Background

- DFID funded technical assistance facility
 - NIAF1 2007 -11
 - NIAF2 2012 16
- Technical assistance for infrastructure development
- NIAF1 focused on power, transport, and PPP
 - Federal and State support
- NIAF2 will also include urban development, climate change
 - Flexible and able to respond quickly
 - Demand driven but requires client commitment



Features of NIAF2

- More targeted on objective outcomes
 - In control of government
- Greater geographical coverage
 - Embedded advisers supported by international specialists
- Infrastructure delivery
 - Project appraisal, prioritisation, SURE implementation
- Legal support
 - Contract standardisation
 - Review existing concessions
 - Procurement, implementation issues



New workstreams

- Urban transport planning
 - Wider application of LASG support
- Mass transit (bus and light rail)
 - Private sector ownership & operation (buses)
 - Licensing and regulation
- Urban development
 - Urban Master plans and policies to generate economic opportunity & employment
 - Link to transport plans and investment
 - PPP implementation likely (eg Enugu)



PPP workstream

- Federal infrastructure delivery
 - Railways OBC
 - Hydropower concessions, small IPPs
 - Roads and bridges (2nd Niger, Nupeko)
- States
 - Implementation (LASG Blue Line, Lekki-Epe concession)
 - Project review and feasibility
 - Contract standardisation and guidance
- NPPPN should be an increasingly important client
 - Bespoke training, capacity building, standardisation
