





### 2. Root and Tuber Expansion Programm

### 3. New Rice for Africa (NERICA)

The basic goal is to contribute to poverty reduction and food security in all the participating countries and State through enhanced access to high yielding NERICA varieties and for import substitution.

Inspection of NERICA farm by officials of Donor Agency.



- 82 NERICA farmers group formed and registered as co-operative society.
- 150 Participatory Varietal Selection Research Plots was established.
- 282.5 ha with a yield of 450.45mt of seed was achieved for further planting.
- 907.5 ha with a yield of 1043mt of grains was produced.
- Ondo State won a Tractor with complements for coming 2<sup>nd</sup> in project implementation.



- Construction of 75km feeder roads across the three Senatorial Districts of the State (on-going).
- Construction of Rice Processing Mills, Market Sheds Market Stores and Dry Slabs at 3 locations in the state (on-going).
- 4. Pre emptive Management of Virulent Cassava Mosaic Disease Control(CMD) Project
- Ondo State is the pilot State for the South West on this programme.
- Establishment of one Cassava Macro-processing centre at Owo and Cassava
   Micro-processing centers in 7 locations in the State .
- Screened 40 but selected 10 new mosaic disease resistant varieties for distribution.




• 5. Cassava: Adding Value To Africa C:AVA Project. (Ondo and Ogun only)

Aimed at ensuring consistent supply of cassava raw materials (High Quality Cassava flower) to political end users

- Formation and empowerment of 9 processing groups for cassava processing and
   18 farmers group for cassava root production.
- Training of farmers Groups on "Common errors in Cassava cultivation."
- Trainig of Extension staff on the use of Global Positioning System(GPS).

- Construction of a 16-room open market stall with ventilated improved pit (VIP) toilet at Ode-Omi in Irele LGA at the cost of N1,295,500.00
- Construction of an 8-room lock-up shops with VIP toilet at Ipogun in Ifedore LGA at total cost of N1,094,464.00
- Procurement of 3,000 juvenile and Plantain suckers at Ode-Omi and Ipogun respectively.
- Procurement of Agro chemicals for five Communities



- Procurement of advisory services on crop and livestock enterprises management for 5 FCAs.

### NATURAL RESOURCES

- •Putting in place a Joint Task Force constituting the uniformed men to keep surveillance over the issues of encroachment, illegal felling, flitching and Indian hemp cultivation in forest reserves.
- •In the last 10 years 4,482Ha covering 8.96 million seedlings of Teak and indigenous had been planted.
- •Urban forestry as a new programme in the state had consumed 540,000 fruit tree seedlings and ornamentals for the beautification of the state.



N30.0M had been spent on enlightenment campaign and N150.0m for first phase of the conservation planning, management and infrastructural development of a wildlife sanctuary in the Ose River Park. (On-Going).



### WEALTH CREATION AGENCY(WECA)

- Establishment of a Honey Processing Factory to process 1,000 liters of raw honey per day.
- 3,000 farmers trained in modern beekeeping and 850 farmers empowered with equipment.
- 600 farmers, 112 extension agents and 90 agric teachers trained in sericulture practices and production of lawyer's wigs.
- 10,000 farmers/youths trained in plantain, pineapple suckers, cassava, sugar cane multiplication techniques.
- Preparation and planting of 140 hectares of land for maize and cassava.



- 2,000 farmers/youths trained in yam minisett techniques.
- · Other capacity training programmes carried out for youths in
- GSM repairs
- Hat and Bead making
- Leather works
- · Make-over, wire jewelleries, rose and flower arrangement and decorations etc.
- Preparation and planting of 140Hactares of Land for Maize and Cassava cultivation.



# COMMUNITY BASED NATURAL RESOURCES MANAGEMENT PROJECT(IFAD SUPPORTED)

- State and Local Government Staff have been positioned and well equipped for programme implementation.
- LG and Communities sensitization fully achieved.
- Community Development Fund for Village Infrastructure, Livelihood Development and Natural Resources Management (NRM) established in the participating Communities based on concluded Participatory Community Planning and Participatory Rural Appraisal of their Needs Assessment.



- Procurement of Goods: Procurement of Computers and Accessories and Internet C-Band and Networking (NCB) and Vehicles (ICB) completed in year 2008 while procurement of additional 10 vehicles and 2 speed boats are now in progress.
- Participatory Rural Appraisal(PRA) Conducted in all the participating 27 Communities in the State in 2007.
- Socio-Economic Baseline Survey conducted in all the participating 27 Communities in the State in 2007.




- Community level teams (CBAT, Sanitation, Health & Nutrition, Community Self Monitoring, Literacy, Commodity Groups etc) put in place.
- Construction/rehabilitation of 5 community schools, 3 civic centre/town hall, 8 health centres, 16 agro processing centres, 3 rural feeder roads, 6 culverts, 8 market stalls, 4 boreholes, channelization/drainages, 2 daycare centres, 6 wooden canoe & fishing gears, construction of wooden footpaths in 3 riverine communities, distribution of planting materials (3 tons of maize, 10,000 cocoa seedlings & 2000 oil palm seedlings, and 81 bundles of cassava cuttings) and distribution of 96 bee-hives undertaken in the participating communities;
- Vocational Skills Acquisition for 144 women and youths achieved;
- Training of community members and groups in various aspects of programme activities/enterprises including crop production, livestock, fisheries, bee-keeping, skills acquisition, planning & monitoring. Similarly, Programme and Local Government staff are trained on various community management and development approaches.

### FISHERIES.

- Establishment of 2 fish hatcheries with a capacity of 5 million fingerlings per annum each at Akure and Okitipupa.
- Establishment of 3 pilot homestead fish pond
  centers(1/Senatorial District) for demonstration purposes
  and promotion of concrete fish ponds and fiberglass tanks.
- Distribution of 67 Outboard Engines(OBE)
- Training of 4,125 fish farmers across the State.



- Took delivery of 10 canoes, 10 Outboard engines,1 unit of mini cold-room and several bundles of fishing net through collaboration with Agip.
- Establishment of an Aquaculture Training Centre at Alagbaka, Akure.



- AGRIC INPUT SUPPLY AGENCY(AISA).
- Improved the living standard of farmers in the State through the provision of genuine, affordable and adequate agricultural inputs.
- Establishment of mobile Farm Service Centers
- Reduction of sales of adulterated agro inputs in the State to the barest minimum through sales of genuine agro inputs.
- Increase in agricultural production as a result of timely supply of inputs to farmers at subsidized prices.

- AGRO CLIMATOLOGY
- Production of State Atlas and Farmers calendar on weather conditions.
- Establishment of a soil laboratory for soil analysis.
- Establishment of weather data bank.



- AGRIC. ENGINEERING SERVICES.
- Mechanization assistance to youth for the production of 2,000 Ha of cassava and
   1,500 Ha of maize annually with corresponding yields of 42,000 tonnes and 2,250 tonnes respectively.
- Employment generation and training of 3,499 youths in modern farming techniques.



### CONSTRAINTS/CHALLENGES

- Inadequate number of professional/Technical staff at the grass root level.
- Challenges of Land Tenure System.
- Over dependence on rain-fed agriculture.
- Poor infrastructural facilities e.g. rural roads
- Unattractive returns on investment in Agriculture.
- · Ageing of farming population.
- Lack of interest of youths in agriculture.
- Storage Facilities.
- · Low re-payment of loans by farmers.
- Encroachment into forest reserves
- Illegal felling and flitching in forest reserves.
- · Illegal evacuation of ungraded produce.
