This work requires support from governments, the private sector, communities, nonprofits, and individuals


- The foundation partners with Nigerian federal and state-level government agencies and affiliates, development partners and with the private sector and civil society organizations

# WE STARTED OUR WORK IN NIGERIA BY FOCUSING ON POLIO AND LATER TRANSITIONED TO ROUTING IMMUNIZATION, AND NOW PHC, SUPPORTING GON ACHIEVE ITS HCD GOALS

Our role within the foundation has also evolved from solely supporting execution to now partnering on strategic investments

BMGF started financing Global Initiative for Polio Eradication (1,000+ estimated polio cases in Nigeria)	Nigeria liaison office was established; MOU framework instituted to transition from polio to immunization (First MOU signed with Kaduna State and then Bauchi)	Liaison office transitioned to a fully operational Nigeria Country Office as part of the Africa Transition; MOU framework transition from immunization to PHC in 2016 following 4 additional MOUs (Sokoto, Yobe, Kaduna, and Borno)	WHO declared Nigeria polio free; we developed the NCO country strategy with a continued focus on PHC	We have been implementing our strategy around strengthening PHC systems, building institutions for the future and continuously creating an enabling policy environment	We are committed to supporting BMGF enable GoN achieve its HCD goals in health, nutrition, labour productivity and education

Working with deeply experienced partners helps us target more opportunities and extend our reach on interventions













## OVER THE YEARS, WE HAVE INVESTED OVER \$2B IN NIGERIA ACROSS KEY FOCUS AREAS
