

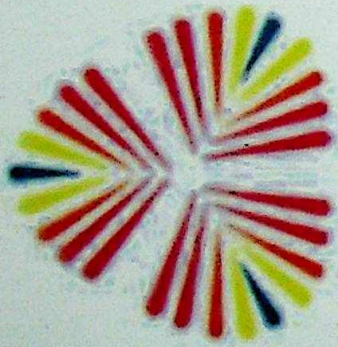

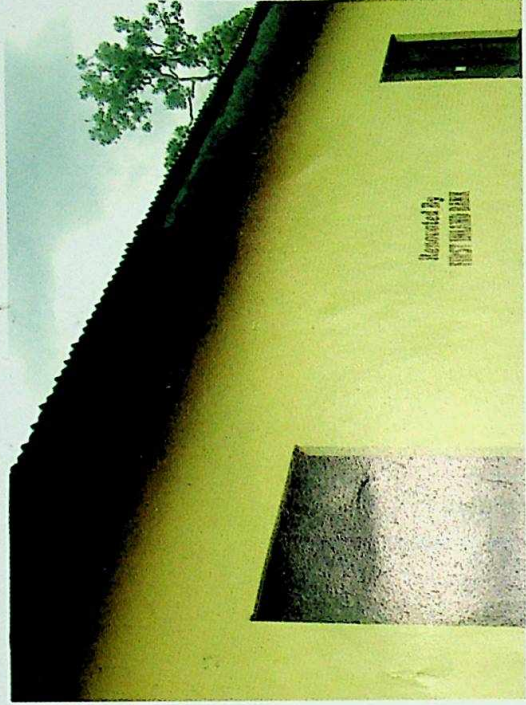

(c) Projects are sited fairly, with priority given to difficult to reach areas.

(d) To enhance the capacity of teachers, the Board has carefully

Early in the life of Jang Administration a 10-Point Agenda to guide the Government on its plan to transform the development landscape of Plateau State was drawn up.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> item on the Agenda lays emphasis on Sound Education and Functional Human Resource Development.

The Government also declared a State of Emergency on the Education Sector and backed this with political commitment as demonstrated in the following:

1. Convening of an Education Summit, which was attended by all stakeholders
2. Paying up of counterpart grants to access the UBE/FGN Funds for 2005, 2006 and 2007 which amounted to N1.3bn.
3. Paying the back-log of Teachers' Leave Transport Grants (LTGs) for 2005 and 2006 and the short fall for 2007 and 2008 amounting to N636m.
4. Regularizing the Payment of Primary School Teacher's Salary in the 17 LGEAs.
5. Appointment of Education Secretaries based on merit.
6. Implementation of the enhanced

Teachers' Salary Structure (TSS)

With the political backing received and conducive environment created, the Board has in the past 3 years worked conscientiously towards realizing the

objectives of agenda 3 of the Jang Administration and to ensure the delivery of quality education to the children of Plateau State in both Primary and Junior Secondary Schools.

(a) Corruption and misapplication of funds has been the bane of the Primary Education Sector for years. The Management of the Board has ensured that the devastating effect of this cankerworm is reduced to its barest minimum by declaring zero tolerance for corruption. Consequently, the LGEA accounts are carefully audited on a monthly basis, an exercise that has proven very useful as over N140m has been saved.

(b) In the award of contracts to improve on facilities (classrooms and furniture), provide instructional materials and enhance Teachers' Professional Development, the Board adheres strictly to the Due Process System.

followed a plan designed to ensure that every teacher is given an opportunity to attend at least one training workshop. So far over 20,000 teachers have been trained in the last 3 years in different areas.

(e) The Universal Basic Education Board collaborates with the Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC); Education Trust Fund (ETF); relevant parastatals of the Federal Ministry of Education, the MDGs; International Agencies like UNICEF, JICA etc; communities and public spirited individuals who are interested in Education. Such collaboration has assisted in no small measure to strengthen the government's resolve to redeem education on the Plateau.

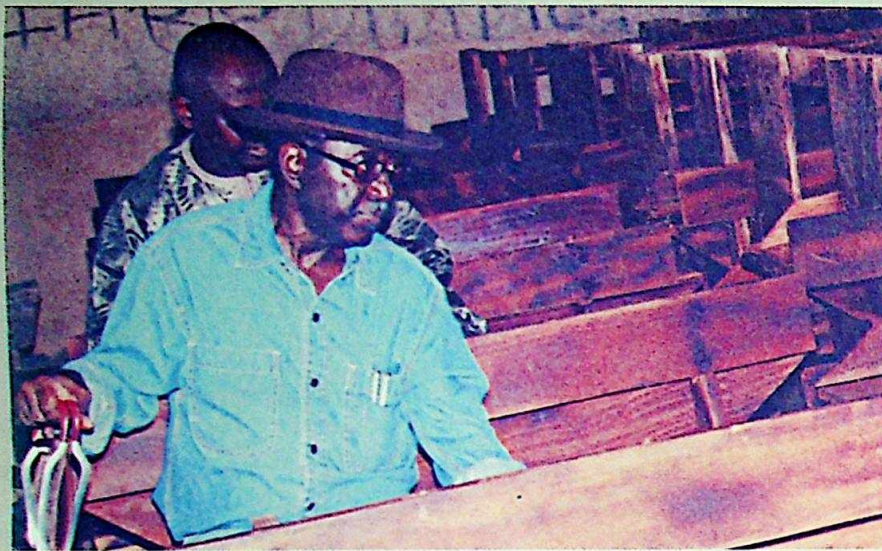

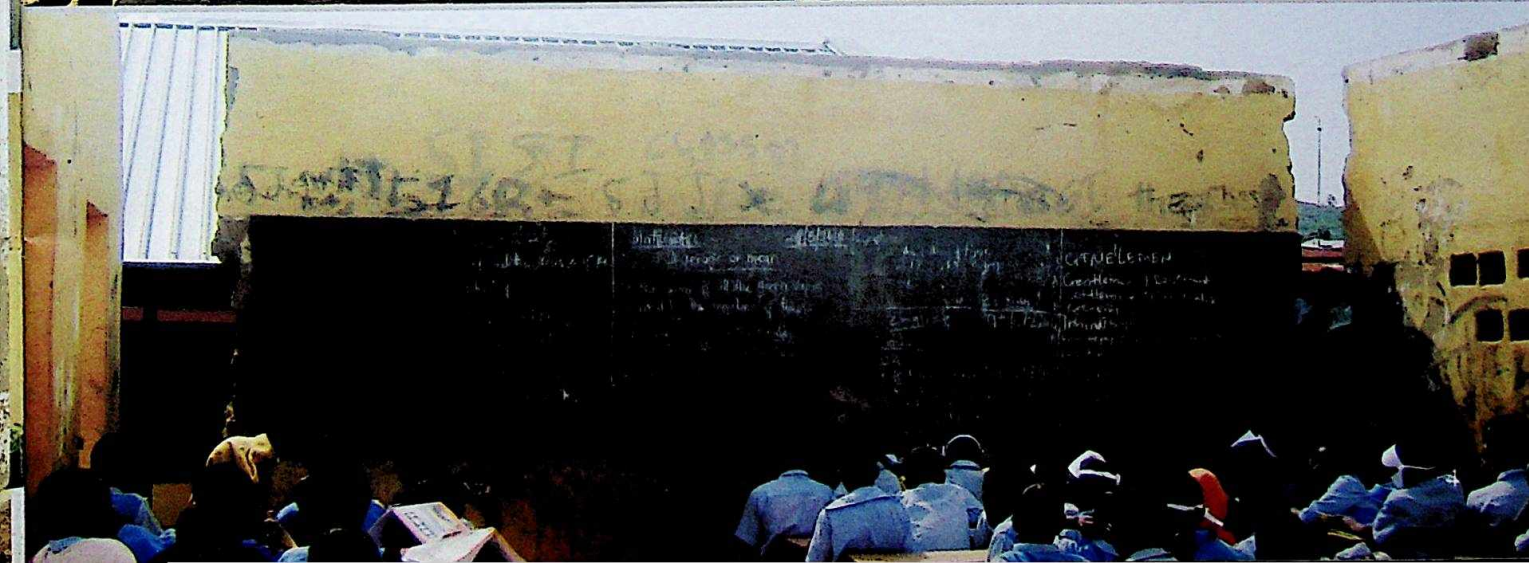
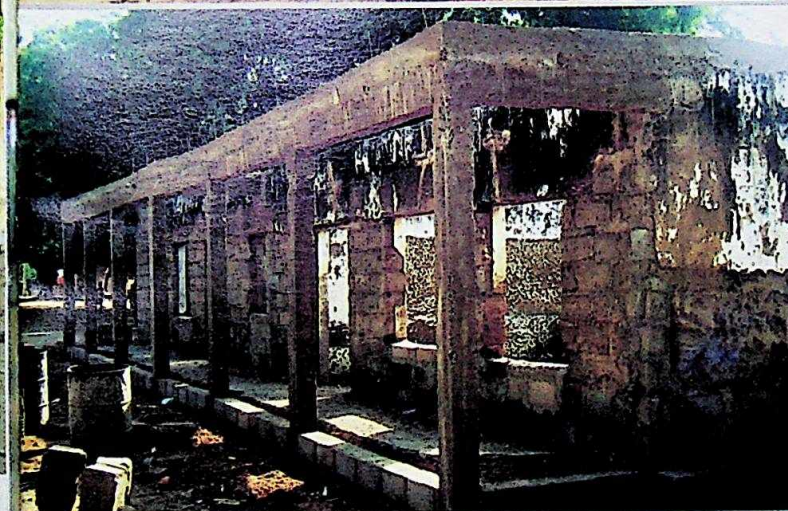
# THE STATE OF DILAPIDATION

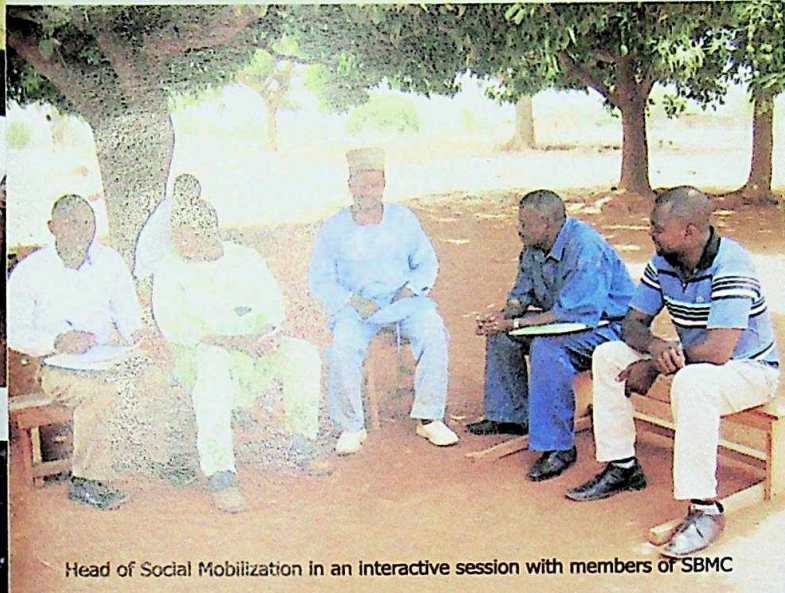




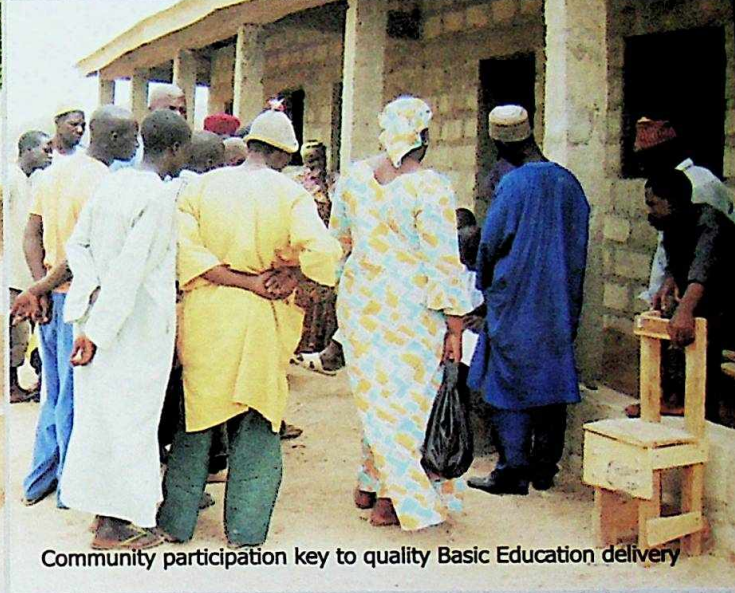

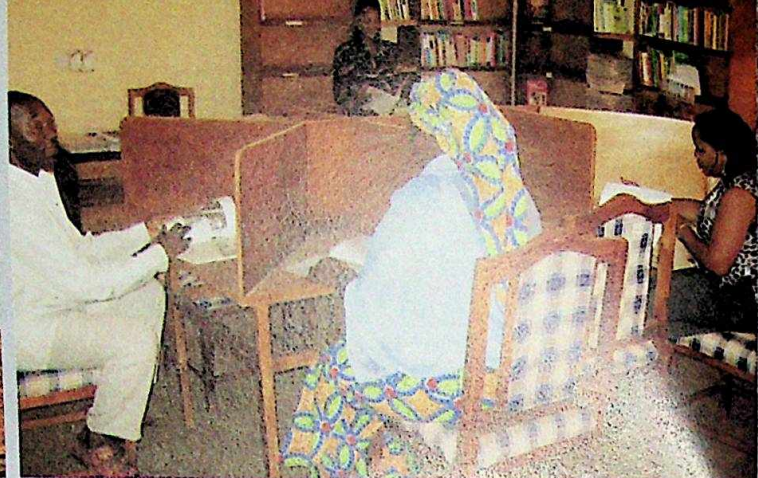
# BOOKS & LIBRARIES

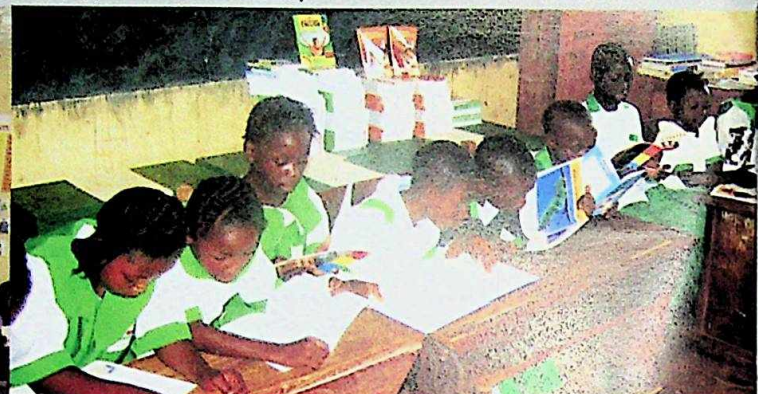

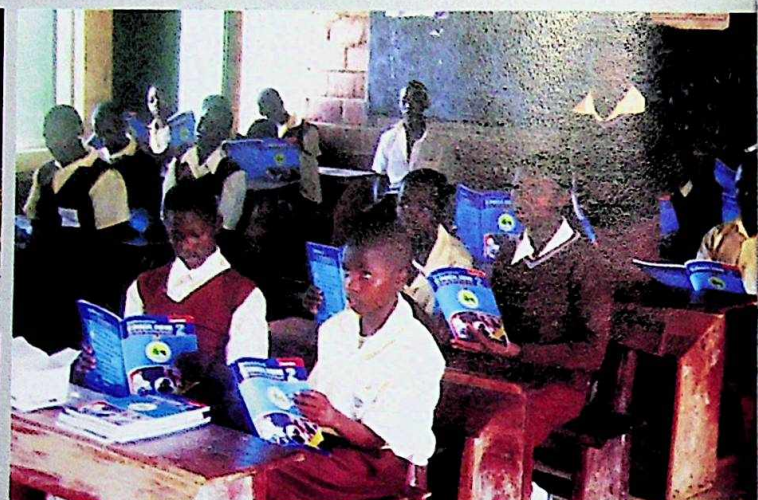

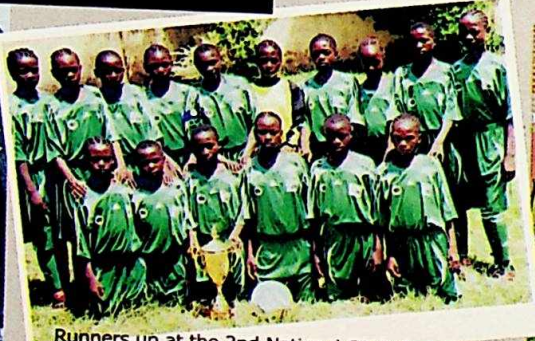

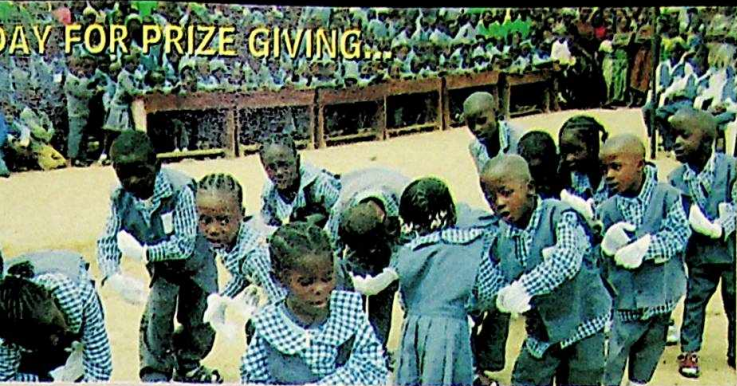

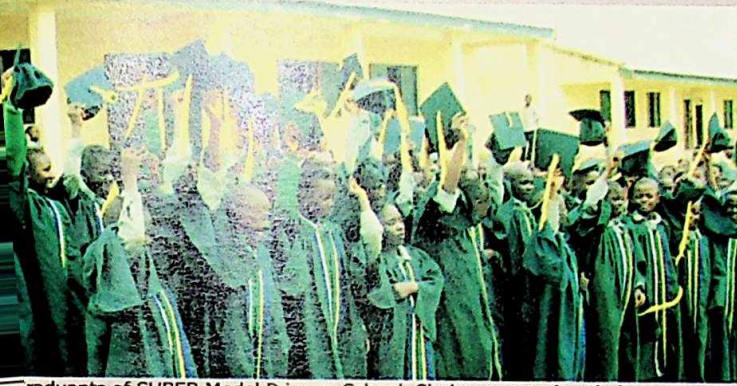

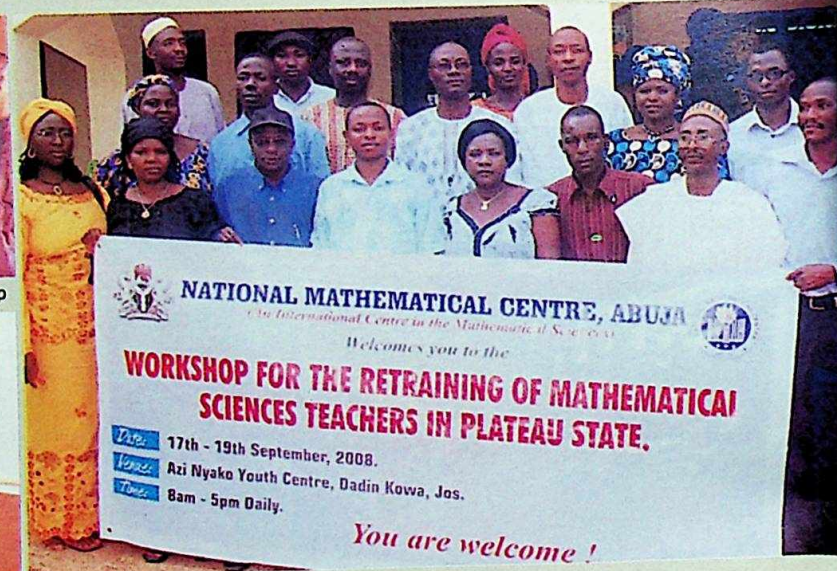

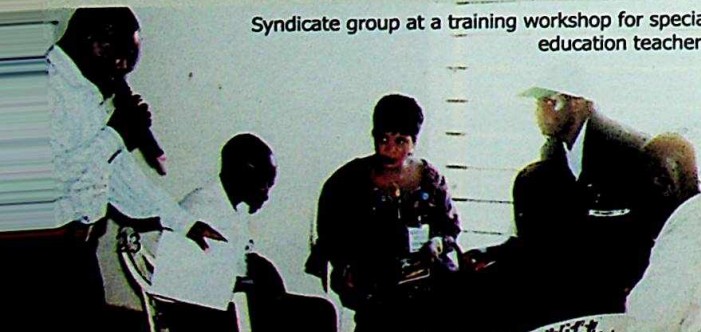

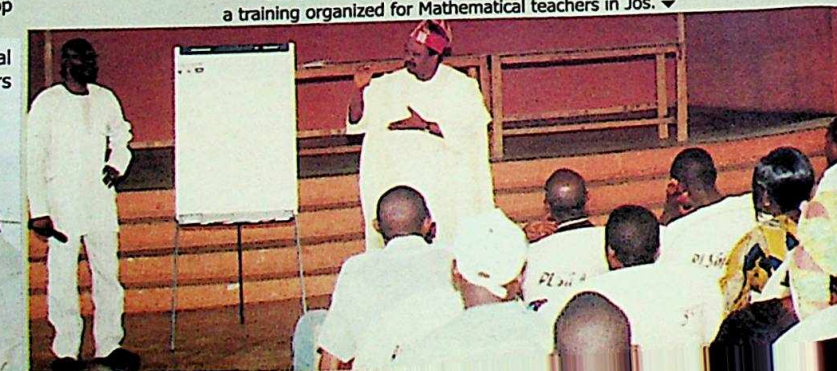

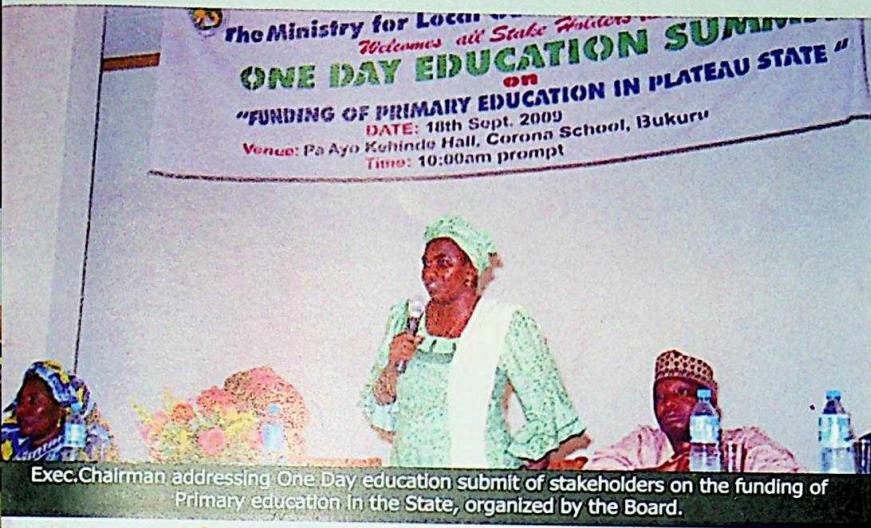

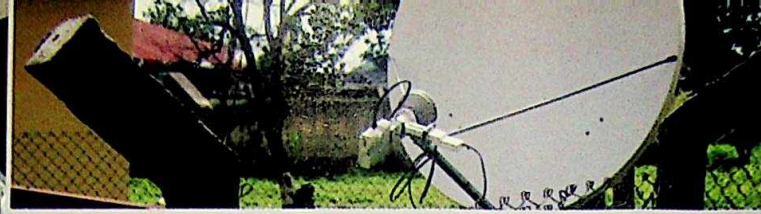

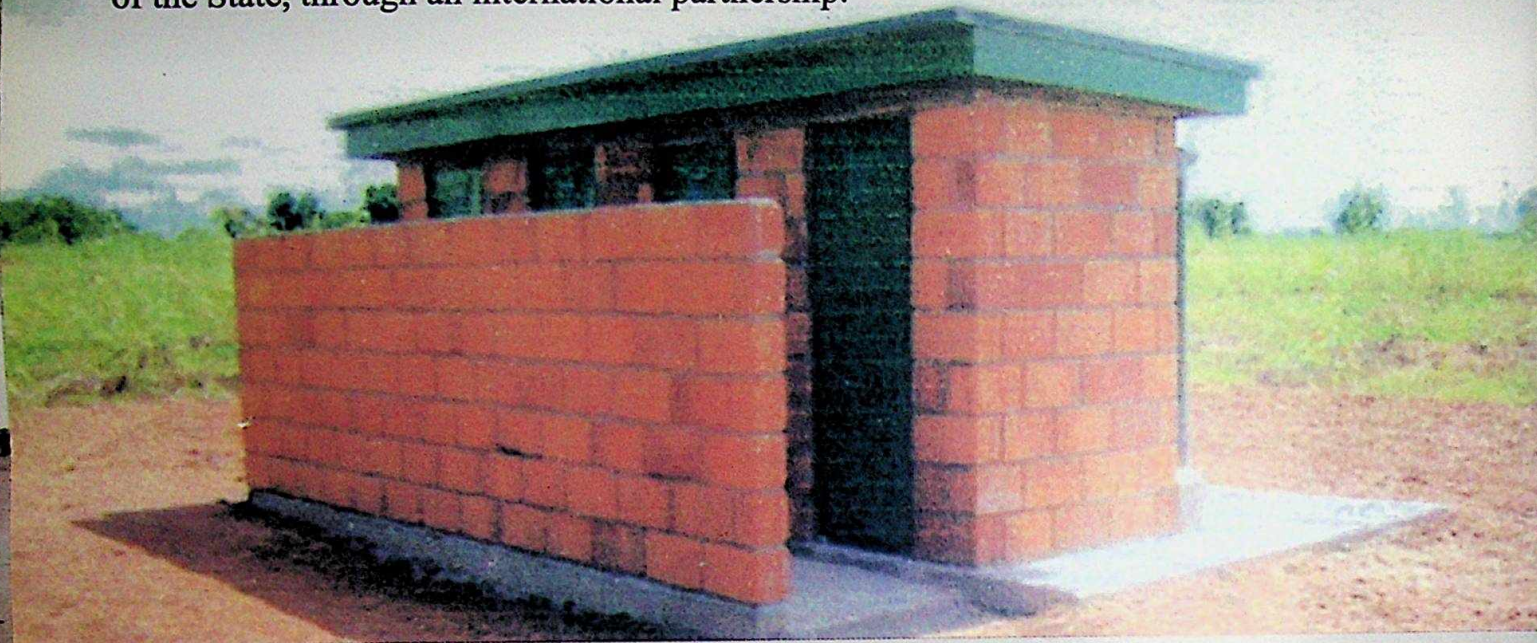

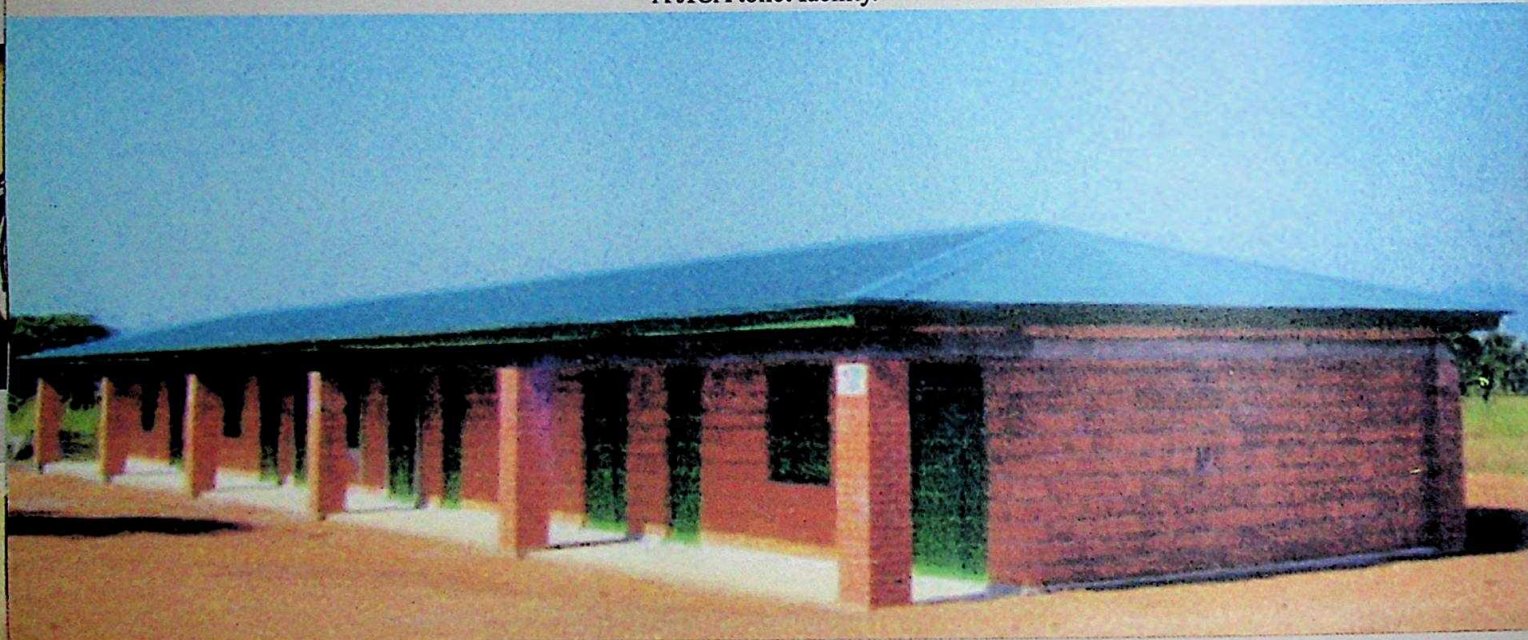

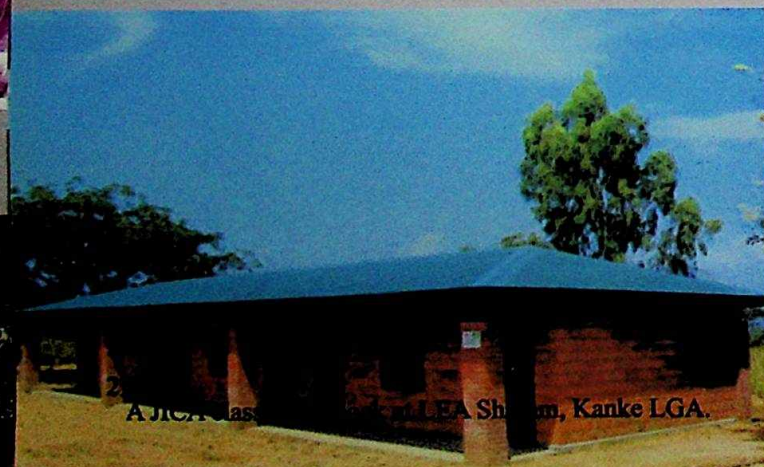

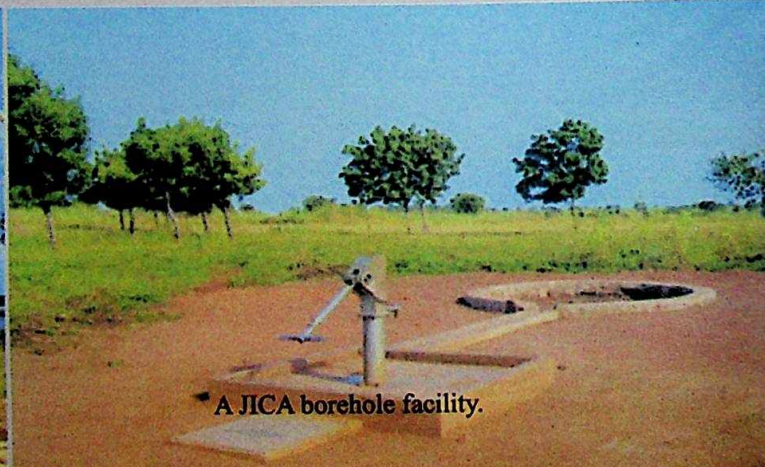
