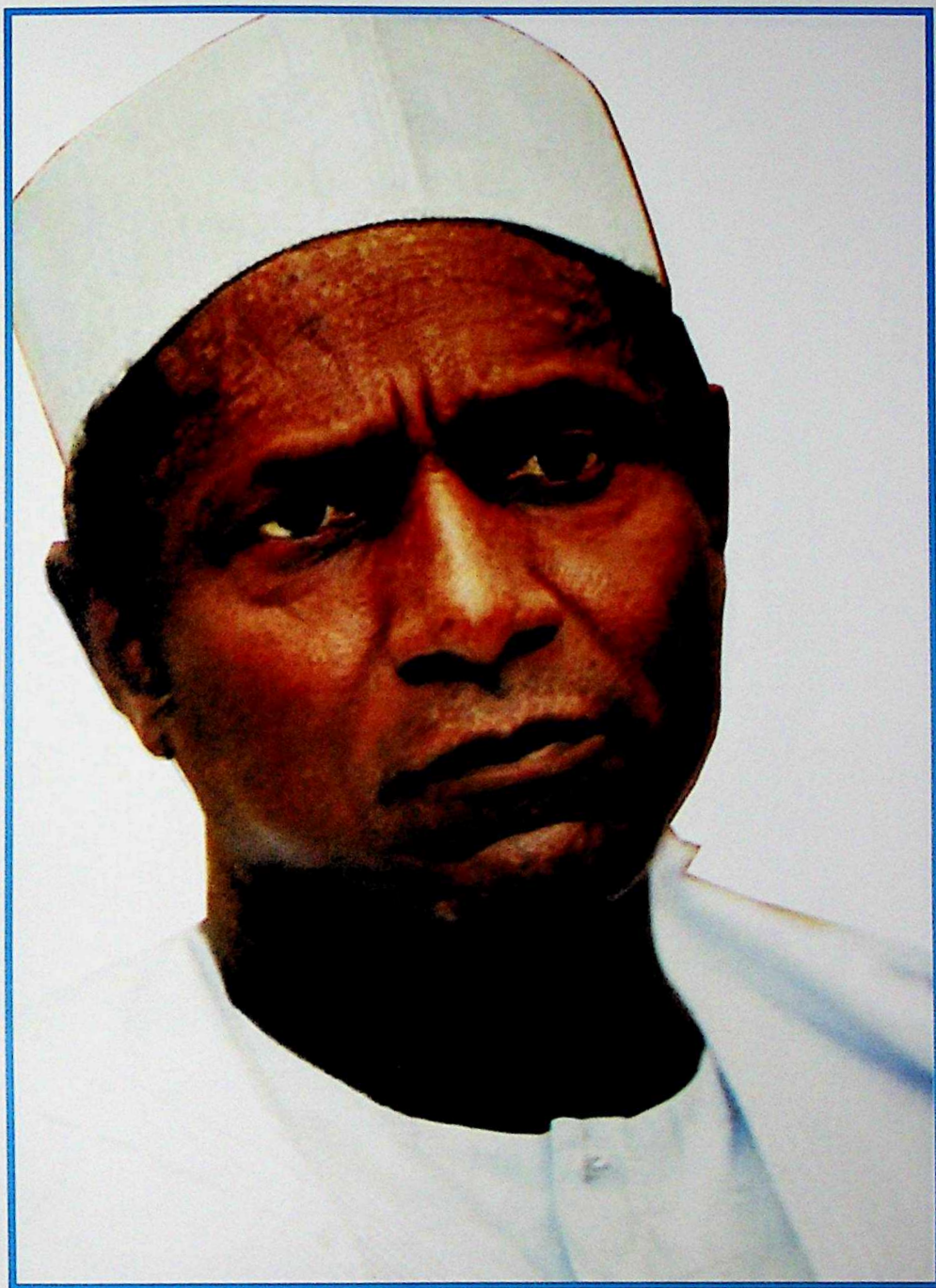

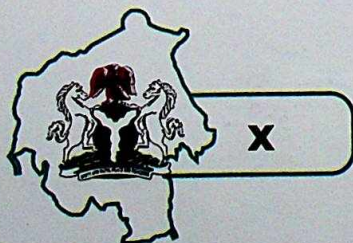

PREFACE

OYO STATE

Profile



Oyo State, popularly referred to as the "Pace Setter" is one of the constituent 36 States of the Federal Republic of Nigeria. It came into existence with the break up of the old Western State of Nigeria during the State creation exercise on 3rd February, 1976.

Brigadier, now Major-General David Medaiyese Jemibewon (rtd) was the first Military Governor of the State (1976-1978).

His successor, Colonel, now Major General Paul C. Tarfa, rtd (July 1978-Sept. 1979) midwived the transition to civil rule which ushered in the Second Republic on October 1, 1979.

Late Chief Bola Ige was the first Executive Governor, 1979-1983. He was succeeded by Chief Victor Omololu Olunloyo, who was the second Executive Governor between October 1, 1983 and December 31, 1983. His tenure was truncated by the military take-over on December 31, 1983.

On 4th January, 1984, Colonel (now Major-General Oladayo Popoola, rtd.) came in as the Military Governor of the State. In September 1985, he passed the baton to Colonel, now Brigadier General Adetunji Idowu Olurin (rtd). It was the turn of late Colonel (later Brig. General) Adedeji Sasaenia Oresanya, who was sworn-in on 27th July, 1988.

On 3rd September, 1990, Late Colonel, later Major-General Abdulkarim Adisa (rtd) was posted to the State as Military Governor. It was during his tenure, precisely Tuesday, 27th August, 1991, that another nationwide State creation exercise was performed during which Osun State with the appellation "State of Living Spring" was carved out of Oyo State.

Chief Kolapo Olawuyi Ishola was sworn-in as the third Executive Governor of the State on January 2, 1992 at the inception of democratic rule in the Third Republic. He was there until November 17, 1993 when General Sanni Abacha came on board as the Military Head of State of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

At the return of the military in the governance of the country, Navy Captain, later Rear Admiral Adetoye Sode (rtd) was posted to Oyo State as Military Administrator on 9th December, 1993. Colonel Chinyere Ike Nwosu (rtd) was the Military Administrator of the State between 1994 and 1996, while Col. Ahmed Usman (rtd) became Military Administrator of the State between August 1996 and 1998.

The last Military Administrator before the advent of civil rule on May 29, 1999, was



Compol (later AIG) Amen Edore Oyakhire (rtd). He handed over to Alhaji (Dr) Lamidi Onaolapo Adesina as the fourth Executive Governor of the State. Senator Rashidi Adewolu Ladoja became the fifth Executive Governor of Oyo State on 29th May, 2003.

Otunba (Dr) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala was sworn-in on Thursday, 12th January, 2006 as the Executive Governor of Oyo State in order not to create a vacuum in government administration and to salvage the then existing political situation in the State culminating in the impeachment of Governor Rashidi Ladoja by the members of the House of Assembly.

During his eleven-month stint at the helms of affairs as the Executive Governor, Otunba (Dr) Alao-Akala achieved greater feat unequalled by any administration under such a short period.

Amongst such achievements is the total renovation of the ancient Mapo Hall in Ibadan which was built during the Western Region period but was almost in ruins due to neglect by successive military and civilian administrations.

The Hall now wears a new look under a new management and has played host to important dignitaries from all walks of lives since its commissioning.

As a man of destiny, fate has a lot in stock for Otunba (Dr) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala, as he was overwhelmingly given a four-year mandate to steer the ship of the State on April 14, 2007 in a keenly contested 2007 gubernatorial election.

Ibadan, the capital city, reputed to be the largest indigenous city in Africa, South of the Sahara, had been the centre of administration of the old Western Region since the days of the British colonial rule in Nigeria. Western Region then consisted of the present Oyo, Ogun, Osun, Ekiti, Ondo, Edo and Delta States.

• GEOGRAPHY

Oyo State is located in the South West Region of Nigeria. Latitude 8 degree and Longitude 4 degree East bisect the State into four nearly equal parts.

The State now covers a total of 27,249 square kilometers of landmass. It is bounded partly by Ogun State (Gateway State) in the South, Kwara State (State of Harmony) in the North. To the West, it is bounded partly by Ogun State and partly by the Republic of Benin, while in the East it is bounded by Osun State (State of the Living-Spring).

The topography of the State is one of the gentle rolling lowland in the south, rising to a plateau 40 metres and above in the North. The State is well drained with rivers flowing from the upland in the North/South direction. The major rivers are Ofiki, Ogun, Shasha, Oba and Opeki.

The vegetation pattern of the State is that of rain forest in the South and guinea savannah to the North. Thick forest in the South gives way to grassland interspersed with trees in the North.



• POLITICAL ZONES

The State is divided into three Senatorial Districts of Oyo North, Oyo Central and Oyo South. Oyo North has 13 Local Governments, viz Saki West, Saki East, Atisbo, Irepo, Olorunsogo, Kajola, Iwajowa, Ogbomoso North, Ogbomoso South, Iseyin, Oorelope, Oriire and Itesiwaju.

Oyo Central comprises 11 Local Governments: Afijio, Akinyele, Egbeda, Ogo-Oluwa, Surulere, Lagelu, Oluyole, Ona-Ara, Oyo East, Oyo West and Atiba.

Oyo South consists of 9 Local Governments. They are: Ibadan North, Ibadan North East, Ibadan North West, Ibadan South East, Ibadan South West, Ibarapa Central, Ibarapa East, Ibarapa North and Ido.

The State has three elected Senators, 14 members in the House of Representatives and 32 members in the State House of Assembly.

• SETTLEMENT PATTERN

People in Oyo State live in various types of human settlements, varying from farmstead, hamlets, villages, towns, cities and metropolis.

The hierarchy of human settlement is usually decided by the settlement size, size of population, availability and scale of infrastructure, social amenities, services and the functions of the settlements. These settlements are used in identifying the hierarchy of the settlements within Oyo State.

• SIZE OF SETTLEMENT

Oyo State ranks amongst the most urbanized States in Nigeria. It has many large urban settlements. Ibadan metropolis, the State capital, is the largest city in Africa, South of the Sahara. It has developed into a metropolis, growing fast towards becoming a megalopolis. Other large urban settlements in Oyo State are: Ogbomoso, Oyo, Iseyin, Saki and Okeho. Some of the urban settlements of medium size are: Igbo-ora, Igbeti, Igboho, Kisi, Iganna and Eruwa. Oyo State is also blessed with small-sized urban settlements such as: Lanlate, Ago-Are, Fiditi, Tede, Idere, Otu, Awe, Ayete, Ilorra, Tapa, Moniya, etc.

At the lowest level of the hierarchical order are the small villages, hamlets and farmsteads. They are usually of small sizes. These villages, hamlets and farmsteads are more concentrated in the Southern part of the State.

• THE PEOPLE

The people of Oyo State are Yoruba with a common ancestor in Oduduwa. Within the State however, there are sub-ethnic groups with distinct dialect peculiarities. The people of Oyo State may be divided into five broad groups, viz Ibadans, Ibarapas, Oyos, Oke-Oguns and Ogbomosos.



• IBADANS

The Ibadans have their settlements in the city of Ibadan and surrounding farms and villages. They trace their roots to Lagelu, a warrior. The city grew around a legendary baobab tree from which it derived its name. It grew quickly, attracting warriors and refugees from the internecine wars that raged Yorubaland in the 18th century. Over the years, the diverse background of the early settlers has evolved into a sub-cultural mix that is unique in Yorubaland. The system of promotion from Compound Head (Mogaji) to the throne is exclusive to the Ibadans. The people are spared the unhealthy rivalry and in-fighting that attends filling of vacant stools. The people were originally warriors and farmers but are now gainfully employed in all areas of human endeavour.

• OYOS

The Oyos occupy a geographic location to the north of Ibadan including Oyo town, surrounding towns and villages. In ancient times, Oyo Empire ruled over a sizeable chunk of Yorubaland and beyond. The Oyos were core people of the Oyo Empire. Today, the Empire is no more, but the people retain their proud heritage. They are engaged in all forms of modern business activities and human endeavours. Oyo State is named after the rich heritage of the people.

• OGBOMOSOS

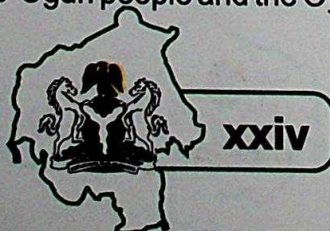
The Ogbomosos dwell in the town of that name and surrounding towns and villages. The people have their home on the strategic route linking the northern parts of Nigeria to the south. In times past, they were fearless warriors. They have many things in common with the Oyos in particular and other sub-cultural groups in Yorubaland. Today, the people are established in all areas of modern business and public service. They are renowned traders, and can be located in any part of the country conducting their businesses. They are established all over Northern Nigeria and the West African sub-region.

• IBARAPAS

The Ibarapas are scattered over seven major towns and surrounding villages. The towns are: Eruwa, Tapa, Ayete, Igbo-Ora, Lanlate, Igangan and Idere. The Ibarapas have a distinct dialect that separates them from their nearest neighbours. The people have similarities with the Oyos. The people are mainly farmers. Yam and cassava flour (elubo) are major farm products in the area. They also engage in plantation farming-cultivating cocoa and palm produce.

• OKE-OGUNS

The Oke-Oguns occupy the guinea savannah area of Oyo State. Many sources ascribe same origin to the Oke-Ogun people and the Oyos. The people are scattered



over several towns and villages, namely Iseyin, Saki, Okeho, Igbeti and Igboho, among others. The people are hardworking and hospitable. The people of Oke-Ogun are mainly farmers. The area is tagged the "Food basket" of Oyo State. Weaving and pottery are cottage industries well developed among the people. The people are noted for their business acumen.

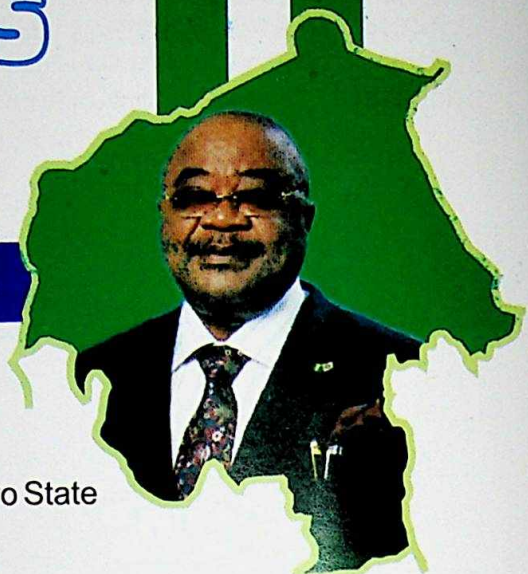

Profile

AKALA: A VISIONARY

LEADER



His Excellency, Otunba (Dr) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala, JP, psc, the Executive Governor of Oyo State is a successful politician and Visionary leader. Above all, he is a God-fearing family man.

Hans Christian Andersen in the preface to his seminal treatise, *Works*, said "Every man's life is a fairy-tale written by God's fingers." The phenomenal rise to fame and fortune and the unqualified success story of the life of His Excellency, Otunba (Dr) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala, JP, psc, the Executive Governor of Oyo State, could be rightly described as a script well crafted by the Almighty God.

Born on June 3, 1950 at Ogbomoso in the Ogbomoso North Local Government Area of Oyo State, young Adebayo Alao-Akala had his elementary school at Osupa Baptist Day School, Ogbomoso. From there, he proceeded to the Kamina Barracks Middle School, 5th Battalion of Infantry Tamale, Ghana.

On leaving Kamina Barracks Middle School, Adebayo Alao-Akala went to Government Technical College, Tamale, Ghana and Ogbomoso High School, Ogbomoso. Still in search of more knowledge, Otunba (Dr) Alao-Akala capped it all with further studies at Nigeria's premier high institution, the University of Ibadan.

For his efforts, Dr Alao-Akala has in his kitty the First Leaving Certificate obtained in 1962, West African School Certificate (1972), ASCON Certificate (1985), Passed Staff College (Psc) 1990, Diploma in Business Administration (1998), Doctor of Civil Law (DCL) Honoris Causa, LAUTECH, Ogbomoso (2006), Doctor of Science (Political Science) Honoris Causa, Lead City University (2008).

His Excellency, Otunba (Dr) Adebayo Alao-Akala has been privileged to attend several career development courses. He enlisted as Cadet Inspector of Police in June 1974 at the Nigeria Police College, Ikeja. Following his brilliant performance, he was recommended for overseas training at the Metropolitan Police Training School, Peel Centre, Hendon, London. He has also attended the Administrative Staff College, Topo, Badagry; the Nigeria Institute of International Affairs (NIIA), Victoria Island, Lagos; Police Staff College, Jos; Command and Staff College, Jaji.

Otunba Alao-Akala has participated as a Nigerian delegate at two INTERPOL Conferences in Nice, France and Malaga, Spain.

Otunba (Dr) Alao-Akala today stands tall among his peers. His astuteness and the uncanny ability to detect the genius in other people is one of the secret weapons of



his soar away success as politician and administrator.

According to Saint Augustine, "The heights by great men reached and kept were not attained by sudden flight, but they, while their companions slept, were toiling upward in the night".

Obviously, the various positions of responsibility held by Otunba Alao-Akala and his rich work experience have helped to mould him into a well-rounded statesman and leader.

From the position of Station Officer in the Nigeria Police, he became Administrative Officer, Federal Operation, Federal Headquarters, Lagos and rose to the position of Operations Officer, FEDOPS, Lagos.

The steady rise of Otunba Alao-Akala to fame and fortune reached its apogee when he became the Personal Assistant to the Assistant Inspector-General of Police and subsequently the ADC to the Inspector-General of Police.

From there onwards, Alao-Akala's star began to shine brilliantly as he held several prestigious command positions in the Police Force.

He was O/C Advanced Training Wing, Police College, Ikeja; Divisional Police Officer, Bode Thomas, Lagos; Divisional Police Officer, Iponri Police Station, Lagos; Railway Divisional Police Officer, Nigeria Railways, Ebute Meta, Lagos; Area Commander, Western District, Nigeria Railway Police, Ibadan; CSP Admin. Gongola State Command, Yola; CSP Admin. Kwara State Command, Ilorin; Assistant Commissioner of Police, Agodi Area Command, Ibadan, Oyo State Police Command, Ibadan.

In September 1995, Otunba (Dr) Adebayo retired from the Nigeria Police as Assistant Commissioner of Police in charge of Logistics and Supply, Oyo State Police Command, Eleiyele, Ibadan. It was, indeed, a meritorious service to his fatherland.

After retirement from the public service, Dr. Alao-Akala became the Chairman of ACALA Nigeria Limited, Private Eye Security Consultant and General Contractor.

In the political arena, Otunba (Dr) Adebayo Alao-Akala could be rightly described as a man with the midas touch. He started his political career as a member of New Dimension, a political association of progressive young elements. He participated in the zero-party local government election of 1996 and later co-founded the UNP before its fusion with UNC to form UNCP.

In the 1997 local government elections, Otunba Alao-Akala sponsored the chairmanship candidate and seven councilors to victory on the ticket of the UNCP. He participated in the Ogbomoso Federal Constituency (One) primary election of the UNCP in 1997.

He was elected vice-chairman of ALGON, Oyo State Chapter between 1999 and 2002.

A versatile and visionary political leader, Alao-Akala founded the Ogbomoso Unity Forum, a political association which later joined the PDP.

He was the Executive Chairman of Ogbomoso North Local Government from 1999 to 2002.

His hobbies include traveling; he has visited all the 36 states of the country and Abuja; he has also visited over 10 countries in the world; he loves reading and meeting people. Otunba Alao-Akala is a member of many social clubs including Ikoyi Club 1938; he was President, Rotary Club of Ogbomosho 2005-2006; he is the current President, Ogbomosho Recreation Club.

Gov. Akala is averse to playing politics with the lives of the people, hence his completion of abandoned projects.

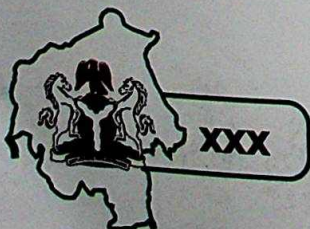

A sum of N40m was released by the State Government to purchase cocoa chemicals and inputs for cocoa farmers at highly subsidized prices.

The State Government released the sum of N980,500 for the execution of projects at Rural Community Development Centre, Awe.

The State Government provided and established Apiaries, Honey pressers, protective clothing to about 500 Bee-Keepers across the State.

Training programmes were organized for over 1,000 Bee-Keepers in the State.

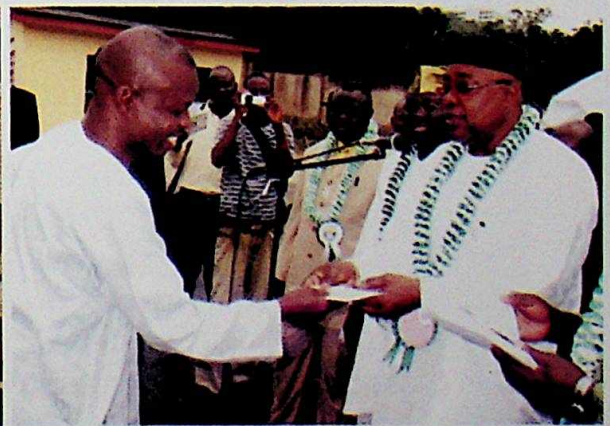
A sum of N1.125m was approved for the rehabilitation of 25 deep wells fitted with hand pumps across the State.

A multi-site Farm Settlement had been established at Ido Local Government.

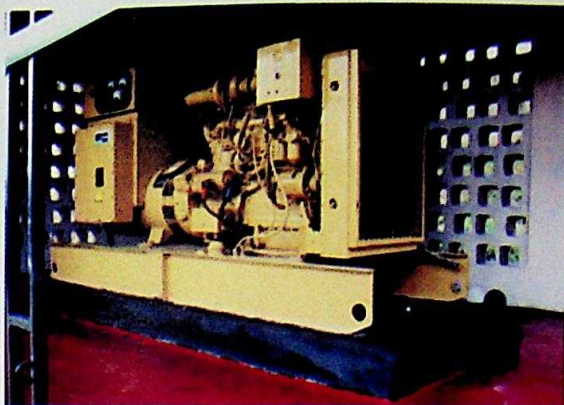

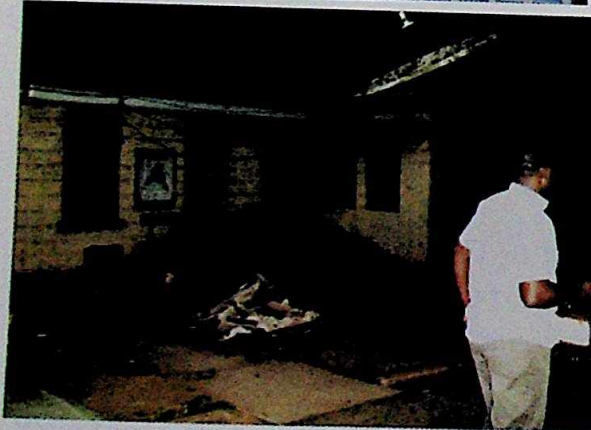

Government released the sum of N195,573,000.00 in 2008 and N249,299,000.00 this year 2009 as payment to WAEC to enable all the State final year students in Public Secondary Schools write the 2008 and 2009 WAEC/SSCE freely.

The State Government released the sum of N22,820,000.00 to NECO to enable the Body accredit public Secondary Schools for NECO Examinations.

The State Government organized a workshop for 250 French teachers in the State in 2008 at a cost of N867,000.00.

The State Government purchased and distributed sports equipment and supplies to 100 Secondary Schools in 2008 and 72 Secondary Schools in 2009 at the cost of N2,752,650.00 and N2,119,250 respectively.

The Government also organized a training workshop for all Games masters in public secondary schools in the State. We are happy to note, that Oyo State came 2nd in the 2008 Shell Football Competition among all secondary schools in the Federation.

The State Government resuscitated the moribund Scholarship Board and earmarked the sum of N779m in the year 2009 estimate for scholarship awards. Government also paid bursary awards to all indigenes of Oyo State in the four Nigeria Law Schools, with a total amount of N6.5million disbursed to the students in 2008.

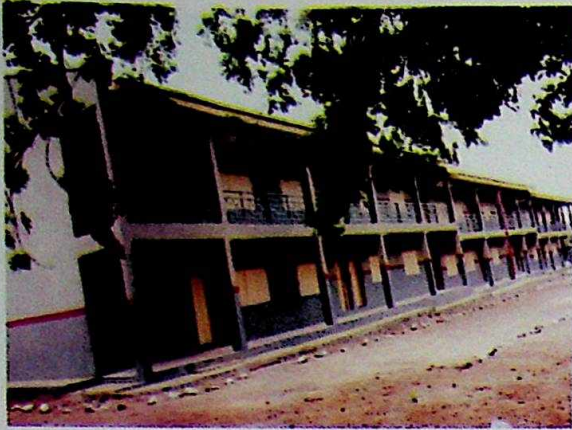

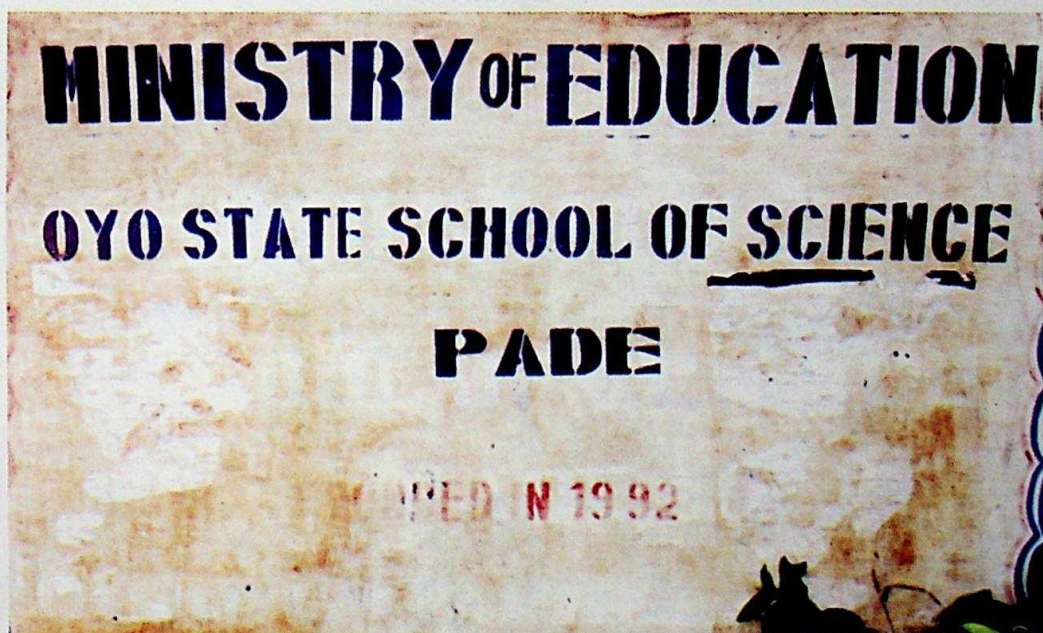

The school was established to serve as a prime energizer for the actualization of science and technological development of the state and nation.



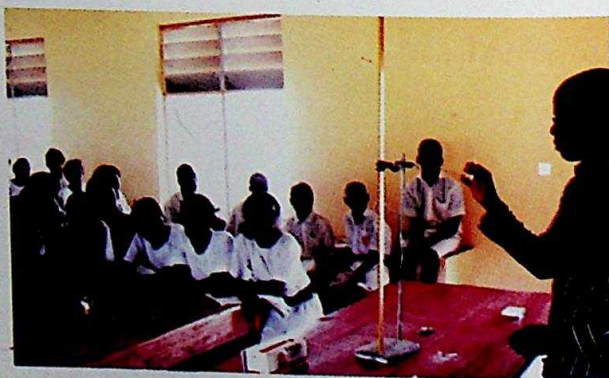
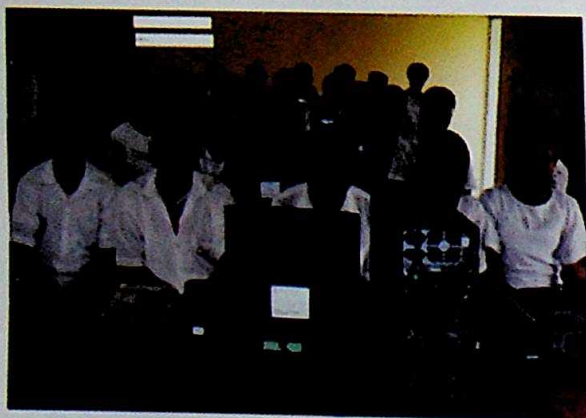

OYO STATE SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME

The Oyo State Scholarship Scheme had been moribund since 1983 (about 26 years ago) when Chief Bola Ige was governor. Since then, the State Government has been involved only in the award of Bursaries to students of Oyo State indigenes in the Law Schools.

Recently, the State Government felt it necessary to encourage and assist Oyo State brilliant students in their academic pursuits in institutions of higher learning. In view of this, the government resuscitated the State Scholarship Scheme on Wednesday, 21st May, 2008 to give Scholarship and Bursary Awards to the beneficiaries.

In order to implement the programme, a sum of N799 Million has been earmarked for the Award of Scholarships to Post-Secondary and Post-graduate in the Nigerian Institutions of higher learning covering all courses. The amount earmarked also covers the award of Bursaries to Law School Students and Final Year Clinical Medical Students in all the Nigerian Universities.

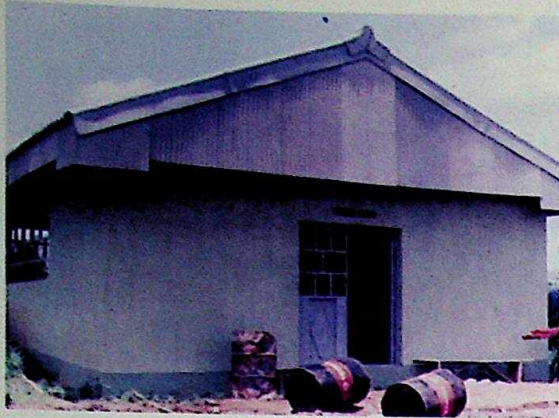

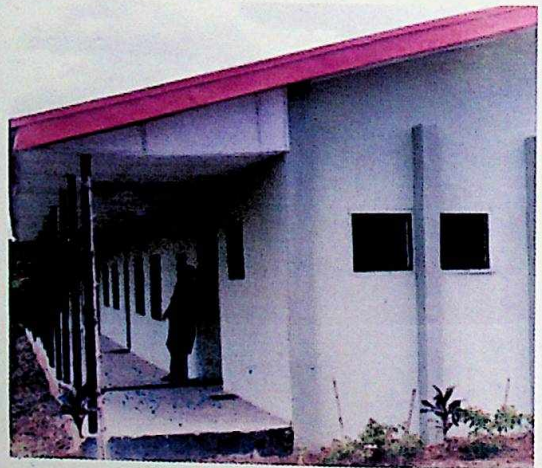

The State Government has appointed 884 [NCE graduate] teachers who had participated in the Federal Teacher Scheme.

Approval has been given to the Commission to recruit 1,305 teachers for English Language, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

A whopping sum of N559,330,680.00 has been disbursed to all 966 Public Secondary Schools in the last two years as running grants.

A sum of N117,036,000.00 has been given to 645 teaching and non-teaching Staff of the Commission as vehicle loan.

The Commission has released N40,165,000.00 to 113 Staff as Housing Loan.

The State Government has appointed 250 Principals and 650 Vice Principals.

OYO STATE UNIVERSAL BASIC EDUCATION BOARD (SUBEB)

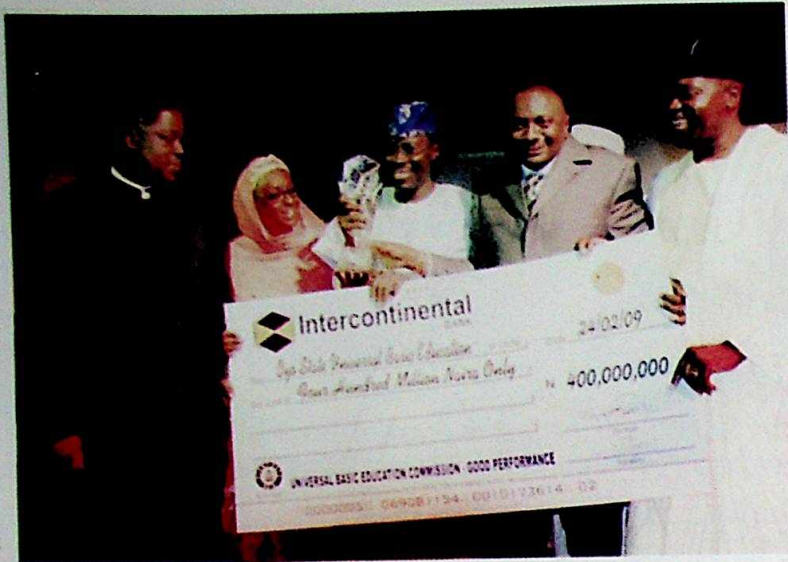
THE MAKING OF OYO STATE AS THE RECIPIENT OF SECOND BEST STATE FOR GOOD PERFORMANCE

Federal Ministry of Education hosted the first Universal Basic Education (UBE) Good performance Award Ceremony. The Good Performance Award was presented to deserving States which have made outstanding achievement in the implementation of the UBE programme for the 2005 and 2006 Intervention projects. These projects were implemented between 2006 and June 2008.

It is aimed at encouraging States to optimize the use of State resources and UBE intervention funds for qualitative UBE programme implementation. The Good Performance Award attracts 5% of the total UBE Intervention Fund for the year as incentives to deserving States. It was held on 24th February, 2009 at the Congress Hall Transcorp Hilton Hotel, Abuja.

The assessment process involved four stages of project monitoring and assessment. The first stage was the nationwide assessment carried out by the Universal Basic Education Commission which involved the staff of the various departments of the Commission. The next level was the assessment exercise conducted by some NGOs appointed by UBEC and the Federal Ministry of Education.

The third level was the assessment carried out by the Education Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives and the Senate Committee on Public Accounts. An informal monitoring was also conducted by other Federal Agencies such as the State Security Service (SSS).

The final stage was the collation and statistical analysis of the national reports by selected professional team of experts who screened all the reports and submitted a final recommendation to UBEC.

UBEC in turn forwarded the results to the Federal Ministry of Education which in turn passed it to the President of Federal Republic of Nigeria for executive approval for the awards to be made.

Oyo State did not achieve this feat easily. It was due to a combination of factors which are highlighted below:

Projects

Construction of classrooms: A total of 790 classrooms were constructed.

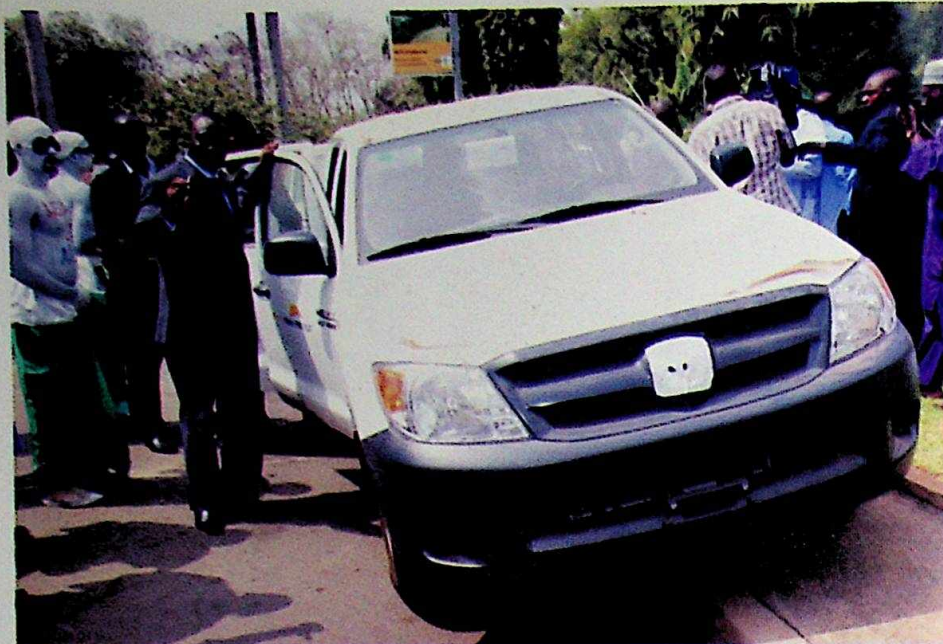

Distribution of Projects

Oyo SUBEB was commended for the equal distribution of projects. All the projects were spread to every nook and cranny of the State even to the most remote parts of the State.

Quality of Consultants

In the area of capacity building, teachers and headteachers are being trained by institutions that trained NCE graduates. The speciality of these consultants also warmed the heart of the Good Performance Team.

Uniformity of Roofing Materials:

The Board made use of the same roofing materials for our construction for the purpose of uniformity, quality and identification.

Uniformity of Paints

The paints being used by the Board is from the same source. The contract for the supply of paints is being done from a single source to all the contractors to ensure good quality job.



Introduction of Metal Doors

Sequel to the 2005 projects, all the projects being embarked upon by all the SUBEBs were done with wooden doors and windows. Oyo SUBEB introduced the innovation of the use of metal doors and windows.

The way forward

For the Board to achieve her ambition of coming first in the next award or at most maintaining her first position, certain innovations are being introduced.

Use of Ramps

All the new constructions being embarked upon by Oyo SUBEB are provided with disabled Access Ramps at both entrances. This will give room for the Inclusive Education being preached by the Federal Government.

OYO STATE LIBRARY BOARD

The last two years of Oyo State administration under His Excellency, the Executive Governor of Oyo State, Otunba (Dr.) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala have been quite eventful, remarkable and result-oriented. The following areas of intervention and support have assisted the Oyo State Library Board to pursue its primary goal of promoting reading and readership in the state with renewed vigour, thus gradually developing the habit and culture of reading in the citizenry.

(a) Acquisition of 30KVA sound proof generator for the fifty- seater Computer Centre.

The fifty seater Information Communication Centre that is equipped with computers that are already hooked to the internet and situated at the Board's Complex, Dugbe, Ibadan became alive and purposeful to the Library users as the lack of power support from the Power Holding Company of Nigeria (PHCN) which rendered the Centre hitherto comatose was solved with the purchase of the 30 KVA sound proof generator for use. His Excellency further ensured that the generator was constantly functional with the release of a total sum of N550, 000.00 to fuel and propel the engine. The free access of users to the Centre has contributed to the number of clientele patronizing the Library.

(a) Purchasing of two brand new Toyota Hilux Vans, 2WD DC AC and the Repairs of the Vehicles of the Board

Two brand new Toyota Hilux Vans (air conditioned) were acquired by the Board while seven of the Board's eight vehicles were repaired and refurbished. The vehicles have assisted the Board tremendously, particularly in the movement of the newly processed books to all the Board's service points.

(b) Participation of the Library Board's Staff at Conferences and Seminars (Local and International)

It is remarkable to report that more than 90% of the Oyo State Library Board staff were sponsored to attend various seminars and conferences in the last two years while the State Librarian, Mr. E. A. Oyegade and the Director, (Finance and



Administration) Mrs. A. O. Adigun participated in the International Federation of Library Association Conference that took place in Quebec, Canada in July, 2008. Apart from the sponsorship by the Office of the Head of Service, a sum of N4, 717, 650.00 was released to the Board for the successful participation of Staff, both junior and senior in the seminars and conferences.

(c) Renovation of the Library Board Complex, Dugbe, Ibadan. The sum of N24, 813,999.40 was approved to renovate the Library Board Complex, Dugbe, Ibadan with 30% of the approval already released to the contractor to ensure that a good job is done. The work is on-going.

(d) Regular Payments of Salaries and Allowances including Leave Bonus

Staff of the Board are grateful that their salaries and allowances including leave bonus were not only paid but paid timely and regularly.

During the 2-year period, a total sum of N36, 130,026.45 was released as payment to the staff of the Board as their salaries and allowances/leave bonus. Kudos to the Oyo State Government for the good record.

(e) Overhead Expenditure

A total sum of N5,812,500.00 was expended by the Board in keeping the Library Board's service centres alive and functional. The releases during the two-year period of report were predictable as unflinching expectations. This predictability has assisted the Board in judicious spending and planning of her activities.

(f) Commencement of the Process of Establishing Community Centres/Libraries in the 33 Local Government Areas of the State.

Last year, His Excellency approved that Community Centres/Libraries incorporating ICT Centre, art gallery, Hall for literary activities be established in the 33 Local Government areas of the State. The process of establishing the centres began immediately, culminating into the appropriation of the sum of N650, 000,000.00 to the Library Board in the current financial year to establish seven of the centres. This is against the N50, 000,000.00 hitherto proposed for the Library Board. This is indeed a remarkable lift and development.

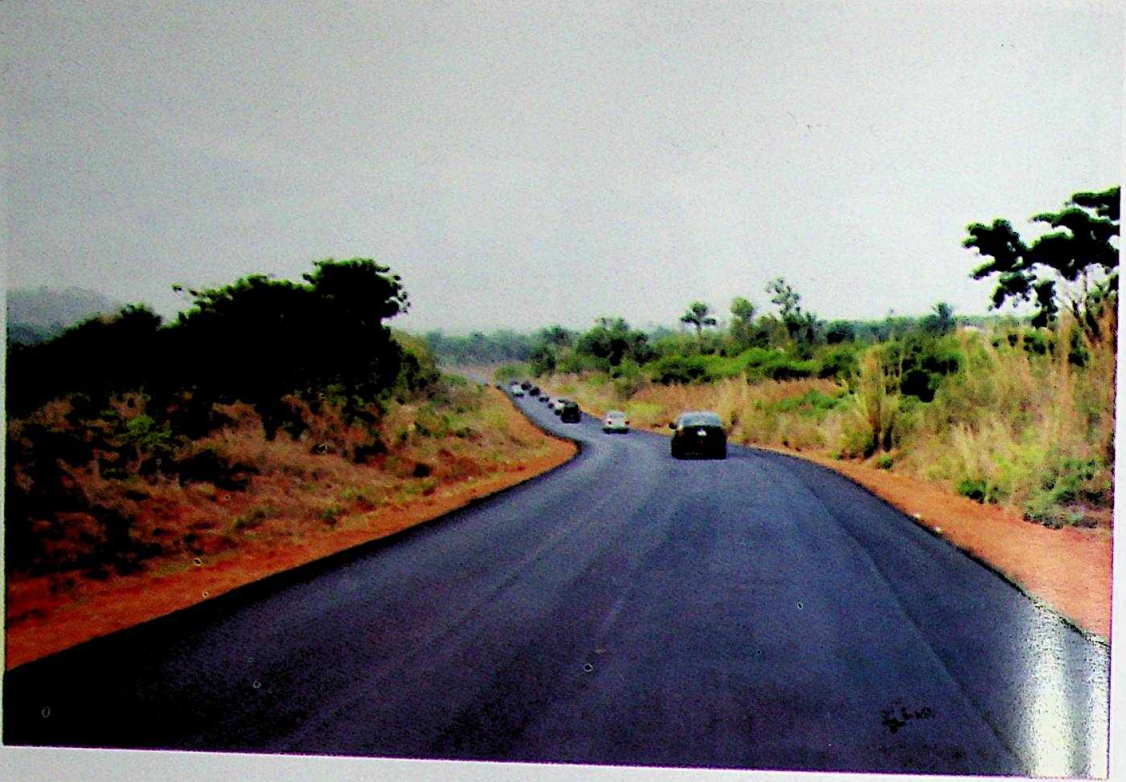

CLEAN ENVIRONMENT

The monthly allocation of the Ministry has been increased from N3,348,879.43 to N9,856,003.33.

The State Government has procured twenty [20] Ro-Ro Trucks and two hundred [200] skip bins for the Ibadan Solid Waste Management Authority for the



sum of N355,025,000.00.

The State Government has approved supply of fifteen [15] Units of Refuse Trucks on Mercedes Benz Chassis with 75 skip bins for Oyo State Waste Management Authority at the sum of N324,697,759.80.

The sum of over N16million naira has been expended on the clearing of blocked drains in Ibadan metropolis.

The State Government has spent N54,193,950.00 on the flood control works across the State.

The Ministry is spending a sum of N13,156,640.00 monthly on the total cleaning package along Ojoo- Tollgate Lagos-Ibadan Expressway.

The State Government has approved the appointment of a Consultant [MOJA T CONSULT LIMITED] to work with and complement the technical and human resources of the Urban and Regional Planning Board of the Ministry to facilitate the siting, erection and display of signage and advertisement facilities in Oyo State.

The old dump site at Ring Road has been converted to commercial land use and leased to SHOPRITE for shopping mall development.

The State Government has evacuated the trailers at Ojoo end of the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway to the newly constructed Akinyele International Trailer Park.

The State Government has released the sum of N4.5m for the execution of conversion of analogue maps and data into digital format.

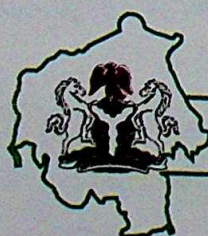

WATER SUPPLIES

African Development Bank Assisted Ibadan Emergency Water Rehabilitation Project

The Ibadan Emergency Water Rehabilitation Project comprising Asejire, Osegere and Eleyele Water Treatment Plants, which commenced in 2005, and had suffered various delays is still on-going and is about to be completed.

It should be noted that shortly after extension was granted by the African Development Bank (ADB) to enable successful completion of the project, the ADB suddenly refused to pay both the Contractor and the Consultant, Certificates in the sum of Euro 2,121,318.48 and CHF 163,829.75 respectively. The ADB said that the maturity date of the loan agreement had expired on 1st March, 2007 and that the final repayment bill by Nigeria for the loan was 31st January, 2007 thus the extension was granted in error. This led to the suspension of work on all sites by the Contractor on 21st May, 2007, about a week before the present administration came into power. This project would have gone in the way of other abandoned projects scattered all over the country, but for the timely intervention of His Excellency, the Executive Governor of Oyo State, Otunba (Dr.) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala.

In order to resolve this problem, a delegation of the Government of Oyo State headed by His Excellency himself, travelled to Tunis, Tunisia in March, 2008 to hold talks with the President and the Management of the African Development Bank.

At that meeting, it was amicably resolved that the Government of Oyo State

should find all means of completing the remaining project which was about 70% completed then, while the ADB on the other hand, would approve a new loan for the rehabilitation and extension of Ibadan Distribution Network. In fulfilling this agreement, His Excellency, the Executive Governor of Oyo State, has consistently been paying the due certificates of the Contractor, and by the time the project is completed, Oyo State Government would have expended about N1.8billion on the project as her counterpart fund. Out of this amount a sum of about N1.3 billion was paid in the last two years.

2. All things being equal, the rehabilitated Asejire, Eleyele and Osegere Treatment Plants, will be ready for commissioning by May, 2009 when His Excellency, the Executive Governor of Oyo State will be celebrating his second year in office.

It is worthy to note that by the time the project is fully completed, the rehabilitated Asejire stages I & II will be producing 82 million litres of water per day. Eleyele too would have been upgraded to its original design capacity of 37 million litres of water per day, while Osegere will be producing 13.5 million litres per day. The direct implication of this, is that an additional 119.0 million litres of water will be available for consumption in the city of Ibadan at the end of the project.

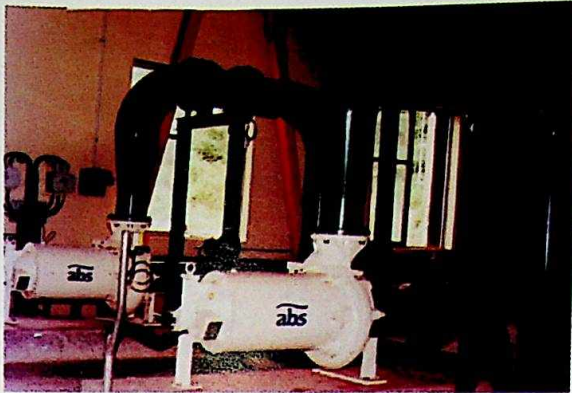
It is also worthy of note that, the promise of a new loan by the ADB is being vigorously pursued by the Government. The new loan is likely to be officially signed before the end of the year 2009. Under the new loan, Osegere Water Supply Scheme would be in a position to supply water to the following towns and adjoining villages, namely Osegere, Erunmu, Lalupon, Ejioku, Ajoda, Iyana-Offa, Kole, Akinbiyi, Ile-Igbon etc. in Egbeda and Lagelu Local Government Areas, while the Ibadan Distribution Network would be rehabilitated and expanded and thus increase the pipage within Ibadan metropolis which will be able to cope with the additional 119.0 million litres of water and reduce loss of water within the metropolis to the bearest minimum.

II. AGO-AMODU WATER SUPPLY SCHEME

This project, which had suffered many set backs since 1987 when it was first initiated, has now been finally completed.

The contract for the completion of the project was awarded in November, 2004 at the cost of N68,760,707.85 (Sixty-Eight Million, Seven Hundred and Sixty Thousand, Seven Hundred and Seven Naira Eighty-Five Kobo) while this administration paid the last certificate on the project in the tune of N9,581,760.91

(Nine Million, Five Hundred and Eighty One Thousand, Seven Hundred and Sixty Naira, Ninety-One Kobo to put the final finishing touches to the project and impressively completed it.

Major works were done on the dam, intake structure, treatment plant, low lift and high lift pumps. One of the major achievements on the project is the salvaging of the collapsing pump house building which had to be rebuilt from foundation.

The scheme has been supplying potable water for the use of Ago-Amodu people since 2006 and it is ready for commissioning.

III. REHABILITATION OF SAKI WATER SUPPLY SCHEME

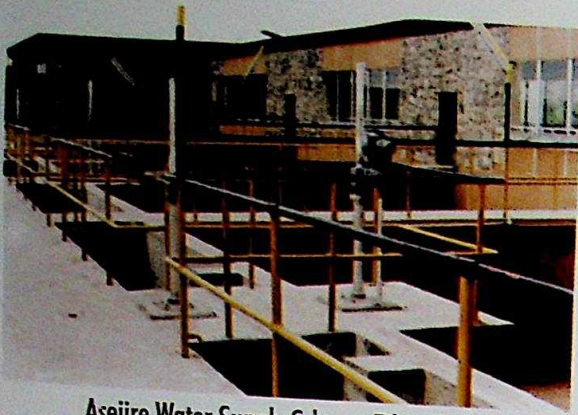
The contract for this project was awarded in November, 2004 at the cost of N139,415,517.50 (One Hundred and Thirty Nine Million, Four Hundred and Fifteen Thousand, Five Hundred and Seventeen Naira, Fifty Kobo). The major works included expansion of the existing treatment plant by 50%, construction/installation of additional sedimentation tank, filter beds, high lift pumps, new rising main and overhauling of existing mechanical and electrical equipment.

The project was taken over by the corporation for execution on direct labour basis in 2007, in line with the contract agreement, when the company handling the project was placed on receivership.

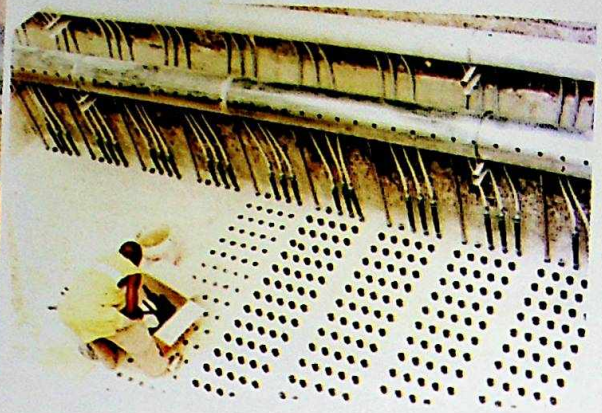
A lot of remedial work has been done on the new rising main after the take over, in order to put it in proper shape while finishing touches had to be put on the sedimentation tank, filter chambers, valves etc. in order to make them functional.

Final testing of the rehabilitated treatment plants and the new rising main would be carried out as soon as the on-going remedial works on the rising main are completed.

It is hoped that the project, which is about 85% completed, will be commissioned very soon.

IV. AYETE/ TAPA/ IDERE WATER SUPPLY SCHEME

The contract for this project was awarded between October November, 2005 at the total cost of N458,742,678.00 (Four Hundred and Fifty Eight Million, Seven Hundred and Forty Two Thousand, Six Hundred and Seventy Eight Naira).

The project entails the construction of a treatment plant based on the slow sand filtration technology and it involves construction of roughening filters, slow sand filters, reservoirs, rising main, pump houses and repair of the dam, all aimed at supplying 3,000 cubic meters of potable water to the guinea worm infested areas of Ayete, Tapa and Idere and later Igboora.

Works on the project have been substantially completed and it is hoped that more progress will be made very soon by the five contractors handling the 5 lots of the project. About 70% of the work has been done and a sum of N21,226,003.67 (Twenty One Million, Two Hundred and Twenty-Six Thousand, Three Naira and Sixty-Seven Kobo) was released in the last two years for the project.

V. RELOCATION OF PIPES ON MOKOLA-OJOO ROAD

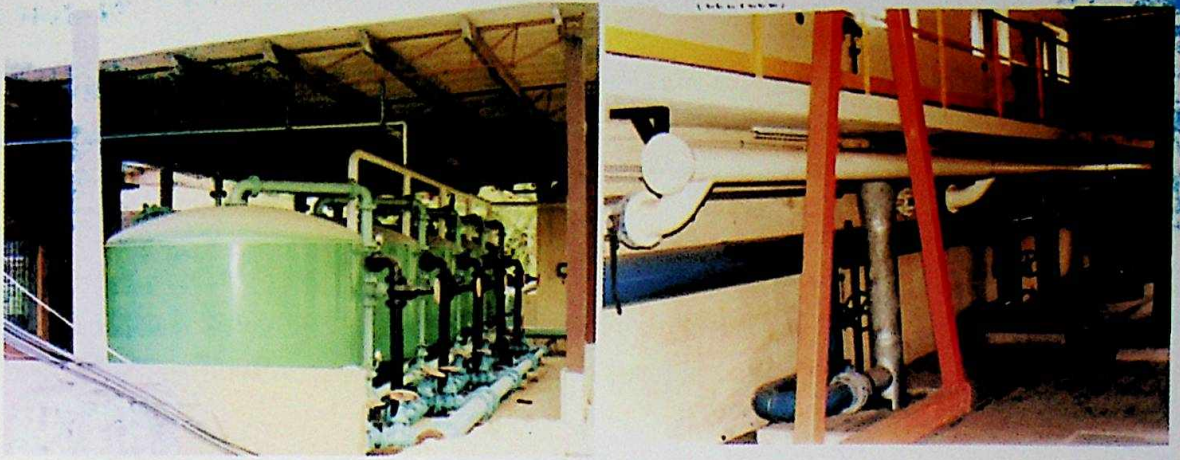
This project is being handled by direct labour at a total cost of 80 Million Naira. 2850 lengths of 8" UPVC pipes had been purchased at about N60 million. The pipes are being laid on both sides of Mokola-Ojoo road and an estimated total length of 17km for both sides will be laid with pipes.

The laying exercise is about 50% completed. The project completion will eliminate the need to cross the newly dualized Mokola-Ojoo road for the purpose of making new house connections and repair of damaged main pipes when completed.

VI. CONSTRUCTION OF DISTRICT OFFICES

In order to free herself from incessant harassment and exploitation from shylock landlords, the Corporation took bold steps in 2006 to construct by herself, district offices for Egbeda and Oyo districts of the Corporation and undertook to renovate and convert her Ososami Cash Office to a district office for Oke-Ado district.





This administration came to our aid in 2008 by making available a sum of N2,000,000.00 (Two Million Naira) for the construction of a district office in Ogbomoso and the renovation of some buildings, carved out of Agodi Booster Station to serve as Agodi district office. Steps are being taken to construct a new district office for the Saki district as well. When this is done, six out of our seven districts would have had their own permanent district offices.

VII. RENOVATION OF BOOSTER STATIONS

Our booster stations have started to wear new looks with the commencement of rehabilitation of Agodi and Mokola booster stations from the N3,000,000.00 (Three Million Naira) approved and released for the exercise. The renovation works have also started at Sango booster station. The renovation works, which include fencing, will provide conducive and safe working environment for our staff and property. The exercise will eventually be extended to all other booster stations in the state.

VIII. SUPPLY OF WATER TREATMENT CHEMICALS

This is an area of government's major contribution to the provision of potable water to its citizens. The government has spent a sum of N123,612,275.00 (One Hundred and Twenty Three Million, Six Hundred and Twelve Thousand, Two Hundred and Seventy Five Naira) for the purchase of Aluminium Sulphate, Hydrated Lime and Liquid Chlorine for water treatment in the state in the past two years. This shows its commitment to good community health conditions and poverty alleviation.

IX. REPLACEMENT OF PUMPS IN WATER SUPPLY SCHEMES AND BOOSTER STATIONS

Consequent upon the purchase of 65 Nos. Low Lift, High Lift and Booster pumps for the Corporation in year 2006, a sum of N1,500,000.00 (1 Million, Five Hundred Thousand Naira) was released in June, 2007 for the replacement of the old high lift pumps in Oyo, Atori and Koso Water Supply Schemes and Ososami Booster Station because the efficiencies of the six old pumps hitherto in use had reduced



considerably, which made their replacement inevitable. When the initial fund released was not adequate for the magnitude of work to be done in the course of replacing the six old pumps, an additional sum of N2,996,320.00 (Two Million, Nine Hundred and Ninety Six thousand, Three Hundred and Twenty Naira) was released in May, 2008 to complete the work.

This intervention prevented total stoppage of pumping activities at Oyo Waterworks and has improved water supply to Oyo town tremendously. Work is on-going on the replacement of pumps at Koso and Atori Water Supply Schemes as well as Ososami Booster Station.

X. PURCHASE OF COMPUTER HARDWARE AND UPGRADING OF BILLING SOFTWARE

The institutional strength of the Corporation got a boost with the award of the contract for the supply of 14 Nos. computer systems, 2 Nos. new servers, peripherals, networking and computer billing software upgrading at the cost of N10,000,000.00 (Ten Million Naira) in 2008.

While hardware supply and networking had been completed, upgrading of the billing software will soon be completed. All these will definitely lead to improved performance of the Corporation, most especially in the area of production of bills and administrative duties.

XI. BULK PURCHASE OF BURST PIPE REPAIR MATERIALS

This administration approved the purchase of burst pipe repair materials to the tune of N20,000,000.00 (Twenty Million Naira) for the Corporation in 2008 and this has ensured prompt response to the constant occurrence of burst pipes at all our water supply schemes and distribution networks throughout the state.

XII. PURCHASE OF CHLORINATORS/CHEMICAL DOSING PUMPS:

When the conditions of chlorinators and chemical dosing pumps in most of the Corporation's water supply schemes became deplorable and in order to ensure adequate disinfection of our final water, the government released a sum of N2,000,000.00 (Two Million Naira) for the purchase of chlorinators in 2008. This gesture has assisted the Corporation in having correct application of liquid chlorine thus meeting the World Health Organization Standard on water quality for domestic consumption.



XIII. OVERHAULING OF GENERATING SETS AT AGODI AND BEERE BOOSTER STATIONS

During the Treasury Board meeting of year 2007, the Governor gave the Corporation the opportunity to request for fund to overhaul the generators at Agodi and Beere Booster Stations which hitherto had been in a state of disrepair.

A sum of N3,000,000.00 (Three Million Naira) was released for the overhauling of these generators in 2008. This has helped the Corporation in meeting the primary objective of pumping potable water to the people of Ibadan metropolis when there is no supply of energy by PHCN.

XIV. AGODI BOOSTER STATION 630KVA OUTDOOR TRANSFORMER AND TRIPPING UNIT

In February, 2007, one of the two 630KVA Transformers at Agodi Booster Station developed fault as a result of which only one pump could be used at the booster station. The implication of this, is that high pressure zones in our network will not be able to get potable water and the resultant effect will be a fall in the Corporation's revenue.

In the light of the above, a sum of N3,000,000.00 (Three Million Naira) was released by the State Government for the purchase of a new 630KVA transformer and the repair of the tripping unit in June, 2007.

When all efforts to get a brand new 630KVA transformer because of the peculiarity in its rating failed, the Corporation resulted to repairing the faulty transformer in order to sustain full operational activities at Agodi Booster Station.

The repaired transformer has been put to use since and the Corporation will buy a brand new 630KVA Transformer when it is available in any of the reliable sources contacted.



XV. REPLACEMENT OF 70MM² UNDERGROUND ARMoured CABLE SUPPLYING ELECTRICITY TO ELEYELE WATER SUPPLY SCHEME WITH OVERHEAD CABLE

With the installation of a new High Lift pump at Eleyele Water Supply Scheme and the current rehabilitation of the whole scheme, there was an increase in the total load to be powered by PHCN supply and this required changing the supply cable from 70mm² to 185mm². The cost estimate of 185mm² armoured cable was enormous, thus an option of overhead cable was adopted for which a sum of N1,424,430.00 (One Million, Four Hundred and Twenty Four Thousand, Four Hundred and Thirty Naira) was released in June, 2007, so that regular pumping operation at Eleyele Water Supply Scheme could be achieved, thus making the Corporation achieve her aim of provision of potable water to the people of Eleyele and its environs.

XVI. PURCHASE OF SURVEY/HYDRO-METEOROLOGICAL EQUIPMENT

In order to solve the problem usually encountered in carrying out survey works for the in-house design of our water supply schemes and collection of relevant hydrological data, the sum of N1,000,000.00 (One Million Naira) was released for the purchase of relevant survey and hydrological equipment.

This has greatly enhanced the quality and speed of our survey works and the collection of relevant hydrological data.

XVII. PURCHASE OF LABORATORY EQUIPMENT AND CHEMICAL REAGENTS

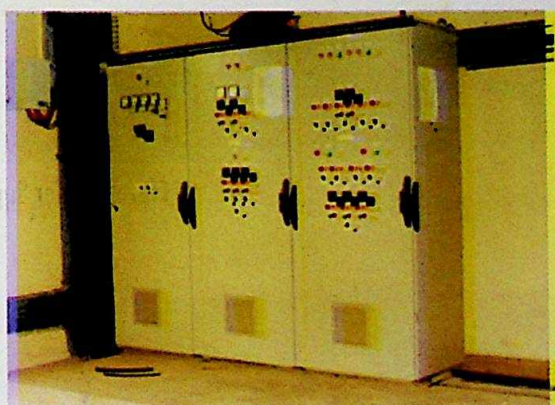
Oyo State Government, through Water Corporation of the State as its agency for production of potable water for the consumption of the good people of Oyo State, made available a sum of N1,786,080.00 (One Million, Seven Hundred and Eighty-Six Thousand, and Eighty Naira) for the purchase of necessary laboratory equipment, glass-wares and chemical reagents. This amount of money represents 60% of the contract sum paid to the successful contractors as mobilization fees. With this kind gesture of the State Government, the Corporation has been able to carry out water quality monitoring and assurance activities at all the Water Supply Schemes in the State.



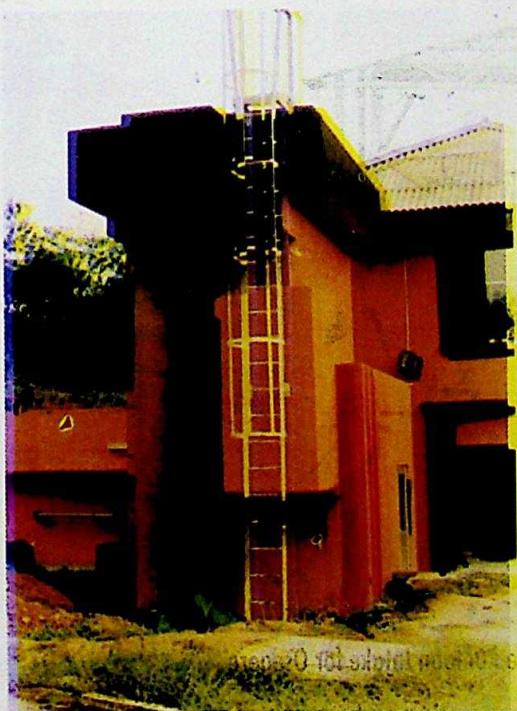
XVIII. REVENUE GENERATION/WATER TARIFF

The State Government in the last two years had ensured that the bills for water consumed through stand-pipes which is being paid for by local governments was promptly deducted from source on a regular basis. So far the Corporation has received a total sum of N48,953,000.00 (Forty Eight Million, Nine Hundred and Fifty Three Thousand Naira) which was deducted at source from June, 2007 to date.

This action coupled with the political will given to the Corporation by the government to collect water rates from every agency of government has made it possible for the Corporation to generate more revenue to supplement the government's subvention to the Corporation and to take care of her multi-farious operational costs.



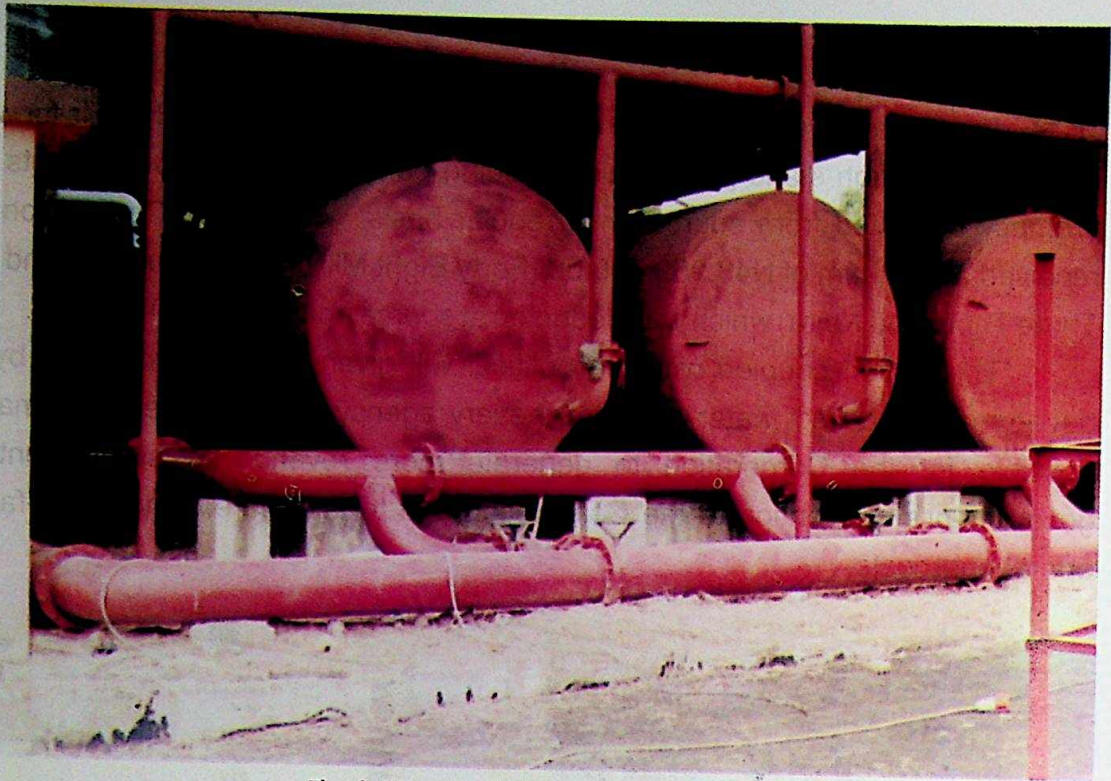

LANDS & HOUSING

KOLAPO ISHOLA G.R.A. HOUSING ESTATE

Historical Background

The Kolapo Ishola Estate which is the project of the Oyo State Government covers 249.25 hectares and it is located along Ibadan-Iwo Road in the Lagelu Local Government Area of Oyo State. It is at the moment put at multi-dimensional uses consisting of residential, commercial, religious and Institutional.

2. The site used to be a dairy farm by virtue of the acquisition notice No. 524 dated 15th June, 1967, Gazette No. 31 volume 16. This land ceased to be put to agricultural use in 1996 during the Military era when it was observed that the existing use had outlived its purpose and for the benefit of highest and best use. The proposal for its use as Residential Estate was recommended, approved, laid into plots and then allocated to the willing members of the public.

3. On assumption of Office on 29th May, 1999, Governor Lamidi Onaolapo Adesina revoked all title documents of allottees of the scheme on the ground that the dairy farm activities would be revived. This, however, did not materialize till the end of that Administration.

4. The status of revocation/cancellation of existing interest, within this scheme as pronounced by Governor Lam Adesina remained even in 2003 until the first coming on board of Governor Christopher Adebayo Alao -Akala in 2006 (during the eleven months period) when the Administration graciously approved that the issue of use as dairy farm be reviewed and the cancellation of residential use be reinstated or reversed.

5. The Oyo State Government, through the Ministry of Lands, Housing and Survey, had since 2006 swung into action to allocate land to willing members of the public both individual and Corporate. At the moment, the entire land mass which is 249.25 hectares is put to the underlisted and use:

6. It is pertinent to state here that the Oyo State Government has provided infrastructure such as water, electricity and good roads within the allocatable plots to encourage immediate development within the area. Similarly, it is worthy of note to also state that by the housing policy of the state, she partners with private developers wherein her contribution is the provision of land alone and the developer finances the project and profit is shared according to contributions.

Infrastructure Development

The old Dairy Farm now known as Kolapo Ishola G.R.A., has an area of 249.234 hectare of land. This area of land was sub-divided into four parts. Three parts were given to 3 private developers as housing units and the remaining part was to be used as G.R.A. (Site and Services).



2. Kolapo Ishola G.R.A. has about 600 plots of land. Sequence to the gracious approval of His Excellency, Dr. Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala, that the Site and Services should be provided with adequate infrastructure, hence, this was advertised in the Nigerian Tribune of 5th June, 2008 inviting qualified Engineers to bid. Tenders were received from 14 qualified Engineers on:

- (i) Construction of road network, with asphalt over lay:
 - (a) Construction of side drains on both side of the road;
 - (b) Construction of cover drains on both side of the road; and
 - (c) Pedestrian walk-ways;
- (ii) Provision of electricity; and
- (iii) Provision of water supply.

Bill of Quantities (BOQ) on the three projects used as benchmark were received from the Ministry of Works & Transport.

3. However, the technical committee from all professional Ministries together with Ministry of Finance, Board of Internal Revenue, Auditor-General for State, Office of the Secretary to the State Government; and Due Process Office, decided on the successful bidder. The successful bidders were the following:

- (a) Messrs. Lee-Fakino Nig. Ltd.;
- (b) Messrs. S. S. Ladsom Nig. Ltd.;
- (c) Messrs. Efbee Nig. Ltd.;
- (d) Piscar Nig. Ltd.;
- (e) Messrs. Agunbe Nig. Ltd.

4. Nevertheless, 16.8 km. length of the road was to be constructed for N990,000,000.00 (Nine hundred and ninety Million Naira). In view of the magnitude of the road network, it was sub-divided into three equal parts to the following three contractors:

- (a) Efbee Nig. Ltd.;



(b) Lee-Fakino Nig. Ltd.;

(c) S.S. Ladsom Nig. Ltd.

Each of the contractors handled 5.6 km. for a sum of N330,000,000.00 (Three hundred and thirty Million Naira).

5. The water project was awarded to Messrs. Piscar Nig. Ltd. at a sum of N162,424,350.00 (One hundred and sixty-two Million, four hundred and twenty-four thousand, three hundred and fifty Naira), while Messrs. Agunbe Engineering Ltd. handled the electricity supply of the G.R.A. at a sum of N94,981,947.50 (Ninety-four million, nine hundred and eighty-one thousand, nine hundred and forty-seven Naira and fifty kobo).

7. A sum of N1,247,406,297.05 (One Billion, two hundred and forty-seven Million, four hundred and six thousand, two hundred and ninety-seven Naira and five kobo) was approved by His Excellency for the completion of the five projects. Out of this amount, N842,951,621.00 (Eight hundred and forty-two Million, nine hundred and fifty-one thousand, six hundred and twenty-one Naira) has been expended to date on the projects.

Borehole was drilled for the office to improve availability of water for its official activities.

Officers enjoyed training in various parts of the country in order to boost their capacity building.



INFORMATION, CULTURE AND TOURISM

A total number of 7,100 assignments were covered by the staff of Directorate of Press and Public Relations from 29th May, 2007 to March 26,2009. 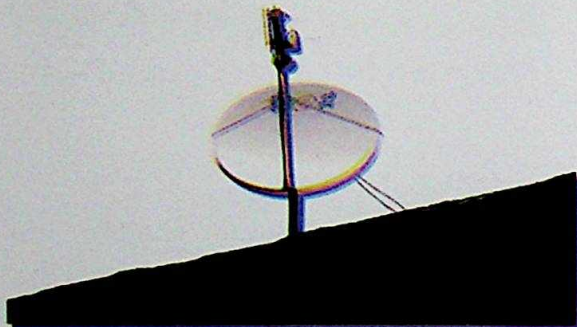

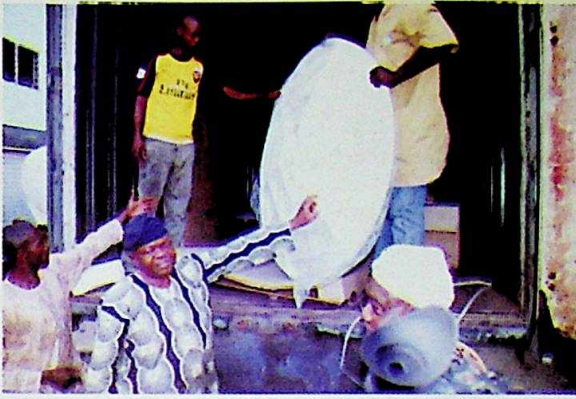

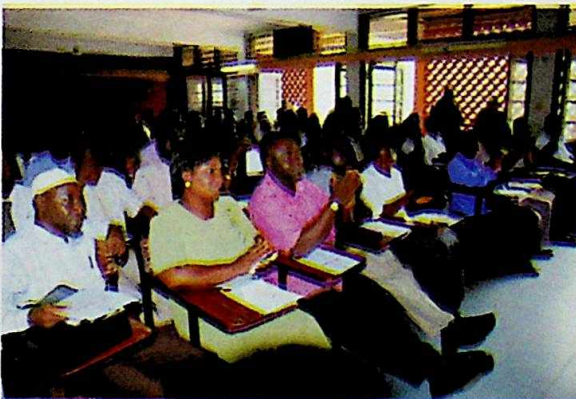

REPORT ON INDEPENDENT POWER PROJECT IN OYO STATE

With the deregulation of the Power sector by the Federal Government of Nigeria, the Oyo State government, under the dynamic leadership of the Executive Governor, Otunba (Dr.) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala in a swift reaction to the erratic state of Electricity supply in the state, took the initiative to develop significant and sustainable power generation capacity and distribution by inaugurating the Committee on Independent Power project in June, 2006 to consider the various proposals submitted by corporate organizations in the business of Independent Power Generation.

2. The committee swung into action immediately by considering, by way of interviewing the sponsors of all the proposals which climaxed into the signing of a Memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Entec Power and Utilities Company Limited for the establishment of 250Mega Watts Independent Power Plant in October, 2008.

3. The details of the MoU is such that the Entec Power and Utilities Company Limited is expected to assemble all necessary partners for the development of the independent Power project including the provision of the turbines that would be needed for the Power Project. The Entec Power and Utilities Company Limited is also expected to identify and acquire the sites for the identified Clusters.

4. State Government on its part is expected to provide an enabling environment for its take -off and provision of land for the identified clusters.

5. To this end, the contract for the supply of the turbines has been signed and the State is expected to take delivery of the turbines and other equipment for the IPP by November, 2009. So far, the State Government is yet to spend a dime as it is a healthy Public-Private Partnership Project. The State Government has however issued Certificate of Occupancy for the sites of three locations of the IPP Project in Ibadan. Furthermore, the Environmental Impact Analysis (EIA) which is a vital aspect of the IPP project has commenced. To this end, series of meetings have been held with the original landowners and Management of Industries located in the vicinity of the IPP.



6. Also the contract for laying of gas pipe lines to serve the turbines has been awarded and work would commence very soon.

7. It is intended that Cluster Plants of 25 Mega Watts each would first be deployed in six locations in Ibadan to serve the following areas: Oluyole Industrial Estate, Lagos-Ibadan Road, Secretariat-UCH axis, Ojo Area, Brewery Area, New Ibe Road and Asejire Industrial Area.

8. Work on the main plant to generate 250MW would however commence in earnest and this would replace the Cluster Plants when completed.

9. As part of the efforts to boost IPP in the State, the IPP committee paid an inspection visit to the Ikere-Gorge Dam with a view to taking over the Dam for the purpose of Power generation, distribution and transmission especially for the Oke-Ogun Area of the State to compliment the Ibadan Independent Power Project and ensure that the length and breath of the State benefit from this noble effort.

10. At present, meetings with Community Leaders of the Ibadan Independent Power Project sites on Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) is on-going and by the end of the year, the Independent Power Project would have taken shape and be rearing to go. Meanwhile, correspondence is going on between Oyo State Government and the Federal Government through the Management of Ogun-Osun River Basin Authority with a view to working out a mutually acceptable working relationship that will lead to bring in Investors to commence work at the Dam Site.

11. It is hoped that by the end of December, 2009, the civil work on the project would have been completed and the turbines installed.

Meanwhile, correspondence is going on between Oyo State Government and the Federal Government through the Management of Ogun-Osun River Basin Authority with a view to working out a mutually acceptable working relationship that will lead to bring in Investors to commence work at the Dam Site.

Brief On Inland Container Depot Project at Erunmu

PREAMBLE:-

The idea of Inland Container Depot was borne out of the outcome of the increase in global trade which led to scarcity of space in most Sea ports, a situation that has made it necessary to look for alternative ways of reducing congestion at Sea ports and also make exportation and importation activities less cumbersome for business enterprise.

2. The establishment and operation of Inland Container Depot was considered by the Federal Government and the projects are to 'be established in Aba, Bauchi, Ibadan, Kano, Jos, Gombe, Katsina and Maiduguri.

STATE GOVERNMENT ROLE

3. The Oyo State Government under the present administration accorded significant priority to this vision of the Federal Government basically to enliven the relatively dying economy of the State to the previous pace setting standard, this informed her effort at wooing various International shipping magnates to partner with the State Government after the turning of the sod by this administration.

3.1 When the project becomes a reality, the following are the benefits that will be derivable by the populace:

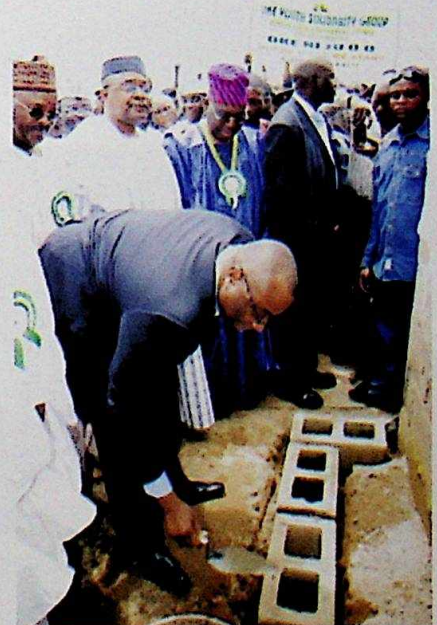
- (i) the ICD, will stimulate industrial growth and create jobs in abundance,



in and around the entire South West especially Oyo State;

- (ii) shippers and other business partners in the States under the zone will no longer require traveling to the Sea Ports to take delivery or send goods to their overseas partners;
- (iii) the project will lead to accelerated development of other supportive economic and transport infrastructure like rail, road, waterways leisure/recreational structures etc.,
- (iv) it will greatly stem the tide of unwarranted immigration for job seekers in search of economic activities;
- (v) the ICD will drastically reduce costs of goods and services thus improve the living standard of the entire citizenry.
- (vi) Also the establishment of ICD would lead to low vehicular movement on our roads thereby leading to reduction in road maintenance and accidents.

4. As part of equity contribution of the Oyo State Government to the project, an expanse of land (area 121.160 hectares) has been released for the project at Erunmu, Egbeda Local Government. So far, the State Government has spent N55m for the timely take-off of this project. On 11th August 2008, the turning of sod which was one of the vital requirements to forge ahead on the project was done courtesy of His

BRIEF ON ULTRA MODERN BUSINESS COMPLEX, OGBOMOSO

The present administration under the leadership of His Excellency, Otunba (Dr) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala has opened for business the Ultra Modern Business Complex at Ogbomoso and paid all outstanding monies on the project. The Ultra Modern Business Complex has 399 shopping units which are categorized into the following types.

Type A (Lockup shops)	-	160 units
Type B (Lockup shops)	-	96 units
Type C (open stalls)	-	100 units
Type D (offices)	-	42 units
Type E (Meat shop)	-	1 unit
Type F (Ware house)	-	1 unit

Some of these shops had opened for business activities. While effort to ensure that other traders open for business is on-going.

The complex has the following facilities in place.

1. Administrative block
2. Police Station
3. Fire Service Station
4. Security post
5. Public toilets
6. Boreholes
7. Refuse disposal sites
8. street lights and other security lights
9. viable Drainage System
10. Asphaltic road network
11. block wall fence round the complex

2.0 For effective management and eventual take-off of activities at the complex, a market committee to work hand-in-hand with the Managing Agent in maintenance of infrastructural facilities, security, sanitary up-keep and settlement of possible rift amongst the traders had been constituted by this administration. Some returnees from Jos and Kano to Ogbomoso had been given a space in the complex for their trading activities, while WAZOBIA traders at Sabo market at Ogbomoso who had been served quit notice had also been given a space at the complex for their trading activities.

Efforts are at top gear to provide borehole and ventilated improved pit latrine for these traders at the new site in the complex.

The phase II of the Ultra-modern business complex would soon commence where most of the much desired facilities like Banks, petrol stations, motels, etc will be provided for by interested members of the public as part of the public private partnership initiative of this administration.

PACESETTER MICRO FINANCE INSTITUTION

Achievements

According to the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN), the formal financial system provides services to only about 35% of the economically active segment of Nigeria's over 140 million financial services. It is therefore not surprising that all the efforts made by past administrations to reduce or eradicate poverty did not yield the desired results. This is due largely to the fact that the poor remain poor because they are deprived of access to life transforming opportunities such as easily accessible and affordable financial services. It is against this background that His Excellency, the Executive Governor, Otunba (Dr) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala, in his quest to accelerate the pace of poverty eradication in Oyo State decided to adopt micro-credit programme as a veritable strategy towards poverty reduction and eventual eradication in the State. Towards this end, the governor presented an Executive Bill to the Oyo State House of Assembly in July, 2008 to provide the legal framework for the establishment of the pacesetter microfinance institution. The Bill, after undergoing all the necessary legislative processes, was eventually passed into law. "The Pacesetter Microfinance Institution Law 2008" and came into effect on 22nd August, 2008 after being assented to by the Executive Governor.

To be able to meet up with the financial implication, the State Government at the initial stage earmarked the sum of One billion naira (N1,000,000,000.00) at the first quarter of 2008 and by the last quarter of 2008, the capital base was increased with another sum of two hundred and fifty million naira (N250,000,000.00) totaling one billion, two hundred and fifty million naira (N125,000,000.00). Also, members of the Governing Board were appointed in November, 2008 to run the affairs of the Institution as provided by the Law while two reputable service providers with tract record of performance as Microfinance banks were appointed, viz



- i. Integrated Microfinance Bank Limited, and
- ii. Blue Intercontinental Microfinance bank limited
(a subsidiary of Intercontinental Bank Plc)

The scheme was formally flagged-off by His Excellency, the Executive Governor of Oyo State, Otunba (Dr) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala at a colourful ceremony held at the Cultural Centre, Mokola, Ibadan on 5th December, 2008.

THE JOURNEY SO FAR

Since its inception, several activities have been taking place.

- i. In November, 2008 Pacesetter Microfinance Institution (PMI) released the sum of two hundred and fifty million naira (N250,000,000.00) each to the Service Providers (Integrated Microfinance Bank (IMFB) and Blue Intercontinental Microfinance Bank (BIMFB) for onward disbursement to the State indigenes throughout the 33 local government.
- ii. On the 5th December, 2008, disbursement of cash and equipment to over 5,000 Oyo State indigenes throughout the 33 local governments was performed by the Executive Governor of Oyo State, His Excellency, Otunba (Dr) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala at the Cultural Centre, Mokola, Ibadan.
- iii. Another giant step taken by the Institution was the monitoring visitation to the beneficiaries through the service provider (Integrated Microfinance Bank). The verification team toured eight (8) local governments and some of the acclaimed beneficiaries were interviewed to ascertain the use to which the fund was eventually put. The eight local governments are:
 - a) Ibadan North West
 - b) Ido
 - c) Ibadan North
 - d) Akinyele
 - e) Oyo East
 - f) Afijio
 - g) Ogbomoso North and
 - h) Oriire local government

All respondents acknowledged the positive contributions the loan had made in their lives.

- iv. In confirmation of the efforts of the Institution, to allow the grassroots enjoy the scheme, the Institution released another two hundred and fifty million naira (N250,000,000.00) only to Integrated Microfinance Bank (IMFB) on the 30th April,

2009 after being satisfied with the reports of the initial disbursement. In this respect therefore, the release of this fund termed as phase two is expected to be disbursed to the active poor in the State.

v. In an effort to ensure that the new Institution starts on a sound footing, the Governing Board often on a working visit to Central Bank Headquarters, Abuja to register the establishment of Pacesetter Microfinance Institution by Oyo State Government and also to familiarize with top echelon of the Apex Bank.

In conclusion, the Institution embarked on enlightenment programme to sensitize the public on the activities of Pacesetter Microfinance Institution (PMI).

A total sum of N5.4million was released for the Armed Forces Remembrance Day Celebration held on January, 2008 & 2009 by the State Government.

Perimeter block wall fence of Juvenile Remand Home, Ijokodo was done by the State Government.

40 abandoned children after thorough social investigation were given out on adoption to registered adopters via legal procedures.

A sum N460,050 was released for the conduct of the Areas & State Council's elections of the Nigerian Legation.

Veteran walk for International Day of Peace was held on 21st September, 2008 and a sum of N780,000.00 was released for the programme.

A sum of N290,000.00 was approved as financial assistance to 3 members of Staff of the Ministry i.e. Messrs Waidi Oyebanji, A.A. Abimbola, Mrs. R. Jayeoba.

A sum of N368,000 was donated to mark the Nigerian Association for Social Workers' Day.

A sum of N1.8million was released for International Women's Day for the last two years.

About 1,500 families were reconciled and the positive effects on the affected children are reflected in their maintenance and well being.

Training/skills acquisition of over 300 physically challenged persons at the Rehabilitation Centre for the Disabled, Moniya and Nigeria Centre for the Blind, Ogbomoso.

Procurement of equipment amounting to N5m for Nigerian Blind Centre, Ogbomoso and sinking of a borehole at the Centre.

Donation of N300,000 to 6 children at the Juvenile Remand Home, Ijokodo as scholarship award.

A subvention of N100,000 is released monthly to the Nigerian legation.

Release of N5m every year for the feeding of the children in Social Welfare Homes.

Production/provision of 15 artificial limbs for the amputees in Social Welfare Institutions.

Graduation and Donation of Equipment to graduands of 12th set of trainees of Rehabilitation Centre, Moniya, by the State Government.

Rehabilitation and Repatriation of 18 Destitutes from Lagos State to their different Homes and Local Government Councils in the State.

Establishment of State Children Parliament consisting 40 members and the release of N300,000 annually for its running cost.

Approval of child Rights Law.

1,000 Self-help projects had been completed in 33 Local Governments Areas in the State, Grant of N7m was released for disbursement to the Local Government Chairmen for the execution of the projects.

Twenty-two [22] vigilante groups were launched in various Local Government Areas throughout the State to complement Government effort on the security of lives and property.

N400,000.00 was released for the resuscitation of Radio/TV programme (Agbajo-Owo) in collaboration with the Oyo State Broadcasting Corporation as a public enlightenment strategy on self-help projects in the State.

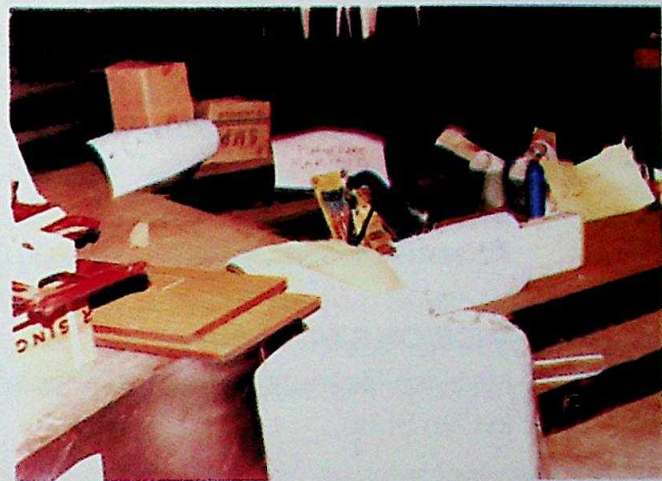
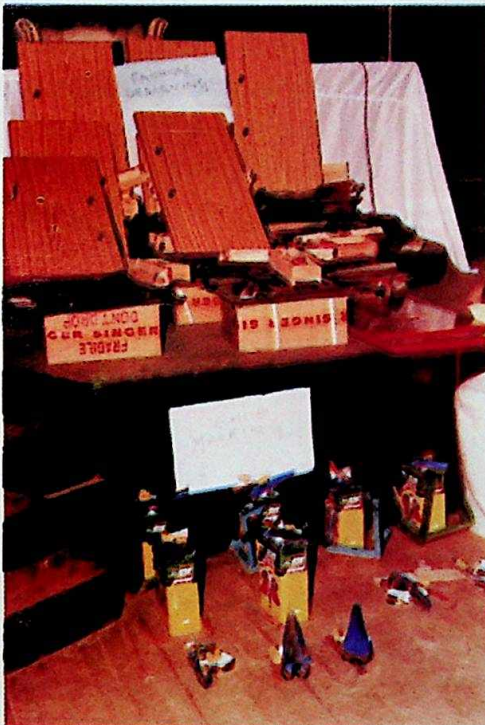
100 members of Staff benefitted from training programmes at the Local, National and International levels. A total sum of N11.2m was released for this purpose.

OYO STATE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (OYSEMA)

Oyo State Emergency Management Agency (OYSEMA) was an offshoot of National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) which was established in March 1999 by Act 12 of 1999 as amended by Act 50 of 1999. It was this same Act that established all the State Emergency Management Agencies (at the State levels and Local Emergency Management Committees (LEMCs) at the Local Government Areas. The Agency was formally under the Ministry of Local Government and Chieftaincy Matters code-named State Emergency Relief Agency (SERA) until late year 2004 when it was transferred to the Office of the Executive Governor with the name State Emergency Management Agency to reflect the paradigm shift from mere distribution of relief materials to an all encompassing disaster risks reduction Agency. Since then, the Agency used to be a unit in the Cabinet and Security department before the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) and other stakeholders advised that the Agency should be autonomous. In yielding to this, His Excellency, Otunba Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala approved in July 2006 that the Agency should be fully autonomous with the Secretary as the head of the Agency who reports directly to His Excellency, the Deputy Governor, Alhaji (Hon.) Taofeek Oladejo Arapaja as the Chairman. The Law establishing the Agency was finally passed by the House of Assembly and signed by His Excellency, Otunba Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala on 2nd January, 2009.

VISION

Towards Disaster Risk Reduction in Oyo State

MISSION STATEMENT.

Mobilise Resources Towards Efficient and Effective Disaster Risk Reduction in Oyo State.

FUNCTIONS: The functions of the Agency, among others, are to
Formulate policy on all activities relating to disaster management in Oyo State and coordinating the plans and programmes of other stakeholders for efficient and effective response to disaster at the State level;
Co-ordinate and promote research activities relating to disaster management at the State level;
Monitor the state of preparedness of all organizations or agencies which may contribute to Disaster management in the State;



Educate and inform the public on disaster prevention and control measures;
Distribute emergencies relief materials to victims of natural or other disasters
and assist in the rehabilitation of the victims where necessary; etc

RELIEF PACKAGES

The Agency has been distributing relief items to victims of natural and man-induced disasters in the State. It noteworthy that the National Emergency Management Agency at times do come to the assistance of the Agency whenever a disaster of higher magnitude occurred. Besides this, the government of Oyo State has been promptly responding to the management of disasters in the State. These include:

Procurement and distribution of 239 bundles of Iron Sheets worth N2.5m to the Survivors of Itesiwaju Rainstorm;

Political violence has also been identified to be one of the vulnerable areas of disaster in the State. The Agency has spread its largesse to the benefit, of some political violence victims in the State by bankrolling their hospital bills;

Cash relief assistance worth N2.5m to the Survivors of fire disaster at Agbeni Market in November, 2007;

Survivors of flood disaster in Atiba Local Government were in 2007 given various relief items to rehabilitate them. Such included clothing and food items; The survivors of fire disaster in Olosun Village, Akinyele Local Government were given financial assistance worth N900,000.00 and various relief items such as roofing sheets, mattresses, blankets, clothing, etc;

Four major survivors of fire disaster at Apake Saw-Mill, Ogbomoso benefited from the relief assistance of the State Government through cash assistance of one million naira (N1m) to jump-start their business while others were given relief materials such as Iron roofing sheets and sundry items;

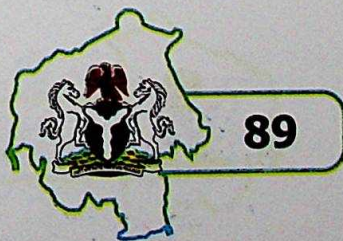
The survivors of rainstorm disaster that ravaged Ibadan South-East and South-West Local Governments on 6th March, 2008 were given substantial relief materials especially corrugated iron roofing sheets and bags of nails worth forty million (N40m) naira;

On Thursday 22nd May, 2008, the survivors of rainstorm disaster that ravaged various communities in Irawo Owode, Baasi, Ofiki, Owo and Ago-Are in Atisbo Local Government were duly compensated with relief materials;

The State Government assisted a Survivor of kerosene explosion, which occurred in March, 2008 by offsetting part payment of her hospital bill;

The State Government continues to provide relief materials on daily basis to individual survivors of disasters throughout the State;

Release of the sum of N500,000.00 to the Survivor of a flood that ravaged a farm at Muslim area of Ibadan in September, 2008;



Conduct of sensitization campaign on early warning on flood disaster in risk zones within the State in April, 2008;

All the 33 LGAs Local Emergency Management Committees were stockpiled with relief materials to attend emergency cases within their jurisdiction on request;

Besides all these, His Excellency, Otunba Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala has advanced certain amount of money from the Agency's approved budget to be domiciled in the Agency's account on quarterly basis to attend to unexpected and unimaginable occurrences that do not require the administrative bureaucracy;

The Agency distributed relief materials to the Survivors of rainstorm disaster to the people of Ilora, Afijio Local Government in April, 2009;

Relief materials were distributed in May, 2009 to the people in Iresaadu and Oko, Surulere Local Government after the communities were ravaged with rainstorm disaster;

The Agency distributed relief materials to the Survivors of rainstorm disaster in Ibadan North-East Local Government on Thursday 14th May, 2009;

Several individuals continue to receive relief materials on daily basis from the Agency.

CAPACITY BUILDING/PROACTIVE ACTIVITIES

His Excellency, Otunba Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala believes so much in the development of human capital hence the giant strides towards exposing the Agency and other stakeholders in disaster management to various workshops and seminars.

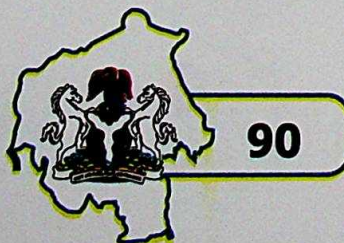
The Agency has organized a workshop on **Information Management for disaster prevention and response** for Information Officers and media organizations in the State in April, 2008;

A TOT workshop was also organized by the Agency for the Local inspectors of Education (LIEs) from 11th-13th February, 2008 towards carrying the message of **disaster management to the Schools**;

OYSEMA successfully organized a workshop on **Peace Building and conflict management** for the people of Igangan in Ibarapa North Local Government from 12th-13th November, 2008;

A workshop for Fulani Bororo Herdsmen and indigenous farmers in Savannah areas of Oyo State towards "**Peace building in Oyo State**" was held at the Legislative Chambers, Saki West Local Government Headquarters on 26th February, 2009. The aim was to educate the Fulani Bororos and farmers on the need to live harmoniously;

The Agency collaborated with NEMA and NICON Insurance to organize a sensitization for Ibadan Market men and women on **the need to partner with Insurance firms and insure their wares** so as to reduce risks and losses in



case of disasters. The programme took place on February 24, 2009 at Bola Ige International Market;

A 2-Day refresher workshop titled “**Enhancing the Efficiency and Skills of Town Planning Officers Towards Disaster Risks Reduction in Oyo State, from 18-20th March, 2009**” was organized by the Agency. The aim was to **incorporate Urban and Regional Planning practices into Disaster Management**;

The Agency's officials had at different times been sponsored to various workshops and seminars in an attempt to enhance staff capacity building;

The Agency has a good harmonious working relationship with UNICEF, National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) and other stakeholders;

The OYSEMA holds periodically the stakeholders' meeting comprising Security Agencies, NGOs and others.

EFFORTS TOWARDS REDUCING DISASTER RISKS AND HAZARDS IN THE STATE

The Agency has evolved strategic plans, policies and structures for disaster preparedness, prevention, mitigation and recovery in the State. These include:

Preparation of Annual Action Plan for disaster management

Periodical meetings with stakeholders;

Establishment of the State Emergency Preparedness and Response Team (EPRT);

School Emergency Response Team (SERT);

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT);

Inauguration of Local Emergency Management Committees (LEMCs) across the 33 LGAs;

Continued awareness Campaign/Media Jingles on Radio and Television Stations and distribution of pamphlets, handbills, posters, etc, on disaster related issues;

Training and capacity building for disaster Managers and Stakeholders;

Provision of Relief materials to disaster survivors in the State;

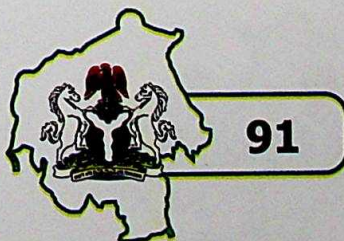
Setting machinery in motion for Vulnerability and Capacity Analysis (VCA);

Approval to collaborate with major stakeholders and partners within and outside the State;

The Agency's Warehouse has been completed and ready for commissioning;.

Constraints The Agency lacks rescue equipment such as Search and Rescue Tap, Camera, Heavy Duty Towing Vehicle, First Aids materials, Ambulances and Vehicles.

The Agency would require adequate Public Private Partnership (PPP) and collaboration from Nigerians and International bodies to effectively manage disaster in the State since government alone can not single-handedly do it.

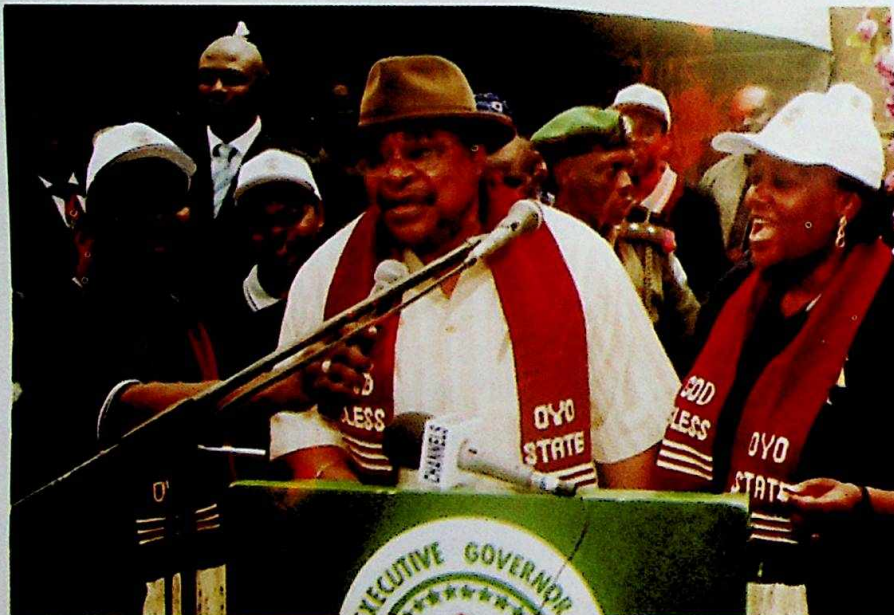

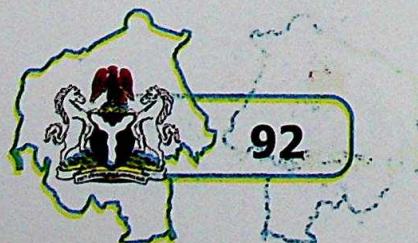

Approved the organization of five years post-pilgrimage thanksgiving service, the best in history of Oyo State.

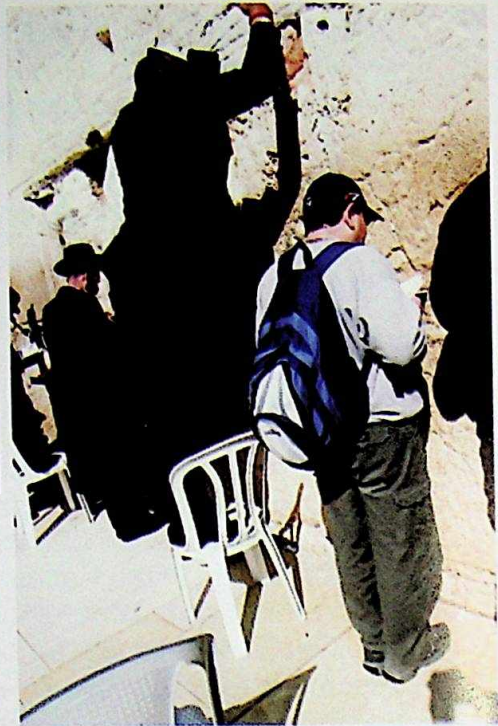

OYO STATE PILGRIMS' WELFARE BOARD (MUSLIM WING)

Before the advent of the present government hajj exercise had almost become jinxed in Oyo State. In fact, it reached the peak when in 2005/2006 for the very first time; none of the intending pilgrims with the State Board was able to perform the hajj! Fortunately however, the brief stint of Governor Alao-Akala in 2006 (11 months) redeemed the situation when the 2005 unable (numbering 700) made it to hajj, along with fresh batch of 800, now totaling 1500.

It is on record that His Excellency, Otunba Adebayo Alao-Akala then made it possible for the said 2005 unable by paying the differential of increase in hajj fare for 2006/2007, running into several millions of naira.

Also since 2006, his administration has institutionalized State sponsorship of intending pilgrims to hajj. This gesture, which was last extended to Muslims by Lam Adesina administration, was taken farther by allowing all the Local Governments in the State to sponsor five each.

By 2008 hajj exercise, local government sponsorship was not only increased to seven per local government, State sponsorship also moved up from 200 to 250!

It is quite heartwarming to mention that the stranded luggage (in Saudi Arabia) of 2006 Pilgrims, occasioned by the failure of the Federal Government selected Airlines for that year, was eventually shipped down to Nigeria in March, 2008, courtesy of the determination and financial commitment of Governor Adebayo Alao-Akala.

This feat was quite unprecedented.

Again, it is gratifying to note that Oyo State has never had it so good, as far as hajj operation is concerned. Before the birth of this Government all available records indicated that the highest figure of intending pilgrims of Oyo State stood at 700, for the past 15 years or thereabout. This situation changed for the better, when in 2006, the figure was 800 (aside from the 700 inherited 2005 unable). From there it moved up to 1400 in 2007 with the last figure (2008) increasing to 1510.





At this juncture, the fact must be stated that, all the above feats were made possible solely by the positive disposition of His Excellency, Otunba (Dr.) Adebayo Alao-Akala to all activities of the Board in particular and issues pertaining to the overall well being of the State pilgrims and the Muslim community in general. A very auspicious instance is the fact that since the coming into being of this administration, Governor Akala has personally made it a point of duty ensuring consistent and prompt facilitation of the State's allocated slots in Abuja through the provision of soft loan to the Board, running into several millions of naira, thus ensuring easy remittance of payment to National Hajj Commission of Nigeria (NAHCON) in Abuja.

For 2009 Hajj alone, a sum of two hundred and fifty million naira (N250,000,000.00) was provided for in the Approved Estimates to take care of the aforementioned soft loan. Though, this soft loan is always paid back into the coffers of the State Government, however, this level of facilitation is second to none in Oyo State since inception.

His Excellency's uncommon desire to engender a very smooth, hitch-free and successful Hajj operation in Oyo State since he came into office is always being matched by the level of his unusual personal involvement in coordination during the peak period of Hajj operation. Yet, he would never interfere with the day-to-day activities of the Board.

Another classical demonstration of the determination of the present government in Oyo State of ensuring Hajj without tears is exemplified by the philanthropic gesture of Her Excellency, the wife of the State Governor, since 2007, to Oyo State pilgrims. For the past two Hajj exercises, she has been providing the entire State pilgrims with the usual uniform popularly called "Ma so mi nu ni Arafa". In fact, it is on record that for the first time in the history of Hajj operation in Oyo State, the money paid by the pilgrims for the uniform was refunded back to them after returning back from Hajj. This is a record breaker!

Mention must equally be made of the fact that about eight years after, it was Governor Adebayo Alao-Akala's government that bought a brand new vehicle (G.M.C. Jeep) in 2008 for the smooth running of the Board activities in Saudi Arabia. This is aside from the brand new 4 wheel drive Toyota Hilux, Double Cabin released in September, 2008 for the use of the Board here in Nigeria.

All these are meant to facilitate the Board and by extension guarantee a stress-free, hitch-less hajj exercise for the State pilgrims, at both ends.

Already, efforts are on by this administration to embark on the construction of ultra modern administration block at the Olodo hajj camp. This is aside from the proposed extension of the Camp hall, new hostels, purchase of additional set of computers (4 units) with all accessories, as well as replacement of the aged power generating set with a brand new and bigger one, to mention just a few. All these have been graciously provided for by His Excellency in the 2009 Approved Estimates.

Another cheering news is that up till 2005 Oyo State Board used to be rated amongst the worst by the Directorate of Pilgrims Affairs (DPA) and the Presidential Committee on Hajj (PCH) both now defunct. However, from 2006, things changed for the better. Today, the National Hajj Commission of Nigeria (NAHCON) not only rated Oyo State amongst the very best, as mentioned by NAHCON Chairman himself before the gathering of the State Pilgrims in Makkah during 2008 Hajj, even the National Forum of State Boards Chairmen and Secretaries unanimously elected Oyo State as its Secretary. Today, the State also represents the entire Southern States numbering seventeen in three most vital Committees of NAHCON, namely, Aviation, Accommodation and Transportation. Since the inception of Hajj operation in Nigeria, no southern state has ever enjoyed that status and level of recognition. But then, all these are made possible by the disposition, interest and unparalleled commitment of His Excellency, Otunba (Dr) Adebayo Alao-Akala to Hajj operation and the unwavering confidence he has reposed in this Board.

Definitely, the administration of Governor Adebayo Alao-Akala, to all intent and purpose, is one with a difference and Midas



touch! **Truly, Oga is OYATO indeed!** And there is no doubt that God being his Helper, the best is yet to be seen from him. May Allah (S.W.T.) continue to guard and guide aright our hardworking, focused, able, purposeful, lucky and very amiable Governor. Amen.

OYO STATE GOVERNMENT AND MILLENNIUM DEVELOPMENT GOALS (MDGs)

At the Millennium Summit in September 2000, the largest gathering of the world leaders in history adopted the millennium Declaration committing their nations to reduce poverty, improve health, promote peace, human rights and environmental sustainability. MDGs are a set of eight interdependent, quantifiable and measureable goals aimed at making the world a place everyone will like to live. The goals have 18 targets and 48 indicators.

Conditional Grant Scheme (CGS) emerged out of the need to develop a new mechanism aimed towards achieving the MDGs. CGS sets aside a portion of Federal Government Debt Relief Gains to reinforce Local governments through pro-poor project and programme through the State Government

In 2008, Oyo State was one of the successful States to access funds from the scheme. The State provided a counterpart funding for the projects and programme. The projects and programmes will be inaugurated in the next few weeks in the 33 LGs across the State. The sectors covered include the following:

- A. HEALTH:**
- (i) up of roll Back malaria Project, viz provision of anti malaria drugs, provision of Long insecticide Treated Mosquito Nets
 - (ii) Rehabilitation and upgrading of 66 Primary Health/Maternity Centres that is 2 per LG.
 - (iii) Construction and equipping of 9 Comprehensive Health Centres that is 3 per Senatorial zone.
- B WATER AND SANITATION:**
- (i) Construction of 200 boreholes fitted with hand pumps that is at least 6 per LG.
 - (ii) Construction of 120 boreholes fitted with solar/motorized pump with storage tank that is least 3 per LG.
- C. SKILL ACQUISITION**
- (i) Equipping of skill acquisition centres for youth
 - (ii) Training of unemployment youth
 - (iii) Purchasing of trade equipments for the youth villages.

To ensure successful implementation of the projects and programmes, a State implementation Committee was set up to ensure timely service delivery. It is believed that the projects and programmes when fully executed will in no small measure alleviate the suffering of our teeming populace most especially at the grassroots level. This is the mission of our able to capable Executive Governor, Otunba (Dr) Christopher Adebayo Alao Akala.

However, the retention fees of N399,823.60 had been approved for release to the Contractors in accordance with the operating Contract Agreement.

A contract for the renovation of Soun Stadium Ogbomoso, which covers re-roofing of the spectators' grandstand, grassing of the field, provision of bore-hole water supply and completion of toilets [10 no.] and 4 no gate houses was awarded to Contractor in December, 2007. The contract sum is N32million and the Contractor had been mobilized.

A sum of N53million was approved and released for the construction of the Sports Centre and Parade Ground at the NYSC permanent oriental camp.

The construction of 2 Hostels and 1 NYSC Camp Commandant/Director's Quarters was awarded in December, 2008. The contract sum is N66,777,053.54 and N8,432,405.35 respectively and the contractors had been mobilized. Construction has commenced.

A contract for the construction of Swimming Pool was awarded in November, 2008 at a sum of N113,841,560.88 and the Contractor had been mobilized. Construction has reached 21.5% work done.

The sum of N10million was released in January, 2009 for the renovation of Squash

Hall at Lekan Salami Sports Complex. The project is on-going.

The phase 1 renovation of the Executive Gymnasium was awarded in November, 2008 at the contract sum of N2,898,894.90. The contractor had been mobilized.

The sum of N460,000.00 was released for the purchase of Table Tennis Boards with accessories and the rewiring of the Gymnasium centre. Furthermore, N50,000.00 was approved for the purchase of First-Aid Box and drugs to the centre in 2008.

The sum of N3,852,000.00 was approved and released in 2009 to procure and distribute sports equipment to 33 Secondary Schools in the State. The Equipment [Set of Table Tennis, nets and ball] had already been procured. Furthermore, N224,000.00 was approved and released for the commissioning of the Sports Equipment.

The sum of N5,794,054.80 was released in January, 2009 to renovate the Ministry's office building and this has been completed.

The sums of N8.9million and N14 million were approved as grants and donations and released in year 2007 to 28 clubs and 2008 to 35 clubs respectively to encourage professionalism and establishment of vibrant clubs.

The sum of N256,000.00 was released in year 2008 to enable the State participate in Odu'a Cup Competition. The Sunshine Football Club, Akure, Ondo State won the trophy.

The sum of N826,000.00 was released to organize competition among Able and Physically Challenged in the State in year 2008.

The sum of N4.5million was released to participate in the Annual Public Service Games in year 2008 held at Niger State. Oyo State participated fully and came 2nd in the Federation.

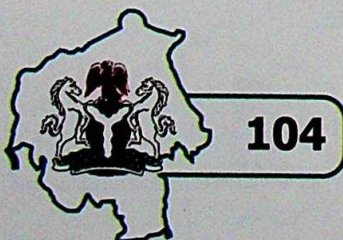
The sums of N2,895,200.00 and N2,901,300.00 were released in year 2007 and 2008 to organize a successful Governors Cup Competition among Secondary Schools in the State. The 2007 winner was Asegun group of Schools, Ibadan while Success High School, Abanla won the competition in 2008.

The State Government has released the sum of N177,556,367.25 till date for successful participation of Shooting Stars Sports Club in the Professional League season.

The sum of N100,000,000.00 was released to Crown Football Club, Ogbomoso, for successful participation in the Professional League season in 2008.

As a result of the fund released by the State Government, the construction and expansion of players' camp has commenced and work has reached a reasonable stage.

To ease transportation of players and officials for away matches, the



management purchased a space bus for official use and two [2] other buses were refurbished.

In order to facilitate the outstanding performance of the State at Zonal, National and International sporting competitions, this administration generously approved the appointment of 120 Athletes and 40 Coaches on Contract basis.

The State Government released the sums of N4,241,800.00 in 2007, N14,747,630.00 in 2008 and N4,844,400.00 in 2009 to support various programmes of NYSC in the State .

In anticipation of the propagation of the National Youth Policy Booklet and its implementation, the sum of N220,000.00 was approved and released for the production.

The State Government released the sums of N1,800,000.00 in 2007 and N1,885,000.00 in 2008 as grants to Voluntary Youth Organizations in the State.

In 2007, 60 voluntary Youth Organisation members and Youth Leaders were trained as peer educators to reduce truancy and other anti-social behaviours among the youths. Four thousand copies of Information, Education and Communication [IEC] materials were printed and distributed freely to youths in the State.

In 2008, Jingles were produced and relayed on Radio and Television in the State to sensitize the youths on the dangers inherent in anti social behaviours as well as send messages to parents on their responsibilities towards their children and wards.

Seventy seven [77] unemployed youths drawn from the 33 Local Governments in the State were trained in various vocational skills i.e. soap making, fashion designing, catering, tie and dye etc. and most of the beneficiaries are now self reliant and gainfully employed.

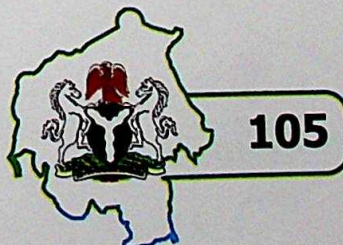
N180,000.00 was released to Publish 4,000 copies of Young Nigeria Magazine to enable the youths air their views on issue agitating their minds, while Government gets feedback on its programmes and projects.

99 School Prefects were trained in 2007 and 2008 yearly with a view to imbuing in them qualities expected of leaders at their level and promote cooperation, peace and harmony with the school authority.

In 2008, 100 selected apprentices in various vocations such as barbing, shoe making, motor mechanic and fashion designing were imbued with skills to enable them run their businesses successfully and be positive contributors to their communities.

42 youths were given awards in recognition and honour of those who have excelled in their various fields of human endeavour.

The first phase of renovation works on the IYY Youth Village, Ajoda, which is the only suitable camping venue for youths in the State awarded to Contractors in the sum of N13,516,746.33 is almost completed. The State



Government has recently approved the release of the balance payment in the sum of N9,011,164.12 for the completion of the project.

The State Government in April, 2008 approved the renovation of the three buildings at the Ososami Youth Centre; Ibadan i.e. Main Hall, Boxing Hall and Hobby Craft Building in the sum of N3,182,105.65. The project had been completed.

Sixty out of sixty-one members of Staff of the Ministry of Youth and Sports attended training programme within and outside the State.

The government had paid N39,979,505.62 as salaries, leave allowances and running cost for the period under review.

The total sum of N949,000.00 had been expended on the purchase of office equipment.

The State Government had expended N1,051,450.00 on Staff training and development.

16th National Sports Festival "KADA 2009"

The Oyo State contingent in the 16th National Sports Festival held in Kaduna tagged 'KADA 2009' between 13th and 26th February, 2009 placed 6th position overall by winning 26 Gold, 27 Silver and 49 Bronze Medals. At the end of the festival, the State returned with an unprecedented winning of Ninety-nine medals.

RECORDS SET

? The first Gold medal won at the 16th National Sports festival was by Oyo State Athlete Miss Victoria Gabriel in Cycling (Sprint) event.

? Mr. Yakubu Adesokan from Oyo State broke the World record in powerlifting. He lifted 170kg weight as against 169kg former World record. This made Oyo State to tower over all other States in the country in terms of world record performance.

? Since the inception of the National Sports Festival (NSF) in 1973, this is the first time Oyo State will win the highest Gold Medals (26) as well as the highest total number of medals (99).

AWARDS

Notably, the Executive Governor, His Excellency, Otunba Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala created an enabling environment for the athletes as they were well motivated with cash awards to all the medalists in the Gold, Silver and Bronze categories at N300,000.00, N200,000.00 and N100,000.00 respectively.

In the same vein, an "on-the-spot" Cash Award of N10,000.00 for Gold, N5,000.00 for Silver and N2,000.00 for Bronze medals won by the Athletes was presented to the recipients immediately after winning their sports.



Amateur Football Activities

Youth Sports Federation of Nigeria Tournament (YSFON)

The Oyo State Non Division Amateur U-14 Football Club represented the State at the Youth Sports Federation of Nigeria Tournament held in Minna, Niger State. The Male Team came first while the Female Team came second. The Female Team has also qualified for the Professional League.

State Football Clubs

Shooting Stars Sports Club (3SC) and Crown Football Club, Ogbomoso

The State Government has continuously released promptly the running costs of these Football Clubs which has alleviated problems of funding. This has gone a long way in enhancing the successful participation of the teams in the Nigeria Nation Leagues.

Sports Facilities

Distribution of Sports Equipment to 33 Secondary Schools in the State

To promote the game of tennis among the Secondary Schools in the State, the sum of N6 million was expended on the procurement of Table Tennis and its Accessories and distributed to 33 Secondary Schools in the State.

Construction of Swimming Pool at Lekan Salami Sports Complex, Adamasingba, Ibadan

In an attempt to complete the complimenting Sports Facilities in Lekan Salami Sports Complex the sum of N113 Million is being spent on the execution of the on-going project-construction of an Olympic Standard Swimming Pool.

Sport Administration

In order to facilitate the outstanding performance of the State at Zonal, National and International Sporting competitions, this administration appointed 120 athletes and 40 coaches on contract basis.

ESTABLISHMENTS, TRAINING AND POVERTY ALLEVIATION

Resolution of strike action embarked upon by the Labour Union between June and September, 2007.

A sum of N50,000.00 was donated to the National Industrial Safety Council, Oyo State Branch;

The Department of Public Administration and Local Government Studies of Simeon Adebayo Staff Development Centre has been affiliated to the Continuing Education Centre of the Polytechnic, Ibadan.

The State Government released a sum of N31million to procure 500 motorcycles which were sold to members of the public at a highly subsidized rate of N48,050.00.

Unemployed graduates were trained on Small Agro-Allied Business Ventures in various fields of Agriculture. Participants were motivated with an interest free loan of N30,000.00. This cost the State Government N5million.

Release of N16million for purchase of starter packs for 2007 and 2008 graduands of the six Skill Acquisition Centres.

Provision of 500 jobs in the Telecommunication Industry. The State Government released a sum of N26million for purchase of 500 orange boxes equipment which were distributed to the unemployed youths at a subsidized rate of N26,000.00.

1,000 unemployed artisans were trained in various vocational courses. This cost the State Government a sum of N37million.

A total of 1,492 retirees have collected their retirement benefits and this has cost the State Government a colossal amount of N1,519,969,437.44.

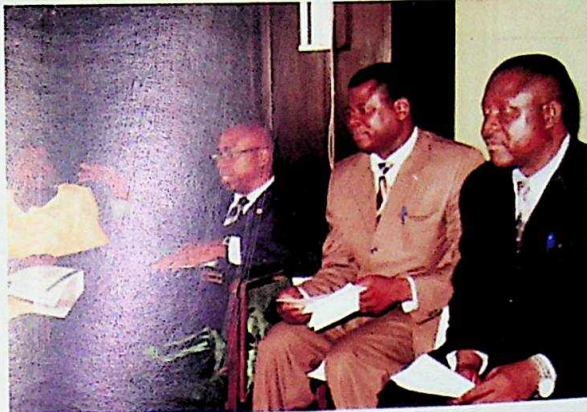
A total of N7,205,000.00 was expended on pre-retirement training with 406 beneficiaries.

The State Government has assisted over 1,205 students to secure placement for their students Industrial Attachment Programme.

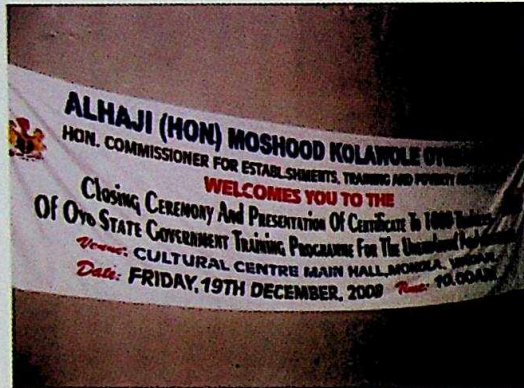

FROM THE DESK OF HEAD OF SERVICE OF OYO STATE, OVERSEER (DR) E.O. OKEBUKOLA (JP)

HOW THE OFFICE OF HEAD OF SERVICE HAS TRANSFORMED OYO STATE CIVIL SERVICE

The Office of the Head of Civil Service of Oyo State is a statutory agency of government saddled with the responsibility of:-

- (i) Providing leadership and direction to the Civil Service by Maintaining high morale, *esprit de corps* and good image of the Officers.
- (ii) Fostering professionalism among Civil Servants.
- (iii) Advising the Governor on the appointment and deployment of Permanent Secretaries.
- (iv) Career development of all Senior Management Staff.
- (v) Handling every Establishment matters of the Civil Service.
- (vi) Providing Management Service to the Civil Service.
- (vii) Serving as member of the State Executive Council.
- (viii) Co-ordinating industrial relations of the Civil service.
- (ix) Active participation at the National Council on Establishments.
- (x) Providing staff for newly established ad-hoc bodies.
- (xi) Liaison with Federal and State Heads of Civil Service.
- (xii) Overseeing Promotion and acting appointments in the Administrative Officer Cadre, and in the Senior Management Posts, that is, posts attracting salaries GL.13 and above.
- (xiii) Discipline of Administrative Officers and Officers in the Senior Management posts.
- (xiv) Treating of petitions within and outside the Civil Service
- (xv) Provision of general Management Services.
- (xvi) Maintenance of adequate personnel records.
- (xvii) Granting of permission to any Public Officer wishing to Travel overseas.
- (xviii) Provision of general welfare services.
- (xix) Making proposals for overseas and local training of Civil/Public Servants.

2. Since its resuscitation in June 1999 following the emergence of a new democratic era in the Country, the Office of the Head of Civil Service of Oyo State has been very active, dynamic and effective in carrying out all the aforementioned



statutory responsibilities and other duties that are assigned from time to time by the Chief Executive of the State. The tempo of achievements of this office however assumed a momentous and unprecedented dimension within the last two years. A lot of innovations were introduced that spurred Oyo State Civil Service to its present enviable status. Some of the innovations include:-

(i) **Training and Capacity Building of Civil and Public Servants in the State.**

Access to relevant information is considered to be a vital ingredient of transformation. It is against this backdrop that the Office of the Head of Service took a bold step to resuscitate regular training and re-training of Civil and Public Servants. Between June 2007 and May 2009, over 9,000 Civil and Public Servants across junior, middle level and Senior Management grades have been sponsored by the State Government to attend both local and overseas training programmes. Teachers in the Primary and Post Primary Institutions were not left out in the training programme. Labour leaders were also sponsored to attend a training programme in Industrial Relations in South Africa. This was done with a view to making them well-informed, sharpen their skills and broaden their horizon for effective service delivery. The impact of these training programmes has been conspicuously noticed in the attitude and productivity of workers in the State.

(ii) **Internally Generated Revenue:**

As a proactive leader, the Head of service led the vanguard for aggressive Internally Generated Revenue (IGR) drive campaign. Even before the current global economic melt-down, he had foreseen a time when revenue from crude oil will drastically reduce or not forthcoming at all. In order for the State to overcome such imminent problem and become self-reliant in payment of salaries and allowances and prosecution of capital projects, an EXCO Committee on revenue generation was constituted under the Chairmanship of the Head of Service. In the same vein, a Revenue Generation committee was set up in all Agencies of Government under the Chairmanship of the Permanent Secretaries. Through this aggressive revenue drive, the State Internally Generated Revenue (IGR) has increased significantly. For instance the State IGR in 2007 was N5,988,883,569.46 per annum. However, as at February 2009, the State realized the sum of N1,599,527,917.62 as IGR. Our target is to reach N3 billion on the short run so that salaries and allowances and pension of officers could be paid from IGR. In other words we should not be dependent on Federation Allocation to pay workers salaries on the long run.

(iii) **Re-orientation and re-branding of Civil and Public Servants.**

Having noticed the non-challant attitude of some Civil and Public Servants in the way



they dress to work and outside workplace, the Office of the Head of Service issued a circular that prohibited indecent dressing by Civil and Public Servants either in the work place or outside workplace when on assignment. Since the issuance of this circular on dress code, all Civil and Public Servants across various grades in Oyo state Civil and Public Service now dress in corporate manner that portrays the pace-setting status of Oyo State. In addition, Civil and Public Servants report punctually for work and stay at their desks courtesy of a circular on movement of officers within and outside the State Civil Service.

Besides, attitude of Civil and Public Servants to service delivery has changed considerably. They now discharge their duties in a timely, honest, fair and transparent manner.

(iv) **Institutionalization of e-government in Oyo State**

Towards institutionalizing e-government in Oyo State, the Office of the Head of Service midwived the Oyo State Government Assisted Personal Computer Purchase Scheme (GAPP), an offshoot of Computer For All Nigerians Initiative (CANi) whereby Civil and Public Servants were assisted by the State Government to procure personal computers of various configurations through instalmental payment. The first 250 beneficiaries of the Scheme were assisted with 50% subsidy on the prices of computer purchased. Apart from increasing computer literacy rate of Civil and Public Servants, the Oyo GAPP provides solid foundation for the recently installed internet facilities in all Ministries and Agencies in the State as part of efforts towards attainment of e-government and paperless office in the State Civil and Public Service.

(v) **General Worker's Welfare:**

Apart from prompt payment of salaries and allowances, the State Government has approved the new vehicle acquisition programme facilitated by the Trade Unions Congress (TUC) Oyo State Council with a view to assisting senior civil servants to own personal brand new cars without collateral security. In the same vein, junior workers were also assisted to procure new motorcycles without collateral security or down payment. With this logistic assistance, mobility and transportation problems confronting workers in the State has been reduced to the bearest minimum. The two schemes were approved by the State Government in view of the positive disposition of the Office of the Head of Service to the schemes.

(vi) **Building of new office of the Head of Service Complex:**

The foundation of a new complex for Office of the Head of Service was laid by the Governor on 18th March, 2009. The building situated at the back of the Governor's Office Complex is unique and a significant landmark in the history of Oyo State Civil Service as Oyo State is reputed to be the first State in the Federation that will have such a separate office Complex for Head of Service apart from Office of the Head of



Service of the Federation.

(vii) Promotion Examinations and Examinations for appointment of Permanent Secretaries.

Through the efforts of the Office of the Head of Service the State Government adopted a policy on promotion examination for all Civil and Public Servants in the State. The Policy took effect with the outstanding 2006 promotion exercise. In a related development, Officers aspiring to become Permanent Secretaries now write examinations and attend oral interview, before their appointment. This is done with a view to ensuring that only competent and brilliant officers are appointed to the enviable position of Permanent Secretaries in the State Public Service. The situation is the same for officers aspiring to attain the position of Heads of Non-Ministerial Departments in the State.

3. Without any doubt, with this catalogue of innovations, the Office of the Head of Service of Oyo State has really transformed Oyo State Civil and Public Service and restored its enviable status of Number Civil service in the Federation.

4. I want to express my profound appreciation to His Excellency, Otunba (Dr) Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala for the visionary and focused direction he has given the Civil Service. We appreciate his love for Civil/Public Servants. I congratulate him on the successful completion of 2 years in Office as Governor of Oyo State. I wish him more success in years ahead.

5. In conclusion, I want to thank all workers of honour i.e the Legislature, Executive and Judiciary for job well done at this period especially for making the welfare of the staff working in all Arms of Government a priority on their plan. Your pens will never grow dry. Our IGR will continue to climb. Let us all work harder to make Oyo State to continue to set the Pace in all good things in the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

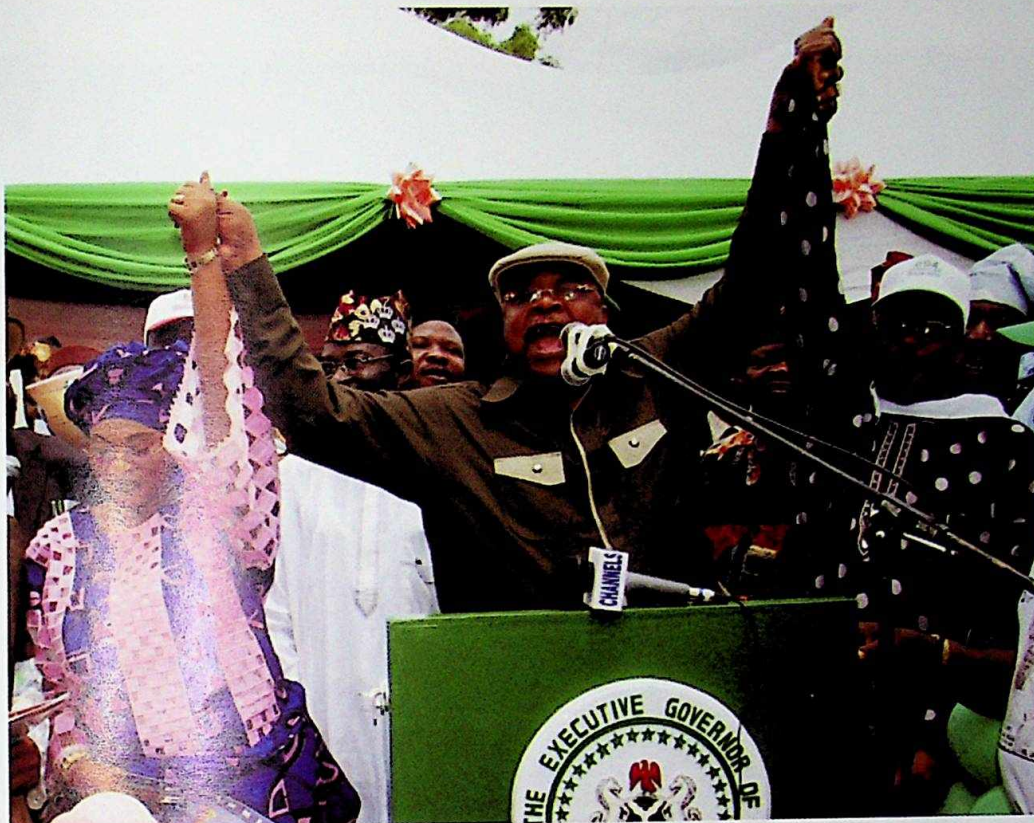

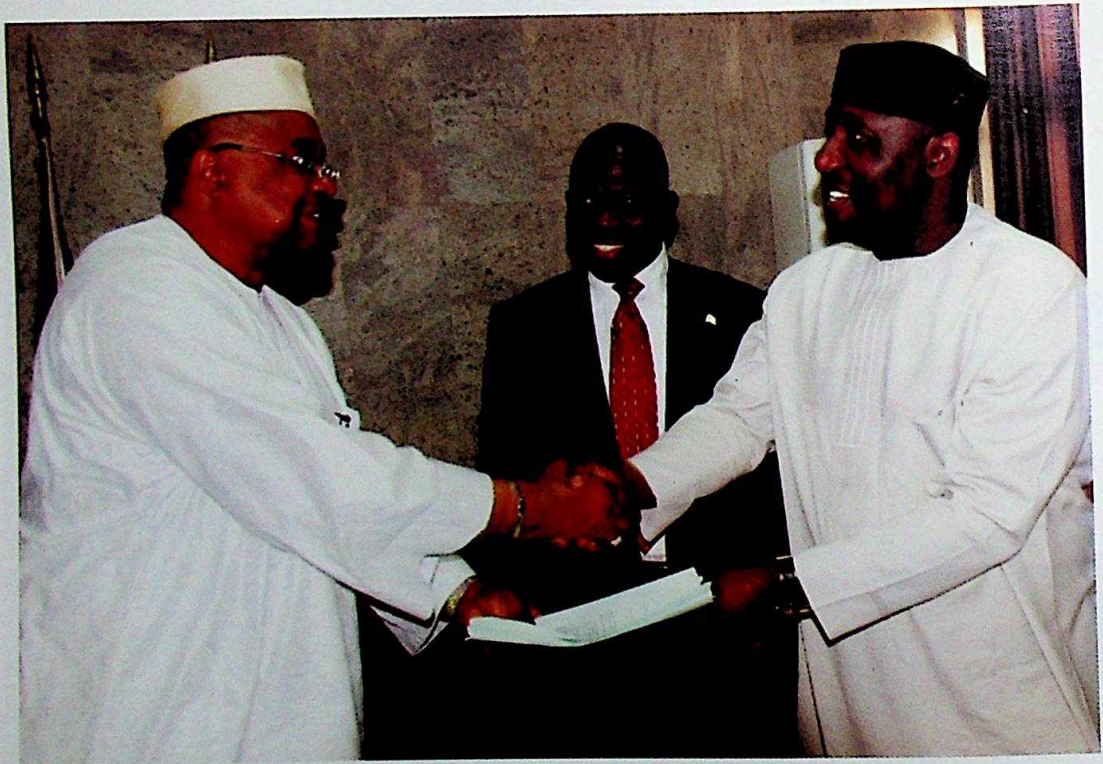

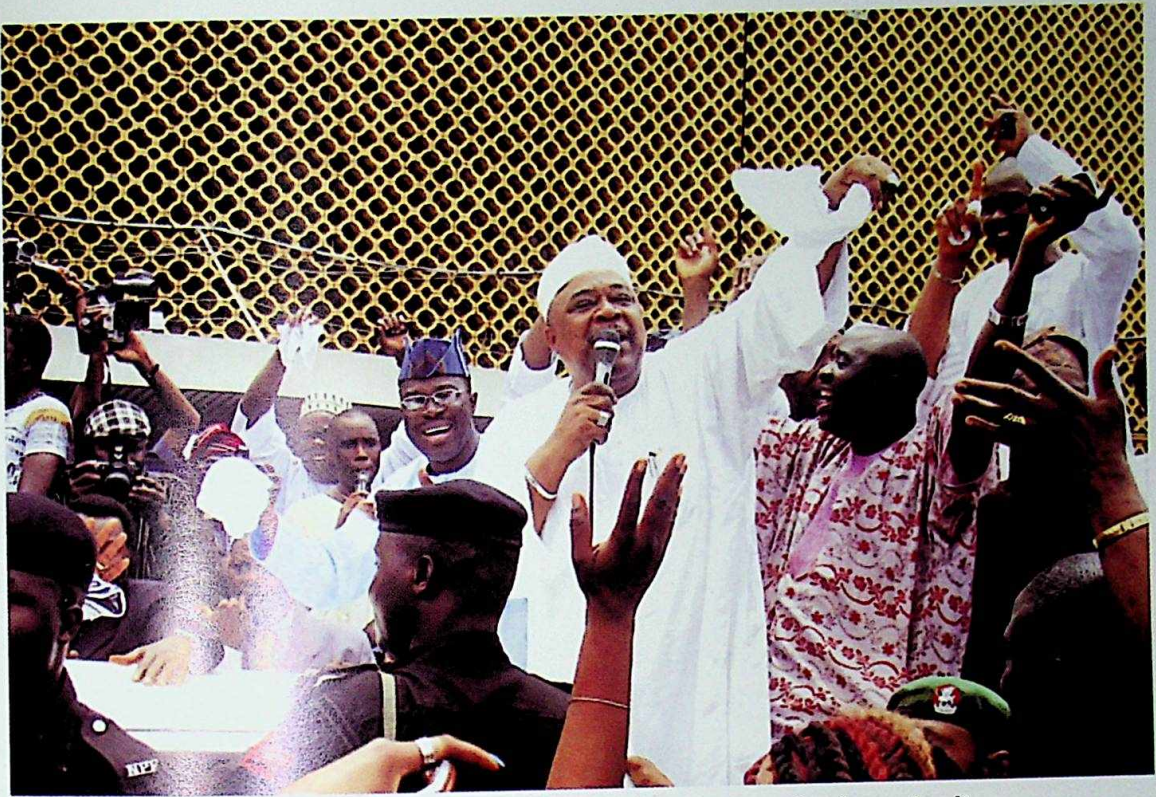

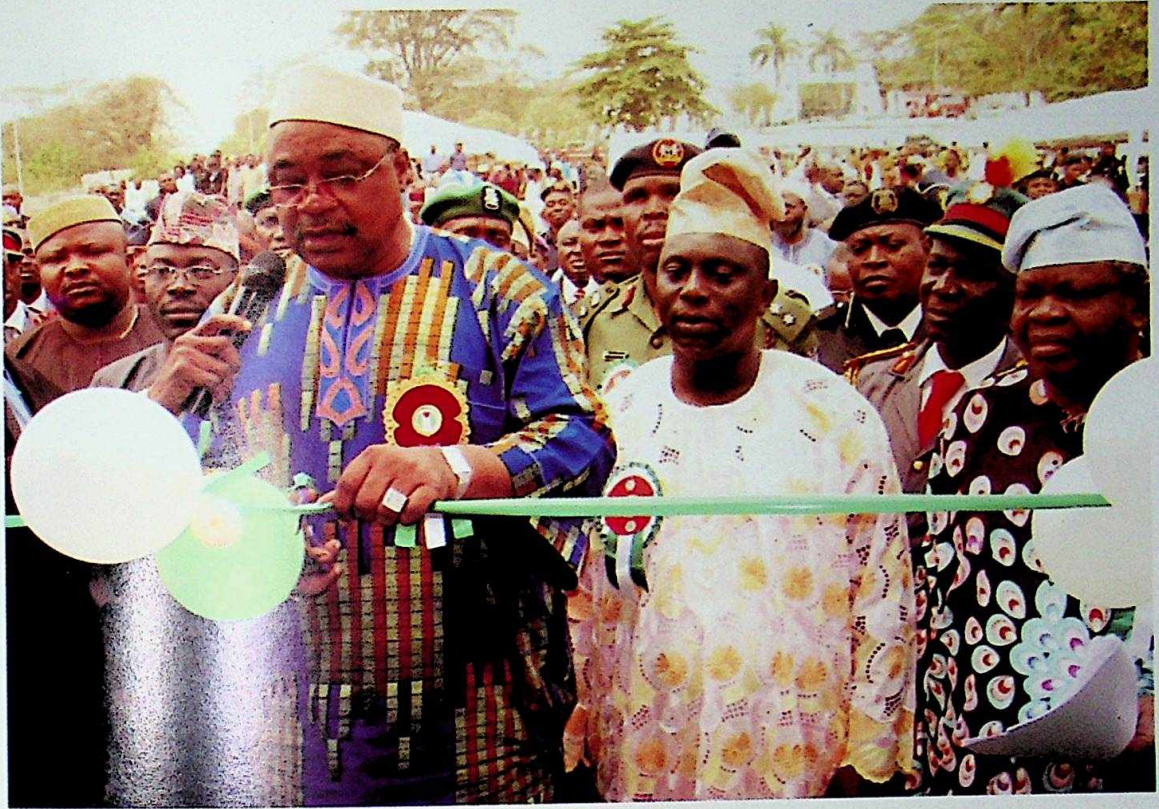

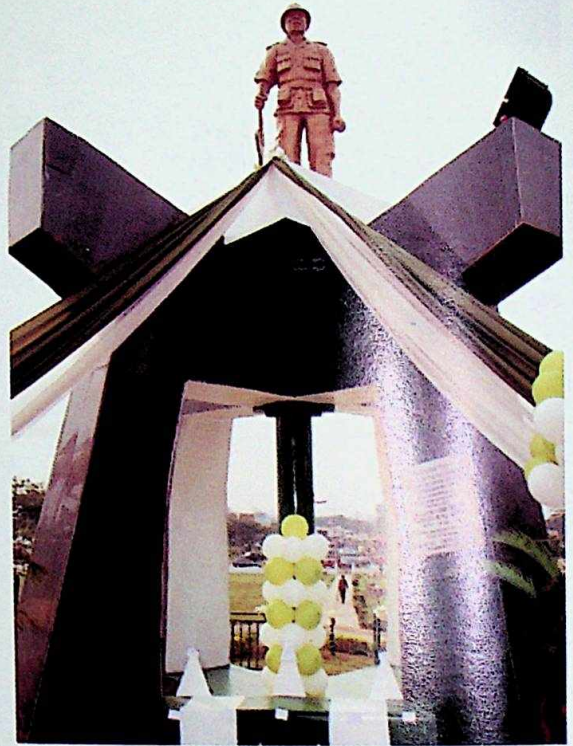

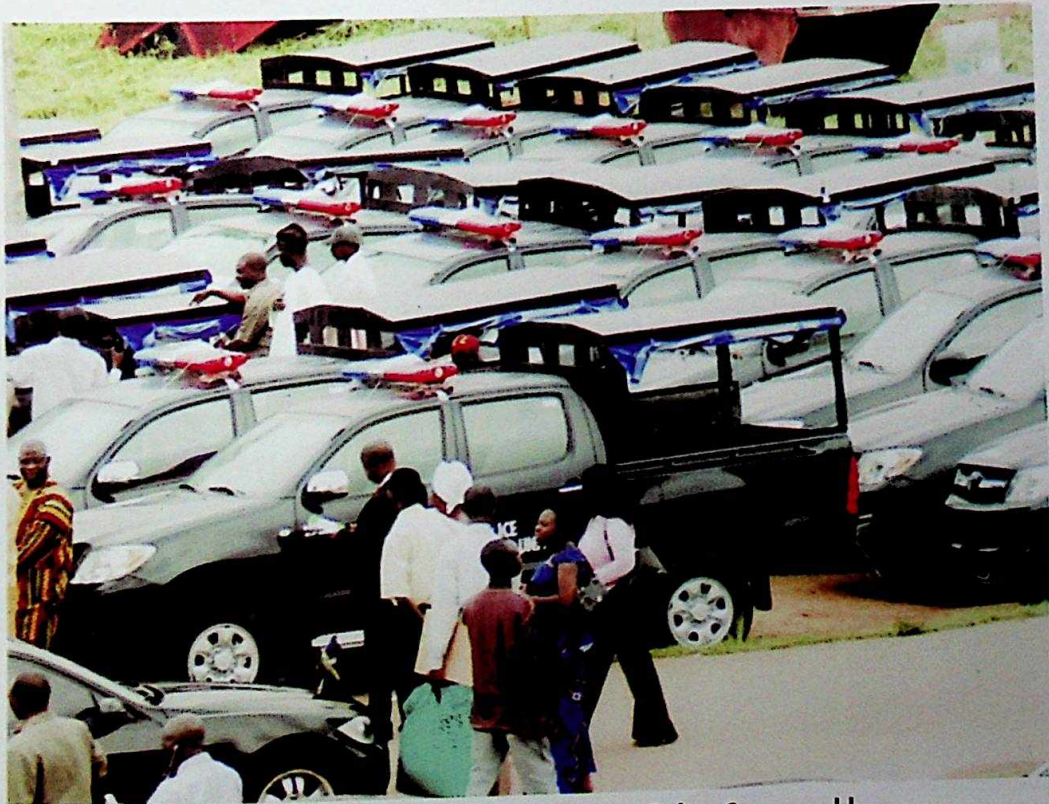

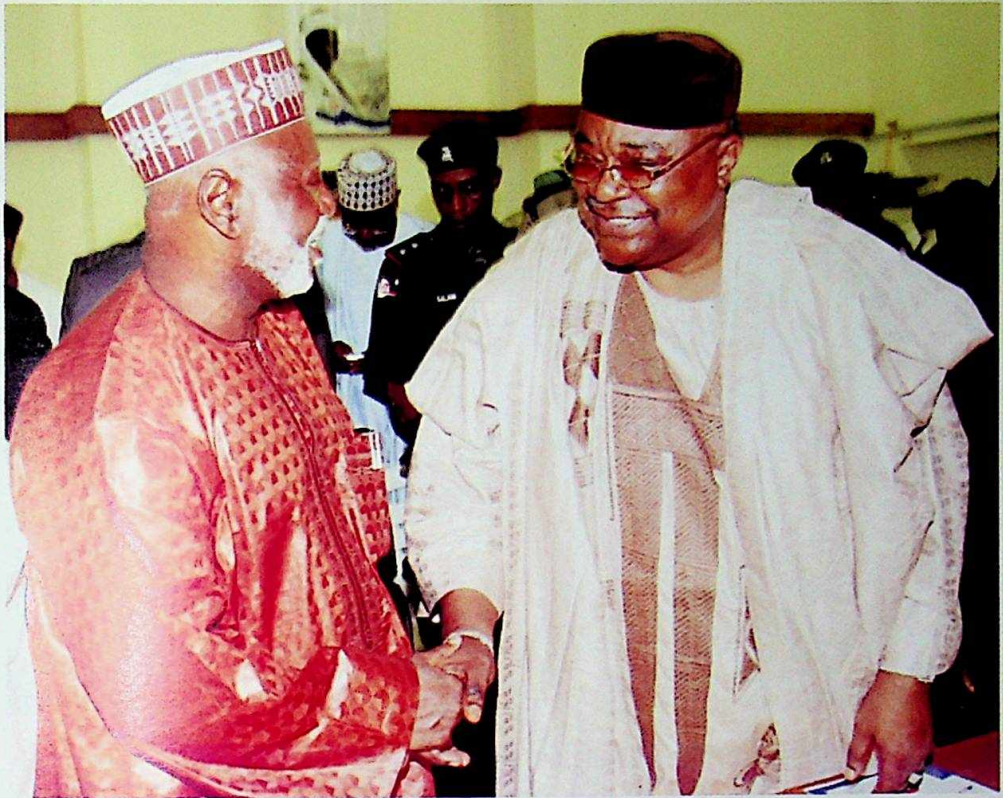

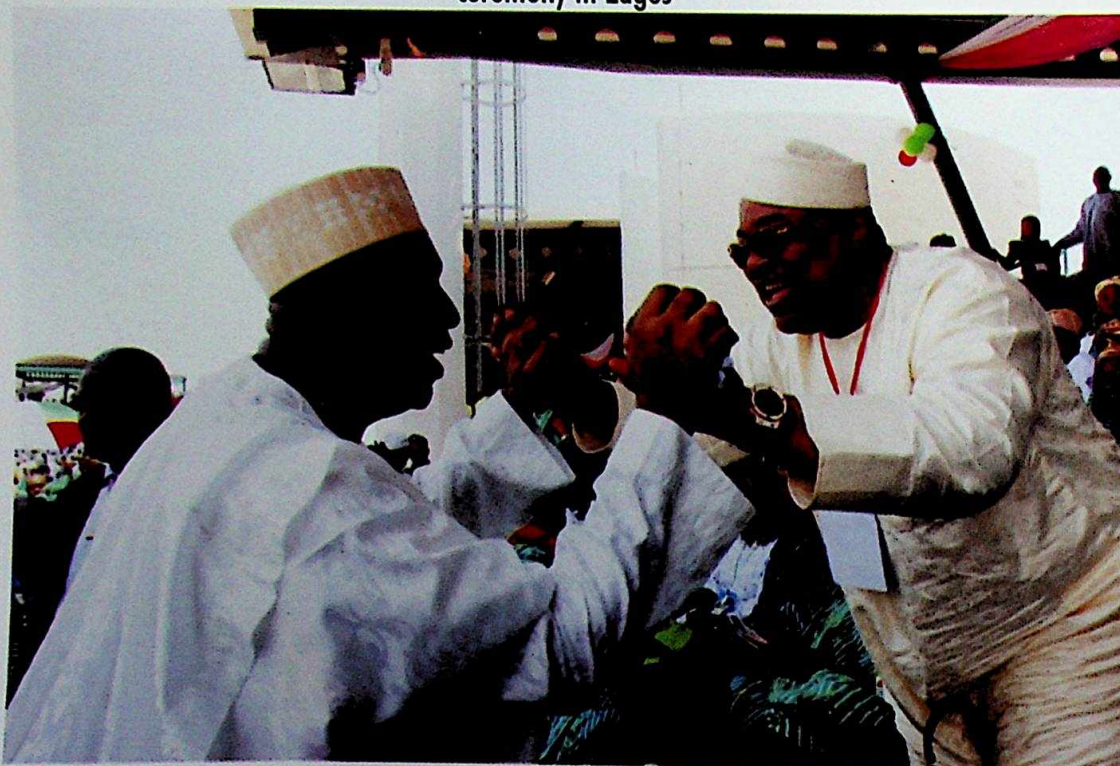

TRAIL BLAZING EFFORTS OF COMMUNITY LINK ADVANCEMENT PROGRAMME (CLAP) IN OYO STATE

Community Link Advancement Programme (CLAP) is a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO), founded by Chief (Mrs.) Oluwakemi Alao-Akala, the wife of the Executive Governor of Oyo State. It is a one Local Government, one product project, with a focus to provide solution to the problems confronting the people of Oyo State in the rural areas.

The mission of this people-centered NGO is to focus on sustainable poverty reduction schemes through agricultural development, financial empowerment, particularly soft loans, to deserving individuals or groups; sustainable potable water supply, environmental protection and educational development driven by CLAP's support of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and the Seven-Point Agenda of the Federal Government of Nigeria.

Community Link Advancement Programme (CLAP) since its formation in 2006 has amazed people in Oyo State with the trail blazing efforts of the Founder, Chief (Mrs) Oluwakemi Alao-Akala. The NGO was formally unveiled in 2007.

According to Chief (Mrs.) Alao-Akala, CLAP was founded in response to the myriad of needs and lack that abound among the majority of the people in the State; with the aim and objective to have a coordinated and effective intervention programme to provide succor to the helpless, particularly women and children.

So far, CLAP has brought joy and delight into many lives in Oyo State, especially with its unique innovation of "an area, a product" approach to meeting the needs of the less privileged in all the nooks and crannies of the State. This is in addition to its help and assistance to individuals and groups. The direct and prompt intervention strategy of CLAP at taking products directly to those in need of them, where they reside and live is an important strategy of inestimable value to the people in the State. The delay and pilfering that often occur in the case of using middle organization or asking beneficiaries for much formalities are off the way.

Significant to mention here are landmark activities that CLAP has carried out within its short period of existence - feats unequalled by contemporaries in the history of the State. CLAP is living after the maxim of the State by "setting pace" for others to follow. Some of these achievements include:

- (i) Provision of N5 million revolving loan for financial empowerment of women traders in Ogbomosoland, made up of five local governments of Ogbomoso North, Ogbomoso South, Surulere, Oriire and Ogo Oluwa;
- (ii) Empowerment of women farmers in Iwajowa Local Government through establishment of dynamic and cohesive cooperative groups and providing the groups with revolving loans for the benefit of their community;

- (iii) Disbursement of soft and interest free loans to 175 women under cooperative societies in Atisbo Local Government to encourage entrepreneurial activities in the area;
- (iv) Promotion and enhancement of eco-system by cultivating a 10-hectare teak plantation at Saki West in collaboration with BATN;
- (v) An integrated milling centre at Ayete in Ibarapa North to assist farmers with their agricultural produce;
- (vi) Animal husbandry in collaboration with BATN Foundation;
- (vii) Distribution of drugs in collaboration with Fidson Pharmaceutical Company to pregnant women, nursing mothers and children round the State free of charge;
- (viii) Empowerment of over 60 people living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA) in Ibadan South East Local Government to make them self reliant and contribute to the society;
- (ix) Construction of a Vocational Training Centre at Oluyole Lcal Government in collaboration with BATN Foundation;
- (x) Training and distribution of Orange box recharge cards producing machines to people in Ibadan municipality;
- (xi) Visits to prisons and charitable homes with gifts items such as foodstuff, cash, walking sticks, wheelchairs, crutches, computers and television etc.
- (xii) Adoption of a family that was homeless. The family was provided with a two- bedroom accommodation and the children registered in a school while the man and wife have been provided with jobs;
- (xiii) Donation of a 16-seater school bus to Police Officers Wives Association (POWA).



To motivate and empower women into acquiring skills that will help them and their children to be self reliant or employed, is not the only concern of CLAP. The Founder, Chief (Mrs) Oluwakemi Alao-Akala is also concerned and interested in the health challenges of the mother and child. She has also demonstrated her care and concern in so many instances and at different occasions by reaching out to them.



For instance, Felicia was moved from Mokola roundabout where she was lying unconscious to UCH, suffering from prolapse of the vagina and manic depression. Treatment lasted six months with Her Excellency regularly visiting the patient. After her discharge at UCH, Her Excellency still caters for her, and has provided a house and job for her.

- CLAP has been taking care of a boy (Segun Ojo) with a hole in the heart since 2006 when he was only 1 year old. He will be going back this month of May for the main surgery in Ghana;



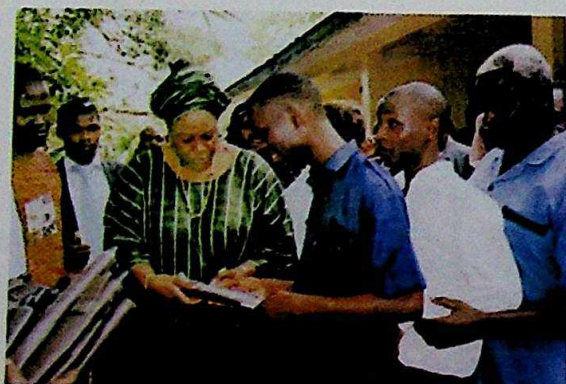
- Three and half year old, Sukura was assisted for eye cancer operation. After which Mrs Akala gave financial assistance to help the mother rent a shop and equip her saloon to help the family;

- Another young girl with bad case of bow-leg was also assisted with surgery;

- Assistance for surgery was again given to a girl without anus;

- Visit to prison led to CLAP's payment of fines and release of affected inmates;

- Oyo State was the first to launch NAWOCA on the 27th October, 2007 by the First Lady of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Hajiya Turai Musa Yar'Adua;





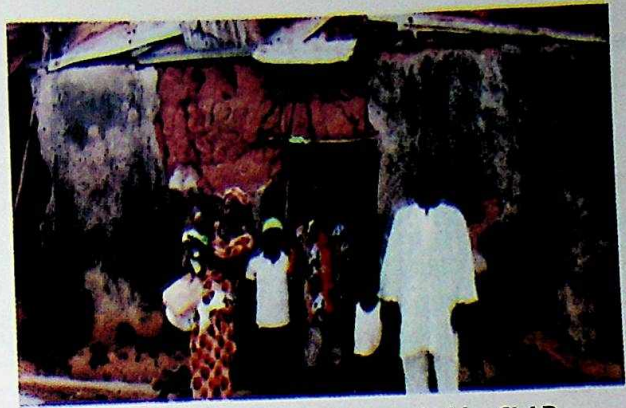

- The State was also the first to launch NAWOCA at the local government level. An event flagged off at Oorelope local government and has covered the 33 local government areas in the State;

- December 1, 2008 the World Aids Day saw Her Excellency marching round the city of Ibadan in a campaign rally against the scourge. CLAP is also committed to the eradication of water borne diseases and provision of safe portable water to communities in critical need of it. Children were not left out in its programme to reach out to all the people in the State. Consequently, a holiday workshop was organized for children from all the 33 local government areas of the State.

CLAP is an independent charitable organization, non-governmental and non-political, with a dual mission of care and support; and, in the words of its Founder, Chief (Mrs.) Oluwakemi Alao-Akala, "Its main focus is to fulfill unmet needs by caring, providing and creating opportunities for people so that they can enjoy more productive and meaningful lives."

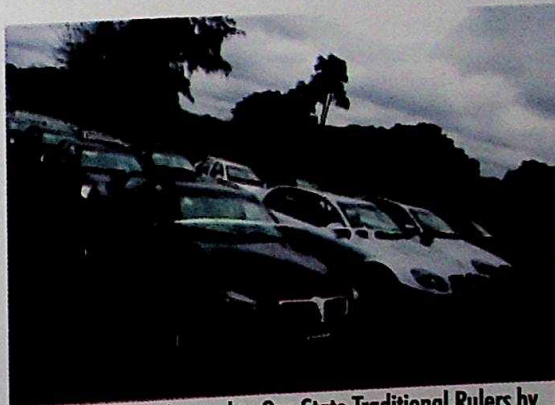

ALAO-AKALA HAS SURPASSED HIS IMMEDIATE PREDECESSORS

OMOLOLU OLUNLOYO

The second year anniversary of the present innovative and humane administration of Governor Bayo Alao-Akala is a convenient point at which to assess, openly appreciate as well as constructively criticize his overall leadership style. We should also focus on his many achievements and perhaps highlight a couple of perceived shortcomings, as no man is perfect.

One should ask: where have we been coming from? Where are we, and where are we heading for in Oyo State? We have just emerged from a long self-inflicted turmoil that virtually tore the state apart between 2003 and 2006. The fall-out of this lingered until the 2007 election and the consequent rash of litigations. We are now in calmer seas of post-tribunal, post Court of Appeal bliss.

Let us start from the man. Propaganda must be strictly avoided here. In my own personal view, Adebayo Alao-Akala has turned out, before our very eyes, as a veritable man of destiny. His steps to power appear fore-ordained. He does not cut a figure of the typical politician driven by AMBITION and power-mongering through wheeling, dealing and contriving. God seems to have reserved him a place from which to benefit from the excesses and inadvertent errors of others. He is not an Ogbomoso Governor or Ogbomoso-sponsored Governor. He is a Governor who happened to hail from Ogbomoso, both Diaspora and home! He is at home and at peace with people everywhere.

One political point needs explanation. His former immediate boss, Governor Ladoja, was sworn in by Chief Judge Lakanmi. Both top Executive and top Judiciary positions were held by Ibadan. Despite advice, private and public as well as warnings from some of us, Ladoja, in a very clumsy way, chucked out Lakanmi. Ladoja himself also got clumsily chucked out by Adedibu, who found powerful allies to assist him. The two deputies, Akala and Adeniran, came on the scene not through their private designs or conspiracy but sheer constitutional consequences of excesses traceable to Ibadan in the first place.

Adebayo Alao-Akala is a grassroots man with experience as a teacher, a police officer and Local Government Chairman before becoming Deputy Governor. There are four phases of Akala's romance with Governorship; exactly as Archbishop Akinfenwa explicated this at a thanksgiving service at Molete Baptist Church recently:

Phase I: He was de-facto (but eventually not de Jure) Governor of Oyo State for 11 months between January 2006 and December 2006. He reverted to Deputy Governor but clinched the Governorship ticket.



- Phase II: He became Governor again after the election of 2007 which was immediately legally challenged. He thus became Governor on trial.
- Phase III: He won the Tribunal case and continued as Governor-on-trial.
- Phase IV: He finally won at the Court of Appeal on March 17, 2009. The coast became clear. He became substantive confirmed Governor and no longer challenged. This is the point at which we are now.
- Phase V: The next phase would come if he attempts the almost jinxed second term.

What comes next would depend on the evaluation of his cumulative activities so far. He has shown himself at the spiritual level, as a man of God. He certainly knows, only too well, that, 'The Lord is A Man of War' (Ex. 15:3). As man in society, Bayo is often an exultant extrovert, man of the world, man for all seasons who believes in Live-and-Let-Live. He surpassed his immediate predecessors in his humanity to all and sundry. Some criticize him for applying his Baptist-derived values to opponents whom he knows only too well to be fiendish, selfish and destructive despite all the clear warnings of Nicollo Machiavelli. These then are the principles which guide his administration. He seems to believe and quite rightly too, in the provision of enhanced facilities for the common man.

Oyo State is a pace-setter. It began as a pace-setter in diverse fields as the one containing Ibadan, famous headquarters of the Western Region of Nigeria, where Awolowo first and then Adesoji Aderemi, Ladoke Akintola and Odeleye Fadahunsi in turn held sway. We were undisputed pace-setters in Education, Local Government Reform as conspicuously as we progressively got somewhat weak in the economic sector. Awolowo tried in Agriculture and industry for his time.

Akala has revved education in Oyo State in various ways too numerous to mention. Through the innovation of the Public-private Partnership concept, PPP, he has tackled problems in transportation, power and energy, Agriculture and industry. He has initiated very serious moves around infrastructural needs like water, road networks in both rural and urban centres. He is making discernible valiant moves to upgrade the health system through the Hospital refurbishment and new construction. Environmental problems have become terribly serious in the large cities like Ibadan. A lot is being done but very much more will have to be done now and in the future.

Like in the rest of the country, where the battle with the hydra-headed monster called corruption seems rather on the wane (the President thinks not), I cannot say. Oyo State has distinguished itself from the entire pack. The Department of Due Process is in capable and physically intimidating hands but yet has to be fortified to be pro-active. There are many departments of government I cannot touch except in passing like his team's often adroit handling of Trade Unions, NLC, NUT, etc, but in which the government still needs more flexible and gentle negotiators. More friends




are needed for the jobs at hand and those of the future! These unions have automatic networks of their own, teachers, Local Government staff, workers generally, in public and private sectors. I would rather have such men as my friends.

The only Achilles heel that I must mention and advise Akala specifically about is the dangerous zone of Local Government and Chieftaincy matters. He should heed my advice as should his principal officers, advisers, official and private. The performance of the Akala Government, like that of all his last four predecessors, is rather very uneven in this domain. The danger is that there are too many petty disputes generated by the high and mighty as well as low-level chiefs for example, often based on ego or ignorance.

Local Governments-State Government relation is not good enough and this could be very costly. The administration will do very well for itself and its Numero Uno, Bayo, if they go defensive but firm. They should dodge all those matters of chieftaincy reforms, the whole lot. They should let sleeping dogs lie. That is, without question what, a wise man should do with a rabid dog. Chieftaincy matters used to account for as much as two-thirds of the Exco memos in the early seventies. Chieftain rivalries, pettiness, complaints and excessive but avoidable, exist in and around the Ogbomoso conglomerate, Oyo Alafin and Ibadanland. I am shocked by the degree of misunderstanding based on ignorance of the extant laws and their origin and history. Both sides are to blame.

Finally, having reached a steady-state in his journey, it behoves the Governor to refurbish the profile of his administration, balance the intra-ethnic factors which appear unduly tilted and easy victims of ill-motivated critics. The Governor and a few key friends are already engaged with smoothening relations with local elite, pressure groups, masses, paramount Obas and Chiefs. Alao-Akala has definitely been a better crisis-manager than his predecessor. With his open-door policy, a no-victor, no-vanquished stance, he only needs to tighten up by adopting a specific agenda for the vital two years whether or not he chooses in future to remain in governance or even quit politics altogether.

He should never take his home base Ogbomoso for granted. That would be mere overconfidence and potentially fatal. His legacy will be defined and assured henceforth depending on what he does or avoids. I send him my sincere congratulations for his part played so well, so far. God bless Akala. God bless Oyo State, God bless Nigeria.

Farm Settlement: More farm settlements should be established in the state. This will enable the state to capture young farmers that are lacking now. It will also ameliorate unemployment.

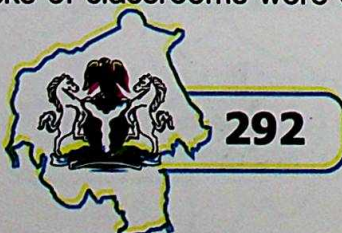

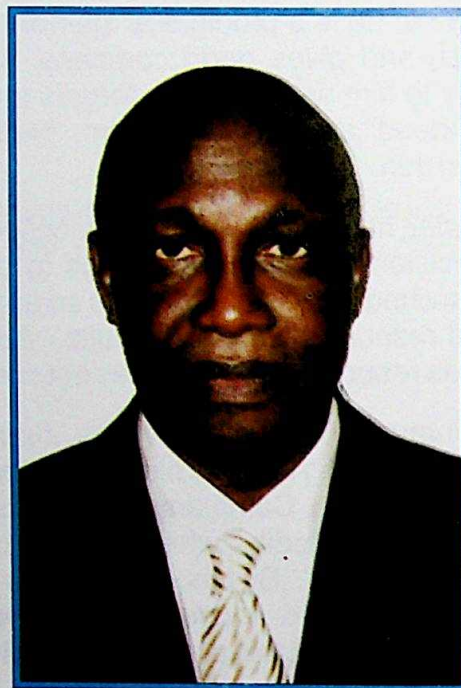


