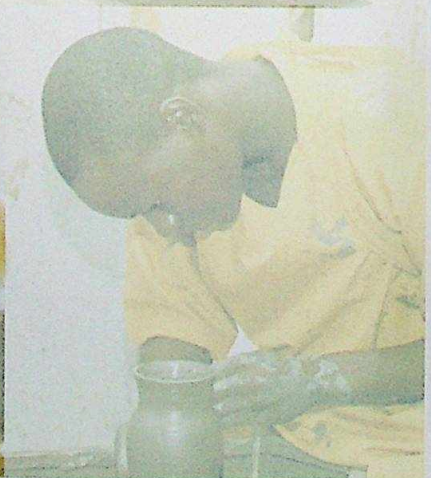




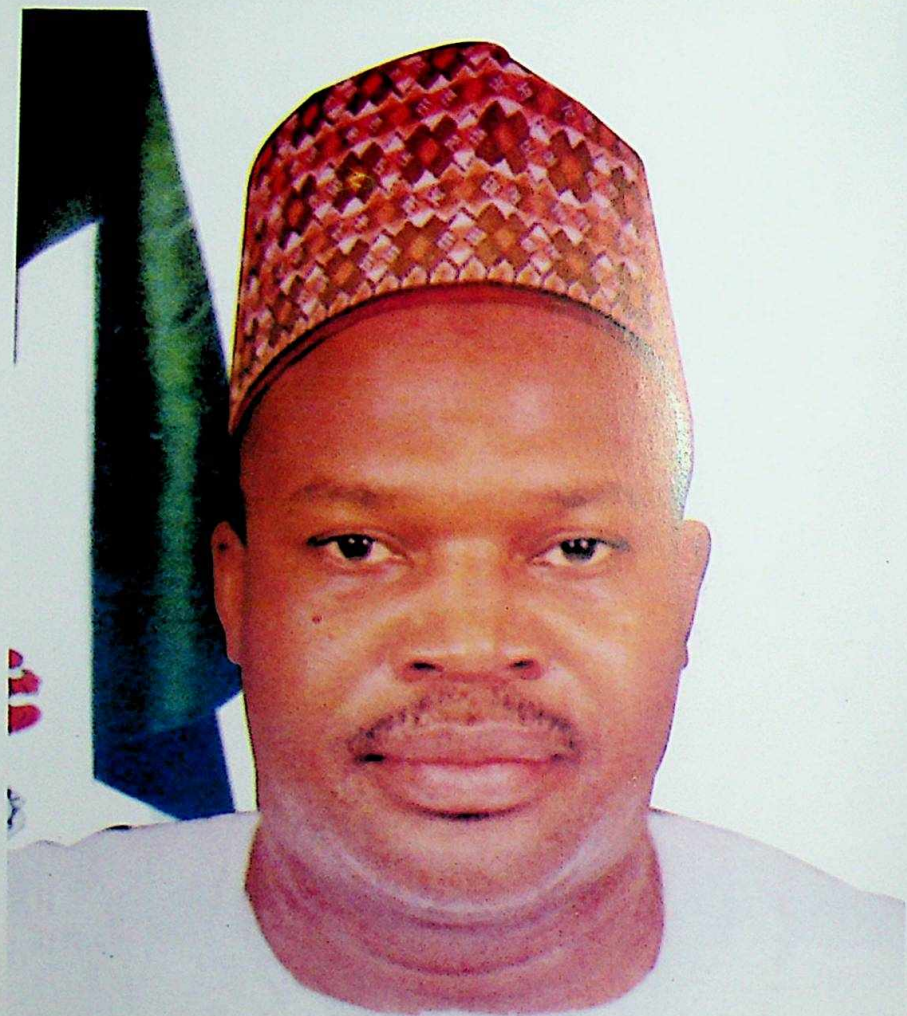

GOVERNOR SHEMA, A BEACON OF RESPONSIBLE LEADERSHIP

Katsina State Governor Ibrahim Shehu Shema has always humbly admitted that his performance at every stage of his tenure would only be a modest addition to the achievements recorded by his immediate predecessor, the late Alhaji Umaru Musa Yar'Adua, his predecessor and former President of Nigeria. Governor Shema has also used his interaction with journalists to stress on his approach to the governance of Katsina State, nature and scale of the inherent challenges and the success he has so far recorded.

Certainly, any serious and curious development analyst or governance specialist cannot help but appreciate and even recommend to other leaders at different levels the introduction of the **Community Development Committees (CDCs)** which the Governor said he has effectively used as machineries for the identification and execution of relevant development projects in the state. It is a strategy that provides the respective communities in the state with the opportunity to determine the kind of projects that are most relevant to their varying needs, thereby making it easier for the state government to provide such projects in the right places, at the right times.

The governor has only utilized these opportunities to provide responsible leadership to the people of the state in the three years that he has been at the helm of affairs in the state. There has been abundant evidence to show that his administration remains well-focused.

According to Shema, it is the rich information that he collated from the CDCs which he has loaded into his computer and which he constantly consults that enables him to verify the basic requirements of every community. This makes it quite easy for the state government to always get it right in terms of project execution. Apart from being a bottom-top approach to leadership, it also enables the state government to take development projects where they are needed.

Journalists who were at one time or another in Katsina State to find out the extent of the governor's performance must have been convinced that Shema is, indeed, Yar'Adua's

worthy successor. By positively touching every aspect of the people's lives, the governor has emerged as the champion of the noble cause of the common people of Katsina State.

A census of the projects executed by the Shema administration since its inception in 2007 has revealed that about 30 roads in different parts of the state were either constructed, rehabilitated or dualised. If the completion of the Katsina International Airport is put among the projects, it can be concluded that the administration has paid adequate attention to road and air transportation infrastructure thereby facilitating the movement of people and goods within and outside the state which is the basis of genuine development.

It is the realization of the vital needs of the people of the state in the key areas of agriculture and education that must have informed the decision of the state government to take remarkable actions in the two areas. By establishing fertilizer blending plants in Batsari, Bakori, Safana and Mai'Adua, the Shema administration must have set the stage for the revolutionisation of agriculture in the same way that the introduction of free primary and secondary education for all has cleared the odds that hitherto stood in the way of young knowledge seekers in the state. The giant strides recorded in education development made the state to win the Universal Basic Education Commission's awards for 2009 and 2010 respectively.

The provision of electricity to over 60 communities is something that has not only enhanced the living condition of the people but has also immensely contributed to the fight against poverty as many more people have now engaged in one kind of trade or another. All such trades as tailoring, welding, shoe-making, barbing and others which were either not common or non-existent in such communities because of the lack of electricity supply are now being widely practised.

It appears that the governor is justifiably proud of the Youth Crafts Centre that his administration has established in Katsina. But the governor is not alone in this regard, as most people in the state are overwhelmingly happy that Katsina State is the first to have such an important centre that is billed to produce 2,000 professionals in various trades within the next year or so.

Both the idea and the method being used in making the Youth Craft Centre a practical reality are quite appreciable especially if considered in the context of the increasing rate of joblessness in the country. It is gladdening to even learn that so far many commonwealth countries lauded the initiative with some European countries and the United States of America commending the state government over its decision to establish such a centre that increases the fortunes of millions of families in the state.

Everyone must have expected Governor Shema, mainly because of his passion for

development, to worry on the inspiring concept of Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). The contribution of about two billion Naira by the Katsina State government to the implementation of 2007, 2008 and 2009 conditional grants services projects under the MDGs in the state has become a clear testimony to the governor's commitment to development-related issues.

A close study of the nature and magnitude of the projects executed by the administration in Katsina has revealed that they serve as tools for quickening the development process in the state. This creates the belief that by the time all the dreams of the governor are translated into practical reality, a monumental development of the human capital will definitely be realized.

Governor Ibrahim Shema would have just relaxed and basked in the euphoria over the victory or achievements recorded by his predecessor. He could also have just considered the projects executed by the late Umaru Yar'Adua as enough for the state and therefore simply sat there to enjoy the fruits of the past leaders' labour. But he did not.

Right from the beginning, he decided to use the record of the last administration to serve as a standard on which he must improve, which clearly explains the zeal, commitment and sincerity with which he steers the affairs of the state as well as the resultant success that has so far been achieved. Governor Shema has demonstrated that prudent management of even scarce resources can bring smiles on the faces of people. He has also, over the three years he has been in office, shown that leadership is a burden and so only those who are committed and prepared for it should be voted into public office.

The administration of Governor Ibrahim Shehu Shema is engaged in the construction of 32 different road projects covering over 500 kilometers. 25 of these roads were initiated by the new administration, while eight others were inherited and completed. The total cost of the projects stands at more than N36.76 billion, out of which the inherited projects amounted to over N11.28 billion, while the ones initiated by the Shema administration will gulp about N26 billion when completed. 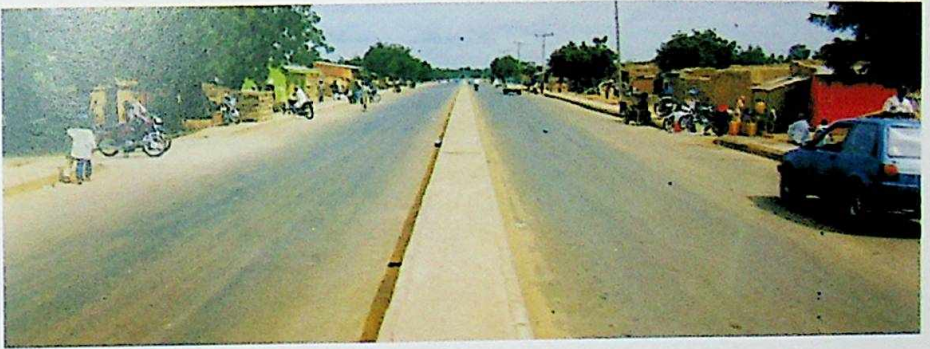

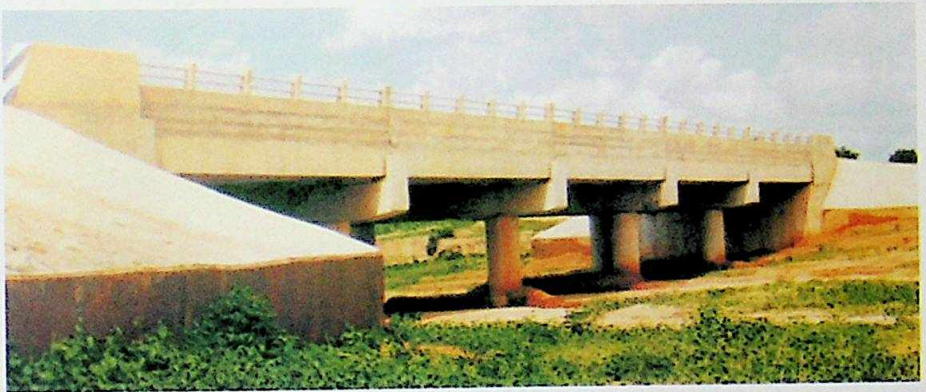

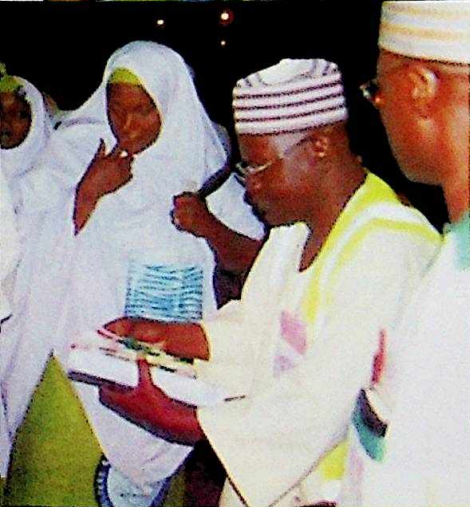

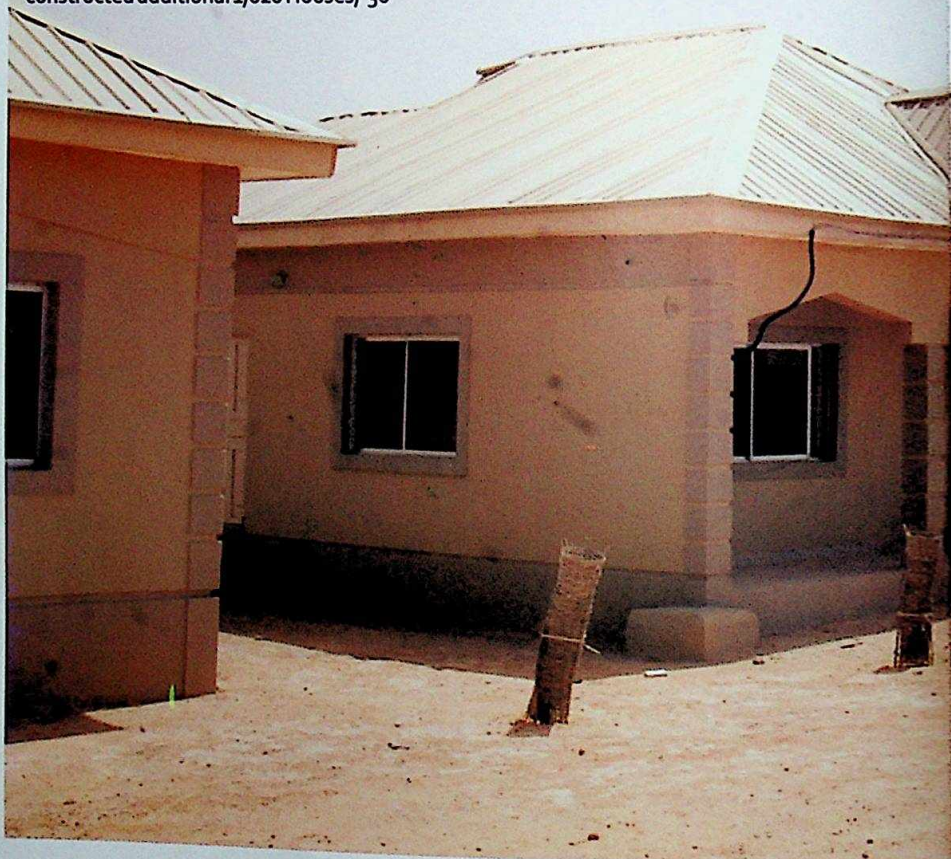

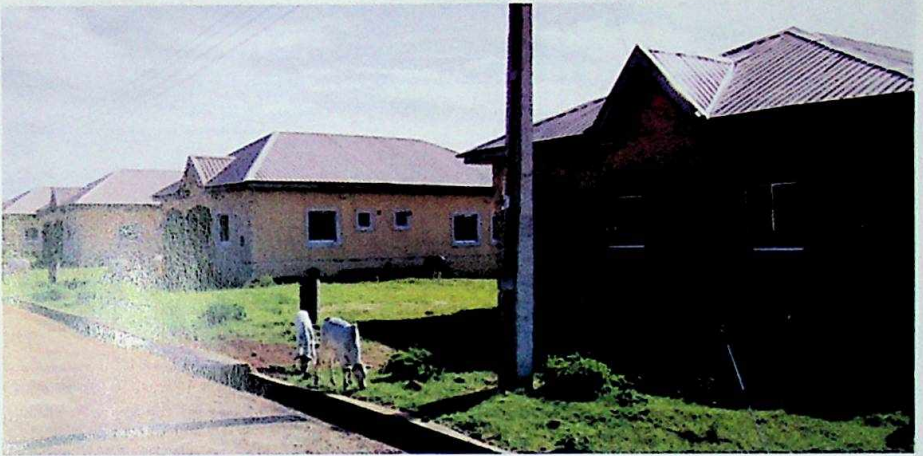

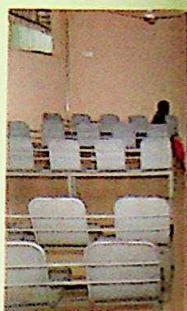

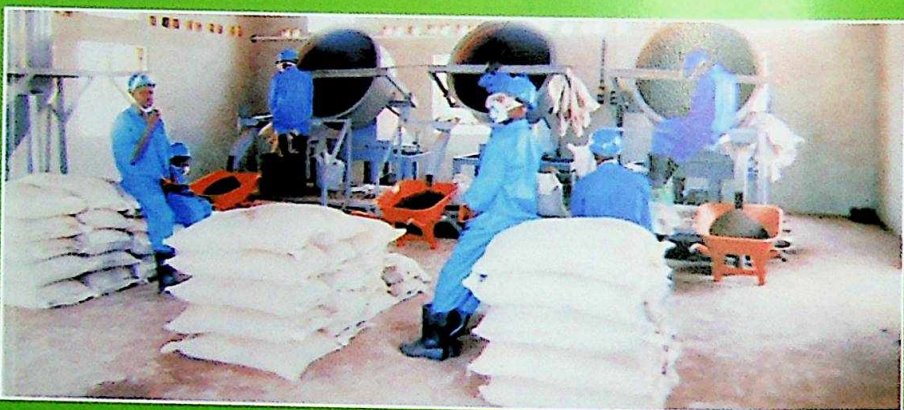

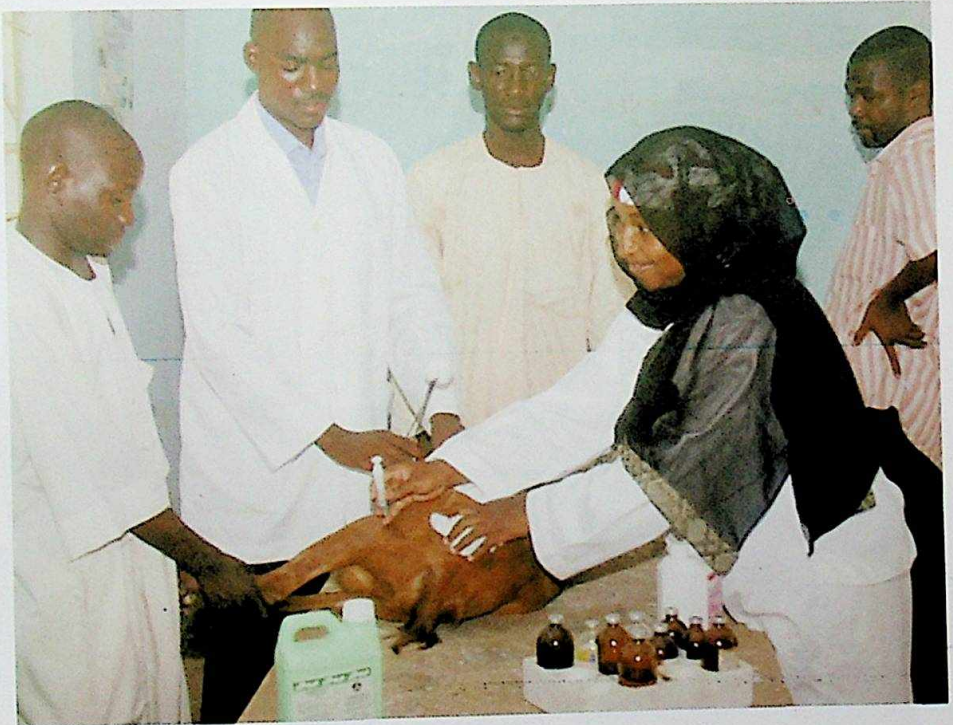

WATER SUPPLY

Government has spent over N1.152 million on rural water supplies from May 2007 to date. Over 537 communities were provided with boreholes since the inception of the Administration. These included 172 solar boreholes under the MDGs, 550 boreholes under the rural water supply program and the rehabilitation of 161 broken down boreholes.

N826.008 million is being spent on the

Katsina Water Expansion Scheme through the construction of five separate semi-urban water schemes at Barhin Housing estate (N167.02 million), Abbatoir quarters (N170.41 million) and Sabuwar Unguwa, Dutsin Safe, Tudun Yan Lifida and Yammawa quarters (N135.85 million), and Makera, N172.7million. N63,869,580 million has been expended on the improvement of



Semi Urban Water Supply, through the rehabilitation of 27 semi urban water schemes. Construction of a new one at Kusada, N80,482,027.67 extension of distribution network at Masabo, procurement of submersible pumps, generators and spare parts for other facilities among others.

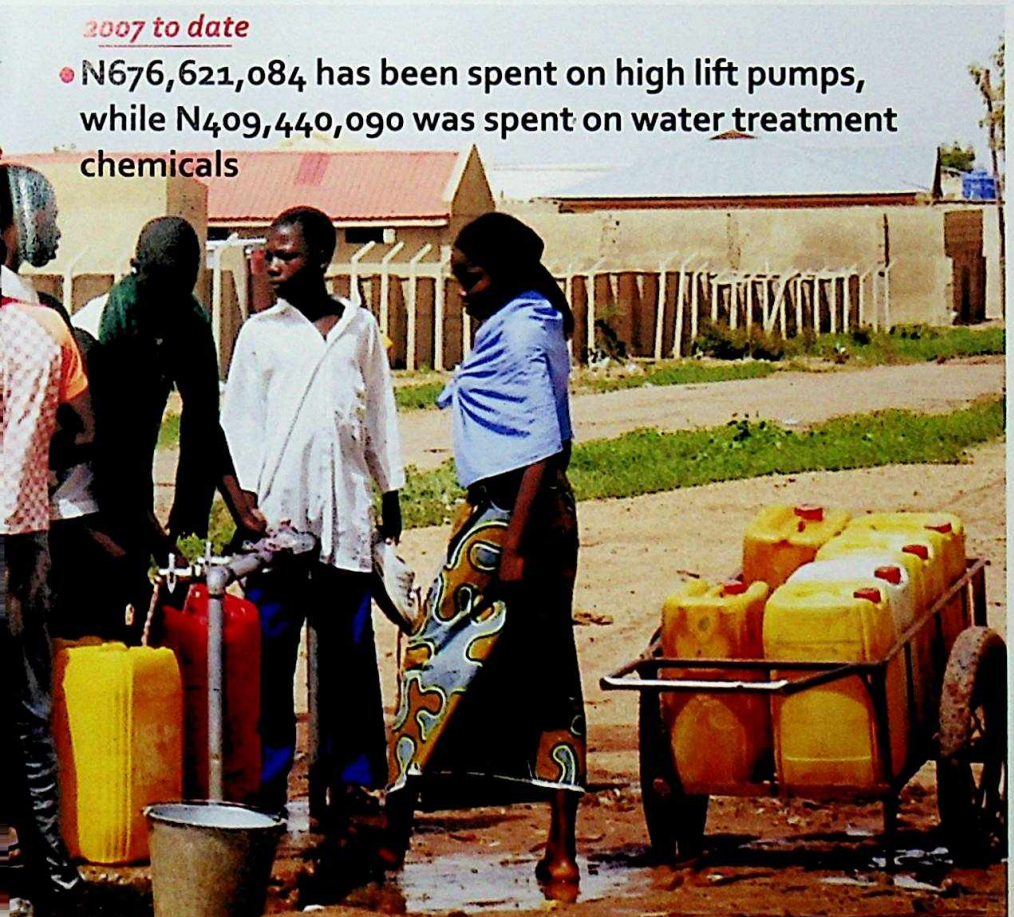
Government has procured three drilling rigs at the cost of N537.2 million and has trained eight staff of RUWASSA in Germany on the optimal utilization of the rigs.

The government has also been maintaining and operating the existing six urban water schemes in Katsina, Funtua, Malumfashi, Daura, Dutsinma, and Jibia.

Some 440 hand pumps operators and mechanics were trained to take charge of hand pumps and motorized boreholes installed in rural areas. Ten rain water harvest facility were provided in GEP Primary Schools in Kurfi, Sabuwa, Bakori, Kusada, Ingawa and

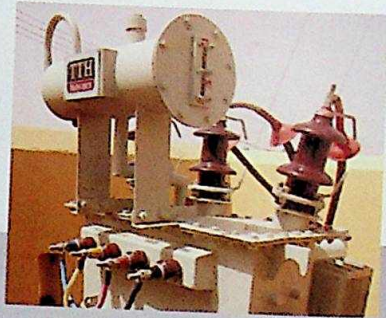
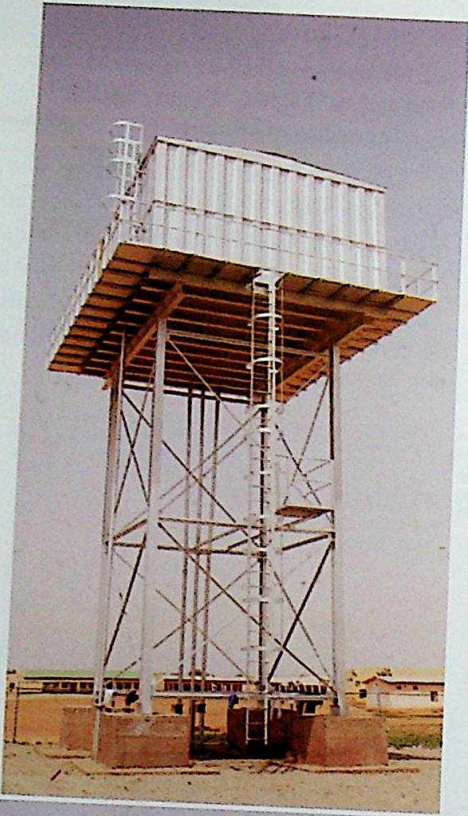

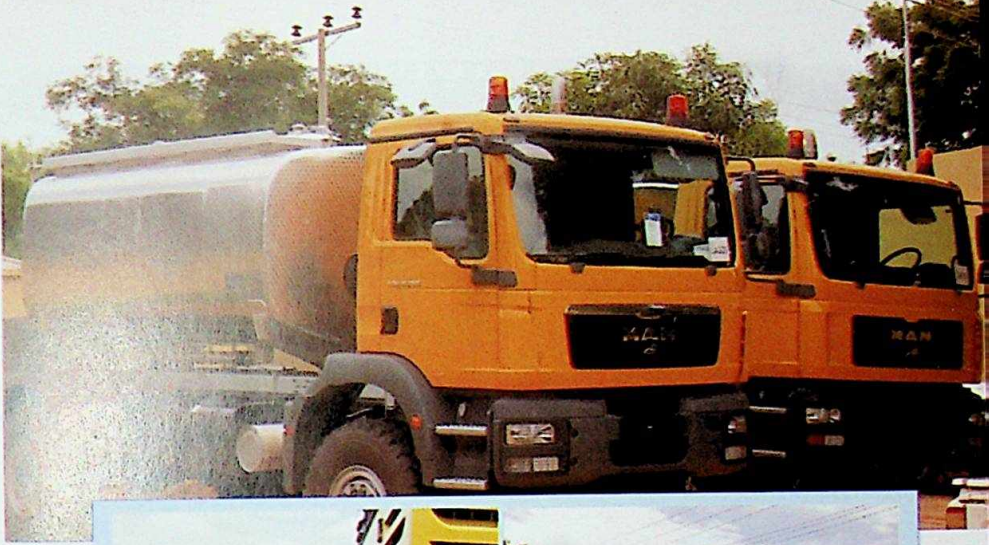

The state government has been collaborating with UNICEF to develop a state-wide WASH multi-year investment plan and sustainable sector policy. The administration is also pursuing the FG, donor agencies and other development partners to complete ongoing regional water schemes, which will draw water from Zobe dam to Katsina, and several urban and rural centers along the route. It is also seeking co-financing of new projects in all categories.

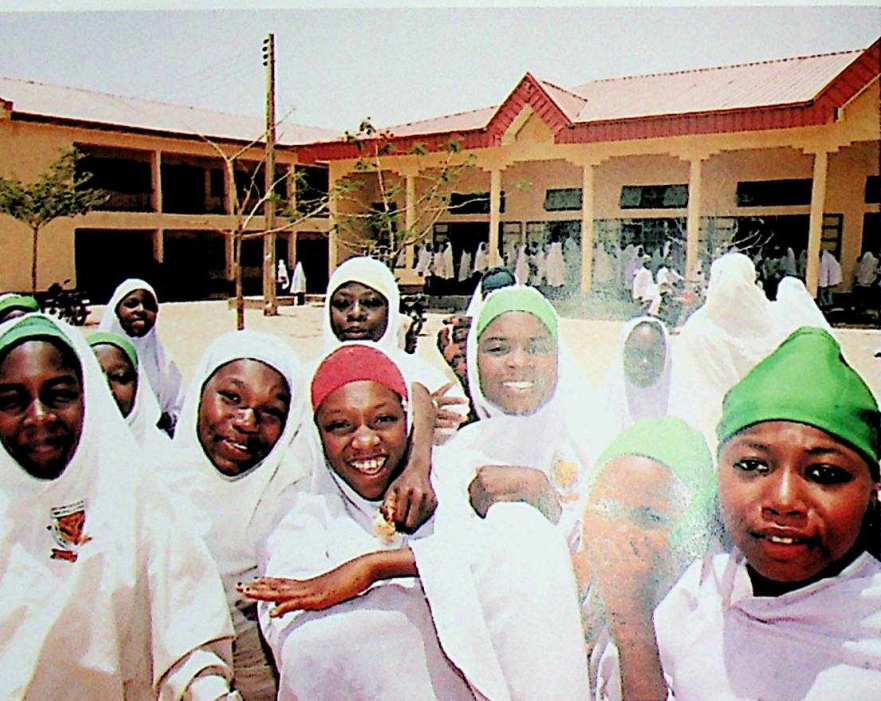

EDUCATION

Education is the number one item on the priority list of this administration. More than N40 billion has been committed to this sector in the past two years.

The effect of this massive investment is in the schools enrolment figure of the last five years; whereas in 2004/2005 session only 142,729 students were in secondary school, the figure jumped to 1,045,141 in 2008/2009 session and 1524172 in the 2009/2010 session.

*Similarly, primary school enrolment during the period went up from 1,001,447 in 2005 to 1,278,418 in

2009.

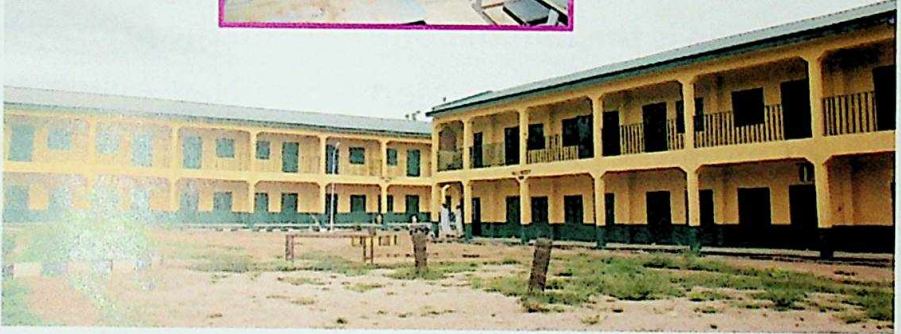

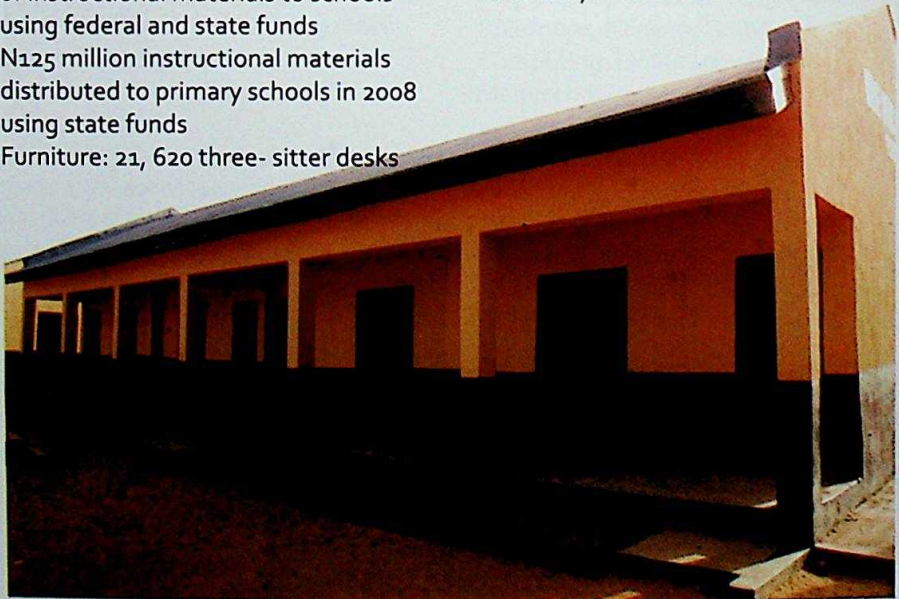

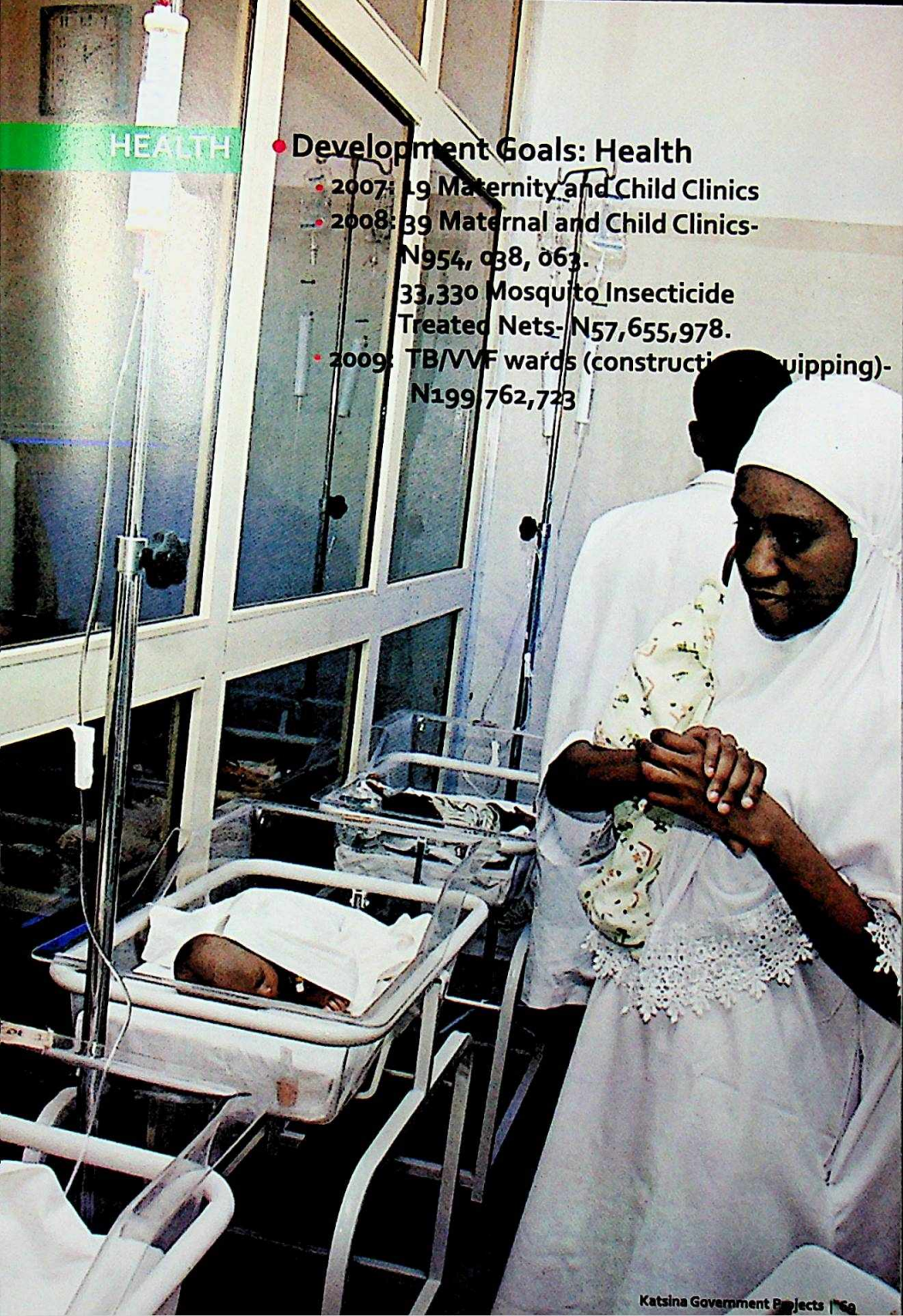

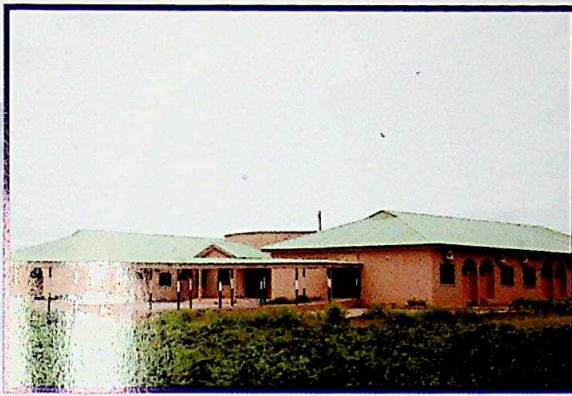

Human Capital Development

More than N2 billion has gone into this area, which is a major priority of the administration. The Government has within two years established 52 Cottage Industries, utilizing the vast mineral deposits in the state. Further details of the government's human capital development activities:

- The state government has set up 28 paint cottage industries and 20 chalk cottage industries at the cost of N135,790,700.65. A total of 555 youths were trained. (332 youths are engaged at the 28 paint cottage industries established at the cost of N78,353,350.65, while 223 youths work in the 20 chalk cottage industries which were set up with N57,437,350.00)
- Four fertilizer-blending plants have been constructed at Batsari, Maiadua Safana and Bakori at the cost of N117,961,681 (including equipment, laboratory facility, logistic and the training of 100 staff)
- Government has disbursed N100 million interest-free loans to about 6,000 traders and artisans under the Small Trades Special Credit Scheme
- It is also distributing N106 million under the youth entrepreneurship and small and medium enterprises loan schemes. A total of 3,218 artisans and SME's to benefit. A census of SME's in 28 trades was conducted in selected areas of the three senatorial districts and a total of 11,229 of such enterprises were registered under the first phase: 2,835 in Daura, 4,377 in Katsina and 4,017 in Funtua senatorial



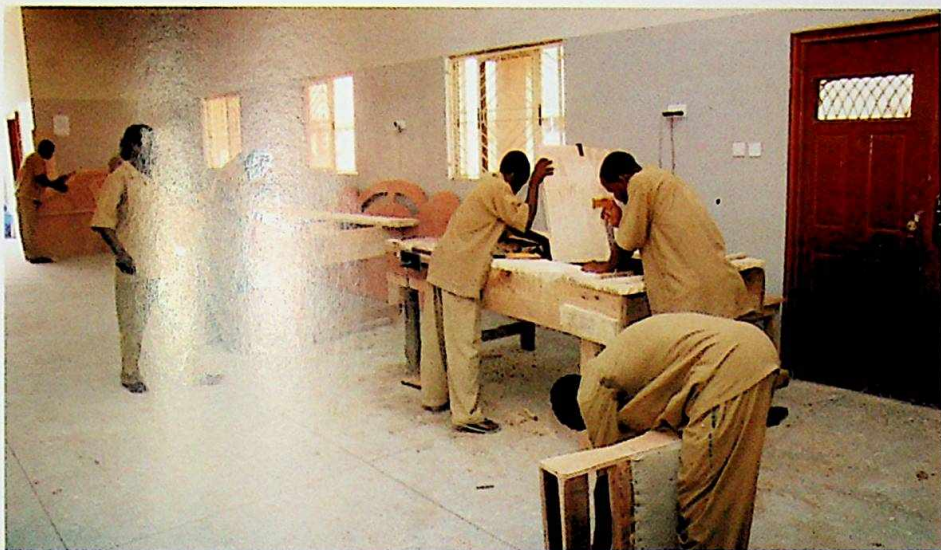

zones. The census was meant to guide the government in planning intervention portfolios for the SME's

- Ng6.05 million was spent by the government to train 50 youths on high-tech welding at Nigeria Naval Engineering Training College, Sapele
- More than N301 million was spent on the construction and equipping of Youth Craft Village in Katsina. The Center offer training in 16 different trades and is expected to accommodate 2,000 trainees annually
- Issuance of solar-powered mobile barbing kits to 500 youths at a subsidized rate. The kits were procured by the government at the cost of N21.5million
- Over 2000 people, including women,

benefited from the Local Quarry Operations Support Program (compressors, drilling accessories and explosives) in nine LGAs (Bakori, Faskari, Matazu, Safana, Batagarawa, Jibia, Maŕhi, Dutsi, Sandamu). The program cost more than N5.58 million

- Over 4,397 youths were trained on various skills at the upgraded 10 Basic Apprentice Training Centers in the state. The government has spent N197.150 million to construct and equip the three new Basic Apprentice Training Centers (BATC) at Batsari, Kankara and Danja. (N141.917 on construction and N55.23 million on equipment).



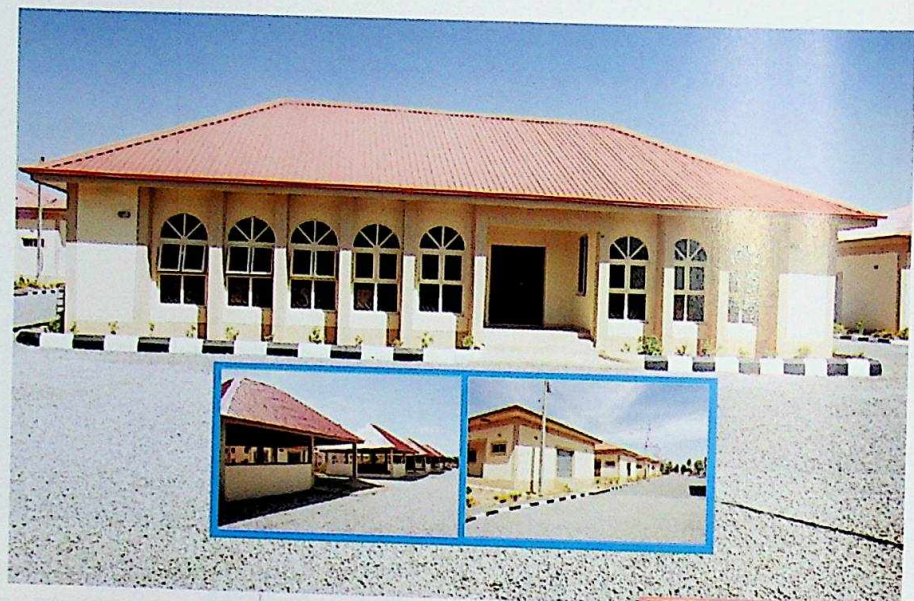
Some 417 persons trained by the BATCs were offered loan under the Youth Entrepreneurship Loan Scheme. N30 million was released to the agency. N10.43 million was spent on the repairs of vocational schools destroyed by rain storm. 2,110 other youths were trained under a special vocational training and attachment 80 percent of the trainees were absorbed by their master craftsmen. N27.72 million has gone into it in the past two years. Some 2,246 people were trained under Agricultural Vocational Training at the six schools located at Kafinsoli, Tashar Nagulle, Tambu, Daudawa, Gidan Kwakwa and Layin Minista. A total of 2,563 applicants were assisted to secure employment in

GOVERNMENT/NAPEP/OCEANIC BANK/CELTEL PARTNERSHIP

The government contributed N200 million under the multi-partner microfinance under NAPEP. Oceanic Bank also contributed N200 million, while NAPEP put in N40 million to empower 847 groups in the state. N361.29 million was issued to the groups on loan.

More than 1000 jobs were created in partnership with Celtel. N124 million was disbursed to 73 groups under the NAPEP Village Economic Development Solution Program.

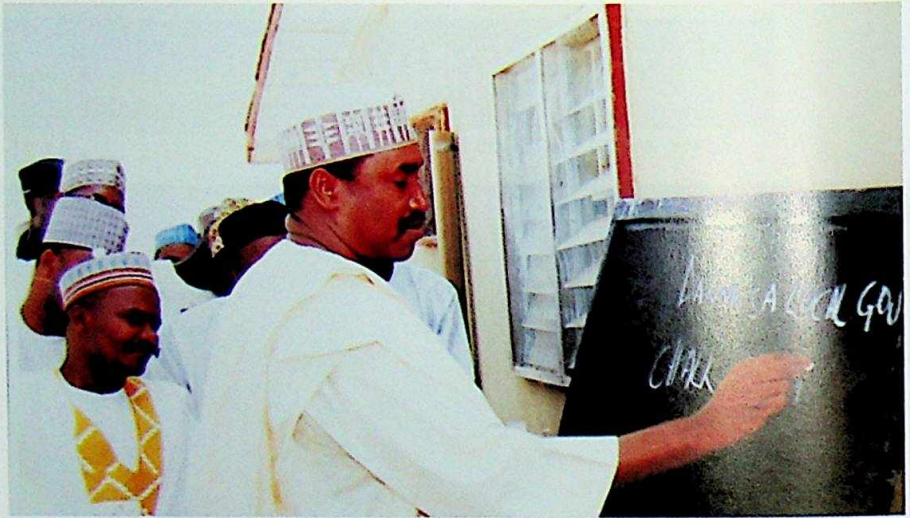

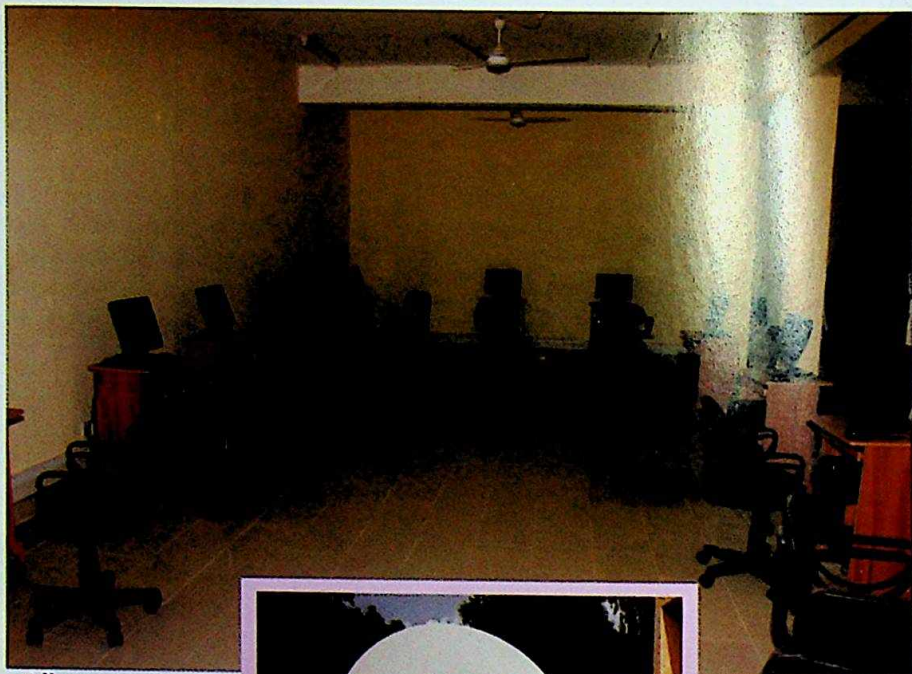

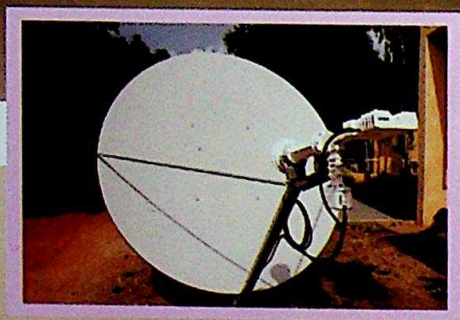
- The moribund Katsina State Radio Corporation was re-equipped and reactivated to cover the whole state and beyond.

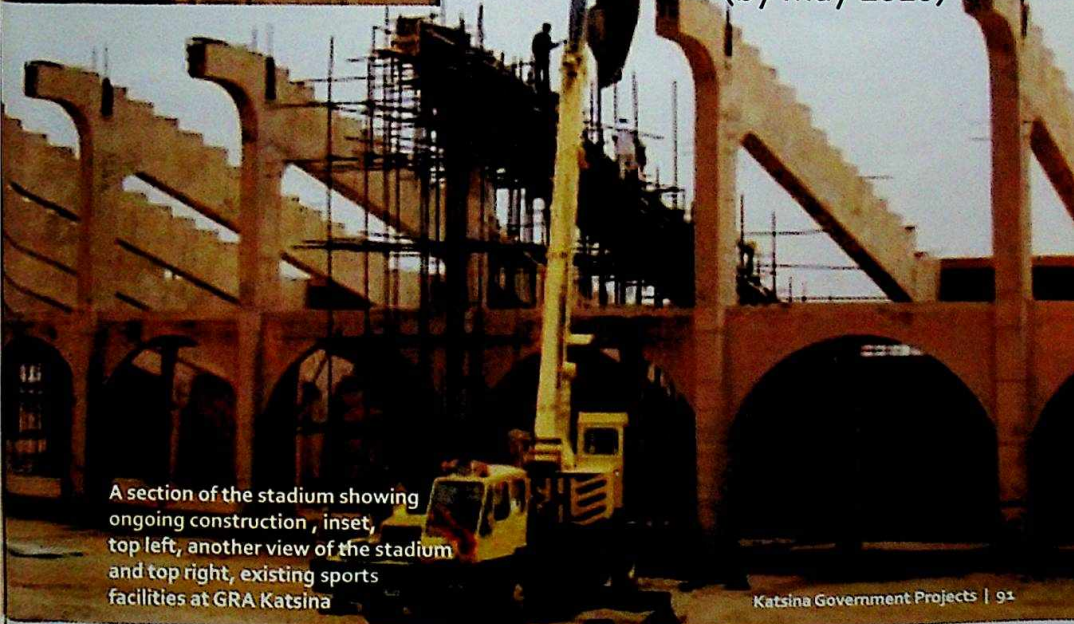

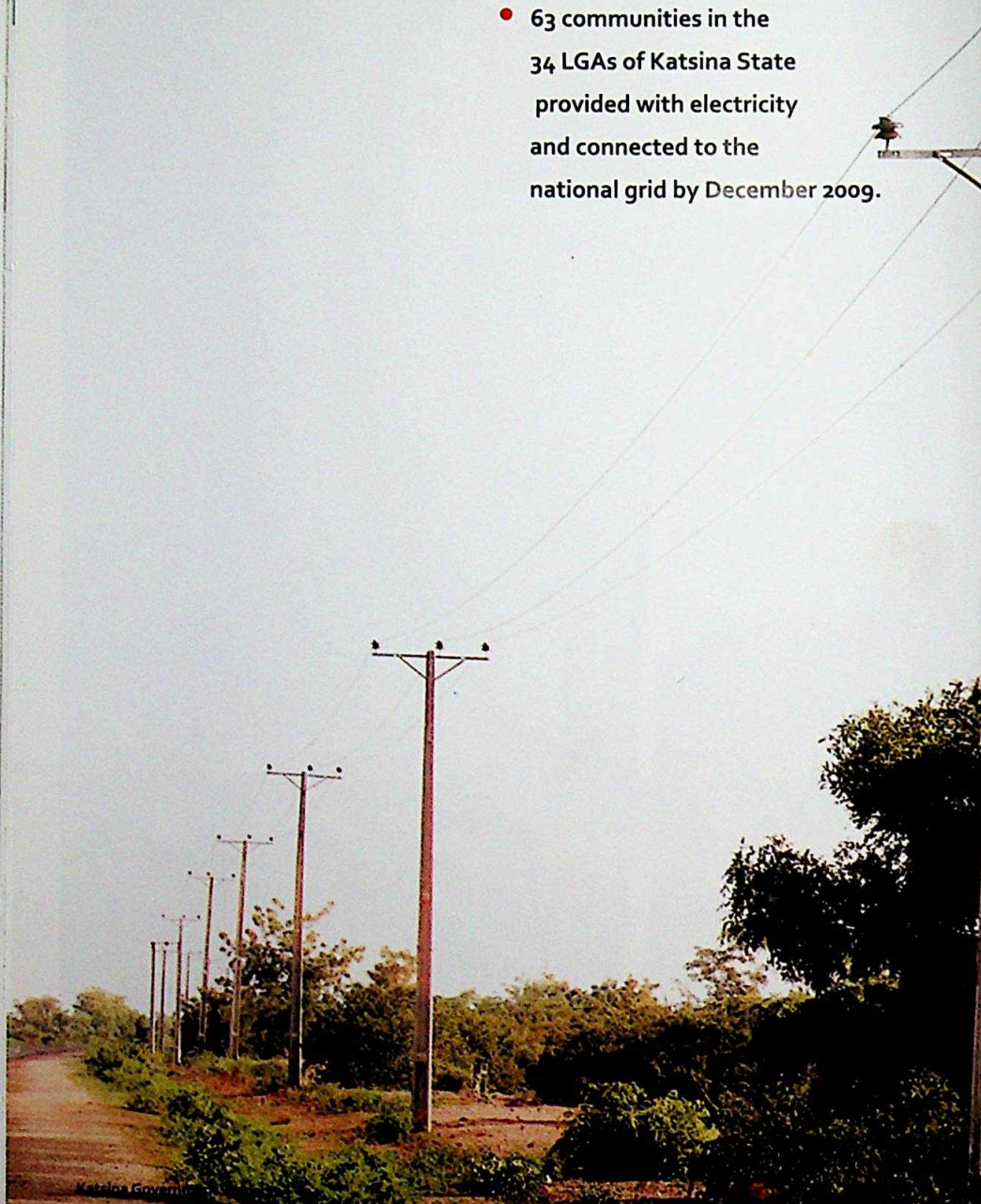

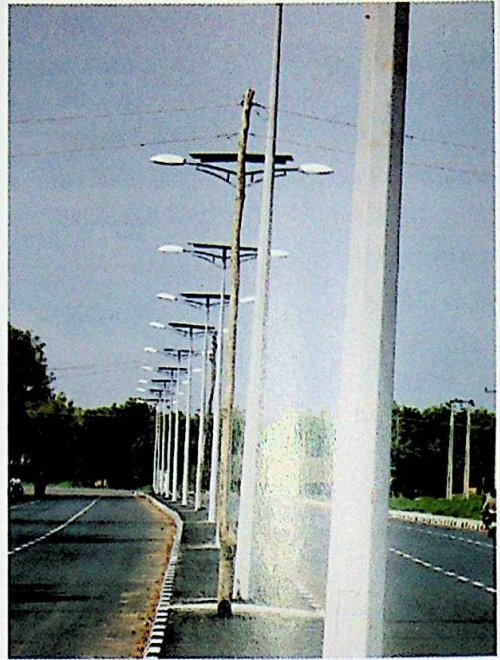
