



SECTION 1

OBSERVATION

EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

This section sheds light on the distribution of Public Educational Institutions in the state during the 2008/2009 academic session. It reveals the position of various levels of public educational facilities available in the State. The table shows the distribution of public educational institutions at different level across the State on Local Government basis.

According to the table, Public Primary Educational Institution is revealed to have a total number of 2116 schools, Akinyele Local Government maintains the highest number of schools with 112 while Ogbomoso North and South Local Government Areas had least figure of 24 schools each.

There are 32 Nomadic Primary Schools in 2008/2009 session which had its operations limited to only 10 certain Local Government Areas in the state for logistic reason. It is also discovered that Nomadic activities are more concentrated in Itesiwaju Local Government with 7 schools in operation while Oorelope Local Government recorded the least number with only one school in operation.

The table further highlighted the position of secondary schools with a number of 1006, bringing into the light Ibadan North Local Government having the highest number of 86 schools while Irepo Local Government had the least of 9 schools. It further revealed that school of science maintained 7 schools spread over seven Local Government Areas in the State while same goes for Technical Colleges where 5 Schools were featured. Colleges of Education and schools of Agriculture were also featured in the arrangement with the establishment of one school each located in Oyo West and Ibarapa Central Local Government respectively. The State has 2 Public Universities located in Ibadan North and Ogbomoso South Local Government Areas.

SECTION 2

OBSERVATION

ENROLMENTS

This section highlighted enrolment in the formal and Non-formal educational institutions during 2008/2009 academic session.

Table 2.1 gives actual enrolment in the State public primary schools on Local Government basis, it shows 151, 721 enrolment in primary one which gradually decreases from class to class to 140265 pupils in primary six enrolment and further stressed Ibadan North local Government leading in the enrolment table among others with 48604 pupils while Ibarapa East recorded the least enrolment with 16,150 pupils. It is interesting to observe that an insignificant gender difference was recorded in favour of female which depicted enrolment of 49% male 51% female.

Table 2.2 focuses on enrolment in Private junior secondary schools. It also specifies number of registered private junior secondary schools in different Local Government of the State. We have a total enrolment of 22745 students with gender break of 11384 male and 11361 female. In this arrangement Ogbomoso south had the highest number 2521 enrolment as well as highest number of 18 registered Private junior secondary schools. It is curious to find Oluyole Local Government recording the least number of one private school with the least enrolment of 7 students but Atisbo and Itesiawaju Local Government having no registered private secondary school as this might be connected with locality. There were no enrolment gender disparities in this arrangement as the aggregate proportional value stands at 50% either side.

Table 2.3 features enrolment in public junior secondary schools in addition to the number of schools in different local government areas of the state. The table specifies 201609 students enrolled in the 597 existing junior secondary schools and further highlighted Ibadan North Local Government having highest number of 23993 enrolments as well as largest number of 61 schools while the least number of 4 schools goes to Olorunsogo Local Government. The enrolment classifications in this structure depicts a slight marginal gender differences which put the figure of male at 100443 or 49.82% and female at 101166 or 50.18%.

Table 2.4 captioned students enrolment in public senior secondary schools in the state by sex, class and Local Government. Under this facilities 409 schools were in place and the enrolment strength was 160116 with gender difference of 80680 male, 79436 female indicating a proportional representation of 50.39% and 49.61% respectively. It is also observed that Ibadan

South West Local Government had highest number of 28 senior secondary schools with total enrolment of 16554 students, but higher enrolment of 18233 students was discovered in Ibadan North Local Government with gender disparity of 8540 male, 9693 female despite lower number of 25 senior secondary schools being in place. Meanwhile Irepo Local Government recorded the least number of 3 senior secondary schools but marginally had higher number of 1262 enrolment compared with Olorunsogo Local Government which recorded 4 senior secondary schools with lower enrolment of 1203 students.

Table 2.5 measures students' enrolment in Government Technical Colleges by sex, programmes and locations. The table highlighted a total number of 2197 students enrolled during 2008/2009 academic session in which 1883 were male and 314 were female showing a proportional indication of 85.70% and 14.30% respectively. This portrays the programme as male oriented, and further supported by the enrolment structure in Ibadan and Ogbomoso centres of the programme where enrolment proportion close to 90% and above were recorded for male.

Table 2.6 gives an account of student's enrolment in School of Science by sex, class and location. Total enrolment summary for 2008/2009 was put at 6709 students which apportioned 3455 students to male and 3254 students to female indicating a proportional representation of 51.50% and 48.50% respectively. This impression is an encouragement in the gender competency of the programme, but the wide disparity in the enrolment at various location of the programme gives source for concern which has been traced to environmental factor which favours Wesley College and Alayande School of Science than any of the programme centres with enrolment capacity of 1596 and 1675 students respectively .

Table 2.7 enumerates enrolment in Adult literacy programme by type of programme and Local Government. During the 2008/2009 literacy session, the programme recorded an enrolment capacity of 3171 participants in 30 different Local Government Areas and AANFE Headquarters, there were no enrolment in three Local Government Areas. It is interesting to note that enrolment position favours female with 1772 participants or 55.88% and male 1399 or 44.12% Egbeda and Kajola are identified for showing more interest to the programme by their level of enrolment which stands at 191 each, a number higher than any other Local Government intakes.

Table 3.1 Contains information on the number of Teachers in Public Primary Schools by sex, qualification and local government during 2008/2009 academic session. It indicates a total number of 28,374 teachers serving in 2116 primary schools across the 33 Local Government Areas of the state with the gender break of 7878 male or 27.77% and 20496 female or 72.23%. This is a good indication of prominence of female in the teaching profession at this level of education. It is also observed that this level of teaching career features more NCE graduates than other category of certificate holders, for instance 23123 teachers were NCE holders representing a proportion of 81.49% while teachers holding degree were just 1456 representing a proportion of 5.13% in addition the highest number of 1820 teachers were also discovered assigning for Ibadan North Local Government with only 74 schools in place while Akinyele Local Government with the highest number of 122 schools in place has 1110 teachers. It is also discovered that Orrire Local Government coming behind Akinyele Local Government in terms of number of schools in place with 112 was discovered to have 641 teachers apportioned to it which might be connected with the locality issue.

Table 3.2 Provides information on the number teachers in Public Secondary Schools by sex, qualification and local government during 2008/2009 academic session. The table specifies a total number of 14131 teachers and also demonstrates gender equalities of 7001 male teachers or 50% and 7130 female teachers or 50% in the system. The classification of education background of the teaching staff in this system favours degree holders with 10765 teachers or 76.18% while NCE holders pull 3131 teachers indicating proportion of 22.12%.

Table 3.3 focuses on number of Non-Teaching Staff in the state secondary schools by sex and local government during 2008/2009 academic session. It indicates a total number of 4517 staff and equally records 2571 male staff or 56.92% and 1946 female staff or 43.08%. It further shows Ibadan North Local Government having largest number of non-teaching staff with 467 staff closely followed by Ibadan North East Local Government with 418 staff while Irepo Local Government had the least number of 25 staff.

Table 3.4 gives information on the number of Teachers in Public Primary and Secondary Schools during 2008/2009 Academic session.

It is observed that the two levels of education had a total number 42505 teachers during the 2008/2009 academic session in the state which further revealed Ibadan North Local

Government having the largest total number of 3624 teachers followed by Ibadan North East Local Government with 2964 teachers while Irepo Local Government recorded the least number of 490 teachers for both levels.

Table 3.5 contains information on the number of Teachers in Government Technical Colleges by sex, qualification and location. The table specifies 110 teachers employed to take charge of five different locations of the programme. Ibadan and Oyo programme centres had the highest number of 35 teachers each, while Iseyin location had the least number of 8 teachers. Different stratifications in the setting reflect larger number of male teachers, which is further proved by the total number of 110 teachers that produced 85 male teachers and 25 female teachers.

Table 3.6 gives accounts of the number of Teachers in School of Science by sex, qualification and school location during 2008/2009 academic session. There were 166 teachers in all seven centres of the college, 132 were male teachers while 34 were female teachers. The environment favours graduate with teaching qualification than their counterpart without teaching qualification while the former recorded 101 teachers or 60.83%, the latter had 54 teachers or 32.53%. It was also discovered that more teachers were allotted to PADE and Oyo School of Science with 41and 38 teachers respectively, while school of science Idere and Okeho had the least number of 14 teachers each, which might be responsible for logistic reason.

Table3.7 Enumerates number of teachers in adult literacy programme by sex and local government. All 33 local governments with the inclusion of AANFE headquarters had 89 teachers indicating 51 male and 38 female, three Local Government Afijio, Atiba and Oluyole did not parade any teacher in the light of zero enrolment taking place in their environment.

Table 3.8 gives accounts of the number of teachers in primary schools by sex and local government. The table shows that there were 11,625 teachers in all 33 local governments with the inclusion of AANFE headquarters. The highest number of 1,830 teachers were recorded in Lagos State, while the lowest number of 1,030 teachers were recorded in Osun State. The number of teachers per state ranged from 1,030 to 1,830.

Table 3.9 gives accounts of the number of teachers in secondary schools by sex and local government. The table shows that there were 11,625 teachers in all 33 local governments with the inclusion of AANFE headquarters. The highest number of 1,830 teachers were recorded in Lagos State, while the lowest number of 1,030 teachers were recorded in Osun State. The number of teachers per state ranged from 1,030 to 1,830.

SECTION 4

OBSERVATION

RATIO

This section measures number of pupils to a teacher and students to a teacher in public primary and secondary schools respectively. It also sheds light on student retention rate in public secondary schools during 2008/2009 academic session.

Table 4.1 Is on Pupils/Teacher ratio in Public Primary School during 2008/2009 Academic Session. The table shows an aggregate ratio of 36 pupils per Teacher in the State Public Primary Schools with individual ratio raging from 17 to 106. The variability in the ratio from one local government to the other could be traced to various factors with more emphasis on the environment, this is true of Irepo local government with highest ratio of 106:1 compared with Ibadan south west local government with the least ratio of 17:1.

Table 4.2 speaks on Students/Teacher ratio in public secondary schools during 2008/2009 academic session. It indicates an improved position of 26:1 in the aggregate ratio of students/teacher in the state public secondary school during 2008/2009 academic session.

Table 4.3 measures Students/Teacher ratio in the state Government Technical Colleges by location. The information reveals a significant level of consistency in the programme arrangement of Ibadan centres where students/teacher ratio was 32:1 which falls almost in line with government policy on education while unimpressive ratio as low as 5 and 1 were recorded for Saki and Ogbomoso centres respectively. Enrolment discovered in Iseyin and Oyo put students/teacher ratio at 22 and 23 respectively.

Table 4.4. Depicts information on Students/Teacher ratio in School of Science during 2008/2009 academic session. The table pointed Oyo and Okeho programme location conforming with the relative standard having recorded ratio 33:1 each, while the

location at Pade recorded as low as 18:1. Alayande School of Science, Ibadan is no exception for demonstrating its traditional peculiarities by featuring high ratio in this arrangement with 70:1 while Ogbomoso programme centre portrayed unusual ratio tendency of 74:1 which is traced to enrolment expansion. Meanwhile, the repressive impression shown by Wesley school of science put its ratio value at 42:1.

Table 4.5 gives measurement on retention rate in junior secondary schools during 2008/2009 academic session. It depicts retentive ability of the programme at the course duration on local government basis. The reflection on the table portrays high retention rate across the board, an indication showing more values to education at this level.
