



That Ogun State was created in February 1976 is a well-attested fact. But what many may not know or perhaps, have forgotten, is that it took the sacrifices of some people; their sheer determination, doggedness and sincerity of purpose to bring the state to its present enviable level of development.



### Executive Governor, Ogun State

In a commemorative lecture delivered to celebrate the 30th anniversary of Ogun State on February 6, 2006, Dr. Onaolapo Soleye, former Finance Minister of the Federal Republic and a member of the "pioneer cabinet", gave a

penetrating insight into how Ogun State came about in 1976.

The genesis, he recalled in the lecture, started with the setting up of the Justice Irikefe (now late) Commission, which recommended the creation of

seven additional states for the country, but did not include Ogun State. It therefore, took the iron determination of Ogun State founding fathers to bring about the state.



Some of those who played prominent roles included Chief Toye Coker, Chief Jonathan Odebiyi, Olori Yetunde Gbadebo, Alhaji Adenekan and many others. The decision to merge the four groups of Yewa, Awori, Ijebu and Egba were finally sealed when Chief Simeon



Adebo contacted Chief Obafemi Awolowo and the late Oba Lipede contacted the Awujale of Ijebuland, Oba Sikiru Adetona.

The issue of Abeokuta as state capital was resolved peacefully after initial wrangling. So also was the issue of assets sharing. Said Dr. Soleye in his lecture: "The difficulty of sharing assets equitably was appreciated. We were committed to continue to live together as brothers to avoid breaking the bond that bind us as Youruba Omo Odua, hence the establishment of Odua Investment Company Limited."

All the commissioners supported the idea of Odua Investment Company at a secret meeting held at the Old Premier's Lodge, Iyaganku, at the instance of Major Gen. Olutoye. All present pledged to go to their respective states to add value to the projects inherited from their predecessors in office. The first governor appointed for the state was Lt. Col. Saidu Ayodele Balogun.


Mr. A. A. K. Degun, the first Secretary to the State Government and Head of Service, in his reminiscences, described some of the constraints the first crop of civil servants who moved to Ogun had as "daunting problems". Mr. Degun was the most senior civil servant that led the cream of Ogun civil servants when the state was created.

"The infrastructure was nil," he said. "Most of those transferred to Abeokuta had their families in Ibadan and had to commute everyday. Mr. Degun recalled that they were confronted with the serious problem of accommodation. "In fact, I would say that we virtually had no accommodation because Abeokuta was a divisional headquarters and we are now having it converted into a state capital almost immediately.

I was virtually living in my car everyday, packing my load to the office at the back of the car and coming in the evening to unload my television, radio, and other luggage, because my quarters were being refurbished and we could not stay in a hotel. I had four permanent secretaries living in a room in the catering rest house. There was no hotel," Degun said.

Dr. Soleye recalled the unwillingness of officials of the State Government to take foreign investors to Premier Hotel, Ibadan, in Oyo State even though Ogun State was a part owner. Lafia Hotel at Apata, located in the outskirts of Ibadan, became a choice. He added that it was the unwillingness to take investors to Lagos or Ibadan that fired their resolve to build our own Ogun State hotel, the first phase of which was completed in one year and five months.

The same determination went into the establishment of Ogun State Printing Press, Ogun Radio, Ogun State Polytechnic and many other critical establishments.

## The Grand Take-off...

The regime of Otunba Gbenga Daniel, which took off on May 29, 2003, has recorded what many people proudly refer to as "run-away successes."

Following his victory at the polls on April 19, 2003, Otunba Daniel swung into action, moving at a dizzying speed nobody ever imagined or believed.

through the Transition Work Group even before we assumed office, we have been burning the candlelight since we came into office, all with the aim of getting things right within a relatively short time.

"All those who have been working with me as well as those who have been opportuned to see us at work can bear testimony to the fact that we have not spared ourselves of the onerous task of redefining a new course of governance for our people."

There is no doubting the fact that Otunba Daniel has lived up to this mission: That of re-defining the future and prosperity of Ogun State. He has not only burnt the midnight candle, he has also changed the course of governance in Ogun State. His "business unusual" approach has become the hallmark of his leadership ability and a barometer for monitoring effectiveness, efficiency, consistency and spread of dividends of democracy to the people.

To describe OGD's take-off as Chief Executive of Ogun State as "grand" now amounts to saying the obvious. Not only has the take-off been grand, four and half years into his tenure the dividends of hard work, doggedness, faithfulness, diligence, honesty, patriotism are there for everybody to see. OGD's performance has not only met the expectations of the people, it has also surpassed them. His administration has brought sunshine into the lives of millions of indigenes of Ogun State and even beyond. OGD's administration in Ogun has brought help for


the helpless, hope for the hopeless and has made life more abundant for the people.

For the first 100 days in office the administration spent over N15 million to resuscitate Odeda Farm Institute for the training of 1,000 unemployed youths.

And to further boost agriculture, he procured immediately 26 new tractors while over 2,000 hectares of land was acquired for establishment of 20 more farm estates.

It is noteworthy that Agriculture has moved to the next level of growth and development since the over four and half years of his administration. Four thousand people have been trained on the farm institutes and whereas less than 1,000 people were trained for a span of over 40 years the institutes were created during the regime of Chief Obafemi Awolowo as Premier of Western Region.

It is on record that finances of the state have efficiently improved and pro-actively managed under a dynamic Commissioner, Mr. Lekan Bello, since the take-off of the administration. As part of the grand take-off, all arrears of salaries and pensions were carefully planned and cleared. It is to the credit of this administration that not a single individual has been relieved of his job; instead more people have been

offered employments.

Within OGD's first 100 days, he initiated the disbursement of N200 million to eight small-scale industrialists through the state's credit scheme. In addition 200 people, 10 each from the local government areas, with particular focus on artisans, were selected to benefit from another N10 million loan sourced from another development trust fund.

Within the first 100 days, and as an indication of the goodies that lay ahead of the people, most internal roads in Abeokuta, Ijebu-Ode, Sagamu, Ifako, Ota and other towns across the state were tarred and maintained for satisfactory vehicular movements.

At the last count, four ICT Polytechnics have been established and more universities have taken off.


It is interesting that the Second Term of the Governor took off at a speed not known to many Second Term public office holders.

\*His Excellency on a get-well-visit to Patients at General Hospital, Ijaiye, Abeokuta




## Olumo Rock in its Nakedness... without OGD touch.

At the inception of Otunba Gbenga Daniel's administration, Olumo Rock was just a sleepy tourists centre with little or no concrete development. Its huge potential as a veritable tourism goldmine had been left largely untapped in the last 30 years since the state was created. But for the devotees, Olumo Rock was

reduced to a site visited by just a few people during holiday periods and some school children on excursions. Expectedly, the payback to the government and the people was near zero.

When Governor Daniel visited the site early in his administration, the fact that only very feeble attempts



were made in the past to tap its huge tourism potential was very glaring from the rowdy environment that confronted him and members of his entourage.

Only a few lion-hearted among those who accompanied the Governor could venture to climb the intimidating rock because of its slippery terrain. Some tripped on the way, while others aborted the journey. At the base of the Rock after the energy-sapping expedition, Governor Daniel suddenly exclaimed, "Yes, I have found it!" He concluded that engineering ingenuity could still make it possible for tourists, who could not climb the rugged terrain through the old, greasy and delicate staircase to the top. All that needs to be done was the installation of elevators that would take tourists to the peak of the historical Rock. However, this posed great engineering challenge because of the topography.


However, it did not overwhelm the Governor and he gave the go-ahead for the commencement of a comprehensive redevelopment of Olumo Rock. The turnaround began with the selection of a competent architect as project designer, and another competent contractor for the main task. Incidentally both men are indigenes of Abeokuta. The two "sons of the soil" were deliberately picked to ensure the traditional sanctity and cultural values of Olumo Rock are protected in spite of the redevelopment.

The result of two years of painstaking planning and execution of the project is now a tourism site of international standard. There are three lift stations and bridges to link each of the stations. So, we can now get to different levels of the rock without sweating. However, the young and agile

can still choose to go up all the way via foot as the ancient pathway to the summit of the rock has been preserved.

The three fully air-conditioned panoramic elevators are undoubtedly rare spectacles. And the last of the elevators would take you to the observatory pad. At that level you are standing on a 28-storey building and can have a bird's eye view of some historical sites of the ancient town of Abeokuta. First to come into view is the ancestral home of the late Chief M.K.O. Abiola, acclaimed winner of the annulled June 12, 1993 Presidential election and businessman extraordinaire, which was recently refurbished by the Ogun State Government. Then you cannot miss the St. Peter's Church, Ake, reputed to be the first to be built in the country by Christian Missionaries led by Henry Townsend. The Central Mosque, Kobiti, also looms large in the horizon while Egunya Hill site of the Baptist Boys High School can also be seen from the peak of the mountain. The free-flowing River Ogun, from which the state takes its name, is also clearly visible from the top of Olumo Rock. The view from the top is both captivating and exhilarating.

As they journey through different levels of the Rock, tourists would see the more than 300-year-old tree whose roots are mysteriously buried in the inner crevices of the rock. At the base of the Rock modernity actually meets tradition as a group of old women, who make supplications for childless couples, take turns in praying for those who ask them. So, for those who come for sight-seeing and deeper needs of life, they would find the new Olumo Rock irresistible.



Other new features incorporated into the site as part of the development carried out by the Gbenga Daniel administration include a Public Hall that can conveniently sit more than 200 people, Food Court (Sweet Sensation has already set up an outlet to cater for tourists and other visitors to the site), Museum, Exhibition Foyer, Standby Generator, Modern Public Toilet, Parking Lot and a water

fountain, all located in the Central Activity Area.


The transformation has already received the seal of approval from Oba Adedotun Aremu Gbadebo, Alake and Paramount ruler of Egbaland. "The new Olumo Rock is a pride to the Egba race. Tourism is now a tool for economic development and I am optimistic that the redevelopment of Olumo Rock will contribute to the economic development of Abeokuta, Ogun State, and Nigeria. I am sure we would now sing our Egba anthem with more gusto," the revered monarch said after a visit to the site his ancestors took refuge in the days of yore.


The man, who knows that tourism is now a tool for economic development and social engineering in leading countries of the world, has also given Governor Daniel a pat on the back for putting Ogun State and Nigeria on World Tourism Map. "The transformation of this historic edifice is an acceptance of the challenge I threw at the Governor to boost tourism in Ogun State. The new look Olumo Rock has made Abeokuta more attractive to tourists from within and outside the country," Chief Olusegun Obasanjo, who set up a Presidential Committee on Tourism Development in Nigeria, said at the commissioning of the site.

Traders at the nearby Itoku Market, where the famous and beautiful Adire clothes are sold, are also benefiting from the redevelopment of Olumo Rock through increased patronage from tourists. 16





## Second Term...

# OGD's First 1000 Days of Action

## ...With commissioning of several projects

For over two and a half decades, it was a rich state wallowing in wants. Blessed with human and natural resources, but grounded economically and thus popularly regarded as a civil service state. The paradigm suddenly shifted with new foundation for prosperity laid in Ogun State on May, 29th 2003.

It was a silent revolution, which blossomed

s secured by discerning people of the secured by discerning changes in governance, economy are astructural development so much desired by

the people for long.

It is pertinent to mention that celebration of first 100 days in office is novel, a mere tradition so to say, but it cannot be used as an index in benchmarking a visionary and performing government whose programmes interwove the past and the future. Suffice it to say that the second term programmes and activities rested squarely on the foundation laid at the first term with a solid agenda for a secured future. The various short, medium and long term projects are therefore key in the developmental agenda.

For those who held the view that a second term Governor has nothing to offer, the searchlight should be beamed elsewhere and definitely not Ogun State where the tempo of development is on fast track.


The first 100 days clearly attested to the resolve of an administration to generate massive employment, encourage private sector participation in development, promote economic empowerment aimed at improving the general well being of the people.

Continuous attention were focused on infrastructural, social and economic development as well as good governance. Indeed the era of mega employment is here, with the various investment drives yielding the desired results. Employment generation is underlying the various mega projects completed during the first term as well as very many other on-going construction works i.e. roads, housing, infrastructure among others, across the length and breadth of the state.

Whereas many corporate organizations make billions of dollars in revenue from Nigeria, but few have shown high level impact and commitment to real social responsibility, the current model being run in Ogun State will not allow for such. Part of the new initiative within the first 100 days was the introduction of local content policy, which seeks to protect the corporate interest of the state.

The policy would not only guide new investments, but would also ensure the engagement of personnel in the area of operations of investors, procurement of materials from the state and the patronage of local firms. With this arrangement, not less than 40% of skilled staff to be engaged by new investors must be sourced from the state while the percentage for unskilled staff is 70%.

What then are the implications of the policy visa-vis the various economic initiatives? With the number of multi-billion naira investments being






Cross section of dignitaries at a public function

cited in the state, the era of prosperity for the people is here.

In the last three years, the response of both local and foreign investors to the Daniel administration's development initiatives cannot be over-emphasized.

Today, the Ogun State axis of the Lagos-Ibadan expressway is one of the fastest growing

economic spots in the country, while various industrial parks are being developed.

Some of the new entries included Multi-Trex, a cocoa processing factory located in Isheri, with employment capacity of 500 (direct) and 5,000 (indirect). The Ekha Agro Farms Limited in Ibafo is also a result of the private sector initiative in the state. This is a state of the art cassava based glucose syrup company with annual output

capacity of 30,000 metric tonnes of high grade glucose syrup.

The company currently engages more than 20,000 Nigerians through its network of out growers and contract farmers producing over 120,000 metric tonnes of cassava required by the company. This has further underscored the cassava revolution in the state, especially with the farming activities at various farm estates, thus increasing the per capital income of an average farmer.

Another company, Real Confectionaries, off Aiyetoro Road, Abeokuta, is currently engaging not less than 50 direct staff and 200 indirect staff while a visit to the Ofada Vee Tee Rice in Ewekoro Local Government revealed construction work in progress with indigenes fully involved and local rice farmers engaged on the rice plantation. It would be recalled that the State Government continued to encourage rice farming through 50% subsidy on rice milling machines to farmers.

The Plant Gate Company with a fleet of 50 tractors is also being patronized by farmers in the State. When completed it has the capacity to generate 50,000 employments for its various sectors such as rice parboiling, milling, bagging and marketing.

The WEMPCO Group of companies has also relocated its headquarters to Ogun State. The multibillion dollar investment in ceramic tiles, roofing sheets, PVC products and steel rolling mills is nearing completion on the Ibafo axis of the state. The first phase of the project, according to the Group Managing Director, Lewis Thung, is capable of providing 2,500 employment opportunities.

With the massive construction workings going on in the Gateway City Development Company, Isheri, where over fifteen local and foreign investors were constructing various housing projects coupled with the various housing programmes in the three senatorial districts of the state, thousands of job opportunities had been created while many people would be proud owners of their own houses.

A visit to the new Ilaro Stadium under construction also revealed a picture of indigenous engineers participating directly in the construction works. The multiplier effect on the socio-economic activities is legion. The corporate head-quarters of the Gateway City Development Company is one of the projects that would be commissioned within the first 100 days of this administration.

Perhaps, the greatest of the Mega employment generating projects is the Olokola Free Trade Zone and Liquified Natural Gas Project,

which many believe would absorb thousands of people in the nearest future.



As part of measures to enhance efficiency in business, some of the ailings government companies like the Gateway Pharmaceutical Company and Print Corp have been privatized while the former Bulk Purchasing Company has been transformed into Gateway Trading Company Incorporated.

The first 100 days in office also witnessed the reinvigoration of the State Employment Generation Programme (OGEGEP) which had been upgraded to the status of a Bureau. A job sourcing and placement Centre had been created to serve as a Labour Exchange, office while the OGUGRAD scheme (for Graduates) continue unabated.

The recent launch of the Data survey of the employed which kicked off simultaneously in all the twenty local governments, is also part of the derivables within the 100 days which would bring succour to the jobless in the state.

The beneficiaries of the State Human Capital Development programme in the UK are settling down for business through their integration into key government agencies like the Gateway Holdings, the OKFTZ/LNG projects while the Regional Master Plan Office under the governor's office is fully on ground.

The entire civil servants in the State would also count their gains as the first 100 days witnessed the implementation of 15% increase the new package. About 200 housing units, already completed, being the first phase of the 1,000 workers estate at Laderin, Abeokuta, been also commissioning.

The people of ljebu-Ode are anxiously waiting for Otunba Daniel to commission the newly dualised road leading into the Obanta city while the earthmoving equipment of the State Road Management Agency and the Ministry of Works continue to construct and rehabilitate roads across the state. The popular Lalubu Street in Oke-Ilewo Abeokuta would also be ready to keep pace with the phenomenal growth of the state capital while the newly created Ministry of Water Resources and Rural Development is set to tackle the perennial water problem and embark on aggressive development at the grassroots.

With various programmes on health, education, Tourism, ICT, agriculture, sports, commerce and industries, human capital development, among others currently being implemented, the stage is set for a more prosperous state.

Generally, all these would translate into economic development and socio-economic well being of the people. Definitely, these transcend the 100 days in office. The list is endless.

## ACTIVITIES OF THE MINISTRY OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT & CHIEFTAINCY AFFAIR

As part of his mission to ensure effective distribution of the dividends of democracy among grassroots people of Ogun State, His Excellency, Otunba Gbenga Daniel, the Governor of Ogun State, created the Ministry of Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs in May, 2005. The Ministry, was specifically set up to effectively monitor the activities of the Local Government Councils as well as to improve the welfare of traditional institutions in the State.

Essentially, the projects and activities of the Ministry are anchored by the Department of Local Government Affairs, Department of Chieftaincy Affairs, Department of Local Government Inspectorate and Monitoring and the Department of Rating and Valuation while the Department of Finance and Administration services the Ministry.

During the period under review, the first 100 days in office of His Excellency, Otunba Gbenga Daniel, witnessed developmental activities which have tremendous impact on the lives of the people. The Ministry's oversight activities are highlighted hereunder:

#### CHIEFTAINCY AFFAIRS:

During the first 100 days of this Administration, the Ministry ensured that peace and harmony continue to reign in the Traditional Institutions in the State. #### **Local Government**

The Ministry coordinates and controls activities of the twenty (20) Local Government the State. In this regard, the Ministry continue monitor and ensure that the Administra guidelines issued to the Local Governments we used as guide in their activities. These Guidelines have been re-issued to the Chairmen of Transition Committees who assumed office July, 2007. These committees were set up oversee the affairs of Local Governments pend the election of new executives for the Local Governments.

In order to properly equip the new functionaries the Local Governments for accountability a



transparency, the Ministry with the consent of His Excellency, the Governor organised a two-day retreat for the Transition Committees Chairmen and Members and some top Local Government officials in the State. The opportunity of the Retreat was used to impress on the officials to improve on their Internal of Generated Revenue so as to reduce the over-condence on monthly funds from the Federation Count. Other activities of the Ministry in the the owing:

Service Settle Local Government Joint Account Committee (JAAC) to Unsure Settle Local Government of funds accrued to Account Governments from the Federation Account.

Service the Ogun State Boundary Committee whose main responsibility is to formulate ideas and policies towards settling all intra/inter-state and International boundary disputes.

Put in place excellent strategy for collaboration and effective communication with the Local Governments through a monthly meeting of the Chairmen of Local Government Transition Committee in the State with the Hon. Commissioner for Local Government. At the meeting, matters of common interests to Local Governments were

discussed.

The Ministry monitored and inspected all projects embarked upon by the Local Government Councils in the State to ensure conformity with standards.

During the period under review, the Ministry only planned and commenced preparation for its next round of inspection visits to the Local Governments having taken cognizance of the need to allow the new appointees to settle down. During its visits, the Ministry would ensure that the 20 Local Government Councils in Ogun State comply with the tenets and mission of LEEDS, MOOS, Regional Master plan and Agenda For A Secured Future.

#### RATING AND VALUATION

This Ministry is saddled with the responsibility of

entrenching transparency and accountability at the Local Government Councils as well as enhancing their revenue base by encouraging them to improve on their Internally-Generated Revenue. It is envisaged that this is a measure to reduce the overdependence of Local Governments on Federal Allocation.

#### CONCLUSION

The Ministry of Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs has bought into the vision of His Excellency, Otunba Gbenga Daniel, the Governor of Ogun State, to ensure virile and sustainable Local Governments in Ogun State. The activities of the Ministry therefore would continue to focus on the rejuvenation of Local Government Administration for accountability and transparency.

During the period under review, the Ministry inspected and graded 1,126.75 tonnes of Cocoa, 4,932.5 tonnes of Palm Kernels, 211.5 tonnes of Cashew and 1,640.24 of Rubber.

#### (ii) Fish Seed Production:

A total of eight hundred (800) Clarias fish of various sizes and nine hundred and thirty-seven (937) Tilapia fish seeds were sold to the public.

(iii) Sale of Fishing Inputs (Fishing Nets):

A total of sixty-seven (67) bundles of fishing nets were sold at various prices to fisherfolk at 50% subsidy and nineteen (19) Fisherfolk were registered.

#### (iv) Tree Crops Development and Horticulture:

During the period under review, the left over of Oilpalm seedlings of the year 2004 were sold. Also, the stock balance of 2005 oil palm seedlings production programme were maintained and equally sold to farmers.

The Ministry has started distributing the 820,000 Cocoa seedlings under the National Cocoa Development Committee (NCDC) programme raised by the Ministry to farmers free of charge to enhance Cocoa production in the State.

#### (v) Cotton Ginnery at Ibara-Orile:

The processing of all the Cotton seeds that were brought from all the South Western parts of the Country to the Ginnery at Ibara-Orile have been completed. In addition, all the cotton growing farmers in the State were supplied seed cotton for the 2007 planting season. Also, a Train-the-trainers-workshop on Cotton development in the South West Zone of the country was concluded at OGADEP Training Hall, Abeokuta, between the 20th and 27th July, 2007.

(vi) Veterinary Hospital Clinics and Sub-Clinics:

A total of 3,931 cases for the treatment and

vaccination of small animals were carried out during period.

#### (vii) Meat Inspection:

The Ministry carried out ante-mortem and pomortem inspections of animals before consumption the public. In all 77,891 carcasses were inspected acertified fit for human consumption.

#### (viii) Control Post and Cattle Market:

Routine clinical examinations were carried out animals that passed through the various control posts the State. To this end, 576,816 animals of Cattle, She Goats and Camels were inspected during the periunder review.

#### (ix) Poultry Diagnostic Unit:

This project handled the treatment and vaccination poultry in the State. During the period under review 77,147 birds were vaccinated and treated for variodisease conditions.

#### (x) Crop Enumeration Activities:

The Ministry enumerated 1,015 hectares of land to corporate bodies and 15 hectares for individuals croppers whose crops were destroyed as a result of later allocated to investors for agricultural production. Aparticipate in the Agro Cargo Airport project and participate in the crop enumeration exercise for the Oloko Liquefied Natural Gas Project in Ogun Water Side Loc Government Area.

#### (xi) Anti-Rabies Campaign:

#### (xii) Avian Influenza/Bird Flu Control:





## THE ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES OF THE MINISTRY OF FORESTRY

#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Ministry of Forestry, a statutory government agency, was carved out of the former Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry in August 2004.

The primary responsibility of the Ministry is to ensure rapid development of the state's forest resources in all ramifications. In other words, the agency is to coordinate all forestry activities in the state and ensure controlled and orderly exploitation of timber and non-timber forest produce so as to prevent soil degradation and other natural disasters such as earthquake, flood, global warming, etc. which could result from deforestation. It is also to ensure the management of forest in the state on sustained yield basis.

#### 2.0 POLICY FOCUS/OBJECTIVES OF THE MINISTRY

In order to fully exploit the potentials that abound in the state's forestry sub-sector, the Ministry is guided by the underlisted policy objectives:

- 2.1 To ensure adequate and continuous supply of forest resources through annual regeneration rate that is higher than exploitation.
- 2.2 To use forestry sub-sector as a policy instrument and a veritable tool for job creation for youths, rural dwellers, etc. in line with the poverty alleviation policy of the present administration.
- 2.3 To protect our forest estates against any form of encroachment, damage or destruction.
- 2.4 To mount extensive campaigns on the need for individuals, schools, communities and other Non-Governmental Organisations to plant trees on their private farm land.
- 2.5 To develop, manage and protect wildlife in order to prevent the extinction of rare or endangered species.
- 3.0 Economic Activities Of The Ministry Of Forestry Since Inception Of Otunba Gbenga Daniel's Administration

#### 3.1 Silvicultural Projects

#### 3.1.1 <u>Timber Seedlings Production</u>

With the advent of the present administration of Otunba Gbenga Daniel, the forest regeneration programme in the state received tremendous boost and attention. Between 2003 – 2006, over four million, three hundred thousand (4,300,000) seedlings of Teak, Gmelina and other indigenous species were raised in our nurseries located in the various forest reserves in the state. A substantial part of the seedlings was used to establish plantations in the various government forest reserves while the rest were sold to private farmers, communities, schools, NGO's, etc at highly subsidized rates. The massive seedlings

production arose out of the need to bridge the uncomfortable gap existing between fores exploitation and regeneration.

#### 3.1.2 Plantation Establishment

In Nigeria, the annual rate of deforestation is put a about 5% of the forested area, which was a result of human activities. Since the coming on board of the present administration of Otunba Gbenga Daniel the Ministry has endeavoured to locat other ways of mainstreaming environment is o its plans policies and programmes. We a very much concerned and determined more a ever to reverse the loss of environmental repurces thus conforming to the United Nations Development Goals on Environmenta Sustainability. Between 2003-Septembe and 2007 a total of 1,891Ha of new forest plantations were established in all the nine forest reserves. The sites were evenly distributed among the three Senatoria With this annual rate of plantation Districts. establishment, the supply of wood materials would





outstrip the demand in the nearest future, thus Ogun State would revert back to its former position of an exporter of timber to other states and internationally.

3.3.3 Private Sector Afforestation Programme

In line with the private sector driven economic policy of the present administration, the Ministry of Forestry introduced the Private Sector Afforestation initiative. In order to ensure full implementation of this policy, an Inter- Ministerial Committee was inaugurated on March 4, 2005. The membership cuts across government agencies, timber contractors, Forestry Association of Nigeria (FAN), NGO's, etc. With this Committee in place a lot of achievements have been, recorded, which included the review of the obsolete forestry law which was hitherto a hindrance private participation in forestry plantation establishment. It should be noted that between 2005 and September, 2007, over 100,000 timber seedlings were purchased by private farmers, schools etc. This is a testimony to the success of the policy. Similarly, during the period of this report, Omo Wood, a private concern planted, over 905Ha of land with timber seedlings of various species. This policy would shift emphasis from government plantations, thus reducing to the barest minimum the incidence of illegal elling

During the first ever forestry week which took place between, July 11–13, 2005 to further consolidate our clarion call to the organized private sector to adopt forest plantation establishment, His Excellency, Otunba Gbenga Daniel at the occasion donated over 6,000 free tree seedlings to schools and Local Governments. Similarly, the Ministry, during the 100 days anniversary of His Excellency's second term also donated 6200 free tree seedlings and planting tools to selected schools and timber contractors to encourage their involvement in afforestation.

#### 3.3.5 Verification of Cocoa Farms

Before the advent of the present Administration, there was a case of wanton destruction of matured timber trees. With the coming on board of Otunba Gbenga Daniel as the Governor of Ogun State, the operations of these cocoa farmers have been streamlined. Over 12,000 acres of illegal cocoa farms have been verified. The Ministry also introduced the payment of annual ground rent and agreement fees by the cocoa farmers to retain the ownership status of the reserves by the state government.

#### 3.2 Regulation and Utilization Projects 3.2.1 Timber Exploitation

A substantial number of people earn their livelihood from timber and timber-related industries. In order to keep these categories of people in business, it is the deliberate policy of the Ministry to allocate part of its plantation to timber contractors for controlled exploitation. Between 2004 and September, 2007, over 2,500Ha of land were allocated to the timber contractors from the forest reserves for exploitation. In order to check illegal felling operations and give room for effective administration of logging activities, the Ministry introduced the use of stickers and tallies for timber contractors.

#### EVACUATION OF TIMBER FROM THE FOREST RESERVE

3.2.2 <u>Issuance of Property Hammers and Registration of Sawmills</u>

As our contribution to the promotion of self employment by the people of Ogun State, the Ministry gave further incentives for the establishment of private sawmills and procurement of property hammers. Consequently, there are about 355 registered private sawmills in Ogun State as at September 2007.

#### 3.3.3 Casting of New Forest Guard Hammers

Over 100 pieces of new Forest Guard hammers were produced to replace the ageing ones which were no longer legible on logs. This vital instrument has been boosting our revenue generation from the forests.

3.3.4 Provision of New Motorcycles

As part of our effort to strengthen log control and forest protection activities, the Governor of Ogun State, Otunba Gbenga Daniel graciously approved

and released funds for the purchase of over 200 new motorcycles for distribution to the field officers on revolving loan. The last batch of 20 motorcycles were commissioned and distributed by His Excellency as part of activities to mark the 100 days of his second term. This gesture had succeeded in reducing the incidence of illegal felling through effective patrol of the reserves while revenue also increased tremendously.

#### 3.3.5 Coppice Management

For the first time in several years, coppice management was introduced as a forest management/maintenance strategy. This is the professional method for managing forests for better yield of timber and revenue in future.

#### 3.3.6 Purchase of Forest/Boundary Guard Uniforms

The Ministry procured for our Uniformed Field Staff 179 and 225 pairs of uniforms in 2005 and 2006 respectively. This gave a total of 404 complete sets of uniforms since inception of the present administration.

#### 3.4 Non-Timber Forest Projects

It is the bold determination of the present administration to continue to explore the alternative sources of livelihood to timber. This led to the new concept of Non-Timber Forest Projects. These projects would no doubt serve as good sources of employment for our farmers, youths, retirees, etc. Such projects are money spinners and they include:


#### 1.1.1 Honey Production (Apiculture)

The Ministry of Forestry succeeded in establishing a Pilot Honey Production Project. A total of 100 beehives were established in all the three Senatorial Districts. The project is a clear demonstration of the capability of honey production to create job thus providing self employment for young school leavers both in the urban and rural areas. In fact, the Ministry is currently working collaboratively with the Gateway Front Foundation (GFF) and AMREC of UNAAB to process and package honey tagged 'Gateway Honey' for sale to members of the public. Bearing this in mind, it is our avowed determination to popularize bee-keeping in the state as a veritable tool for poverty reduction. A 3-day Training Workshop on Community Honey Production for Local Government officials was recently organized by the Ministry in conjunction with the Gateway Front Foundation (GFF), at OGADEP's Training Hall, Idi-Aba, Abeokuta.








17, 2006, a one-day stakeholders' seminar on "Bamboo Based Development for Poverty Alleviation" took place at the NUT building, in Abeokuta. The seminar was in collaboration with the National Special Programme on Food Security (NSPFS) Abuja.

The Ministry is gradually shifting emphasis to this crop so as to popularize its production, processing and utilization to maximally exploit its economic potentials. In order to put to effect this proposal, the Ministry is partnering with a private company, GLIHIO Nigeria Ltd, to establish 5,000Ha of bamboo plantation in the state. The project will be sited at Akila, in J6 in Ijebu- East, Aworo and Ipake in Yewa North and South, respectively. Nursery works have commenced at Akila.

In addition, a team of experts from Abuja and the Forestry Research Institute of Nigeria (FRIN) visited Ogun State recently to assess our progress on bamboo development. For effective coordination of bamboo development work, a Bamboo Development Committee was set up and it has commenced work in earnest.







- · Development Pressure Zone (Mega City Region)

All these investment programmes coupled with the pressure from the developing pressure zones have caused a tremendous increase in population and it is still increasing. The resultant effect is the need to invest in Infrastructure to cope with the upsurge in population.

Provision of adequate, potable and quality water to the populace is one of the priorities of this administration. The State Government is aware of the need for the water provision agency to increase its facilities to meet the current challenges and overhaul its system and rehabilitate some of its old schemes to function at optimum capacities while necessary instrument is being put in place to develop Regional Water Schemes whereby all the identified six regions by the Regional Master plan are catered for. These would involve, Water Supply development that would optimize the available yield from the major rivers sources within the state.

In this regard, the State Government has taken bold steps to develop Regional Water Schemes designed for 2025 horizon:

- Proposed expansion of Apoje regional water scheme to 400 mld to supply the entire ljebu corridor up to Sagamu and Mowe corridor. Also to complement the existing scheme.
- · Proposed Yewa regional water scheme with the capacity of 200mld to cater for the entire lpokia and supplying up to the boundary of Alimosho (Lagos

State Boundary) with Ogun State.

The proposed 700mld Mokoloki regional watescheme to supply the entire

Owode, Ota up to Sagamu and back to Mowe corridor.

Necessary dialogue is on-going with the Federal Ministry of Water Resources, the Ogun-Osun River Basin Authority and the Mega City Authority on the above to ensure adequate raw water release from the River Basin Authority and where necessare expansion of impounding reservoir. Urban Water supply investment is capital intensive hence Multilateral funding would be required for these projects.

The challenges that we have had to face as a government in the area of water provision and distribution is enormous, this gave birth to the launch of a new corporate image for Ogun State Water Corporation tagged "THE NEW DAWN" on the 2nd of February 2007. Presently the amount of money spent in the provision and distribution of potable and pipe borne water is colossal in relation to the amount generated in terms of revenue collected, which is a far cry from the investment.

A total commitment is required of all to be able to have a sustainable water supply.

Complete reform of Ogun State Water Corporation is on-going to ensure right posture for the tasks ahead. A new General Manager/Chief Executive Officer is in place. An Executive Director Operations has also been appointed. Also, 68 new professionals out of which 50 are Engineers has been injected into the system. With this posture, the State Water Agency is set to achieve its objectives. It is clear in the mind of all that the reform is vital and the Government is in full support of the change.

The issue of commercial responsiveness is also being addressed to ensure that the water agency is able to break even.

## MINISTRY OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND COOPERATIVES

## HISTORICAL AND OPERATIONAL BACKGROUND

The Ministry of Community Development and Cooperatives was created in April 2005 by His Excellency, Otunba Gbenga Deniel, Governor of Ogun State, as part of his administration's efforts to develop infrastructures at the grassroots through the framework of Community Development and Cooperative Societies. It was created to serve as a bridge between the Local government, State government and the people at the community level who overtime, had not been recognized, catered for and largely abandoned.

The Cooperative Services Department of the then Ministry of Commerce, Industries and Cooperatives, and the Community Development Department of the former Ministry of Women Affairs and Community Department were excised from their parent Ministries to form the nucleus of the new Ministry of Community Development and Cooperatives.

#### MINISTRY'S POLICY THRUST

(a) Mobilization of the Community Development Association and Associations and Cooperative Societies as the agent of grassroots development and economic empowerment.

- (b) Mainstreaming Peace-Building and conflict resolution into Community Development Practices.
- (c) Facilitating the growth of Apex Trades
  Association.

## **DEPARTMENTS AND WORK PROCEDURE**

Structurally, the Ministry operates four (4) Department viz: Finance and Administration, Community Development, Cooperative Services, and Planning, Research and Statistics. The Ministry also runs two (2) training institutes viz: Cooperative College, Abeokuta and the Social Development Institute (Shasha), Iperu.

## (A) COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

#### Structure

The Department operates twenty (20) Zonal Offices, spread across all the Local Governments in the state. The Zonal Community Development Officers are charged with the responsibility of mobilizing and motivating the people, including monitoring of Community self-help projects at the grassroots. The Department also oversees the

Social Development Institute, Shasha, Iperu. The Institute is affiliated to the Olabisi Onabanjo University, Ago-lwoye, and runs the following courses:

(a) Certificate course in social work (12 months)

(b) 2-Year Diploma Course in Social Development

(c) Citizenship and Leadership training programme for Community Leaders.

The students' enrolment at the Social Development Institute for 2006/2007 academic session stands at One Hundred and Fifty Six (156), details of which are as follows:

**Certificate Course** 78 Diploma I 58 Diploma II Total

However, at the inception of this administration, the figure for 2002/ 2003 academic session was as follows:

**Certificate Course** Diploma I 56 Diploma II 51 Total 116

The Community Development Department comprises three Divisions at the Headquarters as follows:

- (a) Community Organization and Education The Division is responsible for Division: registering, mobilizing and sensitizing Community Development Associations on the need to embark on self-help projects and economic empowerment programmes that will improve the living standard of the people.
- (b) Research and Training Division: The Division is responsible for staff welfare and organisation of training, seminar and short courses for staff. It also monitors the activities of the Social Development Institute (Shasha), Iperu.
- (c) Community Self-Help Projects Division: The

Division is in charge of monitoring the self-h projects being executed by the Commun Development Associations, including the award grants-in-aid and subventions to eligible Commun Development Associations. It also anchors implementation of the Matching Grant scheme.

The distribution of grants is usually performed by state chief Executive who is also the Grand Patron of Ogun State Community Development Council. To credit, the present administration has disbursed 2004 and 2006 Grants-in-aid to worthy self-h projects.

## Functions of the Community Developme Department

The Department is charged with the underlis functions:

- Motivation and mobilization of rural communit and urban dwellers to provide most of their needs by themselves, with minimum support fr the Government
- Promotion of effective community organization a education to prepare the people for impromanagement of their affairs.
- III. Collaboration with financi Institutions/Development Partners to organize, P and implement Integrated Rural Development (IF Scheme; and
- IV. Capacity building programmes for commun development personnel and volunteers
- V. Ensuring conflict resolution and peace building the communities.

## Structure of Community Developme Organizations in the State:

The hierarchy of Community Developme Organizations in the states as follows:

#### (a) PRIMARY LEVEL:

Currently, there are three thousand and ninety to (3,092) registered Community Developme Comparatively, 2,62 Associations in the state. CDAs were registered before the inception of the

administration.

## (b) TERTIARY LEVEL:

This comprises:

- I. Twenty (20) Zonal Community Development Committees (2000s); and
- II. Fifty-six (56) Area Community Development Commisses (ACCS)

## (c) THEAT XEC 1:

The Ogan State Community Development Council (OGSCCC) is the apex body for all Community Development Associations in Ogun State. It was formally inaugurated on 18th October, 1980.

## PHILOSOPHY OF THE OGUN STATE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The philosophy of the State Community Development programme is to educate, sensitize, motivate and stimulate the people so that they could be the architects of their own developmental programmes. In essence, the concept is the development of the people by the people, for the people. Emphasis is therefore placed on the improvement of the people's skill in the organization and execution of their own projects.

## Achievements of the Community Development Department

The achievements of the Community Development Department include the following:

- Ø Disbursement of grants-in-aid to worthy selfhelp projects for 2004, 2005 and 2006. 600 CDAs, 116 ACDCs and 60 ZDCs have benefited from the grants-in-aid.
- Organisation of three (3) Citizenship and Leadership training workshops for 220 leaders of community Development Associations in the State.
- Ø Facilitating the formation of Ogun State Trade Council:
- Participating in the Ward-to-Ward Community Development Assessment Tour of His Excellency,

Otunba Gbenga Daniel, Governor of Ogun State from 30<sup>th</sup> May, 2006 to 3<sup>rd</sup> February, 2007. A comprehensive Report of the tour of twenty Local Governments covered had been compiled and submitted to His Excellency;

- Ø Celebration of the golden jubilee anniversary of the Social Development Institute, (Shasha) Iperu.
- Ø Institutionalization of the Matching Grant Scheme for the execution of special self-help projects by Community Development Associations;
- Ø Presentation of one 10-seater bus, each, donated by the State Government to the ogun State Community Development Council and the Social Development Institute (Shasha), Iperu; in 2006.
- Ø Established Olokola (Ode-Omi) Free Trade Zone Community consultative Forum that serves as the communication channel for the people of Ode – Omi in respect of projects of the OKFTZ. A MOU has been signed in this regard. Also, regular training should be organized for members of the Forum.
- Ø Resolution of conflict at Itoki Community of land matters and at West African Gas project also at Itoki.
- Ø Facilitated the maiden Exchange visit of the Ogun State Community Development Council to Osun State; and
- Mobilization of national support for the election of the immediate past Chairman of the Ogun State Community Development Council as the new President of the National Community Development council of Nigeria.

### **Outstanding/Ongoing Assignments**

(i) Implementation of the Matching Grant Scheme
Consequent upon the approval of the institutional
and funding arrangements for the implementation of
the Matching Grant Local Government Coordinating
Committee had been inaugurated in three Local
Governments. The State Governor is yet to
inaugurate the Matching Grant State Coordinating
Committee.

(ii) Diary of towns' Day Celebration
The Ministry participates in various Town's Day
Celebration and is currently compiling a
comprehensive Diary of such annual Celebrations,
Statewide.

## (Iii) Interactive Session

The Ministry plans to invite prominent indigenes drawn form all the Local Governments to an interactive session, aimed at sensitizing them on the need to identify with community development initiatives in their respective communities. Some Local Governments have forwarded the list of their representatives.

## (iv) National Conference on Community Development in Nigeria (28th January – 2nd February, 2007)

In furtherance of the partnership between the Government, International Development Agencies, private sector and non-governmental organizations towards the promotion of community driven development, a national conference on Community Development in Nigeria, the first of its kind, was held at Abuja between 28<sup>th</sup> January and 2<sup>nd</sup> February, 2007. Expectedly, this ministry participated at the conference in order to gain more experience as well as establish

Sustainable partnerships that will strengthen Community Development practice in the state. The report of the conference from the Federal Department of Community Development is being awaited.

## (V) Projects Certification by CDAs

It was the Ministry's plan to ensure that CD/\s are involved in the certification of projects executed by the Local Governments. However, the Local Government Chairman have not been favourably disposed to this idea.

## (vi) Establishment of Community Development Boards.

In order to create structures and environments favourable for the economic empowerment of the CDAs and Area Community Development (ACDC), Community Development Boards are to be established along the traditional communities existing in each Local Government. The Board will benefit from the exposure and influence of important sons ans daughters and dignitaries from the traditional communities for contact and financing of economic projects.

# (Vii) Governing Council for the Social Development Institute, (Shasha), Iperu The Ministry has forwarded a memo to His

Excellency, proposing names of members of the Governing Council for the Social Development Institute. The Governor's approval for the inauguration of the Council is being awaited.

## (Viii) Database on Community Development Associations

As part of efforts to have an accurate and up-todate database on all Community Development Associations in the state, the Ministry has designed a questionnaire. The data generated from the questionnaire will be analyzed and linked to ilis Excellency's network and the state's website in order to facilitate easy access to information relating to Community Development Associations. Data generation for this purpose is on – going as CDAs are formed and registered on a regular basis.

#### (ix) Registration of Trade Associations

The Ministry has also designed a form for registration of Trade Associations in the state. Already, side Trade Associations have collected the prescribed form while only forty eight (48) have returned the iduly completed forms.

## (B) COOPERATIVE DEPARTMENT Structure

Structurally, the Department operates through eight (8) Zonal offices located at Abeokuta, Ijebu-ode, Sagamu, Ilaro, Otta, Ijebu-Igbo, Ayetoro and Abigi. The Zonal offices serve as outlets for discharging the statutory functions of the Department at the grassroots.

The Department also oversees the Ogun State Cooperative College, Ijeja, Abeokuta. The College is affiliated to the Olabisi Onabanjo University, Agolwoye. It runs the Certificate and Diploma Programmes in Cooperative and Business Management.

#### **Functions**

The Department is charged with the following functions and responsibilities:

- (i) Registration of Cooperative Societies;
- (ii) Arbitration in disputes involving Cooperative Societies and their past/present members;
- (iii) Inspection/auditing of the accounting books and records of Cooperative Organizations;
- (iv) Inquiry into the financial status of Cooperative Organizations;
- (v) Liquidation of moribund/non-functional Cooperative organizations;
- (vi) Division and Amalgamation of Cooperative organizations;
- (vii) Capacity building
- (Viii) Writing of feasibility and performance evaluation reports on Cooperative Societies.

## (c) <u>Computerisation of Data on Cooperative</u> <u>Societies/Unions</u>

At its inception, the Ministry commenced the computerization of data on Cooperative Societies/Unions. When completed, members of the public would be able to access relevant and up-to-date information on the activities of all registered Cooperative organization in the State.

## (d) Committee on the Reform of Cooperatives in Ogun State

As part of efforts to rejuvenate and reposition Cooperatives in the States, the Ministry set up a nine — member committee to examine the



structure and overall management of Cooperative Organisations, identify the problems militating against their optimal performance, undertake a comprehensive review of the existing cooperative laws and regulations and recommend appropriate reforms, where necessary. The Committee submitted its report on 28th December, 2006.

(E) Mass Postings of Cooperative Officers

In order to overhaul the staffing positions at its headquarters and field formations, comprehensive postings of different levels of officers in the Registrar and Cooperative Officer Cadres were recently carried out.

(f) OBJ/OGD Farmer's Empowerment Scheme
The Ministry also spearheaded the active participation of the State Government in the implementation of the National Agricultural Credit Support Scheme for farmers, popularly known in Ogun State as OBJ/OGD Farmer's Employment Scheme.

(g) Formation of Cooperative Societies

At the expiration of the immediate past administration in the State, Five Thousand, Three Hundred and Sixteen (5,316) cooperative societies were in existence. During the first tenure in office of the administration of His Excellency Otunba 'Gbenga Daniel alone, the number of cooperative societies formed increased by One Thousand, Seven Hundred and Eighty-Three (1,783) which is 33.54%. Thus there are Seven Thousand and Ninety-Nine (7,099) Cooperative Societies, to date.

(h) Capital Base

At the expiration of the immediate past administration in the State, the capital base of cooperative societies amounted to N422.1m made up of N214.5m and N207.6m as shares and thrift savings respectively. During the first tenure in office of His Excellency Otuba 'Gbenga Daniel, the capital base alone increased by N331.7m which is 78.8% made up of an increase in respect of shares and thrift savings by N190.7m (88.9%) and N141m (67.9%) respectively. Thus the total capital base is N753.8m.

(I) Disbursement of Annual Subvention

At the expiration of the immediate past administration in the State, the annual subvention released to the Ogun State Cooperative Federation Limited (OGSCOFED) was only N500,000.00 for four years while the administration of His Excellency, Otunba 'Gbenga Daniel during his first tenure in office alone granted N4m to the Movement as subvention an N1m each year.

(i) Micro-Credit Loan

The administration of His Excellency, Otunba 'Gbenga Daniel during his first tenure in office granted a sum of N10m as revolving loan to 103 cooperative societies in the 20 Local Governments in

the State, it is worth mentioning that a substantial amount of loan had been repaid by the loan beneficiaries. The initiative to disbure loan to cooperative societies originated enting the administration of the incumbent governorm order to boost the State's economy through cooperatives. The loan has revolved among cooperative to the tune of N12.9m among 114 cooperative societies while the recovery rate is 82.02%.

In furtherance of its functions, the Cooperative Department interfaces with a host of Agencies and Development Partners as follows:

Cooperative College is affiliated;

Federal Ministry of Agriculture in respect of measures to strengthen the Cooperative Societies.
Outstanding/On-Going Assignments

These include the following:

(i) Report of the Committee on the Reform of Cooperatives in Ogun State.

Following the submission of the Report of the Committee, the Ministry is now to come up with a draft White Paper on the Report, as well as initiate steps that will lead to the amendment of the existing Cooperative laws and regulations, by the State legislature.

(ii) Misappropriation of Funds at the National Bureau of Statistics Staff CT & CS Limited, Absolute.

Sequel to a report lodged by this Ministry, the State Police Command is currently investigating the case of misappropriation of funds involving two officials of the National Bureau of Statistics Staff CTCS Limited, Federal Secretariat, Abeckuta. It is important to note that pressure is being mounted on the Police Authorities through the Director of Cooperatives, in order to ensure that the Society is not swindled.

(III) State Cooperative Arbitration Panel





# ACTIVITIES OF THE OGUN STATE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY

#### **AN OVERVIEW**

A cursory look at events over the last four years in the State legislature reveals a lot of landmark achievements and highly significant progress. The choice of Rt. Hon. Oseni as Speaker at the onset of the fifth legislature was a milestone being the first female Speaker in Ogun State, the Southwest and the only standing female Speaker of State House of Assembly in the whole of the country. With a collective resolve to better the lot of the people, the deliberations of the Honourable members of the House revolved round massesoriented issues with the people as its centerpiece as the resolutions passed so far were those that touched the lives of Ogun State indigenes and residents.

The immediate past legislature passed over forty Bills, the first Bill - The Children's Rights Bill - put Ogun legislature ahead of others being the first State Assembly to do so in the whole of the federation. The legal Department of the House was also established to facilitate and enhance members' understanding of the processes of lawmaking.

However, in the modern state, the responsibilities of legislators have gone beyond mere lawmaking.

The role of the legislature include, aside lawmaking, oversight functions and quassi-judicial functions, among others.

For its oversight functions, the past legislature had 26 standing Committees, which monitored the activities of government ministries, parastatals and agencies. In the area of community relations, it mediated in the imbroglio between the West African Portland Cement Company (WAPCCO) and the Ewekoro and Sagamu Communities. It also brokered peace between the management of the Federal Polytechnic, Ilaro, and the various unions in the institutions, among others. The Ogun House also inaugurated a five-man Anti-Corruption Committee the assignment of which include,

among other things, thorough investigation of perceived act/acts of corruption within the society as it may be notified.

One of the landmark achievements that stand Ogun State House of Assembly out against its contemporaries till date is the quarterly interactive session with the Governor tagged 'Governor Explain This'. The programme afforded the Governor the opportunity to inform the electorate about government policies and programmes as well as the achievements of the present administration so far in the State. Other notable achievement was the adoption of Yoruba language as a medium of communication and adorning Yoruba traditional attire on

Wednesdays. This was to promote and appreciate the rich Yoruba culture while, at he same time, encourage the younger generations to learn how to speak Yoruba anguage fluently.

As a way of contributing their quota to the development of society, the Honorable awmakers of the Ogun state House of Assembly through the magnanimity of the Sovernor, were allowed to embark on executing developmental and peoplempacting projects, otherwise known as Constituency Projects' their respective, ndividual electora jurisdiction or constituency. This feat unique one as it is appening for the first in the State. Since ne creation C Ogtan State, the present awmakers were allow o come out of their egislative responsible as and contribute to what could be described as executive unctions by icentifying particular projects in neir domains. With the granting of this quasiutonomy to the legislators, it has given them sense of responsibility of one kind. It also hows that they are a force to reckon with in ne governance of the state, on the other and. Apart from this, by embarking on onstituency Projects, the lawmakers in gun State cannot cry of political alienation or marginalization. This feat has really urnished the image of the party as well as e State government at the grassroots level.

he Ogun State House of Assembly scored et another first when it hosted the first ever onference of Southwest Speakers in ecember, 2003. The Conference, an itiative of the Speaker, Rt. Hon. (Mrs.) Titi seni, was initiated with the main aim of resenting a united platform for Southwest beakers on national issues. It was a highly accessful event. Recently, Speakers of the Houses of Assembly in the Southwest opolitical zone converged on Abeokuta for special meeting of the Conference of outhwest Speakers to discuss, among other ings, issues of national interest as well as pical political matters concerning the outhwest geopolitical zone. Since its aiden edition in December 2003, the onference had deliberated on various socio-Ditical issues that positively influenced the litical development of the zone.

ie House Committee on Information and

Strategy (now Information and Orientation) publishes a quarterly magazine; The Mace as well as a fortnightly bulletin; Ogun Assembly Update. The two publications have tremendously facilitated dissemination of news from the State legislature to the outside world.

#### THE SIXTH LEGISLATURE

Tuesday, 4th of June, 2007, marked yet the beginning of another legislative term in the political history of the Ogun State House of Assembly as the Governor, Otunba Gbenga Daniel, inaugurated the sixth legislature that comprises twelve former members of the fifth legislature (2003-2007) and fourteen new lawmakers all representing the twenty-six Constituencies in the State. The day also saw the return of Rt. Hon. (Mrs.) Titi Oseni as the Honourable Speaker.

What makes the event of that day worth celebrating was the relative peace that reigned in the immediate past Assembly coupled with consummate partnership with, not only the executive arm of government, but also the judiciary and other tiers of government, which have made the State legislature a reference point in legislative actions ahead of other Houses of Assembly. Since its inauguration, the House has continued to work as an indivisible entity to ensure that the good people of Ogun State reap the dividends of democracy.

Swinging into action after its inauguration, the sixth legislature approved a House calendar and constituted twenty standing committees to handle various aspects of legislative duties. The number of standing committees was pruned down from original twenty-six to twenty in order to enhance faster and more efficient discharge of duties. Performing the inauguration ceremony, the Speaker assured that full support would be given for the total actualization of the 'Agenda for a Secured Future' which the executive arm of government had carefully and thoughtfully enunciated for delivery to the people.

Following the tradition of the House and as a mark of respect, The House leadership led other legislators and principal officers to pay courtesy calls on the four paramount rulers in Ogun State and receive their blessings.

One of the earlier duties of the sixth legislature was the ratification of nominees of the executive council. This was carried out with careful scrutiny and utmost dispatch. In addition, the Standing Committees have started touring various ministries, agencies and parastatals for familiarization with the management

and staffers and on-the-spot assessment of the facilities in respective organization.

In its primary assignment of lawmaking, the new legislature has passed three (3) Bills and fourteen (14) resolutions since inception.

The incessant traffic congestion along Lagos-Ibadan expressway received the attention of the Ogun State House of Assembly and a stakeholders' forum was called following a motion moved under urgent public matter. The motive behind the move was to proffer lasting solution(s) to the ever increasing traffic logiam along the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway as well as putting an end to loss of lives through ghastly motor accidents on the road. An entreaty was also made to the police to resume night patrol on the highways especially the Lagos/Ibadan expressway from dusk to dawn to make it safe for motorists and commuters at night.

Also, in the area of quassi-judicial function, the Ogun State House of Assembly has successfully settled the feud between the members of the National Union of Road Transport Workers and the Amalgamated Commercial Motorcycle Riders Association of Nigeria (ACOMORAN) in Ifo Local Government Area.

It would be recalled that the members went on a subregional tour of Ghana, where they had the opportunity of comparing notes and meeting minds with the Ghanaian Parliament. This has greatly influenced the members' legislative expertise as the timely exposure contributed so much on their presentations on the floor of the House.

The performance of the Ogun State legislature has been widely acknowledged more so because it has not subdued its functions or authority but rather, stayed focused with the basic aim of legislating for overall good governance, promoting the socioeconomic standing of Ogun in the comity of States. Ogun State legislature has brought many things into being since inception exactly four years ago. With an able leadership and dedicated members, the legislators have done the State many good having used their instruments of office to legislate on noteworthy issues that has greatly enhanced the development of the State and paved way for a geometrical progression in the standard of living of its people in a very near future.

## Projects and Activities of Government in the first 100 days

- iv. Two Boreholes

- i. Current textbooks supplied to all the school libraries.
- ii. The School's Demonstration Rooms are well stocked with models

Within the last two months, 20 Tutors and Scientific Officers were recruited into all the schools. This exercise is ongoing and has improved the tutorial staffing in schools in the line with the accreditation requirements of Nursing and Midwifery Council of

Nigeria.

### 4. OSUTH Doctors' Residence


To relieve Resident Doctors of their accommodation problems in the Teaching Hospital, Sagamu. 14 single-room apartments have almost been completed.

# A PRESENTATION BY THE GOVERNOR OF OGUN STATE, HIS EXCELLENCY OTUNBA GBENGA DANIEL TO THE STATE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY ON THE 2008 APPROPRIATION BILL, ON WEDNESDAY, 14<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER 2007

#### INTRODUCTION:

- It is with a deep sense of responsibility and a rich sense of history that I stand before this honourable House to present the 2008 Appropriation Bill, which is the first Budget of the second term of our Administration.
- 2. Before I proceed with my presentation, we should give thanks to Almighty God for His guidance, which has seen us through a peaceful even if eventful first term in office, a term that has been deemed by friends and foes alike as a superlative success. I also wish to register, once again, our appreciation to the electorate of Ogun State for the opportunity we have been given to provide purpose-driven leadership and service to the State for another term. This time around, we are poised to consolidate on our well -applauded successes as we strive to secure for our people a prosperous and peaceful future.
- Madam Speaker, Honourable Members, we acknowledge the contributions of individuals and groups, across and beyond the State,

towards making our first term an exemplar of triumphant stewardship. In the same vein, we are grateful to the members of this hallowed Chamber for the mature manner in which they carried out their oversight functions. I make bold to say that within easy recall, it was probably only in the Gateway State that there were no untoward incidents between the Executive and the Legislature on one hand; or within the House, on the other hand. In the odyssey of governance that we jointly embarked upon four years ago, we have been most fortunate that our interactions have been imbued with a sense of balance, a tendency towards tolerance and mutual respect. This I must say testifies eloquently to the good spirit that continues to animate our great party, the People's Democratic Party and the sense of purpose that permeated the work of the Fifth Legislature and which continues to characterise the affairs of the House to date.

4. At this juncture, let me congratulate both new and returning members of the House



for their success at the polls. I appreciate the support and cooperation we have received so far since the inauguration of the new House. We are hopeful that this will continue. For our people to have the full dividends of democracy, the Legislature and Executive must cooperate meaningfully. Both arms of Government have a duty to serve our people conscientiously. We are quite confident that this goal is attainable having been enjoying the best of collaboration since the new House was inaugurated. I am optimistic that this Sixth Legislature will emerge the most peaceful and most productive Assembly in the country at the end of this term.

## SYNOPSIS OF ACTIVITIES OF THE FIRST

5. Since our assumption of office in May 2003, our Administration has embarked on many people-oriented projects in line with our resolve to significantly improve the quality of life of our people. These have embraced both the life-sustaining projects and the life-changing ones, including the construction and rehabilitation of rural roads, rehabilitation of water schemes and provision of boreholes, enhancement of medical services, upgrading of educational facilities, supply of transformers, provision of houses to the low income earners and human capacity development, to mention a few.

6. Our projects in our first term were all targeted towards meeting the promises made in our first campaign document, "My Contract with Ogun People," which have been corroborated and validated by the United Nations' Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and the seven goals of the Ogun

State Economic Empowerment
Development Strategy (SEEDS). There is
gainsaying the fact that the completion
these major projects has impacted positive
on the lives of the citizenry and brought upon the lives of the citizenry and brought upon our economy in the direction of to
transformation.

### **REVIEW OF 2007 BUDGET**

7. A Budget of N54.80 billion was approved the current year by the House of Assem with a sum of N13.41 billion (24.47%) Salaries and Allowances, N8.19 billion (14.95%) for Overhead Costs and N6. billion (11.77%) for Consolidated Revent Fund/Public Debts Charges, bringing to total recurrent provision to N28.05 billion representing 51.19% of the total budget. The balance of N26.75 billion, representing 48.81% of the total budget was set aside for Capital Expenditure.

8. The projected revenue for the current year was N54.80 billion, which made the 200 Budget a balanced budget, in line with or belief in Fiscal Responsibility. However, the budget was reviewed and realigned in the course of the year in view of the unexpecter rise in workers salaries and allowance occasioned by the implementation of 12.59 salary increase and adoption of monetization policy in Ogun State owned tertian institutions.

9. With the realignment of the budget, total recurrent expenditure increased to N30.0 billion (54.76%) while capital expenditure was slightly reduced to N24.79 billion (45.24%). These slight changes were however, not sufficient to derail the objectives



of the dget sentially because our fiscal and acromomic fundamentals remaind largely unshaken. In four years, and despite the mischievous ministrations of a desperate opposition, our Administration has stayed focused on its initial ideals of waging, and winning, the war on want and freeing more and more of our people from poverty to become active economic citizens.

## **REVENUE PERFORMANCE FOR 2007**

- 10. At the end of August 2007, a total sum of N29.81 billion, representing 81.60% of the proportionate target of N36.53 billion was collected as revenue.
- 11. A gross sum of N15.59 billion was received from the Federation Account, out of which N0.65 billion was deducted at source leaving a net receipt of N14.94. The receipt from Value Added Tax (VAT) was N2.18 billion and the State's Internally Generated Revenue (IGR) was N9.45 billion. The total recurrent revenue amounted to N26.57, while the Capital Receipts was N2.59 billion.
- 12. I am pleased to declare that our Administration through the State investment company, Gateway Holdings Limited, has turned around the fortunes of the State by increasing its share assets from about N550 million in 2004 to over N7 billion by August 2007. It is gladdening to note that the N420 million dividends earned from the investments had been utilised to execute development projects across the State.
- 13. Taking a cue from the successful performance of Gateway Holdings Limited, Gateway Printing Company Limited (formerly Printing Corporation) and the Gateway Trading Limited (formerly Bulk

Purchasing Corporation) were commercialised and transferred to the Holding Company as subsidiaries. In the coming months, more and more of the State's agencies that should be earning revenue will be either privatised outright or graduated into the ambit of Gateway Holdings for better asset performance and enhanced returns to the public purse.

- 14. In pursuit of the major financial thrust of Government, concerted efforts were made during the year to enhance the Internally Revenue Generation (IGR) of the State. It is gladdening to note that the average monthly revenue of the State which was about N150 million in 2003, is now about N800 million. In percentage terms, we have increased our ability to meet our recurrent expenditure from IGR as measured by the Financial Independent Index (FII) from 22% in 2003 to 58% by August 2007. Notwithstanding the achievements so far, however, we are determined not to rest on our oars until our dream of meeting all our recurrent expenditure from IGR is fulfilled and even surpassed.
- 15. As part of our efforts to continue to ensure prudent management of public funds, enforce compliance with due process and block all leakages, the Department of Due Process and the Financial Investigation and Control Unit (FICU) were created shortly after the commencement of our second term. Similarly, the project monitoring function of Government has been strengthened with the recent appointment of a Permanent Secretary domiciled in the Office of the Governor to lead the process.

16. In addition to all this and as part of the process of utilising the various investment opportunities emerging in the State for employment generation, Government has successfully compiled and submitted names of over 7,000 employable indigenes of Ogun State to the OK LNG company and other highbrow companies that are soon to commence operations in the State.

#### **EXPENDITURE PERFORMANCE**

17. As at the end of August this year, a total sum of N24.99 billion has been expended, which was made up of N16.35 billion for recurrent expenditure and N8.64 billion for Capital Expenditure. The percentage performance as at August for recurrent and capital expenses was 87.43% and 48.46%, respectively, which culminated in a total of 68.41% of the budget performance.

## BUDGET PERFORMANCE BY FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION

- 18. Madam Speaker, Honourable Members, permit me at this point to indicate the performance of the 2007 budget by functional classification. In this connection, and as a manifestation of the overriding focus of this Government to widen the economic base of the State with a view to building a financial strong State, 43.86 % of the capital expenditure so far in the current year was expended on Economic Affairs Sector.
- 19. Equally, 10.99% of the expenditure was utilised for Housing and Community Amenities in line with our commitment to accelerated enhancement of the quality of life of our people, especially in the rural areas. In similar vein, the share of the Education Sector in capital expenditure amounted to 9.93% to reflect the pride of place accorded Human Capital Development in our drive towards the socioeconomic emancipation of our dear State.

#### MAIN FEATURES OF 2008 BUDGET


- 20. The 2008 Budget is unique in the sense that it is the first budget of the second term of this administration, which is meant to bequeath an enduring legacy for the good people of the State. These are unequivocally enunciated in the "Agenda for a Secured Future". This budget equally marks the first year of the 2008 - 2011 Medium Term Development Framework of the State.
- 21. This budget is equally unique because it is a surplus budget, as we intend to make more revenue than our expenditure. This is in line with our intention of bequeathing a secured future for the people of this State.
- 22. Consistent with our people-oriented focus, the

preparation of the 2008 Budget has beer highly participatory. Valuable inputs were sourced and received from the people across the three Senatorial Districts of the State. at fora in which political functionaries from the Local Government to the Federal levels were involved. Professional bodies, the organised private sector, mass organisations, civil society, representatives of traditional institutions, non-governmental organisations (NGOs), trade and labour organisations and various other relevant stakeholders were all part of this broad-based consultative process. The budget also derived inputs from the various Summits and Retreats held since inception of the second term, interactive sessions with the Ministries, Departments and Agencies of the State Government, and all this was rounded off with a 3 - day Budget Retreat.

23. Madam Speaker, Honourable Members of the House, as you are aware, the second term of this Administration is premised on our campaign document, "Agenda for a Secured Future". This document is the expression of our passionate desire to build legacies that will outlast this Administration, legacies that are life transforming and which will stand the test of time. We shall pursue the attainment of these laudable goals with our core values of Quality Delivery, Accountability, Excellence in Government, Teamwork and Participatory



Decision - Making.

24. I wish to re-emphasise that we are determined to ensure that our people have access to quality food; that hunger is eradicated from our midst; that our people have unhindered access to qualitative and affordable healthcare; that our children have access to good schools, that more jobs are created for people to earn living wages and become active economic citizens, etc. These, I must say, are the key elements of our 'Agenda for a Secured Future'.

## THE BUDGET OF TRANSFORMATION

25. Madam Speaker, Honourable Members of the House, I now present the 2008 Budget Proposals of the State. As usual, the Proposals will still be defended before the House by the various Ministries and Agencies of Government. After the passage of the Bill, the details will subsequently be presented to the public by the Economic Advisory Committee in line with our policy on transparency and accountability.

26. It is important to reiterate that our annual budgets since the inception of this Administration have sought "to wage war on want, liberate our people from poverty and broaden the economic base of the State". The 2008 Budget, being the first for the second tenure, still has these as its underlying thrust.

 The 2008 Budget will consolidate on the gains of our first term towards enhanced delivery of the dividends of democracy to our people and accelerated socio-economic development of the State. It will also commence the actual implementation of the life-changing projects of the Government, which include the Ogun Agro-Cargo Airport, the OK- Free Trade Zone in the Ogun East Senatorial District, the Kajola Specialised Railway Industrial Free Trade Zone in the Ogun Central Senatorial District and the Ogun Guangdong Free Trade Zone, Igbesa in Ogun West Senatorial District.

28. The policy thrusts of this Budget are:

 Development of Key Agricultural Products with capacity to generate massive employment opportunities and create initiatives to boost production, encourage private sector participation in processing activities and enhance marketing both locally and internationally;

 Establishment of Ogun State into a regional hub in Information and Communication Technology (ICT) to ensure that we benefit

from the Information Revolution;

iii. Transformation of Ogun State into an industrial hub that maximizes the benefits of its unique location next to the nation's commercial capital and as the Gateway into Nigeria and the ECOWAS region;

iv. Development of New Towns to shift growth from the areas identified in the State Regional

Master Plan as Pressure Zones; and

 Assurance that every Government intervention or project would have capacity to

boost employment.

- 29. In conformity with the focus of our administration for the second term, which the Budget is meant to jumpstart, the 2008 Budget is christened "Budget of Transformation". This appellation underlines the revolutionary intentions of our Administration in its second term. It also underscores our commitment to ensuring that from now till the end of our tenure in 2011, our State witnesses growth levels that will ensure that its transition into the ranks of the world's emerging markets becomes truly irreversible. We are steadfast in our belief and firm in our resolve that Ogun State should henceforth only soar and soar above all others.
- 30. Madam Speaker, Honourable Members, the world renowned consultant on leadership, Stephen R. Covey admonishes that "Being effective as individuals and organizations is no longer optional in today's world it's the price of entry to the playing field. Therefore, in our bold and courageous drive into a new era of greatness for our dear State in this second term, the emphasis of the 2008 budget will be on the aggressive implementation of the major

projects that will drive the industrial and technological transformation of our State.

31. The 2008 Budget is, no doubt, an improvement on the previous ones as it has tremendously increased in size. The expected Income is N77.64 billion while the proposed expenditure is N77.34 billion. This is a surplus budget that marks the dawn of prosperity in our State.

32. The various development projects of the State were conceptualised in line with our vision to expand the economic base of the State, premised on the State Regional Plan. It is necessary to emphasise that the increase in the budget size is to specifically take care of the Special Development Projects that I have enumerated which are enduring legacies that will secure our future and provide sustainable development. These include the Agro-Cargo Airport, the three Free Trade Zones, Laogo Paradise Island, New Towns Development, Bitumen development, massive infrastructure deployment and the pursuit of ICT revolution.

#### 2008 REVENUE

- 33. In projecting the revenue of the State for 2008, due cognisance must be given to the revenue projection of the Federation from where the bulk of the State revenue is still derived. The share of the Ogun State Government revenue from Federal Allocation and VAT had been 3% and 2%, respectively, from 2003 to 2007. This is likely to continue between 2008 and 2011. The equivalent amount of these for the State in 2008 would be N31 billion and N4 billion. respectively. A realistic projection of the Internally Generated Revenue for the State in 2008 has been put at N27.2 billion, while Capital Receipts is estimated to be N15.42 billion. These figures generated the cumulative revenue of N42.62 billion as mentioned earlier.
- 34. The 2008 financial year will also witness the expansion of the revenue generating capacity of Government to provide needed funds to execute desired programmes and projects, thereby reducing dependence on allocation from the centre. Let me say that this revenue drive will involve more rigorous efforts to ensure that all collectible funds are captured into the public purse. Henceforth, town planning rules shall be dutifully enforced, people in trades shall be required to pay their taxes and levies as and when due and environmental hazards such as those that caused the horrendous floods during mid-2007 shall be penalised even as we

- continue to pursue the option of Feder assistance.
- 35. Other areas of emphasis in the New Year she include investment in revenue yieldin projects; improvement in the "Accountabili Index" of Government and consolidation of the solid economic foundation already laid through policies, programmes and projects. Our Government intends to vigorously pursue is agenda of economic independence toward building a financially strong and stable State.

## 2008 EXPENDITURE

- 36. In the expenditure profile for the year 2008, total of N32.77 billion (42.37%, ves allocates for recurrent expenditure and 4.57 billion (57.63%) for capital costs. The appearation from the recurrent expenditure for salaries are allowances amounts to N16.12 billion, while overhead costs have a provision of N16.55 billion.
- 37. The distribution amongst the function classifications indicates that N20.67 billic (26.67%) is allocated to Economic Affair Education has a share of N13.47 billic (17.38%), while Housing and Communit Amenities got N14.39 billion (18.57%). The details show a manifestation of our unfunching commitment to and continuing concern for the Economic Growth of our State, the Education of our children, the provision of infrastructure and Social Amenities for our citizenry and the assurance of enhanced Service Delivery to our people.

#### CONCLUSION

38. Madam Speaker, Honourable members of the State House of Assembly, I have laid before you the fiscal intentions of Government for 2008. - 41. Madam Speaker, Honourable Members, the Year 2008 holds very great prospects of the



The OK LNG Company is already on ground in the zones and has started development of the pioneer camp, from where all construction works will be coordinated.

Ogun State also, within this time frame, has won a bid for Block 1 of the 2 Blocks of Bitumen deposits offered to investors by the Federal Ministry of Mines and Steel to explore Bitumen in the State. 



#### PRIMARY EDUCATION IN OGUN STATE: LAYING A SOLID FOUNDATION FOR TOMMOROW'S LEADERS

Primary Education in Ogun State under the present administration has made landmark stride through improved provision of teaching and learning infrastructures and teacher's welfare.

The State Universal Basic Education Board (which metamorphosed from the State Primary Education Board) came into being through the State Law No. 28 of August 2005. The Board is headed by a seasoned and experienced educationist, Chief (Mrs.) Olabosipo Ogunsan. The Board is mainly responsible for the management of 1,350 public primary schools with a population of 452,298 pupils taught by 16,821 teachers.





#### PASSAGE OF THE STATE URBAN AND REGIONAL PLANNING LAW

# Gov. Daniel's WARD-TO-WARD COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ASSESSMENT TOUR:


People as centre-piece of governance

In the new Ogun State, the word service is being given a new meaning. The rate at which Otunba Gbenga Daniel, wants to grow the state is not only phenomenal, it is also legendary. Within a little over four and a half years in office, the gentleman has traversed the entire length and breadth of Ogun State several times in a very bold attempt aimed at bringing government closer to the people...

First, it is on record that during the electioneering campaigns that led to his emergence as governor in 2003, Otunba

Gbenga Daniel, toured the 236 wards of Ogun State two times, a feat never witnessed in the history of electioneering in Ogun State since its creation in 1976. It was a feat no governor or any leader for that matter ever achieved. It's OGD's genuine effort to connect with the people.

And since he came into office, Otunba Daniel has made it a duty to regularly reach for the grassroots in one form or the other. He is there to declare one project or the other, interact with them in order to know first hand their problems. One method adopted before this new initiative, was his decision



to institute the Villa Square concept as a weapon to real the people in their remotest villages.

Any keen observer of the Otunba Gbenga Daniel Administration will tell you that the Village Square meetings he instituted recorded a phenomenal success. With this, the governor was not only able to monitor the performance of his local government chairmen, he was also able to put them on their toes. His desire to regularly connect with the people has not only become a passion, it is a thirst that has become unquenchable.


At each Village Square meeting, the governor was able to meet the local people and their leaders and interact with them. They ask him questions and he provides ready answers. Most requests bother on the needs of each community and their priorities. The governor is able to see the need for such needs, having visited the people in the first place.

The last one created is dubbed: "Ward to Ward Community Development Assessment Tour". The difference, or call it the 'business unusual' aspect of this is that it is the governor initiating the moves designed to enable him see things for himself.

For some leaders, leaving the cozy environment of their offices is something they will rather avoid. Whenever the terrain they are to visit is far removed from the seat of power, they tactically hide under the exigencies of state matters and ask their aides to represent them. Other leaders reluctantly go to one of two rural settings through out their tenure just to fulfill all righteousness.

The only time they are compelled to visit those parts of their jurisdiction that are nearly impossible to get to is when there is a major upheaval that is threatening the peace of their domain and country. Of course, and as a rule, they only stay for one or two hours. Typically, majority of those in power simply leave the people in the lurch after divesting them of their votes.

Ogun State is certainly not one of those climes where the leaders are only interested in the people for selfish reasons. The government of


Otunba Gbenga Daniel is showing in words and deeds, how leadership can connect with the people. In the last four and a half years Daniel has made regular working visits to different parts of the state a cardinal principle of his administration. These are not just whistle stops visits. It is a carefully planned affair during which the governor attends a village square meeting with the people.

The meetings are held in designated rural communities. And it is actually a village square setting as the governor and officials of his government sit with the people, take questions from them, listen to their complaints and demands and explain rationale behind government projects and actions. There have been occasions when the governor had to reverse some decisions based on the demand of the people.

Through the community development assessment tours, Gov. Daniel is once again reinforcing the fact


that the people the centerpiece of governance. But if the truth must be told, the ward-to-ward wait personally led by Daniel is not a tea party and only leaders who are genuinely interested in the welfare of the people can attempt it. Chief Ebenezer Babatope, erudite politician and one of the closest associates of the late sage, Chief Obafemi Awolowo, witnessed first hand the gathering of the people and their governor in Owode during the grand finale of the assessment tour of Obafemi Owode Local Government. He must have witnessed a replication of true democracy during the Obafemi Awolowo era when the people in concert with their true leaders decided the way forward for their communities.


According to Babatope, such regular consultations between the government and the governed engender development and lead to verifiable progress. The former minister of the Federal Republic said he was not surprised that much progress was being recorded in Ogun

State since the government is in tune with the needs of the people. Babatope described the tour, which began in Yewa North Local Government on Tuesday, May 30, 2006, as a mass movement that would change the face of politics and further enhance good governance in Ogun State.

He is right. One of the major aims of the tour was to assess the level of development and the impact of government programmes on the people. The tour is also in consonance with Daniel's belief that the people must have a say in government. The Governor is mindful of the fact that one of the reasons why past governments fail to deliver real dividends to the people was because they did not bond with the people. They did not know what the people actually wanted and which projects were functional and beneficial to the people.

Daniel has made the rounds of the communities to see things for himself. He has talked to the people and not just relying on the





feedbacks from officials. By feeling the pulse of the people, he is able to assess how well his government has performed and what other things that are needed to be done.

For one, the people want to be part of governance going by the way they besiege the venues of the interactive sessions with the governor. The community assessment tours have become a people's parliament of sorts as the representatives of different interest groups take the governor and his officials to task on several issues. On the whole, however, the general consensus is that the Daniel administration has succeeded in bringing government closer to the people through the execution of people-oriented policies and projects.

Chief Sesan Soluade, who served as deputy governor to the late Governor Bisi Onabanjo, had to leave other pressing matters to attend the one held in Kajola in Obafemi Owode Local Government area. Soluade, a chieftain of the Alliance for Democracy, said he was

impressed with Daniel's style of governance annihis delivery of dividends of democracy to the people. At Ode Remo Ward 1, The Alaye of Ode Oba Funso Adeolu, described the governor as man whose truth and sincerity of purpose is obvious from his concern for the welfare of the people.

He said by listening to the people and tailorin development to suit their needs, Daniel has succeeded in transforming the state. 



He is never in a hurry to leave and patiently listens to all questions and comments before providing answers to them or simply giving directives that would provide Immediate succor to the people.


That is why the people themselves are the ones testifying to the many gains of the four and a half years old administration of Daniel in Ogun State.



The project is another testimony to the high esteem, which the Otunba Gbenga Daniel administration holds traditional institution and its support for the preservation of our cultural heritage.





Neonatal health intervention of the organization recognizes the role of proper nutrition and basic health management for mothers to be. The battle for maternal health also reached the market places and this initiative has scored high points because of the large turnout of recipients it caters for.

#### Education

The NGO organizes an annual debate competition among secondary school pupils in the state known as the brain masters! It carries a prize of Lagos-London return flight ticket. This has made it very attractive and competitive amongst students.

Scholarships and Bursary

Indigent students are helped with this, to support their educational yearning. Further more, various academic materials are distributed to students, textbooks and exercise books, mathematical sets, biros, pencils and sandals, etc are also given to students on a regular basis.

Care For The Aged

The welfare of the aged is a major programme of the organization. The aged are given a day of recognition by supporting them with household items and food such as blankets, buckets, lanterns,

towels, beverages and cash. So far, all the 236 wards in the State have been covered.

#### **Widowhood Support**

The Gateway Front Foundation (GFF) tries to ameliorate the trauma of the loss of a life partner and its related problems in our society by annually setting aside a day when this segment of the society are invited to the state capital for counseling and get-together. At the end of the event they are empowered financially to cushion their pains.

#### Wheel of Hope

Under this project, wheelchairs are given to deserving beneficiaries, who have polio affliction and other related disabilities. Thousands have been given out but many more are still on the waiting list. Particular effort and attention have been given to indigent and downtrodden people.

The provision of these wheelchairs has positively affected the lives of these victims of polio. Formerly these people were helpless and so resorted to begging, but today they are equipped to fend for themselves having learnt a trade they practice on their wheelchairs.


Beneficiaries of this programme have received items to help them start a trade/profession of their choice.


