REPORT OF THE SENATE AD-HOC COMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC AND FINANCIAL CRIMES COMMISSION (EFCC) ADVISORY LIST

1. The Senate at its Plenary Session on Tuesday, 20th February, 2007, debated on the Remarks made by the Senate President on the operations of the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission, (EFCC). The Remarks dwelt extensively on the list of persons which the EFCC indicted of corrupt practices and who are said to be ineligible to contest for public offices in the forth coming 2007 general elections.

2. After extensive deliberations on the issues, a seven-man Ad-hoc Committee was constituted with the following Distinguished Senators:
 - i. Senator Lawal Shua'ibu - Chairman
 - ii. Senator A. O. Mamora - Member
 - iii. Senator Sa'ad Mohammed - Member
 - iv. Senator David Brigidi - Member
 - v. Senator Isaiah Balat - Member

- vi. Senator Fred I. Orti - Member
- vii. Senator Uche Chukwumerije - Member

3. The Committee was given the following terms of reference:

- a. to look into the Act establishing the EFCC.
- b. to look into the original list of Indicted Politicians by the EFCC.
- c. to look at any other issue(s) that will strengthen the operations of the EFCC and,
- d. to submit its report on or before Thursday, 22nd February, 2007.

4. With the above mandate, the Committee met immediately on Tuesday, 20th February, 2007 and deliberated on the approach and the methodology of carrying out this very important Senate assignment.

**a. AMENDMENTS TO THE ECONOMIC AND FINANCIAL
CRIMES COMMISSION (ESTABLISHMENT) ACT, 2004**

In order to strengthen the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission, (EFCC) and guarantee its independence, the Committee proposed the following amendments to the Principal Act. The following sections are proposed for amendments:

- ii. Section 2 (1) (g)

- iii. Section 2 (1) (i)

b. LIST OF INDICTED POLITICIANS

In line with the mandate or term of reference No. 2 given by this distinguished Senate, the Committee obtained the original list of the politicians allegedly investigated and indicted by the EFCC. The list is attached to this report as annexure 1.

c. ISSUE(S) AND OPERATIONS OF THE EFCC

The Committee also invited the EFCC Chairman at its second round of meetings held on the 21st February, 2007, at 10.30pm. When queried by the Committee on

why he sent the advisory list to the Presidency, he explained that his action was covered under **Section 6(j) (vi)** of the EFCC Act, 2004 and **Section 137 (1) (i)** of the 1999 Constitution.

5. Mallam Nuhu Ribadu emphasized that the final decision to accept or reject the reports based on the investigation carried out by his Commission is the responsibility of the government. The Executive responsibility is vested in the President by virtue of **Section 5 (1) (a) and (b)** of the 1999 Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

Furthermore, the EFCC Chairman informed the Committee that his Commission has a data base of all persons holding public offices and can call up such names where necessary in the performance of its functions as prescribed by law. He also pointed out that EFCC is a world class Economic and Financial Crimes intelligence outfit devoid of political motives.

6. **FINDINGS:**

Analysis of the briefing to the Ad-hoc Committee by the Executive Chairman, Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) revealed and gave rise to the following findings:

- i. The Committee invited the EFCC Chairman to shed more light on the advisory list of indicted Politicians. Upon his appearance, there were three different versions of the lists which he indicated that none of them was authentic. He indicated that it was in the process of retrieving the list of candidates sent by INEC that the various lists emerged. However, he promised to send to the Committee the authentic list that he sent to the Presidency. The Committee finds unsatisfactory and suspicious, the confusion and uncertainty surrounding the existence of more than one conflicting advisory list of indicted Politicians.

- ii. At the end of our meeting on 27th February, 2007 the supposed authentic list was forwarded to the Committee by the EFCC (Attached here as annexure I).

- iii. The Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) is an executive body created by an Act of the National Assembly. Accordingly, the powers and responsibilities vested in it under **Sections 6 and 7** of the Act, are executive functions. By the nature of these responsibilities and powers, they can only be effectively exercised under an executive direction by the President in line with the provision

of **Section 5 (1) (a) and (b)** of the 1999 Constitution. The President, under the said Section could exercise such responsibilities and powers through his Ministers or other Public Officers including those of the EFCC.

- iv. The objective of the EFCC is to have those investigated prosecuted in courts of competent jurisdiction and the prosecutorial work is entirely an Executive duty constitutionally vested in the Attorney - General of the Federation and Minister of Justice, for offences created by the Acts of the National Assembly as contained in **Section 174 (1) (a) - (c)** of the 1999 Constitution. This is supported by **Section 43** of the EFCC Act, 2004.
- v. The coordination of the business of governance necessarily requires that all executive bodies executing government policies and programmes work in harmony with the President who is the head of Government.
- vi. The EFCC, apart from investigating and prosecuting of offences under its Act, also has responsibility of advising Government on appropriate intervention measures to prevent and

check economic and financial crimes as provided in the EFCC Act, 2004 **Section 6 (j) (vi)**.

- vii. By the nature of its powers and responsibilities, the EFCC can indict persons or institutions involved in embezzlement or fraud after due investigations. The report of such indictment can be utilized by government through an administrative process as provided for in **Sections 137 (1) (i)** of the 1999 Constitution in the case of the presidential election and similar provisions for National Assembly Members, State House of Assembly and Governors as provided for under **Section 66(1) (h), 107 (1) (h), and 182 (1) (i)** respectively.
- viii. When in December, 2006 the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) prepared the preliminary list of candidates to contest elections, they sent copies of such list to the Police, the State Security Service (SSS), the Nigeria Intelligence Agency (NIA) and the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC). These security and intelligence agencies could assist INEC in determining the eligibility of those candidates for elective positions in compliance with **Sections 137, especially sub-sections (a), (d), (e) and (h)**.

- ix. In the instant case, the report of the indicted persons prepared by the EFCC was forwarded to the government in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Constitution and **Section 6 (j) (vi)** of the EFCC Act, 2004. The list was also forwarded to Political Parties, advising them on the undesirability of fielding candidates with charges of criminal conducts hanging on their necks.
- x. The impression created through the advertised indictment list of candidates and subsequent pronouncements of INEC would appear to suggest that indictment in itself *absolutely* disqualifies a candidate from contesting election; a position that this Committee does not share.
- xi. The situation in which the triple actions of indictment, conviction and disqualification of candidates were being done by the executive raises serious doubts about the true intendment of the framers of the Constitution.
- xii. There seems to be a level of inconsistent statements credited to EFCC. The Committee recalls that the EFCC Chairman made a major address to the Senate on Wednesday, 27th

September, 2006 containing some 31 public officers under investigation and indictment for money laundering, fraud and embezzlement. But later development sent contrary signals to the public. We see this development as capable of undermining the integrity of the Commission.

7. RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Committee recommends as follows:









- i.** That judicial interpretation of the full intendment of Section 137 particularly with reference to subsection (2) of the Constitution should be sought and where such indictment has been challenged before a court of competent jurisdiction, the candidate should be eligible to contest election unless otherwise ruled by court;
- ii.** That whatever constraints that have led EFCC to issue contradictory lists of indicted Politicians in the past must be completely addressed. These constraints include possibility of outside interference with the independence of the organization and politics of power play in high places.
- iii.** That the Committee strongly advises the EFCC Chairman to temper his public utterances particularly with respect to the ongoing investigation of suspects.

- iv.** Finally, the moral question arises, is it another case of one corrupt politician being more important than the other? We were told in this Chamber only last week that “the hottest places in hell are reserved for those who in time of moral crisis preserve their neutrality”. The EFCC needs to have its credibility protected especially when cases of crime are glaringly established. Such protection should come from the National Assembly.
- v.** In furtherance of the obvious necessity to strengthen the independence and professionalism of the EFCC, we recommend the following amendments:
