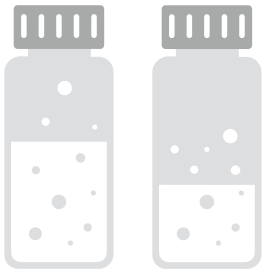
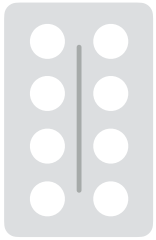

# Our Achievements



**01** Operationalization of the National Supply Chain Strategy 2021 -2026 through the development of the National Supply Chain Blueprint

**02** Support to 4 States with the adoption of the National Supply Blueprint as their supply chain strategy

**03** The Public-Private Partnership (PPP) in Yobe State has led to a 34.5% coverage and Private sector CSR infusion in the value of \$24, 000

**04** 3 States have requested for support in implementing the PPP model. Kaduna and Niger States have adopted the PPP model

**05** 3 States have inaugurated a Supply Chain Unit at the State Ministry of Health to drive Supply chain activities in the State

**06** Support to FMOH with investment in a Warehouse improvement initiative catalyzing a co-investment from TGF through the RSSH Grant for warehouse upgrade valued at \$5million in 12 States

**07** Over \$790,000 worth of cash and in-kind contributions from the Private Sector to support the Government in addressing public health supply chain challenges

**08** Supported 3 Universities with the development of Masters' Degrees in Supply Chain Management - 40 students currently enrolled

**09** Set up a Centre of Excellence (COE) in collaboration with MIT, Kuehne Foundation (HELP Logistics) and ISCEA with 100 individuals gaining certifications in Supply Chain management
