




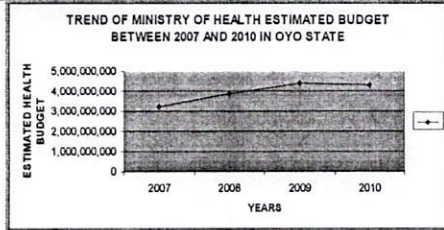
## TREND OF ESTIMATED CAPITAL BUDGET IN HEALTH SECTOR

- **Definitions:** includes interventions and /or services
- **Objectives:**
  - To improve access and equity towards quality health care.
  - To provide a WMCP as a basis for improved health expenditure and investment for all stakeholders.
  - To strength M&E indicators for the Ward Health
- **Health interventions for inclusion in the package**
  - Control of communicable & Non communicable diseases
  - Child Survival, Maternal & Newborn care
  - Health Education and Community mobilization & Monitoring and Evaluation
- **Service Required**
  - Provision of essential Drugs
  - Human Resource for Health
  - Health Infrastructure Development

## INTEGRATED MATERNAL, NEWBORN & CHILD HEALTH

- **Goal:**
  - To reduce maternal, Newborn & Child morbidity and mortality in line with MDG 4&5
- **Target:**
  - To reduce Maternal Mortality by  $\frac{1}{3}$  by 2015 compared to 1990 base .
  - To reduce U5 Mortality rate from 230/1000 in 1990 to 70/1000 in 2015
- **Priority Areas for action**
  - Focused Antenatal Care, Intrapartum care, Emergency Obstetric & Newborn care, Routine postnatal care, Infant and young child feeding, PMTCT, Immunization Plus, Management of common childhood illness and water
- **Guiding Principles**
  - Integration, Equity, Multi sectoral collaboration, Partnerships, Women's & Child right and Continuum of care.

**INTERVENTIONS**



**MALARIA**

- **MALARIA CONTROL UNIT**
- Renovation and upgrading of storage space for malaria commodities at the State central medical store at State Hospital, Ring Road, Ibadan.
- Training of three hundred and thirty (330) role model mothers in all the 33 Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the State. They are meant to give community and household training based intervention on treatment of malaria.
- Training of six hundred and sixty (660) health workers in the 33 LGAs as well as Thirty (30) doctors and Ninety (90) nurses of the State Hospitals' Management Board (SHMB).

**TUBERCULOSIS**

- Expansion of TB screening to 3 additional laboratories - Baptist Hospital, Oyo, Muslim Hospital, Saki, and Catholic Hospital, Iseyin.
- Inauguration of the TB/HIV working group leading to enhanced collaborative activities.

**GUINEA WORM**

- 1<sup>st</sup> reported in Oyo State, 344 cases in 23 LGAs in 1987 and mostly in rural areas.
  - Attainment of zero case incidence in 2005
- STRATEGIES**
- Community mobilization and sensitization
  - Provision of portable water (WATSAN)
  - Abate chemical application H<sub>2</sub>O
  - Distribution of monofilament filters
  - Effective case management
  - Cash reward system for identified case of guinea worm
  - Oyo State now awaiting final certification as guineaworm free state.

**HIV/AIDS**

- **CONDUCTION** of an Integrated Biological and Behavioural Surveillance Survey (IBBSS) in the State with a focus on intravenous drug users and men having sex with men.
- Inauguration of the State team on facilitative supervising, monitoring and evaluation.
- Distribution of State procured HIV test kits to all anti-retroviral test sites in the state.

## ONCHOCERCIASIS

- Orientation and training of LGA programme managers and PHC coordinators in thirteen (13) community directed intervention (CDI) LGAs.

## IMMUNIZATION

- Inauguration of the State Interagency Coordination Committee on Immunization with a focus of coordinating activities of Ministries, agencies and partners on vaccine preventable diseases in children.
- Production and airing of jingles on radio stations in the State to bring about public enlightenment on immunization
- Production and airing of thirteen (13) week prime time interactive programme on immunization on radio stations in the state.

## NUTRITION UNIT

- Conduction of the Child Health Week with a focus on child nutrition, vitamin supplementation and antenatal care for pregnant women.
- Processing and packaging of soya-based complementary foods for malnourished children.
- Training of a batch of health workers on Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM).

## REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH UNIT

- Training of ten (10) trainers on Life Saving Skills (LSS) in the State.
- Training of ten (10) doctors of the SHMB on emergency obstetrics care.
- Training of one hundred and eighty (180) LGA health workers on safe motherhood.
- Capacity building of members of staff on community contraception.
- Conduction of situation analysis on Maternal, Neonatal and Child Health (MNCH) in the State.

## INTERVENTION CONTD

- **FREE EYE OPERATION**
  - 500 people benefited from eye services organized by the South West Ophthalmological Society of Nigeria in collaboration with State Government. This includes cataract operation, free drugs and glasses were also given free.
- **FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE**
  - The sum of N5.18million was released by the State government for financial assistance for the less privileged citizens of the state to settle the cost of the health care services received outside the State owned facilities



## FIGHT TO ERADICATE QUACKERY

- In the past 2 decades, the health sector witnessed a gradual decline
- 55% of the population recognized private sector as their provider due to easy access.
- A large number of quacks infiltrated the private sector

## HEALTH MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM (HMIS)

### INTRODUCTION:

- HMIS incorporates all the data needed by policy makers, clinicians and health service users to improve and protect the health of the population. The data needed in a comprehensive health management information system ranges from birth, morbidity and mortality data.

### INTERVENTION

#### Printing of NHMIS formats

- Training of 600 Health Personnel on HMIS form.
- Procurement & Distribution of computers to 16 LGAs.
- Mandatory Monthly meeting with LGA M&E officers with Zonal health officers.
- Quarterly data verification
- Development and increasing of web portal and integration of HMIS in to state website "[www.oyohealth.org](http://www.oyohealth.org)"

### ACHIEVEMENTS

- Access health information and trend
- Ability to derive the needed health data for policy makers.
- As yardstick in monitoring the 13point Agenda and MDG5 "Target" of the present Administration

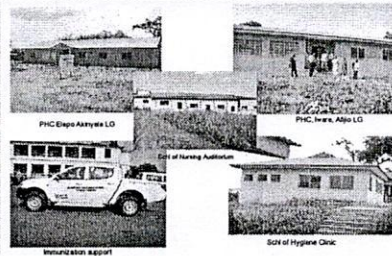
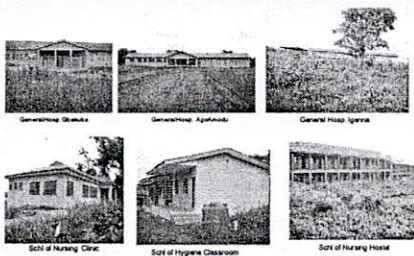

## The Health & Hospitals' Monitoring Department

- The Health & Hospitals' Monitoring Department was created on 1st June 2009 with a permanent secretary as the head, forms part of the Ministry of Health. The Permanent Secretary also takes charge of Adeoyo Maternity Teaching Hospital.
- MISSION STATEMENT
- To ensure delivery of quality health care services to the people of Oyo State by dedicated, committed, resilient, selfless and God fearing health professionals at secondary level of health care delivery system which is adequately equipped with all necessary requirements.



## OBJECTIVES

- Monitoring of all medical, paramedical, administrative and support staff in the Oyo State Hospital; ensuring punctuality at work; regular attendance to duties and prompt attention to patients.
- Ensuring that all categories of staff in the State Hospitals discharge their duties with all sense of professional ethics and compliance with Civil Service and Financial Regulation.
- Ensuring that all available equipment, drugs, consumables and other facilities in the State Hospitals are effectively utilized for high quality health care delivery services.
- Ensuring that all State Hospitals are prompt supplied with consumables that will constantly be required for effective service delivery

## ACHIEVEMENTS

- Majority of professionals and other workers now report for work as expected. Discovery of some officers who had left service without following due process. Their salaries were immediately stopped.
- Prompt attention to patients especially at Adeoyo Maternity Teaching Hospital.
- Provision of Ultra sound services
- Computerization of medical records division.
- Provision of needed equipment such as Beds, Mattresses, air conditioners, cots, ultra sound machine, steel cabinets, furniture, fans, curtains
- Purchase of two (2) 5 KVA and 210 KVA petrol generators for key areas such as the blood bank, SCBU Laboratory and theatre to ensure uninterrupted power supply

## OYO STATE HOSPITAL MANAGEMENT BOARD

- Oyo State Hospitals Management Board is an Agency that implements the policy matters relating to health delivery services in the State.
2. It has five Directorates, all of which function towards improving the health status of the people of Oyo State, viz:
- Directorate of Medical Services
  - Directorate of Pharmaceutical Services
  - Directorate of Finance and Supplies
  - Directorate of Personnel
  - Directorate of Maintenance.
