2. 2009 - Embarked on serious design of waste Management at the State Capital. This project involved waste evacuation, desiltification of our drainages and establishment of a Standard land fill in preparation for our programme of waste to wealth. This programme has thus far consumed N155Million Naira.
3. The State Executive Council has just approved a pilot scheme of Afforestation to halt the advancement of desert encroachment.. We are waiting for the release of the money. It would cost N139 Million Naira

## THE ACTIVITIES OF THE MINISTRY OF LAND AND SURVEY FROM JANUARY 2008 TO DECEMBER, 2009.

### INTRODCUTION

The Ministry of Land and Survey was created on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2002 out of the former Ministry of Works and Housing. It has four (4) Departments namely; Administration, Land Services, Town Planning and Survey and Mapping. The four departments work together for the Management and control of land in the State.

### ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT

The Department is charged with the responsibility of training all staff to enhance job performance.

The Ministry spent the sum of Five Million, Five Hundred Thousand Naira only (₦5,500,000.00) on training of staff, including 50 who received training on Auto Card and on General Computer.

The Ministry spent Five Million Eight Hundred Thousand Naira (₦5,800.00) only on sponsoring staff to attend workshop/seminar and conferences. Payment of Four Hundred and Thirty Thousand, Five Hundred and Nineteen Naira (₦430,519.00) as tuition fees to staff was also made. Renovation and building of offices, purchase of 15KVA Generator, Installation of V-sat for Internet access.

### LAND SERVICES DEPARTMENT

**The Department has 6 main Sections:** These are mainly

- (a) Land Administration
- (b) LUAC (Land Use Allocation Committee) Secretariat
- (c) Deed Registry
- (d) Public Lands Acquisition
- (e) Revenue
- (f) Valuation
- (g) Owner Occupiers

#### **Land Administration Section:**

##### Conversion of Customary Title

The Ministry received 542 applications during the period under review for conversion of customary titles, out of this number the Ministry processed and conveyed 319 approvals while the rest are being processed. The 9 applications for conversion of customary titles are in increase due to the

fact that most Bank and Financial Institutions prefer statutory certificates of occupancy to customary titles as collateral security.

A sites were also acquired for mini sugar plantation for Adamawa Investment Ltd., at Loko, Song Local Government, Cement Company at Guyuk , Law School at Yola, Stadium at Yola, Civil Defence Training School at Yola. There was also Site Board for Layouts at Yolde Pate Wauro Jabbe etc.

#### **Land Use and Allocation Committee Secretariat and Plot Allocation.**

Briefly, the activities of the Land Use and Allocation Committee 1<sup>st</sup> January 2008 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2009.

##### **(i) New Applications**

A total number of 6,195 applications for Residential, Commercial, Industrial and other uses were received by the LUAC Secretariat for presentation to the Committee. The Land Use and Allocation Committee at its 38<sup>th</sup> and 39<sup>th</sup> LUAC Meeting held on 17<sup>th</sup> of October, 2008 and 25<sup>th</sup> June 2009 approved a total of 2,150 applications for allocation.

#### **Mass Housing Development in the State**

The new National Housing Policy entails a major slight in Government Housing policy from the provision of Mass Housing by the Government agencies to the provision of Mass Housing through collaboration with private sector real estate developers.

To realize these objectives a meeting was held on the 6<sup>th</sup> December 2007 with 14 private sector Real Estate Developers in which an agreement was reached for allocation of land to the Estate Developers.



Land had been allocated to the Estate Developers who showed seriousness. The Estate Developers and other proposed developments are as follows:

Government is expected to provide infrastructure to the Estate such as water, electricity, roads etc. developers on the other hand are expected to provide infrastructure within the Estate. Government could however provide infrastructure within the Estate in order to lower the disposal cost of the houses.

The applications have been considered and approved by the Land Use Allocation Committee for allocation.

### **Pending Application**

There are presently a total of 32,910 pending application awaiting allocation. The Ministry is undertaking the production of new layouts to allocate plots to these applicants.

### **Owner Occupier Unit**

During the period under review, the owner-occupier unit of Ministry has received and processed 150 applications. The unit has also bind about 56 Nos of certificates ready for forwarding to His Excellency for his signature.

### **Land and Deeds Registries and Computerization**

Despite the advent of modern technology, Land records in the Ministry are still being kept manually. The manual system of record keeping makes the storage of documents and retrieval of vital information slow and difficult. The release of ₦19.4 Million for the construction of Land and Deed Registries was made and the project is at 95% completion. Land Registry if funds are released will go a long way in solving the Ministry's problems.

Also the Computerization and Automation of Land and Deed Registries has been approved.

### **SURVEY DEPARTMENT**

The Survey Department is made up of three units, Namely; Survey, Cartography and Lithography.

#### **(1) Field Unit:**

The field unit carried out the following surveys:-

- (i) Demarcation and survey of 7 Science/Technical Colleges spread across the State.
- (ii) Demarcation and survey of Government Approved Layouts, namely ADSYP 14, ADSYP 16, part of GSYP 18 Extension.
- (iii) Demarcation and survey of Adamawa State University Teaching Hospital.
- (iv) Re-Demarcation and re-survey of 4 out of the 7 sites of the Science/Technical Colleges. This is due to change of sites and extension of the area. These are Mayo-Belwa, Madagali, Song and Lamurde.
- (v) Demarcation and survey of 6 sites for private developers.
- (vi) Demarcation and survey of Police Housing Scheme.
- (vii) Topographical survey of the 7 Science/Technical Colleges.
- (viii) Demarcation and survey of the site for Homes and savings.
- (ix) Demarcation and survey of 302 Isolated items.
- (x) 128 cases of re-establishment were treated.
- (xi) 9 cases of encroachment were treated.
- (xii) 3 Ring Roads were set out.

(xiii) Demarcation and survey of ADSYP 22, 12, 17, 24 and 27.

2. **Boundary Unit:**

(i) Nigeria/Cameroun International Boundary Tracing:-

The 3<sup>rd</sup> phase of the Nigeria/Cameroun International boundary was traced in February, 2008. It covered three Local Governments in Adamawa State. The Local Governments are; Jada, Ganye and Toungo.

(ii) Adamawa/Gombe Inter-State Boundary Demarcation:-

The final demarcation of Adamawa/Gombe boundary was carried out under the period of review. Three grey areas were skipped pending the resolution by the joint consultative forum of the two States. The demarcation was carried out by a contractor under the supervision of the representatives of Dg National Boundary Commission, office of the Surveyor General of the Federation and office of the Survey General of the two States.

(iii) Adamawa/Borno Inter-State Boundary:-

Consultative meeting of the two States at the instance of National Boundary Commission was held at Maiduguri, Borno States. The representative of the Surveyor General of the Federation was there. At the end of the meeting, it was resolved that, the Gwoza/Madagali sector which has been traced and preliminarily demarcated be arranged for final demarcation. The remaining sector be traced and the tracing was to start by September, 2008. it could not start as earlier scheduled due to logistic problems from the two States. However, Adamawa State is ready now and is waiting for Borno's response, but there was no response up to the end of the year 2008.

3. **Cadastral Unit:-**

(i) Processed 2,082 new applications, conversion cases.

(ii) 3,529 new applications from Government Layouts.

(iii) 12 Sites Board Meetings were held.

(iv) 1,988 beacon numbers were issued for various surveys.

**TOWN PLANNING DEPARTMENT:**

The Town Planning Department whose statutory function is physical planning of all settlement in the State both Urban and Rural for a clean, healthy and aesthetically attractive environment had over the period under review carried out the following functions.

**Layouts**

14 layouts were designed, whereas 2 were redesigned. They are:-

- (i) ADSYP 12, 14, 17, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29 30, 31 and 32 along Jimeta Yola Road behind Abattoir.

**Clearance Letter**

A total of about 162 clearance letters were issued out to prospective developers.

**Complaints and adhoc duties**

Numerous complaints precisely on encroachment were received and treated accordingly that is why we have about 90 letters of stop work notices issued out to encroachers for compliance in order to forestall sanity. Complaints coming from area offices especially southern Zone Demsa in particular, was referred back to Numan area offices for clearance and the result is being awaited. A member of our staff in this Department also undertook a visit to Savannah Sugar Company intimating them to be up to date revenue wise.

Township Mapping for Yola, Mubi, Numan and Mayo-Belwa has been completed in Digital form. A printer 44 inches 256MB of Memory, 40GB Hard Disk was also purchased for production of Maps and can print on A0 paper with a speed of about 2mm per second. Also Digital Images for greater Yola was purchased within the year at the cost of ₦2,304,531.25.

**ACTIVITIES / PROGRESS REPORT IN THE LAST TWO YEARS**

**Introduction:**

The Ministry for Livestock Presumes that Livestock holds the best prospects for enhancing and sustaining the State's socio-economic development.

**Disease Control:**

A total number of 3,000 vials (3,000:000 doses) of Contagious Bovine Pleuropneumonia Vaccine ( CBPPV) 1,500 vials (75,000 doses) of Pest of small ruminants Vaccine (PPRV) and 100 liters of normal saline were supplied by the Federal Department of Livestock (FDL) to the Adamawa State Government to assist in the control of trans-boundary Animal Diseases in the state.

Mass vaccination of Livestock was launched at Wuro-jabbe, Yola south L.G.A in the month of April, 2009. Vaccines were given to Divisional Veterinary Officers (D.V.O) at the L.G.A and subsequently mass campaign carried out throughout the state. The vaccines had since been exhausted.



### **Livestock Marketing**

Nine Million naira only (N9M) was realized as revenue during the year under review.

### **Veterinary Public Health**

To ensure healthy and wholesome meat and disease free animals in the state, this component was handled with care. However the challenge of meeting up an ideal meat transportation from the abattoir still remains. This is why the need for the purchase of meat vans cannot be repeatedly overemphasized

This department is concerned with livestock production for enhancement of protein and settlement of nomadic Pastoralists which is being pursued with vigor. In the production process modern methods of animal breeding and husbandry techniques are embraced.
